Criminal Investigation

Sgt. Gillaspie said he did not talk about what happened to anyone but his . . . He may have talked to Coach . . . about the incident to explain that . . . was startled and may have gotten a snag on his pants.

Sgt. Gillaspie said he was surprised that . . . had been injured and it would have been a game changer for him had he known. He would have called for medical attention and reported it to his supervisor. Supervising Investigator Ramsey left the room to see if the administration wanted to speak with Sgt. Gillaspie. I told him I appreciated it cooperation. Ramsey returned and told him that they would like to talk to him and Sgt. Gillaspie stood up and left the room.

End of Statement

Lt. Navarre escorted Ramsey and I out to the patrol vehicle parking lot to where Sgt. Gillaspie's marked Amador Sheriff's Office patrol vehicle #17 had been parked. Supervising Investigator Ramsey photographed the vehicle and the interior. He opened the glovebox and located the two expended taser probes inside the glove box. He photographed and collected the probes and subsequently turned them the probes over to me on 06/02/22 and I booked them into evidence at the El Dorado DA's Office and the loaded the photos into Evidence.Com.

On 06/01/2022 at approximately 1600 hrs., Supervising Investigator Joe Ramsey and I met with Amador County Capt. Jarret Benov and Lt. Jason Navarre at the Amador Sheriff's Office located at 700 Court Street, Jackson CA. They turned over several documents to me including an Axon Taser 7 activity log for serial #X40002C3P issued to Sgt. Ryan Gillaspie dated May 02, 2022. The taser activity log showed that on May 2, 2022 at 1833 hrs. a trigger pull registered deployed from Bay 1, cartridge serial #X420385Y for 1.71 seconds with electrical discharge and then immediately disarmed and the safety was turned back on.
