FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Where do I vote?

If you don't know where your polling place is, visit votespa.com and click the link under "Where is my polling place?" Enter your home address, and the site will tell you the street address of your polling place and give you directions.

What if I have problems voting?

If you have problems at your polling place, call the Lancaster County Elections Office at 299-8293. You can also stop by the Elections Office at 150 N. Queen St., Suite 117. That's the former Armstrong building at Queen and Chestnut streets. If you'd like to report a voting problem to the newspaper, call 291-8622. If you're on Twitter, tweet voting problems or issues using #LancasterVotes.

Where can I find results?

The results will start filtering into the Lancaster County Elections Office a short time after the polls close at 8 p.m. Check LancasterOnline for live coverage and breaking news throughout the day and evening.

I'm not registered as a Republican or Democrat. Can I still vote?

Yes, you can. Just not for any candidates. Pennsylvania's closed primary system allows only registered Republicans and Democrats to vote for their party's prospective nominees. But anyone can vote on ballot questions. There are two proposed amendments to the state constitution on the ballot.

BALLOT QUESTIONS

Voters are being asked to decide whether to raise the mandatory retirement age for the state's 1,029 judges and justices to 75. They're also being asked to formally abolish the defunct Philadelphia Traffic Court, whose duties were stripped in 2013 following a ticket-fixing scandal that led to the convictions of more than half a dozen judges.

Shall the Pennsylvania Constitution be amended to require that justices of the Supreme Court, judges and justices of the peace (known as magisterial district judges) be retired on the last day of the calendar year in which they attain the age of 75 years, instead of the current requirement that they be retired on the last day of the calendar year in which they attain the age of 70?

Reminders

If you are a first-time voter or are voting in a new precinct for the first time

• You must bring one of these approved forms of photo identification:

- Pennsylvania driver's license or PennDOT ID card.
- ID issued by state agencies.
- ID issued by U.S. government.
- U.S. passport.
- U.S. armed forces ID.
- Student ID.
- Employee ID.

If you do not have a photo ID

• You can use a nonphoto identification that includes your name and address. Approved forms of nonphoto identification include:

- Nonphoto ID issued by any commonwealth agency.
- Firearm permit.
- Nonphoto ID issued by the U.S. government.
- Current utility bill.
- Current bank statement.
- Government check.
- Voter registration certificate issued by the county voter registrar.
- Current paycheck.
