In what was perhaps one of the first occasions of a newspaper offering supplemental content to

inquisitive readers, the Examiner & Herald offers a "semi-weekly telegraph" dedicated solely to reports from the Pennsylvania Legislature. At \$3 for the whole year, that's quite the steal. The paper promises a "coming session [that] will be looked to with much interest." The topics at hand? Reforming the currency and "banishing shinplasters from circulation." So, in essence, the paper was asking for money so people could read about money.

INFORMATION WANTED

Long before Amber Alerts, the only way to help find information on a missing

child in the 1830s was to place a newspaper advertisement and hope for the best. In this edition, a young boy named William Baldwin had left his parents' home in Cumberland County for a "short journey" and never returned. Jane Baldwin, the woman who wrote to the paper and is presumably his mother, feared that some accident had befallen him.

PANIC OF 1837

Though it is not mentioned explicitly on these pages, the United States in 1837 was dealing with the worst financial catastrophe up to that point in history. Deemed "the Panic of 1837," this depression lasted a full six years, into 1843 Triggered by economic problems in Britain, failing wheat crops and a variety of other speculator concerns, the Panic lead to shuttered financial institutions across the country. Then-President Martin Van Buren felt a large brunt of the blame, as his role as Andrew Jackson's vice president and single term in office coincided with the upheaval.
