### A SIMPLER EXTERIOR

From vertical board and batten siding to fewer shutters, home exteriors have a cleaner look with less ornamentation, says Elysia Monderewicz, design gallery consultant for Landmark Homes.

"I think part of it is the whole modern farmhouse takeoff," she says.

Where homeowners are getting a little bolder, Monderewicz says, is with the accent color on their front door - anything from earthy greens and oranges to reds and blues.

Bill Martin, architectural designer for Alden Homes, is a fan of the more dynamic front door hues. You'll see an orange front door on Alden's Parade entry in The Gables at Elm Tree in Mount Joy.

"You can take almost any home and the right front door in the right color catches your eye," he says.

### QUARTZ COUNTERTOPS

"While granite has been popular for years, quartz has really taken the lead in the market," says Becca Yeager, administrator with Turnberry Construction, who has a Parade entry in Willow Bend Estates in Lititz.

The price of quartz has come down, making it more competitive with granite. Quartz also offers more ease of maintenance and a more consistent pattern when compared to granite, Monderewicz says.

"Quartz comes in a myriad of hues and variations," Yeager says, noting that Turnberry's Parade kitchen features a solid-color quartz perimeter countertop and an island countertop in a complementary quartz with the look of Carrera marble.

The Parade of Homes tour is known for showcasing the latest in home designs, and this year is no exception.

Local builders share some of the popular trends you can see on the annual tour of homes from June 15-23.

### BLACK-TRIMMED WINDOWS

Another take on the modern farmhouse look, black windows have been a popular feature in industrial and commercial spaces for some time, and have recently become more popular in personal homes, says Bonnie Martin, interior designer for Garman Builders.

Black offers an exceptionally clean contrast with white siding. While some homes reserve the black trim exclusively for the outside, others feature black for the interior window trim, too. The look is best achieved with the lower half of the window showing no grills at all, Martin says.

"Because the style starts with a black and white palate, it's a very flexible way to decorate," she says. "For the exterior, flower pots, or pillows on porch furniture, can provide a pop of color that can easily be changed. The same flexibility is true for the interior as well."

"I think a black window just makes a statement," says Bill Martin of Alden Homes. "Black and white are neutral. You can put black and white on any house. I think black is underused."

### EXCITING LIGHTING

Light fixtures are the personality of a home, Bill Martin says. "You only need three or four cool ones."

Monderewicz says homeowners are turning to light fixtures as a way to add interest, and they don't mind spending more for show-stopping pieces.

"People are looking to add a wow factor to every room of the house, not just the kitchen or living room," Monderewicz says.

In addition to the fixtures themselves, lighting is getting a boost from the variety of LED options available, Yeager says. LED lighting offers the benefits of energy cost savings and longevity.

"LEDs are also sold in a variety of hues — warm or cool, and every variation in between — to suite your lighting preference, and (they) are dimmable as well to give you the perfect ambiance," Yeager says.

### RUSTIC MODERN

Clients are asking for rustic modern elements in their homes, says Nate Wenger, who handles sales and design for C&S Construction in Lebanon. Rough-appearing wood-look flooring, interior brick accents and cedar wood on the exterior are among the popular requests. The C&S Parade home in Lebanon features interior brick accent walls, custom wood beams and cedar accent pieces, including porch posts, shutters, gable brackets and corbels.

"It's a very unique and beautiful blend of styles as the majority of the home is very clean and simple, but then we add in some of these rustic elements and the house really pops," Wenger says.

## Visit 29 homes on this year's tour

The annual tour hosted by the Building Industry Association of Lancaster County takes place from June 15-23 and includes more than \$12 million in new construction in both Lancaster and Lebanon counties.

This year's 29 stops range from the latest townhome built by students at Thaddeus Stevens College of Technology to a single-family home featuring a loft-style study with reading nook to a modern Mount Joy duplex with smart technology.

Visitors can expect to see sunken vaulted living rooms, custom

cedar accents, luxurious owner's suites, finished basements, walk-in pantries, fireplaces with unique surrounds, patios and decks, state-of-the-art appliances, and architectural styles ranging from Old World European to modern farmhouse.

Entries represent 18 different builders and range in price from \$199,190 to \$855,900.

In addition to this handy guide, visitors can also use the free Parade of Homes app. Visit the app store, type in ParadeSmart, download the free app, and select the Lancaster/Lebanon Parade of Homes.

The app includes details on each home, along with directions, and also allows you to create a customizable map as well as take notes and photos.

The Parade homes are judged by a panel of building and industry

experts, with awards presented at the annual Parade of Homes Gala on Friday, June 14.

Homes are classified into divisions by price, and judged with other homes in the same price division using a numerical scoring system, with awards for best of show, kitchen, bath, interior design, exterior, decorating and landscaping.

The top scoring single-family and townhome/duplex homes each receive the coveted Fulton Bank Award, the highest honor in local homebuilding.

The Parade of Homes is free and open to the public. The event is sponsored by Fulton Bank and UGI Utilities Inc.

## The Gables offers something different

The Parade of Homes is not only a chance for builders to showcase their work, but it is also viewed as an opportunity to see some of the latest trends in home design.

For Alden Homes, however, the Parade is an opportunity to show visitors how smart, thoughtful design can create a home that's memorable and pleasing — whether or not it features the latest trends.

Trends come and go, after all. And when they go, they can leave a home feeling dated, says Bill Martin, architectural designer and director of sales for Alden Homes.

"I subscribe to the fact that a home doesn't need to look dated," he says. "If it's tastefully done now, it will remain relevant."

That's the philosophy behind the modern cottage-style homes at The Gables at Elm Tree, an Alden Homes community in Mount Joy initially designed to target millennials with its modern flair and smaller, smarter home designs. What the builder soon discovered, however, was that the concept appealed to baby boomers, too — so much so that the community population is now split equally between residents over 50 and residents under 50, Martin says.

Visitors to Alden Homes' Parade entry in The Gables, a two-story Montgomery villa at 1403 Heatherwood Drive, Mount Joy, will get a chance to see that appeal for themselves.

"We are different inside and out," Martin says of Alden Homes' designs. "Whether you like the product or not, you're not seeing what we're doing in any other home."

What you'll see in the Montgomery is the creative use of space and smart technology that have become trademarks of Alden's modern cottage style — from a built-in desk tucked next to the stairs and a floating vanity in the powder room to wireless remote features by Lutron Electronics and an Adorne

under-the-cabinet kitchen lighting system that eliminates receptacles in the backsplash.

The European-style kitchen features a tile backsplash with the look of wood that extends to the ceiling, a walk-in corner pantry and a modern stainless steel version of the farm sink. The Signature Custom Cabinetry kitchen offers a combination of open shelving, lift-up cabinet doors on upper cabinets, drawers on all lower cabinets, and additional large drawers on the 4-foot island for ease of access and maximum storage.

The kitchen overlooks a dining area, with access to an enlarged patio, and a cozy family room, where custom built-ins flank either side of a gas fireplace.

The first floor also includes a flex room with frosted-glass sliding barn doors that meet at a corner, creating options from a private office to an open playroom or additional family space.

There is also a mudroom with bench and cubbies.

The upstairs offers an owner's suite with walk-in closet and private bath, two additional bedrooms, an additional full bath and a laundry room.

The Montgomery also showcases expandable

space in the form of an unfinished second-floor room over the garage that can be used for storage or easily finished in the future for additional living space.

Such unfinished storage space has become increasingly popular in lieu of basements, Martin says. Although basements are an option in any home at The Gables, only four homeowners in the community have chosen to include them so far, he says.

Martin hopes visitors notice a few other things as they walk through the Parade home at The Gables:

■ "Modern" doesn't mean cold. "I would challenge them to come check out our version of a modern cottage," he says. "You don't lose the warmth. You don't lose the character."

■ Little things matter, right down to placing the trash can in a location that makes sense with the traffic flow in the house. And those hidden receptacles under the kitchen cabinets? They may seem like a small thing — until you have them yourself. Visually, it means there's nothing breaking up the clean, beautiful lines of the tile backsplash. Practically, it makes it easier to wipe up food splatters with-

out having to clean in and around an electrical outlet or light switch.

■ A well-designed home creates visual intrigue from every angle. "A room needs to have character without furniture in it," Martin says.

That attention to detail extends to The Gables community as a whole. The homes have been designed in a particular color scheme and layout to create an eye-pleasing streetscape, both from the front and the back.

The Montgomery is one of two two-story models at The Gables. There are also three one-story floor plans. All of them are fully customizable, and all can be built as detached homes or villas.

In addition to the Montgomery, several other models will be open for tours during the Parade of Homes.

Each home is designed to create a feeling, Martin says, and he hopes visitors will come out and experience that feeling for themselves.

"The biggest thing I hear is how memorable our homes are," he says. "I want visitors to come see our product and see if they remember us. I guarantee it won't be a waste of their time."

Other features include a private master suite, a large kitchen island and pantry, dining room, study, mudroom and three-car garage.

At 3,406 square feet, the Atland Farmhouse is priced at \$629,500.



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Southern Village duplex loaded with character

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Southern Village is a quiet neighborhood of duplexes and single-family homes in Lancaster Township, located near the scenic Conestoga River with easy access to routes 30 and 283.

It is also a stop on this year's Parade of Homes, thanks to a bright and open three-bedroom duplex by Grande Construction at 128 Goldenfield Drive.

From its arched garage door to its stone-and-siding exterior, the home has lots of character.

Like all Parade homes, this one includes some special upgrades. Among them are granite kitchen countertops, a corner family room fireplace and a dining room with laminated hardwood flooring. The master bedroom includes a vaulted ceiling, a walk-in closet and a private bath with double-bowl vanity. A second first-floor

bedroom and another full bath are on the opposite end of the home, offering added privacy.

A third bedroom on the second floor offers another little oasis, with a private full bath and walk-in closet all its own.

The home also has a two-car garage and a 6-by-12-foot concrete patio with sliding-door access off the family room.

At 1,530 square feet, the home is priced at \$257,800.

In addition to its upgraded features, there are a number of standard features that also add special character to the home, including rounded drywall corners and arched doorways. A carpeted family room, tile in the foyer and kitchen, and a vaulted family room ceiling are also standard.

Grande Construction is building a total of 18 duplex and single-family homes in the Southern Village community, with

the potential for additional phases in the future. Buyers can choose from semi-detached models like the Parade entry, as well as ranch homes and two-stories with a first-floor master bedroom.

With Grande Construction, the floor plan is merely the starting point. Buyers have the freedom to fully customize their homes to meet their wants and needs.

Every buyer meets with a builder representative along with Laura Grande to select their

lot and determine which floor plan best suits their needs. Buyers will then work closely with the draftsman to make any necessary modifications or changes prior to finalizing the floor plan.
