

### Eastside swimmers looking to improve

AUBURN — Things are going swimmingly, appropriately enough for Eastside's swim program.

It helps already knowing what some of the swimmers can do coming into the season. That's because some of them have swam for head coach Abby Scoville through the YMCA of DeKalb County program.

Scoville welcomes back four letter winners on the boys side in Cayden Burkett, Johnny Buss, Gabe Fuentes and Carter Helbert.

Two seniors graduated from the girls' side and two others did not return, but returning swimmer Brooklynn Landry has shown promise.

"Brooklynn, Gabe and Cayden were new last year, and they came back," Scoville said. "I'm super excited because they're really good swimmers.

"I'm excited to have a boys relay team this year. I know we only have one girl, but I'm excited to have her (Landry)."

There are no seniors on the swim team; all members are underclassmen.

Scoville expects all of the swimmers to try different events while the boys have even to compete in relay events.

"We have a couple of kids that will focus a little more on distance, but they're pretty grounded individuals," she said. "They're pretty flexible. They can just go where I put them.

"It's helpful to have those kids that can just pop in and fill it out and do it well. They'll all do well no matter where I stick them," Scoville said.

Chloe Buss, Laney Millay and Connor Stoy all graduated. At sectionals, Buss placed seventh overall in the 100-meter freestyle and nine in the 200-meter freestyle.

Eastside will follow DeKalb's swim schedule. The 2024-2025 swimming season opens Tuesday, Nov. 26 at Goshen with a meet the following night against Concordia.

Home meets will take place at the YMCA of DeKalb County, 533 North St. The first home meet is Dec. 3 against Bishop Dwenger.

### Blazers, new coach are learning together

BUTLER — It's a blank slate in more ways than one for the Eastside Blazers.

Will Lewis takes over as head coach after the Blazers finished 8-15 for David Prokop, who is now athletic director at Hamilton.

Four of the leading scorers from that team
— Noah Acquaviva,
Loden Johnson, Clayton
Minnick and Ryder Reed —
graduated.

Minnick averaged just over 12 points per game to go with 33 three-point field goals. Johnson averaged 6.9 points per game and 31 threes. Acquaviva averaged 6.8 points per game and Reed checked in at just under five points a contest.

Junior Nolan Baker has the most returning experience, averaging 4.7 points per game a year ago.

Lewis is counting on Baker, Bryan Cuenca, Evan Elden and Bryce Strong, among others, to play bigger roles this season.

He's not sugar-coating

anything.

"The only thing we know about Eastside basketball is that we don't know anything about Eastside basketball," Lewis said.

"We are a blank slate. I'm in a fortunate situation to start building our team toward my vision," he continued. "We're going to learn to love this journey together — process over prize.

"I'm excited about the energy bubbling up and what the future of Blazer

basketball looks like. Whatever it takes!"

The new coach said the team's style of play will depend on what he feels will put the team in best position to win.

"In a perfect world offensively, I like to use the whole court," Lewis said. "This forces a team to be fundamentally sound on defense the entire possession

"Defensively, I like multiple physical, high-pressure defense. I want to find

out early and often if your team can make the right decision quickly and under pressure."

Lewis, who is a special education teacher at Eastside, played basketball at Northrop High School and earned his bachelor's degree while also playing basketball at the University of Tennessee-Martin.

He earned his master's degree at the University of Saint Francis. Before coming to Eastside, Lewis was a varsity assistant coach and teacher at North Side and the past two years as reserve basketball coach and teacher at Bishop Dwenger.

"I envision this program as a family, where high schoolers mentor lower school kids like little brothers," Lewis said. "To earn admiration from

# Eastside girls using how last year ended as motivation for 2024–2025 season

BUTLER — It could be another fun season in eastern DeKalb County.

The 2023-2024 Eastside Lady Blazers set a new program record with 21 wins while also winning the Northeast Corner Conference tournament for the first time since the 1993-1994 season.

Most of the players from that squad are back and they will be supplemented by players from a JV squad that went 19-2 a year ago.

Head coach Mike Lortie, 82-41 in five seasons at Eastside, returns five players who were either All-Northeast Corner Conference picks or received honorable mention a season ago.

The Blazers have averaged 16 wins per season under Lortie, including a sectional championship in the 2021-2022 season.

He has a three-headed monster in seniors Sydnee

Kessler, Lily Kreischer and Paige Traxler to lead the way.

Kreischer averaged 11.8 points per contest last year. Traxler was right behind at 11.1 points a game while Kessler chipped in with 10.3 points per game.

As freshmen, Lucy Kitchen and Taylor Mack provided plenty of support. Kitchen averaged 6.2 points per game while Mack added 5.3 points per contest.

Through two games, the Blazers have distributed the

scoring evenly, with four players in double figures in a season-opening win at Concordia on Nov. 7. Mack went off for 21 points in a Nov. 12 win over Blackhawk Christian.

Senior Avery Wilson can hit the outside shot. Adelaide Elden, Paige Kreischer, and sisters Addison Moughler and Rylan Moughler all got into varsity games last year. That quintet will be counted upon to make bigger contributions this season as dependable players Jayci Kitchen and Haley Wies graduated.


The 21 wins surpassed the previous best of 19 wins, set by the 1978-1979 team that advanced to the semi-state in the single class format.

As great as the 2023-2024 season was, it ended with a disappointing 47-42 loss to Central Noble in sectional play. That loss is being used as motivation.

"The year ended not as planned, but a great year nonetheless," Lortie said. "We are all using the way the season ended as fuel every day since to attempt a deeper run at the end of the year."

Assisting Lortie are returning assistant coaches Kaci Yoder, Mandy Dale and McKenna Hoffelder.

Eastside will host defending Class 2A state champion Bishop Luers Tuesday, Nov. 26.

### Eastside bowlers making steady progress

BUTLER — While the Eastside bowling team has several new faces in the lineup, they are right in the mix of the Northeast Bowling Conference race.

"The team is off to a 4-1 start this season," said head coach Brandon DePew. "We have a large number of first-and second-year bowlers this

season, so I expect the team to gel together and improve greatly in the second half of the season."

The Blazers said good-bye to graduated bowlers Nick Kaiser and Braydon Weicht from a 2023-2024 team that finished 8-2 in all matches. Eastside was sectional runners-up and qualified for the team regional.

Returning bowlers

Charles Baldwin, Triton Fiechter and Braden Wilson are being counted upon to provide leadership for the team's new faces.

Baldwin, Fiechter and Exzavyer Roby are the team's only seniors. Wilson, Julian Gaff and Timothy Kraft are juniors. Champ Banda, Mark Brown, Clinen McDonald, Demetri Swank and Chase Tornblom are sophomores on this year's team.

DePew is assisted by Erin DePew and Patrick Curcio.

Bowling season began in October. As of Nov. 15, DeKalb leads the NEBC with a 5-0 record. Eastside is right behind at 4-1. Garrett and Angola are 3-2. Central Noble and Oak Farm are each 2-3 and East Noble is 1-4.

DeKalb's average team

score is 713, Eastside's is 714, Garrett's is 747 and Angola checks in at 737.

Eastside's home matches take place at Butler Bowl and Recreation Center.

Conference competition will end Jan. 12, with sectionals to take place by Jan. 19. The regional tournament is Jan. 25. Semi-state is Feb. 1 and state finals take place Feb. 15 and 16.
