

## 9 Injured Here By Hurricane

### Brick Hits Fireman; Farmer Hurts Knee

Nine persons in the city and county were treated at hospitals for injuries received from Hurricane Hazel. Three were admitted.

Larry J. Heffner, eighteen, 104 Brown St., Elizabethtown, a volunteer fireman, was struck on the head with a brick while helping to put a tarpaulin on a damaged roof at the home of Martin Eck, Elizabethtown R1. He was admitted to St. Joseph's Hospital, suffering possible concussion.

#### Blown Off Steps

Ellis Rettew, fifty-nine, Lancaster R1 farmer, was blown off the steps of his home, tossed across a field and into the side of a parked truck. He suffered a possible fracture of the right knee and was admitted to the Osteopathic Hospital.

Richard Brackbill, twenty-one, Lancaster R7, suffered a lacerated tendon on the left wrist when struck by slate blown from a roof. He was admitted to the General Hospital.

#### Treated at Hospital

Treated at the General Hospital were: Donald Reynolds, four, Willow Street R1, laceration above right eye when he bumped into furniture in his candle-lit home; Miss Hazel Dorworth, fifty-four, 36 E. New St., lacerated left elbow when she fell over a tree limb; James Frey, twenty-eight, 727 East End Ave., lacerated left eyebrow when window blew shut; and Henry Horn, fifty-four, 755 New Holland Ave., lacerated forehead when a garage door blew shut in his face.

Mrs. Coleen Pennington, 217 E. Clay St., a storm victim, was treated at the Osteopathic Hospital for a puncture wound of the right foot. Pearl Smith, three, daughter of Mrs. Verna Smith, 40 S. Front St., Columbia, was treated at Columbia Hospital for an injured right index finger when high winds slammed a door on her.
