



'Sip & Smile Auburn Style" welcomes visitors

AUBURN — Time travelers, apes, honey bees and fallen heroes are among the themes and subjects depicted on patio bars around downtown Auburn as part of the Downtown Auburn **Business Association** and Auburn Main Street summer art exhibit.

"Sip & Smile Auburn Style" is made up of 20 wooden patio bars featuring art created by local and regional artists. The bars were built by local carpenter Craig Presley from 4 Quarter Wood Products of Pleasant Lake. The exhibit has been sponsored by individuals, businesses and organizations and will remain on display through Labor Day.

This is the 15th outdoor summer art exhibit DABA and Auburn Main Street have presented.

An art walk took place July 11 when artists share the inspirations for their work and the techniques they used to create their bars. The walk is free and open to the public.

enforcement in their bar, "Cheers to the Heroes." The bar is dedicated in memory of Indiana State Police Master Trooper James Bailey of Auburn, who was killed in the line of duty on Interstate 69 in March 2023.

The bar top features a display of patches from DeKalb County police and marshal's departments, as well as casings and a pair of handcuffs. The front of the bar shares the message, "In VALOR There is HOPE." One side of the bar pays tribute to Indiana fallen officers of 2023, listing each by name. The other side of the bar is dedicated in memory of fallen K9s. which are described as

partners, friends and family.

The bar is sponsored by the Auburn Police Department and is located outside of Auburn City

In her bar, entitled "Playstation," artist Alisha Getts Murphy features popular family and children's games, such as Mousetrap, Trouble, Monopoly, Sorry and Clue. A side panel of the bar offers an interactive version of Plinko. The bar's top is decorated with two checker boards.

Sandy Cisco used bottle caps to create an image of two hands toasting with drinks on the patio bar entitled "Cheers!"

Members of the public are invited to use a ballot included in an exhibit brochure to vote for their three favorite bars. The People's Choice scores will be combined with the university's scoring to determine the winners. Completed ballots should be turned in to Carbaugh Jewelers in downtown Auburn by Sept. 1.

The patio bars will be available for purchase at the "Sip & Smile" annual "FUNdraising" dinner auction on Sept. 11.
Proceeds from the event will go to fund future summer art exhibits and other events and activities

throughout the year in downtown Auburn.


