Dear Sheriff Rhodes, Chief Cost and law enforcement partners,

Today, I signed an Interagency Service Agreement (ISA) to restore the \$10 million in funding that had been cut from 32 law enforcement agencies' budgets across Arizona in the recently passed State budget. Recognizing this reduction in law enforcement agencies' budgets could hamper public safety, we worked with the Governor's office who identified grants from the American Rescue Plan Act to restore the full amount of lost revenue to replenish your bank accounts.

The documentation you submit to the Attorney General's Office for your RICO expenses is sufficient to satisfy federal reporting requirements. In other words, you won't have any additional reporting requirements on your end.

There are two restrictions on this funding your offices should be aware of. First, it cannot be transferred to your County-held Anti-Racketeering Revolving Fund accounts because we cannot satisfy the federal reporting requirements if that happens. Second, ARPA money must be spent by September 2026. We do not anticipate needing to return ARPA money, but if you were delaying RICO purchases, you should make them before then.
