conference. Two of its hockey teams are club sports.

Trine football stadium has artificial turf, lights, press boxes, locker rooms, weight and training rooms and offices.

Trine is also home of the Keith Busse ARC, an indoor athletic facility that features an indoor track along with other amenities.

Trine's new MTI Center just opened in 2018 and in 2017 the Thunder Ice Arena opened, ushering in a new era of sports at Trine.

Auto racing

Angola Motorsport Speedway is a three-eighths of a mile, sanctioned asphalt track for stock car racing. It is located at 2850 N. C.R. 600E, Fremont. The telephone number is 495-7223. The season runs from May through September with racing in a variety of stock car classes.

Along with grandstand seating, the track also has sky boxes available for rent.

Biking, hiking

Angola, Steuben County, Pokagon State Park and Hamilton offer hiking and biking trails in their communities. The longest trail, starting in Angola in Commons Park, stretches north to Hoosier Hill covering about 6 miles. The trail now connects with an existing trail in Pokagon.

Boating

To drive a boat with a motor of 10 horsepower or greater one must be at least 15 years old. Those older than 18 need a driver's license or state-issued photo identification card. For those ages 15 to 17, operators must have completed the official Indiana safe boating course and also must have a state identification card or driver's license.

Generally, lakes less than 300 acres in size have speed limits and do not allow high-speed boating. Many lakes in the county have public access sites. In addition, public access sites are located at the Pigeon River State Fish & Wildlife Area in western Steuben County.

Steuben County lakes with public access sites include Ball, Beaver Dam, Big Bower, Big Otter, Big Turkey, Clear, Crooked, Fish, Fox, Golden, Hamilton, Jimmerson, Lime, Little Turkey, Loon, Marsh, West Otter and Pigeon. There are also for-pay ramps available at local marinas. The Lake James chain of lakes can be accessed via the Big Otter Lake and Jimmerson Lake public access sites.

Boat and other related rentals are available at Pokagon State Park and area marinas.

ANGOLA — What started out as an Angola Middle School project to lend a hand to those needing a fresh meal during the COVID-19 pandemic became a weekly tradition for more than a month, sponsored by numerous entities in the community.

The meals were sponsored by first the Middle School then other community entities and were prepared by Monument Pizza and Sutton's Deli.

"All the credit for this goes to our students," said AMS Principal Ryan Bounds prior to the first meal distribution. "Our kids are just awesome."

Bounds said the students each year do a candy bar fundraiser. The school builds up its emergency fund that is banked for things like someone getting sick with cancer or a house fire.

The fund is for times like these, said Bounds. In the midst of the coronavirus pandemic, grocery store shelves are empty and families unexpectedly must shelter in place at home to try and stop the virus from spreading.

The school was able to use funds to sponsor the pasta meals, with each pan of pasta being enough to feed a family of four twice.

To receive the meals, people just had to drive through either northern quadrants of Public Square and roll down a car window. Volunteers wearing face masks and gloves for personal protection handed meals through the open windows, giving instructions and wishes for good health to each family.

Donations were welcome, though not required.

On the first meal distribution, Joe Hysong, co-owner of Monument Pizza, said cars were parked by 3 p.m. waiting on the meals. Serving was supposed to start at 4:30 p.m. but with people already waiting, volunteers decided to begin early.

"You started this," Hysong said to Bounds, looking at the long line of vehicles with a joking grin creasing the fabric of his zebra-striped face mask.

Angola gets its first new fire chief in decades

ANGOLA — For the first time in decades, Angola has a new fire chief.

In March 2020, Mayor Richard Hickman appointed Thomas R. “T.R.” Hagerty to the position that became vacant at the end of 2019 with the retirement of long-time Chief Mike Meek.

“I’ve appointed an individual who is passionate about this community and places the members of his department as his top priority. As chief he will continue

building strong partnerships with other agencies while focusing on expanding the leadership and the development of staff members and continually improving on the services provided by the Angola Fire Department,” Hickman said.

Prior to Hagerty’s appointment, there had been speculation that Hickman might reach outside the ranks of the current force because he sought and received approval from the Angola Common Council to seek applicants beyond the veterans with the Angola Fire Department.

“I was very surprised and honored,” Hagerty said Monday afternoon.

The position of chief is a mayoral appointment and does not need approval from either the Common Council or the Board of Works and Public Safety.

Hagerty didn’t layout any detail about the plans for the department’s future. Bill Harter was named as Hagerty’s assistant chief later in the year.

“I just want to move things forward with the fire department,” he said. “We’ve sat down and talked about a few things. I’d like to have an assistant chief. I’d like to get a tanker purchased. We’re working on stuff. We’re taking it one day at a time.”

Hagerty said he plans to continue

being the department’s public information officer for the foreseeable future. The position is responsible for informing the public, particularly through contacts with the media.

Hagerty has been involved with fire service since 1990 in volunteer roles and joined the Angola Fire Department as a full-time firefighter in July 2004.

He holds numerous certifications including emergency medical technician and Fire Officer I. In addition to his firefighter duties, Hagerty serves as the public information officer for the fire department, is a part of the incident management team for District 3 and has been a safety site supervisor at Fire Department Instructors Conference since 2015.



Study says Steuben has housing market potential

ANGOLA — If you ask Laurie Volk of Zimmerman/Volk Associates, Clinton, New Jersey, there is a lot of market potential in Steuben County for housing.

A housing strategy commissioned in 2019 by the Steuben County Economic Development Corp. through HPG Network, Fort Wayne, was designed to not only look at housing needs but to be implementable in all areas of Steuben County, not just one specific municipality.

A meeting was held Friday on the video platform Zoom with the SCEDC, representatives from HPG, Volk and several area municipalities to discuss more about the strategy.

“The strategy is a collaborative process,” said Ryan Chasey, president of HPG Network. “It’s designed to be implementable. We want to provide information that each town and county can choose to take action on.”

The strategy, Chasey continued to say, was built on Volk’s work.

Volk’s company has been doing market studies since 1988 and focuses on looking at market potential more than market demand.

“It is important to provide housing not only for new households but also for those that already live here, to give them options as well,” said Volk. “Fifty-seven percent of the potential housing market already lives inside Steuben County.”

Steuben County households

The methodology used by Volk shows that households by life stage in Steuben County currently include 47% retirees or empty nesters, 38% traditional or non-traditional families and another 15% is young singles or young couples.

“That tells me there is some of a problem because you need a higher percentage of younger people as the future of your county,” she said.

In an overview of the county from 2019, Volk said the population was sitting around 34,540 people, with 65% of the county living in one and

two person households.

Single family detached houses made up 77% of the housing style in the county, which she said is typical of Midwestern cities and towns.

Potential

Volk said the methodology used shows more than 2,000 households of all income levels and life stages have the potential to move into or within Steuben County over the next few years.

Though the housing preferences still lean toward detached single-family homes at 48%, Volk said housing preference strongly favor rental units also, at 36%.

“That is considerably higher than you have available here right now,” she said.

Going with households with income levels above 60% area median income, Volk said the bulk of the market in Steuben County can afford rentals around \$750-\$1,200 per month with some being able to afford higher.

Though the preference for condominium housing is lower, it is still there, with the majority of incomes above 60% AMI being able to afford around \$100,000-\$200,000, which she said can make for some nice condos.

Townhouse buyers with incomes at or above 60% AMI, per Volk’s projection, can afford \$100,000-\$150,000, with some able to go up to the \$250,000 range, at the high end.

The primary market for detached house buyers shows prices around \$100,000-\$200,000.

Housing price points

Not all areas in the county were optimal for all types of housing.

Volk presented optimum market position for Angola, Hamilton, Fremont, Hudson and Orland showing price points and housing sizes for reference.

In Angola, apartment rents from \$650-\$1,200 per month were recommended with sizes from 450-950 square feet.

As one of the only municipalities recommended for condo-style housing, price points for Angola area condos ranged from \$110,000-\$160,000 suggested, with size from 750-1,100 square feet.

Pricing on townhouses or rowhouses ranged from \$175,000-\$195,000 for homes ranging from 1,200-1,350 square feet.

The highest price for Angola was detached housing, with a range from \$200,000 to \$245,000 for homes ranging from 1,350-1,700 square feet.

Apartment rental was slightly higher for Fremont, with a range from \$750-\$1,450 per month for apartments ranging from 550 square feet to 1,250 square feet.

“We wouldn’t advise condos in Fremont,” said Volk. “But, any developers that want to try it, I would wish them good luck.”



Sculptures Angola adds art to downtown Angola

ANGOLA — For the second straight year, the downtown was graced with sculptures as part of the Sculptures Angola project.

Downtown Services Coordinator Maria Davis said installation looks a little different this time because of the COVID-19 pandemic, which resulted in cancellation of a kickoff gala to unveil the sculptures and introduce the community to their artists.

It looks different because there won't be a big celebration like last year, complete with a reception with the artists, due to social distancing concerns because of COVID-19.

The 2020 artists included Maureen Bergquist Gray of Interlochen, Michigan, Pat Mack of Indianapolis, Greg Mendez of Decatur and Fremont's own Greg Summers.

Both Mendez and Summers had displays in the first sculpture installation. Mendez's brother, Alex, also had a sculpture in the first installation as did Nathan S. Pierce of Cape Girardeau, Missouri.

Summers's sculpture from the first round can now be seen in Fremont at the pocket park across from D.J.'s Tempting Treats and BBQ on East Toledo Street. It was later moved to Crossroads Industrial Park in Fremont.

Plaques identifying the artist and sculpture title were put in place.

A fall art installation did not take place in 2020, but sculptures from the 2019 installation are still in place on West Maumee Street.
