Downtown Auburn is 'in full swing'

AUBURN — With summer in full swing, downtown Auburn also is in full swing with the Downtown Auburn Business Association and Auburn Main Street summer art exhibit.

"Downtown in Full Swing" is made up of 16 wooden swings featuring art created by local and regional artists. The swings were built by local carpenter Craig Presley from 4/4 Wood Products of Pleasant Lake. The exhibit has been sponsored by individuals, businesses and organizations and will remain on display through Labor Day.

This is the 16th outdoor summer art exhibit DABA and Auburn Main Street have presented.

Artist Tia Killen takes on a celestial theme with her swing, "Swinging with the Stars." Shooting stars and colorful planets are depicted against a dark night sky background.

As in previous years' exhibits, artists Jessica and Shaun Green include interactive activities on their bar, "A Flowerbed of Fidgets." A bed of delicate flowers complete with butterflies and bees is painted on the front of the bench, while the back side of the piece is covered in brightly colored flower "fidgets" that can be turned and spun.

In her swing, entitled "Dear Self," artist Alisha Murphy uses words from scripture to remind people that God says they are "unique," "special," "lovely," "precious," "strong," "chosen" and "forgiven."

A giant luna moth and the phrase, "Love you to the Moon and Back," are featured on "Resilience Moon" by Audrey Donat.

Artist Lisa McNamara-Hoffman pays tribute to birds in "Fly High, Dream Big," while Jessi Christian's

swing sends a message — "Save the Bees."

Stephanie James and Breely Taylor note that "A bad day fishing beats a good day at work" on their swing, "Lake Living."

The seat portion of Abigail Garman's swing is decorated to represent a keyboard, while the back rest features sheet music to "It Don't Mean A Thing (If it Ain't Got That Swing)."

All outdoor swings are available to bid on all summer long using a QR code. Proceeds from the event will be used to fund future summer exhibits and events throughout the year in downtown Auburn.

Cash prizes will be awarded to the top three wings at the end of the exhibit. The University of Saint Francis Art Department will select its choices for the top three bars, based on artistic criteria. Members of the public are invited to use a ballot included in an exhibit brochure to vote for their three favorite swings. The people's choice scores will be combined with the university's scoring to


determine the winners. Completed ballots should be turned in to Carbaugh Jewelers in downtown Auburn by Sept. 1.






