PETITION FOR DAMAGES

NOW COMES Your Petitioner, WILLIAM "BILL" LUNN, a person of the full age of majority, and a resident of Bossier Parish, Louisiana, who, through undersigned counsel, respectfully represents as follows:

1.

Until his career was destroyed by his former competitors, Nexstar Media, Inc. d/b/a KTAL, Daniel R. Jovic, Sr. and Jacquelyn A. Jovic, Defendants herein, William "Bill" Lunn ("Lunn") was an award-winning journalist employed as news director and lead anchor at KTBS 3 Shreveport, an ABC affiliate ("KTBS").


2.

Defendants – with malice aforethought – rushed, sensational and poorly sourced lead news story on the 10 p.m. broadcast, reaching Lunn's children, friends, family, ministers, former classmates, employer, former wife, and innumerable viewers and internet users in Louisiana, parts of Arkansas and Texas, and eventually the entire world – that told everyone that Lunn was a child predator. Defendants made these claims without regard for the facts and evidence in their actual possession, or worse, ignored that Lunn was nothing more than a decent man caught up in a criminal scheme and completely innocent. Defendants' claims were, and are, false.

3.

Petitioner believes strongly in the newsgathering protections afforded journalists in the United States. He seeks to follow the rulings of the Supreme Courts (both the United States and Louisiana Supreme Courts) and relevant jurisprudence to show that Defendants' actions are a rare example of actionable defamation and character assassination. Defendants' refusal to correct, retract or place in context the false allegations only add to the need for this action and further salts the wound.

THE DEFENDANTS

4.

Made Defendants herein are:

- A. NEXSTAR MEDIA INC, ("Nexstar") d/b/a KTAL NBC 6 ("KTAL"), a Delaware Corporation licensed to do and doing business in Louisiana, with its principal business office in Irving, Texas. Nexstar is the largest owner of local television stations in the United States, operating a portfolio of more than 200 owned or partner stations affiliated with the nation's leading broadcast networks. Its stations serve 116 markets and reach approximately 220 million viewers nationwide. Within the Shreveport-Bossier Designated Market Area (DMA), Nexstar owns and operates KTAL NBC 6, KMSS FOX 33, and KSHV 45. Nexstar/KTAL competes directly with Lunn's former employer KTBS in this market. Nexstar will be served in accordance with the service instructions below;
- B. DANIEL R. JOVIC SR., ("Jovic" or "Dan Jovic"), an individual of the full age of majority and, along with his wife and Co-Defendant, Jacquelyn A. Jovic, is a domiciliary of Caddo Parish, Louisiana. Jovic is a Nexstar/KTAL employee, news anchor and reporter. He is the lead co-anchor for KTAL in the Shreveport regional market. Jovic will be served in accordance with service instructions below;
- C. JACQUELYN A. JOVIC, ("Jacque Jovic"), an individual of the full age of majority and, along with her husband, Co-Defendant, Dan Jovic, is a domiciliary of Caddo Parish, Louisiana. Jacque Jovic is a Nexstar/KTAL employee, news anchor and reporter. She is the lead co-anchor for KTAL in the Shreveport regional market. Jacque Jovic will be served in accordance with service instructions below.

Nexstar, Dan Jovic and Jacque Jovic may be collectively referred to as "Defendants."

5.

Venue in this Court is proper pursuant to La. C.C.P. art. 42 and La. C.C.P. art. 74.

6.

For years, Bill Lunn and the Defendants were direct competitors — with Lunn and KTBS consistently headlining and carrying the top-rated newscast in the Shreveport/Bossier Designated Market Area. KTAL's Dan Jovic-led newscast generally ranked behind its main competitors, KTBS and KSLA News 12. Jovic and his co-Defendants seized on the opportunity to bend the facts to their will in an attempt take out or otherwise substantially interfere with the market leader

and their direct competitor, Lunn. Lunn resigned from his job at KTBS on June 3, 2024 - hours before the Defendants aired their newscast that has - to date - ended his career in broadcast journalism.

7.

This matter is a civil action for defamation, invasion of privacy, false light, the intentional infliction of emotional distress, violations of the Louisiana Unfair Trade Practices Act ("LUTPA"), and other tortious conduct, that has, as will be described in more detail herein and at trial, damaged Bill Lunn's ability to ply his trade, enjoy his profession, engage in the enjoyment of his life, livelihood, build relationships and have hope for the future.

8.

The Defendants' actions are exceptionally egregious and harmful, particularly given that the Defendants have never acknowledged, corrected, or retracted their numerous defamatory broadcasts in which they named Petitioner a child predator, despite knowing that the statements they made were either false or so reckless as to question their truth or veracity, and upon confirmation of the falsity by witnesses, the police, and common sense, the Defendants continued to praise their proclaimed "vigilantes" and have never remediated their conduct.

WHAT ACTUALLY HAPPENED

9.

On May 27, 2024, Lunn used his mobile device to log into Tinder, a dating application used by millions of adult Americans. Lunn's personal Tinder profile reflected his real name, used a recent photo, and reflected that he was a single man in the Shreveport-Bossier area looking to meet women.

That day, the adults-only dating application¹ showed that Lunn had "interest" from a 19year-old local woman named "Jasmine."

l 1.

Soon, "Jasmine" asked Lunn to text her on her cell phone. Jasmine and Lunn told each other their backgrounds, including Lunn's job, Jasmine's history in the area, and Jasmine explicitly confirmed that she was 19 years old. Later, Jasmine initiated a sexually explicit exchange.

12.

Unbeknownst to Lunn, "Jasmine" did not exist, and the individual pretending to be the 19year-old woman that he had been text messaging later "edited" that text message to change her claimed age to 16, not 19. Her Tinder profile continued to reflect an age of 19 years old.

13.

On May 29, 2024, "Jasmine" gave Lunn an address and suggested they meet "at her home."

Once there, Lunn was led into the house by a woman he believed to be "Jasmine."

14.

Once inside, Lunn was immediately surrounded by three men, Antonio Coleman, Kataurio Grigsby, and Cameron Kennon, and was beaten and robbed of his belongings.

Somehow, Lunn broke free and ran out of the house, yelling for help. Hearing Lunn's pleas for help, a neighbor called 911. Another Samaritan allowed Lunn to use his phone and call 911. Lunn, bleeding, specifically described the violent incident to the 911 dispatcher.

16.

Lunn waited and relayed the same story to the Shreveport Police Department (SPD). That he was there to meet a woman he had met online, Jasmine, but that a female friend of Coleman, Kennon, and Grigsby had lured him into the house. There, he was violently attacked and robbed. SPD questioned Coleman, who lived at the address "Jasmine" had given Lunn, and Laura Robinson, the woman who had lured him into the house.

17.

Lunn sat in the back of an SPD squad car – with his door open, his hands free (not handcuffed) and was never under arrest. SPD. Cpl. Allen retrieved Lunn's phone, keys, credit cards and driver's license from his assailants. Lunn showed the police officer the messages on his phone and voluntarily gave SPD his cell phone for SPD to perform a forensic analysis. It was at this point that Lunn saw that the text message from "Jasmine" stating her age had been edited.

18.

As a cooperative, known and trusted victim, Lunn was not prohibited from leaving and did leave the scene on his own free will. Lunn was not ticketed, admonished, or charged with any crime. He immediately reported these events to his family, friends, and his employer.

DEFENDANTS "INVESTIGATE"

19.

On the afternoon of Saturday, June 1, 2024, Defendant Jovic sent a text to a SPD source asking about whether Lunn was caught with a 14-year-old girl and ran from the police.²

On the morning of June 3, 2024, SPD told Jovic that an investigation was ongoing, that Lunn had not run from authorities as Jovic suggested, and that no arrests had been made.³

21.

After obtaining and reviewing more information about the incident, Jovic rushed, with a KTAL camera crew, to find and interview Coleman, Grigsby, and Kennon.

22.

After meeting them, Jovic engaged in leading and calculated questioning eventually eliciting some "facts" that, despite the source and Jovic's own training and knowledge as to their questionable truth or veracity, culminated in the false broadcast that derailed Lunn's career, destroyed his mental health, impugned his credibility in the community, and damaged his family forever.

23.

Jovic, interviewed Coleman, Grigsby and Kennon on camera for the evening news – just hours away. Jovic's camera video recorded Coleman showing his phone screen at various times. Coleman demonstrated for Jovic (and the camera) the entire ruse, "Jasmine's" Tinder account, her fake text messages with Lunn, and even explicit texts "Jasmine" sent Lunn to lure him to a trap.

24.

Upon information and belief, Coleman told Jovic he used the "MeetMe" app to lure Lunn—
despite showing the Tinder app and no evidence Lunn had a MeetMe account. While Tinder does
not allow underage accounts and has stringent requirements to combat underage use, at the time
of Jovic's interview, MeetMe allowed anyone 13 or over to join and "meet."

25.


Footage shows Jovic reviewed the text message between Coleman (as "Jasmine") and Lunn, in which Coleman ("Jasmine") edited a previous message about Jasmine's age.

During his review of the communications between Coleman, posing as "Jasmine" and Lunn, Jovic found no evidence that Lunn was seeking to have sex with a minor. As reflected below, the only evidence suggesting that "Jasmine" was a minor was a text message that was clearly marked as "edited," and which showed it had been changed from "I'm 19" to "I'm 16."

27.

On June 3, 2024, Lunn, aware that he may cause embarrassment to his employer and after discussing the matter with his superiors, resigned from KTBS, with the intention and hope to return to work once the facts cleared his name.

28.

It was not until his cellphone was returned to him by the SPD in March of 2025 that Lunn learned that Jovic had known all along that the text message had been edited, the actual situation which had occurred, and that the Defendants had taken their best shot: using reckless falsities to destroy a leading newsman employed by their biggest market competitor.

29.

During Defendants' interview with those highly questionable and dubious sources, Jovic encouraged Coleman to spin his tale. Coleman obliged: claiming he was a "child predator hunter" supported by local authorities like the District Attorney. Coleman also claimed that he and his coparticipants had "caught" 10 men over the past three weeks through their "vigilante" efforts.

30.

Defendants, led by Jovic, suspended all critical analysis, assessment, and logic in service of an unbelievable story from three young men who had admitted to deception and criminal activity. Despite his extensive and decorated experience as a reporter, upon information and belief, Jovic did not challenge the source, report on the existence of an edited text message, or contact the local authorities to determine the credibility of any of these claims. Instead, he rushed to the newsroom to edit and package the hit piece (in mere hours) to take out a longtime competitor.

31.

Two of Jovic's depicted heroes, Coleman and Grigsby – the Defendants claimed they were "vigilantes" seeking "justice" – were soon arrested for nearly identical, brutal and violent crimes inflicted on other victims: including "rich guys" on dating apps who were lured, beaten and robbed.

32.

Coleman and Grigsby were arrested on June 7, 2024, in Caddo Parish, and on July 31, 2024, in Bossier Parish and await their trials on felony charges including Armed Robbery, Second Degree Robbery, Second Degree Battery, Aggravated Second Degree Battery, False Imprisonment, and Felony Access Device Fraud. The charges reflect strikingly similar criminal activities.

THE JUNE 3, 2024 NEWSCAST

33.

Just a few hours after Jovic's hurried, deferential and unchallenged interview with Lunn's assailants, Defendants prepared to air the story on their 10 p.m. newscast (hereinafter, "the Newscast"). Anchoring were the husband-and-wife duo of Dan and Jacque Jovic.

Nexstar and Dan Jovic's superiors at KTAL failed to vet, edit, or confirm the allegations against Lunn in the report.

35.

With gusto, the Jovics led the 10 p.m. news with the rushed, reckless, false, and defamatory story about Lunn. The Newscast featured footage interviewing three men, Coleman, Grigsby, and Kennon, who admitted that they had committed crimes in attacking Lunn.

36.

The broadcast was meant to shock and titillate, with the damage including the demise of a prominent market competitor. The Defendants showed no regard for the truth, Lunn's reputation, or his family, and instead relied on an interview conducted with a wholesale lack of diligence.

37.

In the Newscast and its subsequent video and written story distributed online, the defendants lied, misrepresented, and ignored the evidence in their possession and promoted the incident as an "explosive" story about Lunn being "caught" attempting to sexually engage with a 15-year-old child, until he was brutally beaten by three concerned citizens.

38.

The text messages between Lunn and "Jasmine" were in the Defendants' possession – and even a novice reporter would have questioned Coleman's story, his motivation, or subjected them to any questioning about the story and its characters.

39.

As a single man, Lunn was not concerned about using a dating app to meet women. Despite the actual facts of the action, the Defendants reported that Lunn was on a "new" social media app called "MeetMe" – despite their own literal possession of Lunn's Tinder profile and the text messages between Lunn and "Jasmine." Defendants falsely reported to the world that Lunn sought to meet a 15-year-old girl until the "vigilantes" stopped him.

The age of 15 was fabricated. The edited text message, the Tinder profile, and more were in Defendants' knowledge and possession before, during, and after the Newscast.

41.

For the Newscast, Defendants further staged a video recording of Jovic calling Lunn's cell phone for comment. Jovic's false representations were undermined by his personal knowledge that Lunn's cellphone was in SPD custody, and that Lunn could not answer the call.

42.

Defendants allowed the Newscast to air, approved the story script, and "teased" that it would be airing on the 10 p.m.

43.

At 9:50 p.m. on June 3, 2024, while boasting to Shreveport Police Cpl. Bordelon, Jovic shamelessly plugged his upcoming story by texting the following:

Моп, Jun 3 at 9:50РМ Hey Corporal . Watch at <u>10рт</u> 📥

44.

Defendants made these false allegations against Lunn, because it served their contrived and self-serving narrative. On information and belief, the evidence will show the Defendants focused on the damage to Lunn and explosiveness (viewership) of the story, not accuracy.

45.

The Newscast claimed that the investigation was "sparked due to the efforts of three local men who say they've made it their mission to catch men trying to have sex with underage girls." 6

Despite their brutal, illegal actions, Jovic gushed that Coleman, Griggs and Kennon were "self-described predator hunters," reporting, without any evidence, that "for a little over three weeks they have been pretending to be an underaged girl online in an effort to catfish^[7] local men who are allegedly trying to meet up for sex."

47.

Defendants failed to probe Coleman and his co-participants, review relevant public records, or ask any official source, to corroborate Coleman's representations that they were fighting an epidemic of child predators in the Shreveport-Bossier area.

48.

During the eight-hour sprint, Defendants repeatedly ignored and recklessly failed to exercise even a modicum of diligence. To wit: Defendants failed to follow up on the capture of 10 – ten – child predators in the area in under a month. In May 2025, fellow Nexstar station WGNO-New Orleans celebrated the FBI's arrests of just four – 4 – child predators across the state.⁹

49.

The 10 p.m. hour came, and the Newscast was aired on KTAL, a major regional station, but also sent into the worldwide ether. It was subsequently published to KTAL 6's Website, YouTube Channel and social media, amplifying its reach and public impact. Below are screen captures of the Newscast that track with the transcript of same:¹⁰

DAN: Tonight, we are sharing an explosive report claiming a local news anchor, who also served as the organization's news director, is the subject of an on-going investigation by Shreveport police. Good evening, I'm Dan Jovic.

JACQUE: And I'm Jacque Jovic. The investigation was sparked due to the efforts of three local men who say they've made it their mission to catch men trying to have sex with underage girls.

DAN: They've showed us the evidence they have provided to police and share a firsthand account of what they say unfolded that day. It's our top story. (video begins)


ANTONIO COLEMAN: What we do, is like we catch child predators.

DAN: Antonio Coleman, Kameron Kennon, and Kataurio Grigsby are self-described predator hunters. For a little over three weeks, they've been pretending to be an underage girl online in an effort to catfish local men who are allegedly trying to meet up for sex.



KAMERON KENNON: "It's just this how fast they are willing to meet young females. It's crazy."

DAN: The trio says they were surprised by their efforts last Wednesday, May 29. That day Shreveport police received a call at 11:04 a.m. The call came from former KTBS news anchor Bill Lunn, according to police and a call for service report obtained by NBC 6, Lunn claimed he was the victim of an assault and battery but a case report on the alleged incident paints a different story. According to the case report, the alleged offense is not for assault and battery, rather for computer aided solicitation for sexual purposes. These three men are the reason why.



ANTONIO COLEMAN: "As soon as he seen us, he just darted out."

DAN: They created a fake MeetMe profile, that profile is of an underage girl. They say they then wait for men to like the profile and spark a conversation. They say Lunn initiated a conversation Tuesday night.

ANTONIO COLEMAN: They had a little conversation going on and he asked how old she was, the girl told him she was 15 years old.



DAN: Antonio says he was actually the girl. He says he and Lunn exchanged dozens upon dozens of text messages over the next several hours where the conversation quickly turned to sex.

ANTONIO COLEMAN: He was like sending pictures to her. He was saying, like, he wanted to do this to her. Explicit things that I can't say on camera.

DAN: Antonio checked the phone number he was texting with. It was the same number Lunn lists on his LinkedIn profile.

ANTONIO COLEMAN: I'm like, oh my God. So, I looked to his Facebook. This is really his number. This is really Bill Lunn. And it was just really crazy.



DAN: We were shown images in the text message chain, displaying sexually explicit photos that Lunn allegedly sent of himself. Antonio says Lunn set up a meeting date last Wednesday.

ANTONIO COLEMAN: He came on his lunch break from work to come meet her.

DAN: According to Antonio, when Lunn arrived at their designated meeting spot the trio jumped out informing him of what was happening.

ANTONIO COLEMAN: You could see the guilt in his eyes. He knew like, oh I'm done.

DAN: They say Lunn ran and later called police saying he was a victim of an assault and battery. The 3 men waited for police to arrive; they say hours of questioning followed. The call for service report shows police spent four hours and 21 minutes at the scene. The young men say Lunn was handcuffed in the back of a police vehicle for hours. All parties were released from the scene with no charges filed. Shreveport police told me there is an active investigation into Lunn based on the events of that day. I tried reaching out to Lunn to get his side of the story.

BILL LUNN VOICE MAIL GREETING: Please leave your name and number and I will get back to you as soon as possible.

DAN: "Bill this is Dan Jovic calling from NBC 6 news trying to get your side of the story related to an incident that took place last week."

DAN: My call went unanswered and was not returned.



KATAURIO GRIGSBY: The thing is as Bill was running off, he yells I have a wife and kids. I'm sitting there, as he's running off, I'm thinking in my head, how can you say that when you literally just walked yourself in that house expecting to meet an underage teenager which he was going to do it regardless.



DAN: Lunn resigned Monday from both of his roles at KTBS. Lunn's profile was immediately scrubbed from the station's website. Calls to KTBS management regarding to the incident have gone unanswered. Antonio, Kameron, and Kataurio say they have allegedly caught 10 men in the span of just three weeks through their vigilante efforts.

50.

Defendants further sensationalized the narrative by broadcasting a blurred picture of Lunn's private area, one of the explicit photos Lunn sent back to "Jasmine" and also published Lunn's Tinder profile picture.

51.

On June 5, 2024, the Defendants published a follow-up story linked to the June 4, 2024, Newscast further lauding Coleman, Grigsby and Kennon as heroes dedicated to catching child predators, who had teamed up to create their own task force to protect underage girls. ¹² In the June

5, 2024, story, the Defendants showed two separate images of stacks of files. These files were fake: props staged by the Defendants to add credibility to their defamatory statement and false narrative.

52.

In the Newscast, Jovic reported numerous falsities, including, but not limited to:

- a. The existence of Jasmine;
- b. Lunn and "Jasmine" met on MeetMe, and that "Jasmine" was an "underage girl;"
- c. Lunn initiated a conversation with "Jasmine" on MeetMe;
- d. Lunn had a MeetMe account;
- e. "Jasmine" had told Lunn she was a minor, and either 16 or 15-years-old;
- f. Lunn purposefully walked into Coleman's house to meet a 15-year-old girl to engage in some sort of illicit relations;
- g. Lunn was handcuffed in a Shreveport Police vehicle and detained; and,
- h. Despite a staged call Lunn could not answer, that Lunn would not tell his "side of the story."

THE AFTERMATH

53.

After the Newscast, the story went "viral," from MSNBC to the New York Post, embedding into the public's mind that Lunn was a child predator. As a result, Lunn was threatened with vulgar and terrifying threats which continue to this day based on the Defendants' false reporting.

54.

On June 5, 2024, still celebrating the "vigilante" efforts of Coleman, Grigsby, and Kennon, Defendants released a follow-up story, claiming the "heroes" were after men like Lunn — who they again named a child predator — and after "men who ... try to have sex with underage girls," who commit "juvenile sex crimes," and to "help somebody else keep their daughter." ¹³

55.

On June 6, 2024, at 11:43 a.m., in response to an update request from Jovic, Cpl. Bordelon responded there were "actually some issues" in proving "that Lunn knew the girl was a juvenile."

Less than three minutes later, Jovic shot back an image of the precise moment in Defendants' June 3 interview footage where Coleman, acting as "Jasmine," had clearly edited the text message in which she told Lunn her age.

57.

The next day, June 7, 2024, Grigsby and Coleman falsely lured, beat, and robbed another man as part of their criminal enterprise, catfishing scheme.

58.

On or about June 8, 2024, Coleman and Grigsby were arrested on felony charges. Including multiple felony counts relating to their "vigilante" scheme.

59.

Defendants failed to probe why the "vigilantes" were arrested a few days later, focusing on the "vigilante angle" and again failed to contact the June 7th victim.

60.

After posting bond from the June 8, 2024, arrest, on July 21, 2024, Grigsby and Coleman resumed their criminal enterprise in Bossier Parish and allegedly lured, attacked and kidnapped a man in Bossier Parish, extorting \$600 from a friend of the victim before they released the victim.

Three days later, July 24, 2024, Coleman and Grigsby and a female accomplice allegedly lured a victim into a public bathroom in Bossier City, stripped a man of his clothes, beat, shot, and robbed him causing him to walk naked for help.

62.

Despite KTAL's air coverage celebrating these men as vigilantes, there is no evidence that they ever delivered any criminals or prospective criminals to law enforcement.

63.

Between July 31, 2024, and September 9, 2024, Coleman and Grigsby were arrested multiple times for the crimes they committed, including the May 29, June 7, July 21, and July 24, 2024, "vigilante" events: KTAL News 6 chose not to report on the charges, which include kidnapping, battery, robbery and unauthorized use of internet and credit cards.

64.

On August 14, 2024, KTAL aired an inadequate update that did not meaningfully address—
the damage caused by the original story. 14 In that broadcast, Jovic again falsely presented the
"Jasmine" edited age text as newly uncovered, explosive information—despite having it in his
possession since June 3, 2024.

65.

In summary, Defendants continued to exacerbate the damage on Lunn by perpetuating the lies, featuring stories about the vigilantes and Lunn (some of which occurred even after Coleman and Grigsby had been arrested for similar criminal schemes). KTAL published and broadcast including but not limited to the following about Lunn and the vigilantes:

- June 4, 2024, 12:00 a.m.: Local "predator hunters" spark Shreveport police investigation into former KTBS news anchor¹⁵
- b. June 4, 2024, 7:44 p.m.: Shreveport police warns against vigilantism16

Following forensic analysis by the Shreveport Police Department, on March 12, 2025, Lunn's cell phone was returned to him. As described *supra*, upon receipt of cellphone, Lunn realized the text had been edited: a fact that Jovic had known (and failed to report) on June 3, 2024.

67.

Defendants' false, malicious and misleading reporting, when viewed objectively, involved an extreme degree of risk, considering the probability and magnitude of the potential harm to Lunn; and of which Jovic and KTAL had actual, subjective awareness of the risk involved, but nevertheless proceeded with conscious indifference to the rights, safety, or welfare of Lunn.

Despite requests, Defendants have not corrected, retracted, or clarified the falsities published about Lunn. Nor have they acknowledged any error at all. As illustrated in **Exhibit "5"** and reproduced below, on March 12, 2025, in response to Lunn's attorney presenting Nexstar with the damning evidence above, including the demonstrable falsity, error and animus, Defendants' counsel stated:

Good Afternoon Mr. Gatti,

Thank you for your recent communications.

Nexstar stands by the journalist and the stories as presented.

DAMAGES

69.

The Defendants' reckless indifference including the additional indignity of the Defendants' refusal to acknowledge or correct their error, has devastated Lunn. He has suffered from depression and suicidal ideation for which he has sought mental health treatment. Due to the acts and omissions of the Defendants, Lunn will suffer lifelong physical and mental health conditions.

70

He has sustained severe reputational damage. He has lost the love and affection of his family and friends, as well as the respect of his colleagues. It will take years, if not decades, to rehabilitate his personal and professional reputation, if ever.

71.

Before the Newscast, Lunn was an Emmy award-winning journalist, author, non-profit founder, and the news director at the top-rated news station in the area in the Shreveport Broadcast Area. Today, he is working as a manual laborer for a friend's Christian-oriented moving company.

Lunn is a 1993 graduate of the Northwestern University Medill School of Journalism.

Despite his credentials, Lunn has been unsuccessful in obtaining any job in journalism despite multiple attempts to do so. Nor has Lunn been able to return to any KTBS position.

73.

Lunn has a thirty-year history in Journalism, including more than 20 years working as a news anchor in Memphis, an award-winning career in Minneapolis-St. Paul, and numerous high-profile accomplishments. Highlights including an election night 2000 interview of vanquished candidate Al Gore, and a stint covering the Clinton impeachment hearings. He was cast as the reporter in John Grisham's hit movie *The Rainmaker*, reporting the verdict at the end of the movie.





74.

Lunn is a published author, interviewing numerous individuals and publishing a 360-page biography - Heart of a Ranger, about an Army special operator killed in Afghanistan. Lunn was awarded the state of Minnesota's highest civilian military award. Lunn has emceed the Congressional Medal of Honor National Convention.

75.

At KTBS-TV, Lunn earned respect and trust of the community. He was promoted to news director, responsible for a \$2 million dollar budget supervising more than 40 employees. In 2023, the Louisiana Association of Broadcasters gave Lunn the "Best Series or Documentary" award for his KTBS report, "Butterfly Man."

Lunn was well-known for "Bill's Bikes," working to refurbish bikes and for children in need. Since 2021, Lunn has provided 500 bikes to children in the Shreveport community.

77.

As a result of Defendants' tortious and malicious actions, Lunn has not been able to return to broadcasting, despite applications and interviews with other news outlets—and even a Nexstar station. Once a prospective employer connects him to the Newscast, Lunn is excluded from the candidate pool.

78.

As a direct result of the defamatory attack and the defendant's failure to correct or retract,

Lunn has suffered the following injuries and losses:

- 1. Past, present and future mental pain and suffering;
- 2. Past, present and future physical injuries and suffering;
- 3. Past, present and future public humiliation and reputational damage;
- Past, present and future damage to family relationships;
- 5. Past, present and future lost income;
- 6. Past, present and future loss of employment opportunities;
- Loss of past and future earnings and employment related benefits;
- 8. Loss of enjoyment of life; and,
- 9. Any other harms and losses to be shown at trial in this matter.

79.

The harm caused by Defendants' false reporting extends well beyond the Ark-La-Tex viewing area. Numerous national and local media outlets picked up KTAL's false reporting and repeated it verbatim, including:

a. The New York Post, which republished and referenced the KTAL reporting in its story, which garnered 377 comments from readers.²²

- Yahoo.com, with more than 700 million visitors a month, republished and referenced the KTAL story.²³
- MSN.com republished the story and referenced Lunn.²⁴
- d. WKRG.com is a news site owned by Nexstar affiliate WKRG covering the area Mobile, Alabama and Pensacola, Florida viewing area. It republished the June 4, 2024, video and story.²⁵
- e. Fox 26 Houston with over 615,000 subscribers on YouTube, featured the KTAL story and even interviewed constables in the Houston area who remarked "...with the news anchor, a criminal case can be made" directly reinforcing the defamatory claims Defendants made.²⁶
- f. KTVE in Monroe, LA., a Nexstar affiliate, which also operates Myarklamiss.com and linked the story.²⁷
- g. The Daily Mail, with 2.8 million followers on X, 22 million followers on Facebook, and millions of subscribers on Instagram, YouTube and TikTok, republished and referenced the KTAL-TV story. 28
- h. 96.5 KPEL, a Lafayette, Louisiana news radio station repeated the false statement that KTAL had reported Lunn was meeting a 15-year-old girl on its website, www.kpel965.com.²⁹
- KEEL710 Shreveport Radio repeated verbatim the allegations of the KTAL story.³⁰

- j. KLFY, a Nexstar station in Lafayette, Louisiana, republished the story and video.³¹
- k. WGNO in New Orleans, a Nexstar station, shared and republished the original Newscast. 32
- CBS42, a Nexstar station in Birmingham, Alabama, shared and republished the original newscast.³³
- m. WJTV.com / WJTV Jackson, Mississippi, a Nexstar station republished the Newscast that remains online.³⁴

The false and defamatory statements made by Defendants, and foreseeably republished as demonstrated above, created a lasting and irreversible perception, seared into public consciousness, playing into the public's deep-seated animosity toward child predators, which has now been permanently and wrongfully directed at Lunn. For example, on May 20, 2024 – weeks before the Newscast – Lunn posted on his Facebook about the anniversary of a school shooting. After the Newscast, the comments in that same post, filled with insults and threats fueled by the false reporting from the Defendants.

81.

The enduring and permanent reputational harm holds significant implications. Lunn, unable to find work as a broadcaster anywhere in this country, currently works at Christ Fit Gym Recycling and with Strongmen Movers. He is a member of a team that moves residential and commercial moving projects and makes approximately \$20 an hour.

DEFAMATION

82.

The allegations contained in Paragraphs 1-81 are realleged and incorporated as if fully reproduced hereinbelow.

83.

While the Newscast did contain a modicum of truth—that Lunn was "under investigation" in connection with a 911 call made on May 29, 2024—the Newscast went far beyond reporting the fact of the investigation, and Defendants took it upon themselves to elaborate, relying on unreliable sources, uncorroborated accounts, and blatantly demonstrably false statements into the story.

84.

The Newscast was replete with false statements and allegations of criminal activity, with Defendants identifying and characterizing Lunn as a child predator and pedophile, while crediting, believing and extoling the violent actions of Coleman, Grigsby, and Kennon. As described above, these statements were demonstrably false, and Defendants know or should reasonably have known of their falsity at the time of publication.

85.

The false statements made by Defendants about Lunn were published in a feature story, that was not "live", but rather scripted and edited, and not during a live segment or on-air interview.

86.

Jovic personally reviewed Coleman's phone, including the full Tinder conversation, message history, photos, and all installed applications. The Tinder profile clearly showed the age of "Jasmine" as 19, and there was no reference to MeetMe or any other dating platform. The only indicia of "underage" was in a single text message, which was clearly marked "edited". Jovic filmed this, saw it, and later disseminated a screen shot of it. Defendants either saw the "edited" icon and chose not to investigate or inquire further or viewed what had been "edited" (changing "I'm 19" to "I'm 16"), and published the story anyway without any reference to the edit. Jovic knew that Lunn's phone was in police custody when he filmed himself trying to call him and

included that footage in the June 3, 2024 Newscast. These were not errors in judgment—they were **knowingly false affirmations** of a fabricated narrative. Defendants' decision to ignore the truth they possessed, and instead publish a damning lie to the public, constitutes clear and convincing evidence of **actual malice** and **intentional defamation**.

87.

Defendants understood and intended for the June 3, 2024, Newscast to paint Lunn as a child predator and pedophile and knew that the public and the viewers of the Newscast would understand and perceive Lunn to be a child predator, pedophile and criminal. In fact, as demonstrated by a representative sample of social media posts and comments, the public *did* in fact believe that Lunn was a child predator, pedophile and a criminal, regardless of the oft-repeated, but ultimately meaningless use of the word "allegedly." *See* Exhibit "6" exemplar public comments.

88.

Defendants falsely reported that Lunn was a child predator attempting to meet a 15-yearold girl, an absolutely false claim made with reckless disregard for the truth. This falsity was
repeated multiple times and became the bedrock by which multiple follow-up stories and a
narrative about Lunn were crafted. This conduct was reckless and far exceeds the bounds of
decency and is utterly intolerable in a civilized community.

89.

As described *supra*, Lunn has been irrevocably damaged by Defendant's conduct, and is entitled to recover damages as a result thereof.

FALSE LIGHT

90.

The allegations contained in Paragraphs 1-89 are realleged and incorporated as if fully reproduced hereinbelow.

In late May 2024, Lunn was engaging in online dating and seeking companionship with an adult female.

92.

The actions of Defendants and publication of the June 3, 2024, Newscast and subsequent reporting on Lunn dragged Lunn's private, personal life into the public eye, for which he had a reasonable expectation of privacy.

93.

Defendants' decision to feature Lunn's private life, relying on sources they knew to be uncredible, publishing information they knew to be false, further "sensationalizing" the matter by publishing graphic, blurred out images of Lunn, and characterizing Lunn's behavior as criminal and pedophilic, were blatantly unreasonable and embarrassing.

94.

Defendants relied on a text message that they knew was "edited" and the word of objectively un-credible witnesses as the basis for their Newscast placing Lunn in a false light.

95.

Moreover, the Newscast's inclusion of a stand-up of Jovic purporting to call Lunn to ostensibly get his side of the story was misleading and contained demonstrable falsity, because Jovic knew that Lunn's phone had been retained by the police. The public perception of Lunn failing to comment or "hiding" further placed Lunn in a false light.

96.

As a result, Lunn was damaged by the actions of Defendants and is entitled to recover damages directly and proximately caused by Defendants.

INTENTIONAL INFLICTION OF EMOTIONAL DISTRESS

97.

The allegations contained in Paragraphs 1-96 are realleged and incorporated as if fully reproduced hereinbelow.

Lunn is entitled to recover and hereby seeks all damages directly and proximately caused by the Jovics' intentional infliction of emotional distress. Falsely and recklessly broadcasting unreported and uncredible "facts" that an esteemed and high-profile member of the community is a child predator is extreme and outrageous. The Jovics' failure to confirm basic facts and indeed, their conscious decision to intentionally mislead and portray Lunn in a false light to obtain credit for a sensationalized, albeit demonstrably false narrative, constitutes intentional infliction of emotional distress.

99.

Defendants had knowledge that the "vigilantes" story was based on a false and edited text message, and still rushed to publish it based on:

- 1. Jovic's interview with Coleman, Grigsby and Kennon;
- Jovic's examination of Coleman's phone and the "edited" text message stating the woman's age; and,
- Direct communication with Cpl. Bordelon between June 1 through June 13, 2024.

These sources provided no evidence Lunn was a child predator or that he sought to meet a child on the day he was lured to a house where he was beaten and robbed by Coleman, Grigsby and Kennon. In fact, there was never any woman (much less an underage girl), and the evidence supports that at best, the Defendants rushed to publish / broadcast a story that they knew would inflict severe emotional harm and distress on a direct competitor.

100.

Defendants knew that publishing the Newscast and its subsequent reporting, including failing to correct the egregious errors within, would cause public outrage, reputational harm, and that labeling someone a child predator would evoke public condemnation and lasting stigma.

101.

As a direct and proximate result of the Jovics' conduct, Lunn suffered immediate and significant emotional suffering, including humiliation, anxiety, insomnia, loss of appetite, and fear for his physical safety. Withdrawing from public life, he has sustained deterioration in his professional and personal relationships resulting in damaging isolation. The distress he continues to suffer is not fleeting or trivial — it is profound and medically documented.

102.

Lunn cannot escape the severe emotional distress intentionally inflicted by the Jovies by relocating to another town, because the story went viral having been shared thousands of times on the internet. The scope of the internet shares increase Lunn's already significant damages.

103.

Nexstar and KTAL did not merely air their false and defamatory statements about Lunn on a single local broadcast. As a matter of corporate practice, they amplified and republished these harmful claims across Nexstar's vast digital network, which spans more than 200 local affiliates. The defamatory content was disseminated widely through affiliate websites, social media accounts, and mobile apps, ensuring that the damage to Lunn's reputation was not confined to a local audience but instead broadcast nationally through a coordinated and far-reaching digital enterprise. This deliberate and systematic distribution magnified the harm and made it nearly impossible to contain or correct the false narrative.

104.

The Defendants' ongoing refusal to correct the egregious errors have allowed the original falsehoods to persist unchecked, causing sustained, ongoing and chronic harm to Lunn's personal and professional reputation. See Exhibit "6", which contains a small sample of the social media posts, comments, and shares that illustrate the depth and breadth of the damage done to Lunn.

105.

Defendants disseminated a false narrative – that Lunn was a child predator caught attempting to meet an underage girl – with reckless disregard for the truth, and acting with the intent that the story would be published, widely consumed, and permanently humiliating and damaging to Lunn. Defendants' conduct was reckless and deliberate, and it exceeds all bounds of decency tolerated in a civilized society – meeting the legal standard for extreme and outrageous behavior required to establish a claim for intentional infliction of emotional distress.

LOUISIANA UNFAIR TRADE PRACTICES ACT

106.

The allegations contained in Paragraphs 1-105 are realleged and incorporated as if fully reproduced hereinbelow.

107.

The actions of the Defendants, who were his direct competitors and of which he was a consumer, are violations of the Louisiana Unfair Trade Practices Act, La. R.S. § 51:1409 et seq, and a copy of this Petition is being transmitted to the Attorney General of the State of Louisiana along with its filing for examination by that office in accordance with law.

108.

As described and alleged above, the actions taken by the Jovics and KTAL in the preparation, investigation (or lack thereof), writing, broadcasting and otherwise publishing the June 3, 2024, news story about Lunn were unfair, deceptive, unethical, offending to public policy and substantially injurious to Lunn, such that such actions constitute a violation of the Louisiana Unfair Trade Practices Act (La. R.S. 51:1401, et seq). By way of example only:

- Jovic had actual knowledge that the statements he was making about Lunn were false.
- b. Jovic saw that the text message from Coleman's phone about the age of the "catfish" was edited, such that he either knew that his report and story about the "catfish" being underage was false or purposefully avoided gaining that knowledge.
- c. Jovic knew or reasonably should have known that the credibility of his sources (Antonio Coleman, Kameron Kennon and Kataurio Grisby) were unreliable at best.
- d. Jovic knew that the contact that led to the police's investigation of Lunn did not originate or ever occur on MeetMe, but falsely made such a statement in the June 3, 2024, story anyway.
- e. At the time that Jovics and KTAL recorded the segment of the June 3, 2024 news story with Jovic "attempting to call" Lunn "for comment", Jovic had actual knowledge that Lunn's phone had been seized by Shreveport Police and was in Shreveport Police custody.

- f. Defendants' failure to investigate, fact check and obtain accurate information and their decisions to publish facts and information they knew to be false on June 3, 2024, offended common notions of ethical and moral conduct and raise serious questions regarding professional obligations and duties.
- g. After it came to light that the June 3, 2024 Newscast contained numerous false statements, implicated Lunn in a crime, and held Lunn out to be a pedophile, KTAL refused to retract the June 3, 2024 Newscast and, in response to a request by undersigned counsel for a retraction and apology, executives from NEXTSTAR simply stated that "Nexstar stands by the journalist [Jovic] and the stories as presented." See Exhibit "5".

Simply put, Defendants engaged in a course of conduct which no ethical, properly motivated journalist would undertake: to pursue and publish as fact an improbable, sordid and devastating theory about one's chief competitor, without supporting credible evidence or investigation that would predictably destroy their primary, dominating professional competitor, and publish (and republish) feature news stories based thereon.

110.

There can be no doubt that this was more than mere negligence: the defamatory statements, failure to investigate, and purposeful avoidance of the truth by Jovic and KTAL in their June 3, 2024 Newscast were misrepresentative and deceptive at best.

111.

The June 3, 2024 Newscast was a featured and packaged news story, edited prior to broadcast, complete with supplemental footage to enhance the story ("b-roll"), graphics effects, voice-over sound on tape (VO/SOTs"), interviews, and segments where Jovic is speaking directly into the camera ("stand-ups"), all of which was created by Jovic and KTAL. It was not an advertisement, editorial, talk show or opinion piece. It was aired during the first block ("A Block") of the evening news, which is the broadcast equivalent of the front page of a newspaper.

Lunn has suffered significant and ascertainable competitive injury and loss as a result of Jovic's and KTAL's conduct, and accordingly, Lunn is entitled to and requests damages directly and proximately caused by Defendant's LUTPA violations, along with attorney's fees, costs and treble damages.

The damage and injury to Lunn continues. Nexstar has refused to issue a retraction. And, Lunn, his family, his friends, his potential employers, and all internet users have ready access and exposure to the Newscast—as well to as a multitude of republications. "Where our memories fade, the Internet never forgets." See, May Crockett, The Internet (Never) Forgets, 19 SMU Sci. & Tech. Law Rev. 2, 151 (2016).

114.

Lunn is entitled to and demands a trial by jury on all issues so triable in order to hold these Defendants accountable for their actions.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner, William "Bill" Lunn, prays that the Defendants be cited and served with this Petition and be required to answer within the delays allowed by law. Lunn further prays that after due proceedings are had, this Honorable Court renders a judgment in his favor and against the Defendants in the amount of damages to be proven at trial, including treble damages seen fit, as well as attorneys' fees, costs, and legal interest from the date of demand, and all other just and equitable relief under the law.

BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority, on this date personally appeared Corporal

Christopher Paul Bordelon, who after being duly sworn, deposes and says as follows:

- I am employed by the Shreveport Police Department, serving as the Public Information Officer for the Shreveport Police Department, and my professional address is 1234 Texas Avenue, Shreveport, LA 71101.
- I am familiar with the police investigation and the events occurring on May 29, 2024 near 9517 Chaparral Lane, Shreveport, LA.
- 3. On May 29, 2024 William Lunn called 911 to report an assault and robbery.
- On May 29, 2024, during the investigation Antonio Coleman, Kataurio Grigsby and Kameron Kennon accused William Lunn of being a child predator.
- William Lunn was not arrested.
- William Lunn voluntarily provided his phone to Shreveport Police on May 29, 2024 and it was returned to him on March 12, 2025. No evidence was found indicating William Lunn had communicated with a juvenile at all.
- On June 1, 2024, Dan Jovic sent a text to me concerning the investigation. On Monday, June 3, 2024 I responded. After 1:49 p.m., in one of my responses, I shared the SPD incident report number with Dan Jovic.
- The SPD incident report at that time was incomplete and consisted of only one page.
- 9. On June 6, 2024 at 11:49 a.m., I informed Dan Jovic that we were having trouble in prosecuting the case and there were issues in proving that William Lunn had communicated with a juvenile at all. In response at 11:51 a.m., Dan Jovic sent me a picture that included an edited text. At 11:52 a.m., I responded that the picture of the text conversation he sent me says "edited" underneath it. On that date I informed Dan Jovic that the text had been edited from 19 to 16 by either Coleman, Grigsby or Kennon.
- 10. Between June 1, 2024 and June 13, 2024, Dan Jovic and I communicated through text about the May 29, 2024 investigation. I have reviewed all those text messages and the eight pages of screenshots attached to this affidavit as Exhibit 1 are an accurate representation of those text messages.
- I have also reviewed the screen shot depicting the time that texts were sent to me and from me on June 6, 2024. That screenshot is marked as Exhibit 2 and is accurate.
- I have also reviewed the picture that Dan Jovic sent me on June 6, 2024. That photo is attached as Exhibit 3 to my affidavit and is accurate.
- Coleman, Grigsby and Kennon were not working with local law enforcement.
- On August 14, 2024, William Lunn was cleared of all charges. There was no evidence to support the claims of Coleman, Grigsby and Kennon.
- This affidavit is based upon my personal knowledge, review of the investigative file and my text communications with Dan Jovic between June 1, 2024 and June 13, 2024.







DAN JOVIC:

Tonight we're sharing an explosive report claiming a local news anchor, who also served as the organization's news director, is the subject of an ongoing investigation by Shreveport Police. Good evening, I'm Dan Jovic.

JACQUE JOVIC:

And I'm Jacque Jovic. The investigation was sparked due to the efforts of three local men who say they've made it their mission to catch men trying to have sex with underage girls.

DAN JOVIC:

They showed us the evidence they have provided to police and share a first-hand account of what they say unfolded that day. It's our top story tonight.

ANTONIO COLEMAN:

What we do, we catch, like, child predators.

DAN JOVIC:

Antonio Coleman, Kameron Kennon and Kataurio Grigsby are self-described predator hunters. For a little over



three weeks, they have been pretending to be an underage girl online in an effort to catfish local men who are allegedly trying to meet up for sex.

KAMERON KENNON:

It's just crazy, like, how fast they just, like, how fast they are willing to meet young, like, young people. It's just crazy.

DAN JOVIC:

The trio says they were surprised by their efforts last Wednesday, May 29th.

That day, Shreveport Police received a call at 11:04 a.m. The call came from former KTBS News anchor Bill Lunn.

According to police and a call for service report obtained by NBC, Lunn claimed he was the victim of an assault and battery.

But a case report on the alleged incident paints a different story.

According to the case report, the alleged offense is not for assault and battery, rather for computer-aided solicitation for sexual purposes. These three men are

They say Lunn ran and later called police, saying he was the victim of an assault and battery. The three men waited for police to arrive. They say hours of questioning followed. The call for service report shows police spent 4 hours and 21 minutes at the scene. The young men say Lunn was handcuffed in the back of a police vehicle for hours.

All parties were released from the scene with no charges filed. Shreveport police told me there was an active investigation into Lunn based on the events of that day. I tried reaching out to Lunn to get his side of the story.

BILL LUNN:

"Please leave your name and number and I'll get back to you as soon as possible. Thanks. Have a great day."

DAN JOVIC:

"Bill, this is Dan Jovic calling from NBC6 News. Trying to get your side of the story related to an incident that



took place last week." My call went unanswered and was not returned.

KATAURIO GRIGSBY:

Thing is, as Bill was running off, he yells, "I have a wife and kids". I'm just sitting there, as he's running off, I'm thinking in my head, how can you say that when you literally just walked yourself in the house expecting to meet an underage teenager. Because he was going to do it regardless.

DAN JOVIC:

Lunn resigned Monday from both of his roles at KTBS. And Lunn's profile was immediately scrubbed from the station's website. Calls to KTBS management regarding the incident have gone unanswered. Antonio Cameron and Kataurio said they have allegedly caught ten men in the span of just three weeks through their vigilante efforts.



Christine,

To clarify, our expert found that many of the stories online and on social media were based off and even linked to the still active story on the KTAL website. There is no retraction on this post. The YouTube version of the story has over 6500 views and does not include a link to a retraction. The story stating charges were dropped has a mere 356 views and does not discuss the felony arrest of the "vigilantes". It's obvious the story was written to increase traffic to site.

It would be helpful if KTAL would review each line of the YouTube video and story on the website retract each untrue statement. I would be glad to review the retraction and approve or add to it.

The article you mentioned with the New York Post references the KTAL report in paragraph 2. The New York Post story posted on June 5, 2024 at 2:15 PM. (TV anchor Bill Lunn resigns after he was accused of sexting teen girl) The New York Post post includes a source link in paragraph two to the KTAL report from June 4, 2024 (Local "predator hunters" spark Shreveport police investigation into former KTBS news anchor) This seems to be consistent with most of the links and shares we have cataloged. Most social media

influencers use a link to the article or pictures from the YouTube video. Those cannot be removed.

In fact, Jovic's story is shared or referenced hundreds of times. This link is most troublesome News Director suspected of soliciting sex from teen after undercover civilian-led sex sting - YouTube. It is obvious FOX 26 in Houston did not interview the three men and they simply relied on KTAL to expand on the story. They will assert they pulled most of their content from Jovic's story and that they relied on him following the 10 Commandments of Journalism before printing. They did post a meaningful retraction and won't be sharing KTAL items anytime soon.

We have compared KTAL's reporting of the story with KTBS, KSLA and other local stations. In fact, those other stations when contacted were very surprised at the angle Dan took. They gave the specific reasons that they did not report to the extreme level that Dan did. One local news person mentioned they discussed with Dan that he should not run that story until an arrest was made. He was very surprised Dan ran with the story allowing the witnesses to make wild self- serving allegations that were not true. Remember these men were being investigated for assaulting Bill Lunn so the story they were "vigilantes" was self-serving. The news family in our area is very small and no one agrees the story should have been run.

Local news teams gave these objective reasons for not interviewing the felons or stating merely that "Bill is under investigation." Their reasons included but are not limited to:

 Bill called 911- "in all my years we have never had a child predator facing mandatory jail time call 911 because the victims family beat them up."

- Bill was not arrested- "Gatti, if there was any evidence at all, Bill would have been in jail that day on a 500,000 bond."
- 3. Bill didn't have his phone- "What troubled me the most about Jovic's story is it was really a hit piece against a competitor." "He knew the police had Bill's phone when he called it for his story—he literally called Bill's cell phone after the police told him they had Bill's phone! he knew he was not going to get Bill to answer because Bill didn't have his phone! That part of the video was most troubling to me"
- 4. The witness story was unbelievable- "Those three guys were not telling the truth. They had never called the police after "catching a predator." "They kept changing the age of the victim 16, then 15." "It was obvious they were trolling dating apps to catfish men." "The police has to go back in the house and get Bill's credit card—they still had it in the home! Evdiently they were taking cash and credit cards after beating victims." "Dan just turned a blind eye to obvious."

Additionally, our focus group did not side with Dan.

I hope we can resolve this matter quietly prior to filing suit. A mediation might be helpful to give Bill closure. Please review this matter and advise. Thanks,

Good Afternoon Mr. Gatti,

As a follow up to your email below, the station, along with various other media outlets including the New York Post, reported on this matter – at various stages - beginning in the first week of June 2024.

KTAL continued to cover the matter through August 2024. That coverage included, among other facts, Mr. Lunn's denial of any wrongdoing as communicated in a statement provided by Mr. Dhu Thompson, Mr. Lunn's former attorney, on June 6, 2024, and the arrest of two of the three alleged vigilantes for assault and battery of an unidentified man on June 13, 2024.

KTAL also covered when Mr. Lunn was cleared of all charges – on August 14, 2024. That story clearly stated, "Mr. Lunn will not be charged with a crime." The story summarized the matter and included an interview with Cpl. Chris Bordelon who confirmed that there "was evidence [of a crime] ...unbeknownst to them [patrol officers] that evidence had been altered" and that following a subsequent investigation by the vice unit of the phones, police determined that the claims were falsified. Therefore, the story confirmed Mr. Lunn's innocence and "a conclusion of this [criminal investigation] case".

On August 19, 2024, KTAL provided Mr. Dhu Thompson, Mr. Lunn's former attorney, with an opportunity to speak on camera as well.

There was a police investigation. Mr. Lunn was given an opportunity (and did) comment through his former attorney.

The police concluded the investigation, and Mr. Lunn was not charged with any crime. The final story clarified that the investigation involving Mr. Lunn was initiated based on false information.

Accordingly, the station is unclear on your reference to a retraction in the 2/24/2025 and your mention of a retraction below.

Please clarify.
