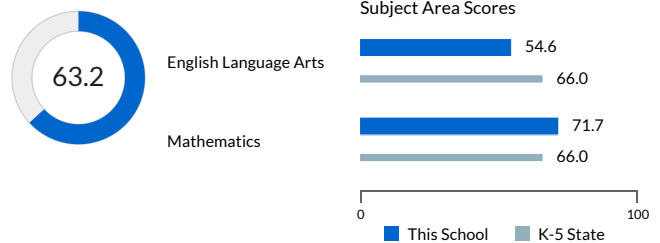

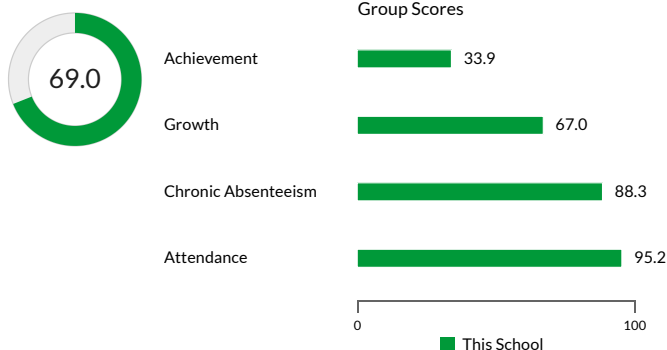

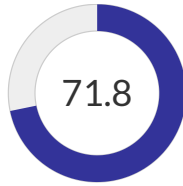




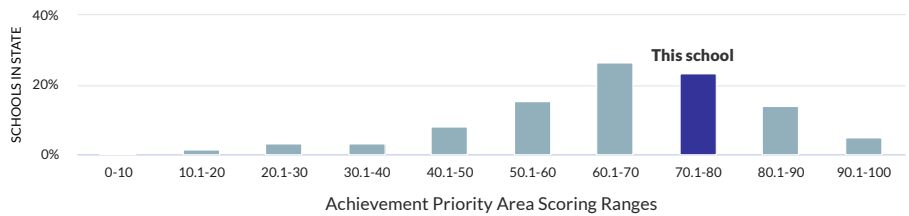
ACHIEVEMENT

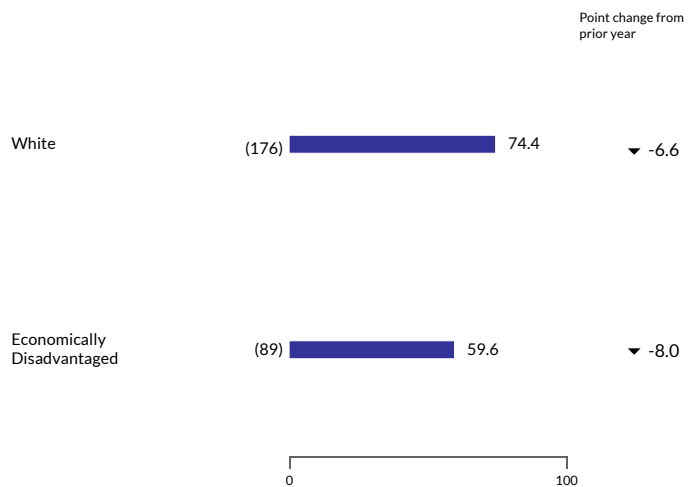
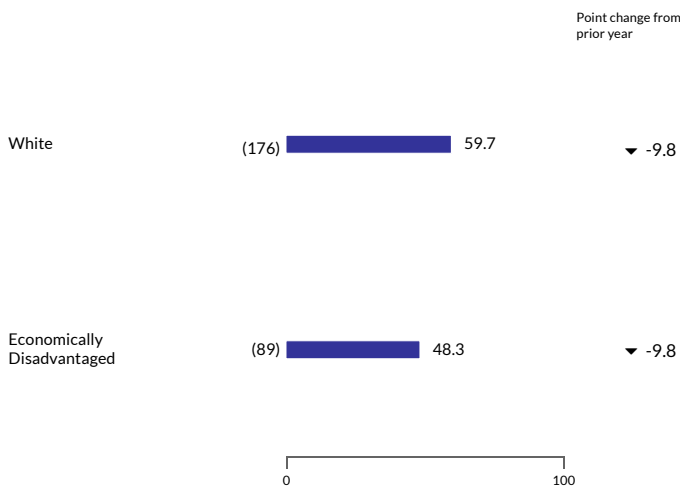

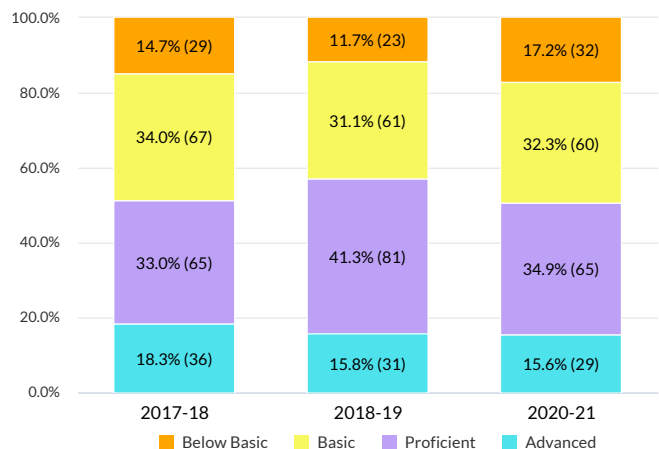
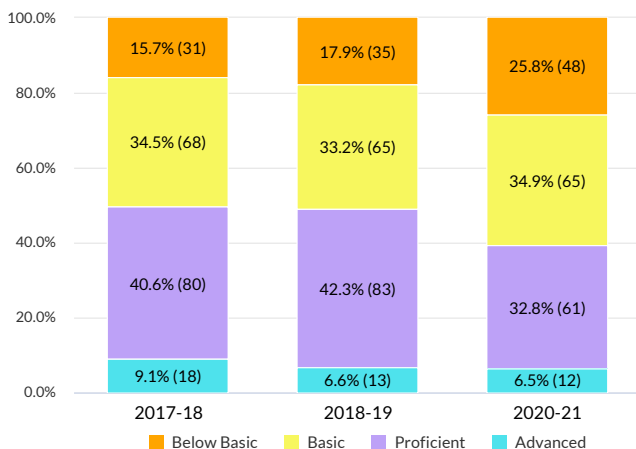


Performance Levels by Year

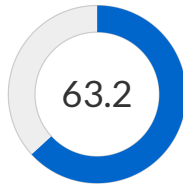

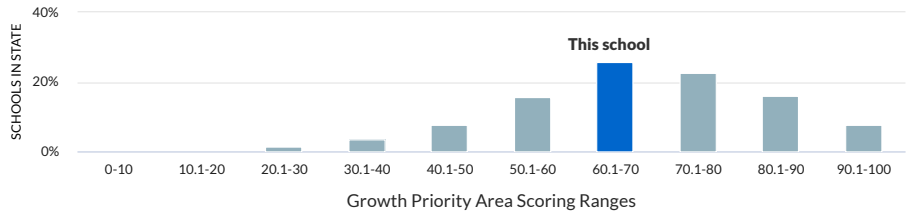
GROWTH

This priority area measures year-to-year student progress on statewide tests. It uses a value-added model that seeks to control for circumstances beyond the influence of educators. A high value-added score means that on average students in the school are progressing more quickly than other, similar students. Growth is scored from 0 to 100 to match the other priority areas and is a conversion from the roughly 0 to 6 value-added score.

This school's score was the same or higher than 37.2% of K-5 schools in the state.



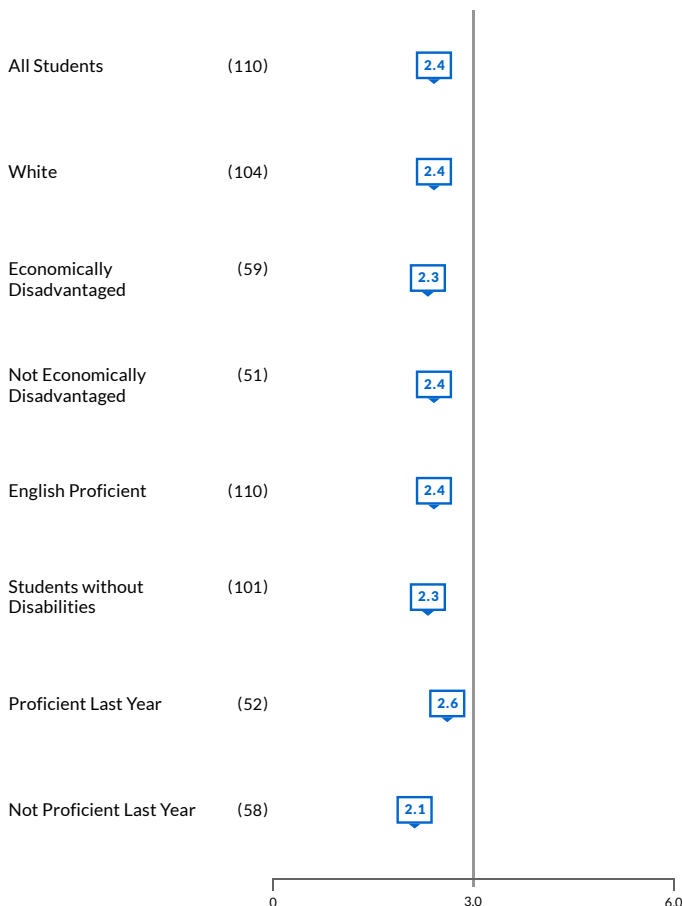

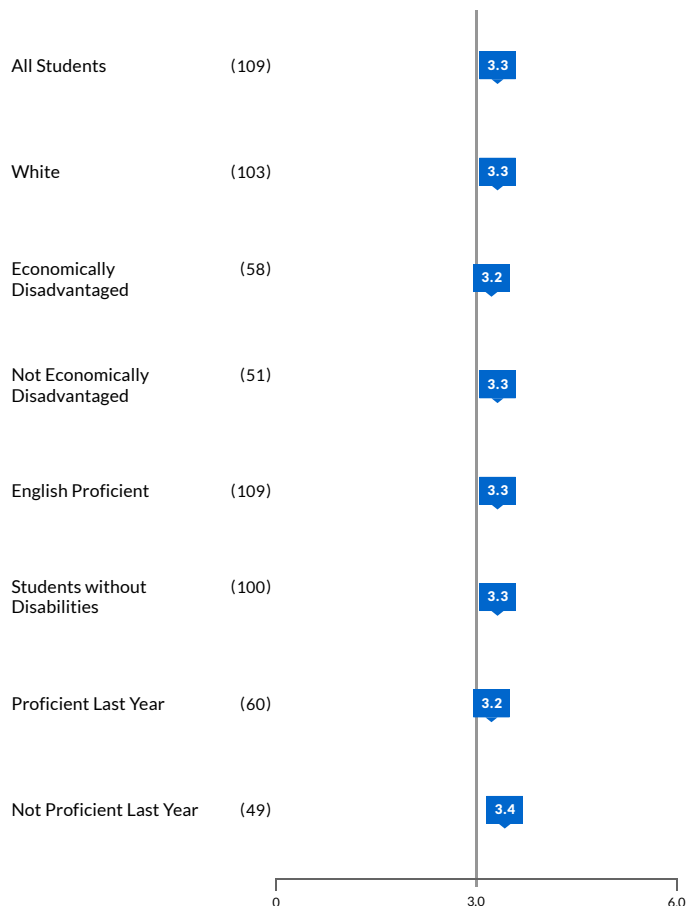

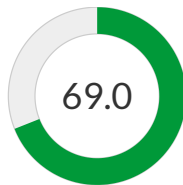




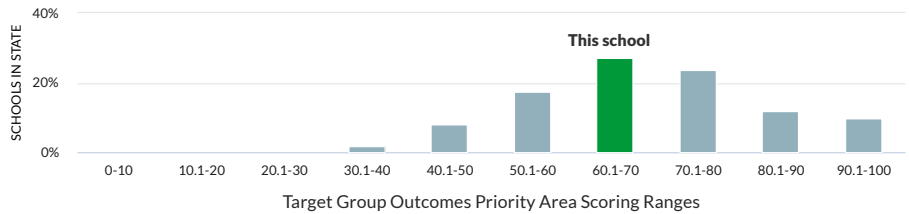
TARGET GROUP OUTCOMES

This priority area examines outcomes for students with the lowest test scores – the Target Group. It is designed to promote equity by helping schools focus on learners who need the most support while also improving outcomes for all students. The priority area score combines component scores for achievement, growth, chronic absenteeism, and attendance or graduation rate. ■ This school's score was the same or higher than 52.4% of K-5 schools in the state.



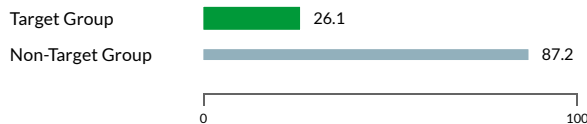

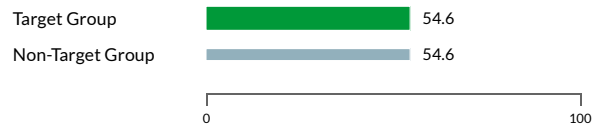

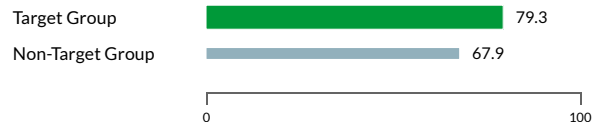

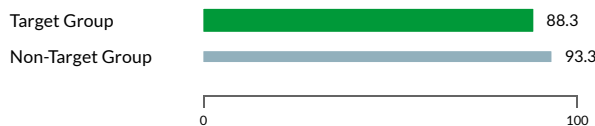

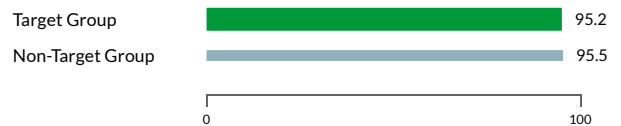

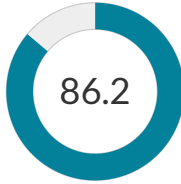




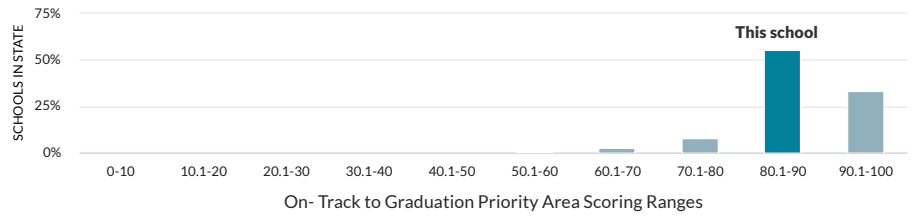
ON-TRACK TO GRADUATION

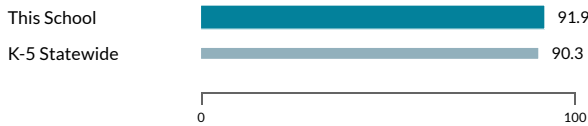

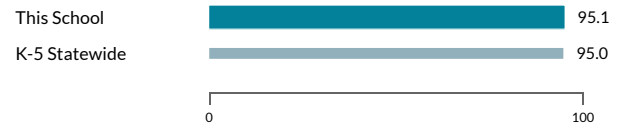

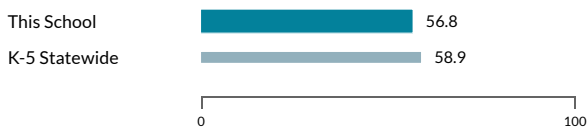

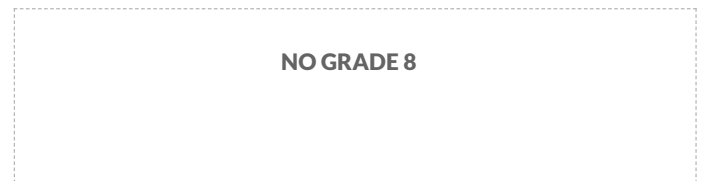
