### **Budget Narrative**

The grant funds will be used for the following line items:

- (1) Event Preparation: \$1,167,500. This budget category includes the rental costs of trailers, restrooms, fencing, windscreen, golf carts, generators, and miscellaneous equipment.
- (2) Event Hospitality: \$1,500,574. This budget category includes the tent rentals and related event dcor that will be set up along the course for the various spectators.

The USGA is prepared to pay the remaining match funds of \$168,074 for these expense categories. In addition to the above items, USGA will be privately funding the remaining event costs which exceed \$29 million. These additional costs include uniforms, travel and lodging, food and beverage, player day care expenses, furniture, office supplies, utilities, club rental, transportation, facility improvement costs, equipment, maintenance, and medical/fire/police.

IX. PROJECT NARRATIVE SUMMARY
Identified Problem The USGA is planning to host its 2024 U.S. Womens Open in Lancaster County, PA at the Lancaster Country Club (LCC). The total estimated budget for this event is \$29 million. The USGA spends a substantial amount of the events budget on marketing and hospitality costs, ensuring that the event remains attractive and entertaining for spectators visiting from around the world. Though the USGA has conducted many professional golf events throughout the country, Pennsylvania has hosted the most events to-date. The 2015 U.S. Womens Open, also held at the LCC, drew more than 134,000 spectators during tournament week. This was a record breaking attendance figure at the time. In order to expand attendance and ensure that Pennsylvania remains a competitive venue for future events, USGA is requesting a STAMP grant to fund a portion of the promotional and operational expenses associated with successfully launching a professional sporting event of this scale.
Project Plan
Use of Funds The USGA plans to use the grant funds towards the rental of tents and towards the supplies and equipment necessary to host the event and ensure the spectators are realizing the expected experience. Tents are erected throughout the venue in order to provide shading and shelter for golfers, spectators, media personnel and staff.
Project Schedule The event is planned to run from May 30, 2024 through June 2, 2024. The equipment purchases and rentals will be procured in the months prior to the event.
