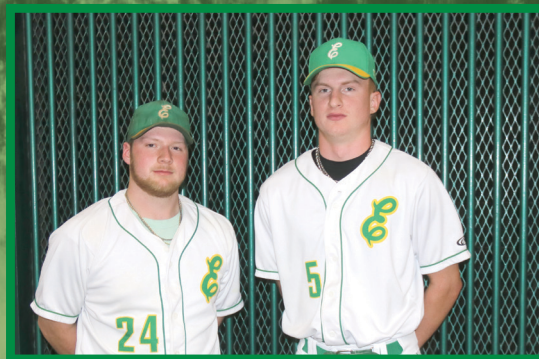


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Eastside girls want an even bigger dream season

BUTLER — Describing the 2024 campaign as a “dream season,” Eastside track coach Nicholas Beard said there were plenty of positives.

Winning championships at the Hamilton, Turtle Town (Churubusco) and the Harriet Metz (Central Noble) invitations is a great way to start.

Sending four girls to regionals is even better.

Want more? Three of those athletes are returning this season.

Junior Adelaide Elden won the Northeast Corner Conference meet and sectional championships in the 300-meter hurdles. She was timed at 48.69 seconds in the event at the NECC meet and broke the tape in 48.57 to win the sectional. At regionals, she lowered her time once again, running 48.06 to finish eighth.

She tied for fourth in the high jump at the NECC and was sixth at sectionals. With scratches by other athletes, she was able to compete in regionals, clearing 4 feet, 10 inches, finishing in a four-way tie for seventh.

Senior Lily Kreischer missed a good chunk of the 2024 season with injuries, but was able to return in time to place second at sectionals in the 400-meter dash, with a time of 1:00.73. She was 13th at regionals.

Junior Addison Moughler was second in the long jump at the NECC meet, with a leap of 15 feet, 6 1/2 inches. She finished fifth in the 100-meter hurdles and sixth in the 300-meter hurdles.

At sectionals, she improved to 16 feet, 2 inches in the long jump. Once more, she stretched her distance at regionals, popping a jump of 16 feet, 5 1/2 inches. She earned points in both hurdle races at sectionals.

In addition to Elden, Kreischer and Moughler, Beard welcomes back eight more letter winners, including seniors Kiersten Haynes, Karly Kaufmann, Dasia Richards and Regan Smith. Kamdyn Creech and Paige Kreischer. Stella Dickerhoff and Rylan Moughler earned letters as freshmen and are back in the fold.

Beard is expecting contributions from newcomers Adyson Brown, Mackenzie Dawkins, Olivia Gillespie, Emily Graves, Olivia Lehrman, Paige Roth, Paris Santos, Jayla Sudduth, Greenleigh Suffel and Ralynn Warstler.

BUTLER — Eastside boys track coach Nicholas Beard is hopeful to see additional growth after some successes last season.

Last year, three Blazers competed in the Carroll Regional. One of them, Dane Sebert, is now throwing at Indiana University after winning both the shot put and discus championships at regional. He went on to finish third in the discus and second in shot put at the state finals to put nice bow on a fantastic high school career.

“Dane Sebert advancing to state in both shot and disc and placing in the top three in both was a huge momentum swing for our expanding program,” Beard said. “We will continue to build off of last season’s success.”

Also lost to graduation were David Burns, Joey Eck and Connor Stoy.

Nolan Baker and Andrew Strong are two athletes to build around.

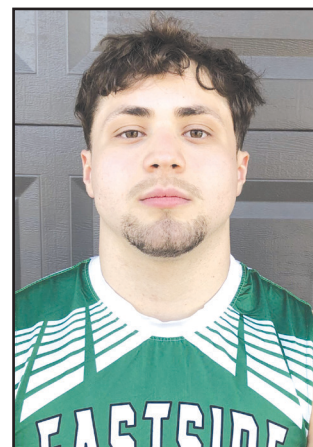
As a sophomore, Nolan Baker won the sectional championship in the high jump, clearing six feet even at East Noble to earn

a spot in the regional. He was unable to clear starting height at regionals.

Andrew Strong also had a solid sophomore season, placing second in the 1,600-meter run with a time of 4 minutes, 28.95 seconds. He finished 12th at regionals.

Strong is coming off a tremendous cross country season, finishing 25th overall at the state finals with a time of 15:36.9. He won the sectional championship (15:47.5) and was eighth at regionals (15:59.9).

The 2025 Blazers have just two seniors, returning

Home meets will take place April 15 with Fremont, April 22 with Lakewood Park and May 6 with Garrett.



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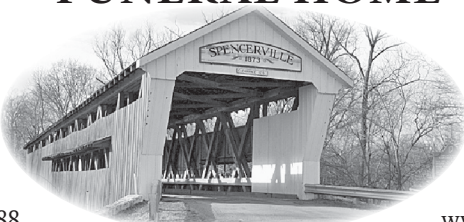




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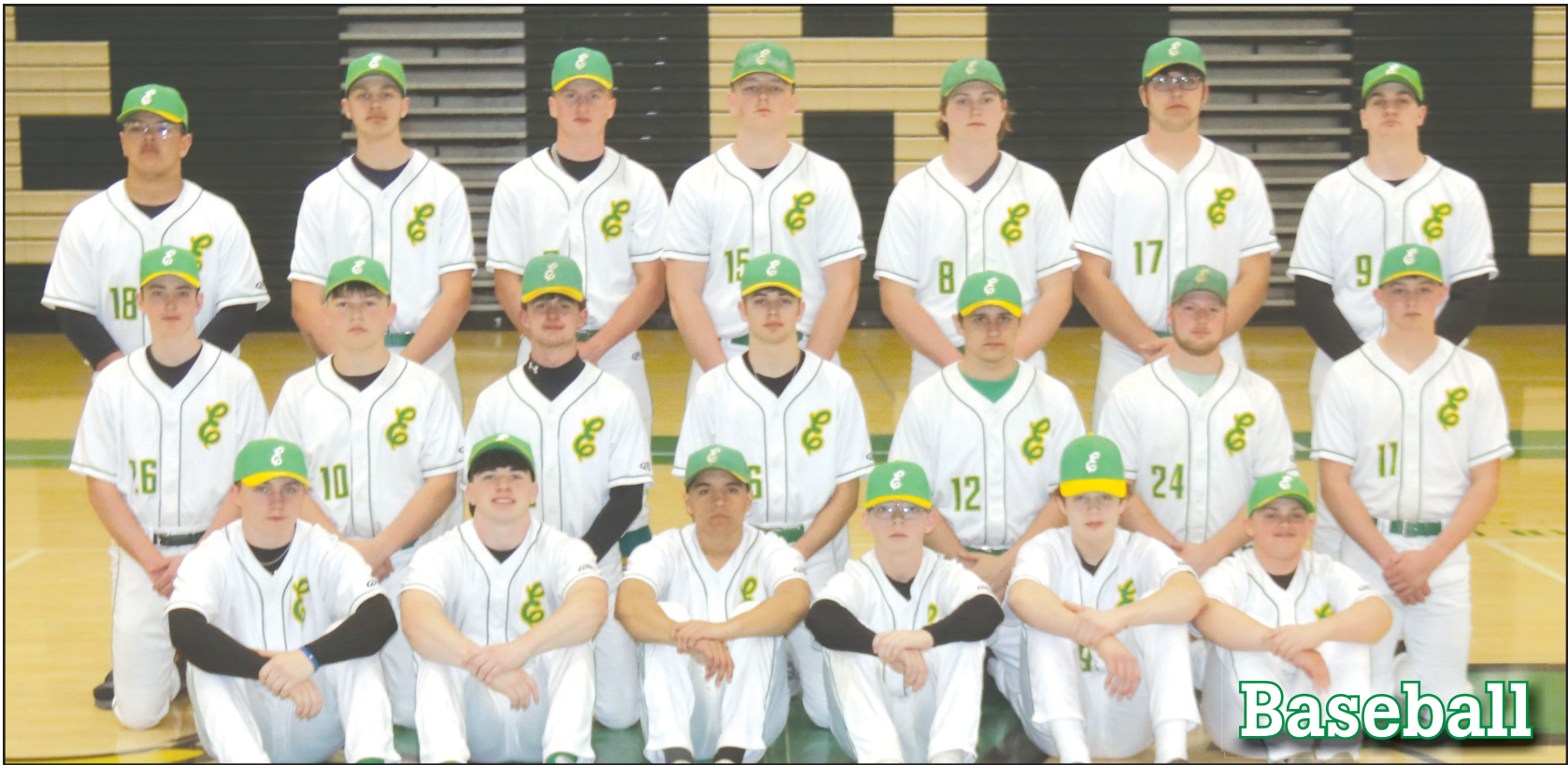

Baseball team will be 'young but scrappy'

BUTLER — Eastside's baseball team will need to replace lots of experience from a team that finished 16-9 a season ago.

"We will be young, but scrappy and competitive," said head coach Cade Willard, who has guided the Blazers to a 33-18 the past two seasons.

Noah Acquaviva, Aydian Davis, Wyatt Davis, Loden Johnson and Ryder Reed all graduated and Nolen Steury graduated early this school year.

Acquaviva batted .290, with 24 hits and 18 runs batted in. Reed batted .310 with 27 hits and 14 RBIs. Johnson (.220 average) had 19 hits, including nine doubles.

On the mound, Reed finished with a 5-1 record, striking out 77 while walking just 17. Aydian Davis was 4-0 with 30 strikeouts.

Seniors Brayden Baatz and Jace Mayberry will be called upon to provide leadership for a young group.

"This season, we will rely on our two seniors that have played a lot of high school baseball," Willard said. "We will rely on many underclassmen to step up this season on varsity."

Baatz can play either short or second base. Mayberry mostly split time on the mound or behind the plate.

Baatz missed some time with injury a year ago, but batted .270 while appearing in 18 games. He had 15 hits, drove in nine runs and drew 14 walks.

Mayberry batted .300 with 21 hits, including seven doubles. He batted in 13 RBIs.

Despite finishing with a 1-5 record, Mayberry compiled a solid 2.28 earned run average while working 40 innings and striking out 62 batters.

As a freshman, Wyatt Shull finished 3-2, striking out 22 batters in 27 innings.

"Those two (Mayberry and Shull) will have to keep us in games if we want to be successful," Willard said.

"I'm excited to see what our underclassmen must provide early on," the Blazer coach continued. "Guys like Gabe Guerra and Wyatt Shull will have to step up in big ways this year. We have a few freshmen that will play varsity baseball from day one and will get better over time."

Guerra, a junior, can play infield or catch. Juniors Bryan Cuenca (utility), Julian Gaff (pitch or first base) and Corbin Gardner (third base) will also get chances to show what they can do.

Sophomore Eli Hankey can be used as a utility player. Classmate Cole Omspacher can play first or pitch. Evan Policinski can pitch or play outfield.

Freshmen Bo Hurraw, Bo Martin and Will McCreery will also receive consideration. Hurraw can pitch or play outfield. Martin can pitch or play the infield. McCreery can help in the outfield.

Tony Emenhiser and Mark Grove return as assistant coaches. Former Eastside players Conner Dove and Lance Garman have joined as assistant coaches.

Eastside opens the season Tuesday with a home game against Antwerp, Ohio. The Blazers will have home games Thursday against New Haven and April 5 against Edon, Ohio.

A May 6 contest with Fairfield is slated to take place at Parkview Field, home of the Fort Wayne TinCaps.





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Young Blazers emphasizing learning from mistakes

BUTLER — Focus on what you can control and win the next pitch.

That's the approach Eastside's softball team will take when it steps onto the field to begin the 2025 season.

"With a young team, we need to have a short memory, learn from our mistakes and focus on the next pitch," head coach Brennen Kitchen said.

The Blazers finished 23-6 last season, winning their third straight sectional championship and Northeast Corner Conference regular season championship.

Five players graduated from that team, including center fielder Jayci Kitchen, pitcher Moyra McAtee, catcher Timmery Hunter, first baseman Victoria Roose and third baseman Kennedy Smyth. Kitchen and McAtee were named to the north all-star team.

Kitchen, now playing at Taylor University, set a new

school record with a .622 batting average, connecting for 61 hits, scoring 51 times and driving in 30. She added 13 doubles and was a perfect 42 of 42 in stolen bases.

Hunter, now playing at Glen Oaks Community College, batted .344 with 31 hits and 29 runs batted in. Roose, now at Coe College in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, batted .315 with 28 hits, 25 RBIs and 35 runs scored. Smyth batted .274

with 20 hits and 17 RBIs.

McAtee went 19-5 in the circle with a 1.313 earned run average and a team-best 242 strikeouts. At the plate, she batted .325 with 27 hits, 27 runs batted in, 10 doubles and a team-best three home runs.

That's not to say the cupboard is bare, however. Lilli Cline, Lucy Kitchen, Elodie Bishop and Emily McClain all played significant roles last season. Cline and Kitchen were selected

to the All-Northeast Corner Conference team.

A senior, Cline batted .381 with 37 hits, five doubles, 30 RBIs and 24 runs scored. She added 12 stolen bases. She returns at shortstop.

As a freshman, Kitchen batted .485 with 33 hits, eight doubles, 33 runs scored and 33 RBIs. She swiped eight bases. Kitchen played all three outfield positions last season.

Bishop, now a junior, spent time at both second and third base. She batted .339 with 21 hits, 21 runs scored and 16 runs batted in.

As a freshman, McClain batted .309 with 25 hits, 22 RBIs and 30 runs scored. She had a team-best eight sacrifices. She is slated to return at second base.

"Even though we have two seniors and four juniors on our team this year, we are looking for steady improvement game by game, day by day," Kitchen said. He is 82-10 leading the program the past three seasons.

While the Blazer coach said there are very good competitions for all positions, pitching will

need to be addressed. "We graduated about 96% of our innings pitched from last season, so we will be inexperienced in the circle," he said. Junior Jenna Howard, sophomores Danelle Guerra and Lucy Kitchen, and freshman Kaylyn Mayberry could all get the ball this season.

Bishop, Kitchen and freshman Molly Dick will compete for time behind the plate. Guerra, sophomore Teagan Vanover and Mayberry are all candidates at third. Howard, Vanover and junior Reese Shull are candidates to play first base. Kitchen, Dick, senior Anna McAtee, junior Serentie Davis, sophomore Payton Reycasa and freshman Ava Delgado could see action in the outfield.

Assisting Kitchen are returning coaches Todd Dale, Dylan Hertig and McKenna Hoffelder. Joining the staff this season are Mataya Bireley, a member of Eastside's 2022 state championship squad, and Karsyn Kitchen.

The 2025 season was slated to begin Monday. Eastside will host Edon, Ohio on Friday, April 4.
