Dear President [REDACTED]:

Pursuant to the Arizona Board of Regents Policy 5-401, et.seq. and in accordance with the Arizona Board of Regents Student Code of Conduct, this letter is to inform you that effective immediately, Phi Delta Theta is placed on **Activities Suspension**. *Activities Suspension* has been imposed pending the outcome of this investigation because it has been determined that your organization presents a substantial risk to members of the university community.

**Activities Suspension prohibits hosting, attending, participating, and sponsoring any organizational activities until the final disposition of this case. Club business meetings are the only allowed activities during this suspension.**

Reportedly, during the Fall 2025 and Spring 2026 semester, Phi Delta Theta's new members were subjected to forced alcohol consumption, degradation, humiliation, hazing, and other threatening and endangering behaviors. Such behavior is in violation of the Arizona Board of Regents Student Code of Conduct, pertinent parts of which are stated below:

**Code of Conduct/15. Alcohol - Violation of Board or university rules or applicable laws governing alcohol, including consumption, distribution, unauthorized sale, or possession of alcoholic beverages.**

**Code of Conduct/16. Drug - Unauthorized use, sale, possession, or distribution of any controlled substance or illegal drug or possession of drug paraphernalia that would violate the law.**

**Code of Conduct/19. Hazing - Engaging in, supporting, promoting, or sponsoring hazing or violating Board or University rules governing hazing.**

**Code of Conduct/2. Endangering / Threat / Cause Harm - Endangering, threatening, or**

**causing physical harm to any member of the university community or to oneself, causing reasonable apprehension of such harm or engaging in conduct or communications that a reasonable person would interpret as a serious expression of intent to harm.**

To discuss the allegations pending against the fraternity, please contact me by Wednesday, April 15, 2026, to schedule a meeting with the Dean of Students' Office. When we meet, I will answer questions and explain the Student Code of Conduct Disciplinary process. It is expected that Phi Delta Theta fully cooperate with this investigation. Any acts impeding the disciplinary process are prohibited. Any contact with the alleged victims for the purpose of intimidation or retaliation is prohibited and will result in disciplinary action.

Please note that your FSP Liaison, Chapter Advisor, and representatives from your national organization have been included on this notice for their awareness and are encouraged to attend our meeting(s).

If this directive is violated, Phi Delta Theta may receive more restrictive sanctions, including, but not limited to, loss of recognition.**
