Loaded Warriors look to maintain top perch in area

EMMA — Westview High School baseball has been one of the top programs in northeast Indiana these past few seasons, and the Warriors don't look to be in position to miss any beats in 2025.

Westview (19-11 last season) won the Class 2A Eastside Sectional a year ago, then followed that up with a 12-1 win over Eastbrook in the Oak Hill Regional. The ride ended at the Class 2A North Semi-State with an 8-7 loss to Rochester in the semifinals.

The Warriors lost some key players to graduation, including shortstop Braden Kauffman, third baseman/pitcher Mason Wire, and outfielders Scott Yoder, Micah Miller and Jayce Brandenberger.

As longtime Westview

coach Jason Rahn prepares for his 14th season, he's encouraged to see a strong core back in 2025, especially on the pitching staff.

Seniors Max Engle, Gavin Engle, Maverick Deveau and Jack Massey all threw for the Warriors in 2024. Jaxon Engle is back to catch, and Gavin Engle plays the infield, too. Deveau is also an outfielder and Massey is a utility guy when not on the mound.

Max Engle is the Warriors' ace, and was one of three KPC Media Baseball Preps of the Year last season along with Kauffman and Lakeland's Carson Mickem.

Engle was an All-Northeast Corner Conference selection, going 7-3 with a 1.75 earned run average. He amassed 113 strikeouts in 64 innings.

"Our pitching staff is better than last year and we are excited to see how they compete," Rahn said. "We will need to have some younger guys step up and help fill some gaps left from last year's senior class, but we are confident our young players are ready."

Elijah Zolman, a pitcher-infielder, will be a key newcomer for Westview in 2025.

Rahn is assisted by Adam Christner, Mike Antal, Matthew Jones, Michael Christner and Mason Atra.



On the mound, we have a deep group of arms capable of attacking the zone and controlling games. Our focus is simple — play the game hard, play it the right way, and let our preparation show."

Knights look for solid encore from last season

It was a big bounce-back season for the East Noble girls track and field team last year. The Knights look to follow that up in a solid way this spring.

Last year, EN won its first sectional championship since 2021 and its first Northeast 8 Conference title since 2019. The Knights won the sectional on their home track.

East Noble returns much of the core of last year's squad. It lost a small senior group to graduation, including team leaders Julie Crow (400 meters, long jump) and Lauren Munson, who stood out in the hurdles. Crow is running the longer sprints and middle distance at NCAA Division I Indiana University Indianapolis.

This year's Knights will have winners from their cross country team and their Class 3A Concordia Sectional champion girls basketball team from this past winter. Those groups include sophomore Elli

Will, a state qualifier in the best pole vaulters in junior 200-meter dash last spring, and junior Chloe Gibson, the KPC Media Girls Cross Country Prep of the Year last fall.

Will and the harriers taking to the track will look to compete in better health this spring. Will dealt with back issues throughout the basketball season, and the EN girls cross country team battled illness and injury during its fall 2024 campaign.

Johanna Carpenter, Macey Colin, Rian David, Rae David and Gracyn Koons are also back from the Knights' distance crew.

Will posted the secondbest times in program history in the 200 and 100 dashes as a freshman in

Along with Will and Rian David (800 meters), other basketball players expected to contribute are junior Addison Deming in the high jump and junior Kate David in the 400.

East Noble also brings back one of the area's best long jumpers in senior Lilly Crow and one of the area's

Kylie Walz.

"Throwers Jourdan Anderson and Addisyn Ritchie are returning and have already been hitting marks better than last year in our early season," fourth-year Knight coach Cody Wait said.

There have been adjustments to postseason fields. All 14 area schools will be in the local sectionals this spring. That means Churubusco and Lakewood Park and is moving out of Fort Wayne and heading north. Angola will host those sectionals in May.

Local teams will be heading west for regionals instead of south. The girls' regional will be at Warsaw while the boys' regional will be at Goshen.

Local teams have competed in regionals at Marion and Carroll over the past few years.

'Ît will be a deeper field with bigger schools, including Penn, Warsaw and Elkhart," veteran Churubusco coach Zach Dock said. "The field events are going to be

Head Coach: Nicholas Beard, second season

The Blazers won three invitationals and sent four girls to regional last season. Three of those regional qualifiers in senior Lily Kreischer and juniors Adelaide Elden and Addison Moughler.

Kreischer missed a good chunk of the 2024 season with injuries, but was able to return in time to place second at sectionals in the 400-meter dash, with a time of 1:00.73. She was 13th at regionals.

Elden won the NECC meet and sectional championships in the 300-meter hurdles. She was timed at 48.69 seconds in the event at the NECC meet and broke the tape in 48.57 to win the sectional. At regionals, she lowered her

time once again, running 48.06 to finish eighth.

She tied for fourth in the high jump at the NECC and was sixth at sectionals. With scratches by other athletes, she was able to compete in regionals, clearing 4 feet, 10 inches, finishing in a four-way tie for seventh.

Moughler was second in the long jump at the NECC meet, with a leap of 15-6.5. She finished fifth in the 100 hurdles and sixth in the 300 hurdles.

At sectionals, she improved to 16-2 in the long jump. Once more, she stretched her distance at regionals, popping a jump of 16-5.5 inches. She earned points in both hurdle races at sectionals.

Lakeland Lakers



BUTLER — Eastside softball has been quite the dynasty in the area in recent years, and the Blazers look to be loaded and ready for more success as the 2024 season beckons.


