Criminal Investigation

Lt. Navarre provided Sgt. Gillaspie's signed taser training files. He said although the training was an annual certification, Sgt. Gillaspie's last training and certification on the Taser 7 device was May 27, 2020 which Sgt. Gillaspie signed and explained that there was no training in 2021 due to the COVID pandemic.

I reviewed Sgt. Gillaspie's MDC activity log dated 05/02/2022. It showed him going into service at 0530 hrs and off duty at 1844 hrs which confirmed he was on duty when his taser deployed. The activity log was later uploaded to Karpel at the El Dorado District Attorney's Office.

I received from Lt. Navarre, (1) Taser 7 (Serial #X40002C3P) in its holster, (2) taser cartridges; one grey expended cartridge (Serial #X4820385Y) and one black cartridge (Serial #X49202YF2) which were transported back to the El Dorado DA's Office and booked into the evidence module. Lt. Navarre had collected the above listed items from Sgt. Ryan Gillaspie.

I reviewed the Amador County Sheriff's Office Conducted Energy Device Policy #309:

Section 309.5.5 Actions Following Deployments: It clearly states that all employees shall notify a supervisor of all taser device discharges.

Section 309.6.1 Unintentional discharges shall be documented in a memorandum to the employees supervisor detailing the circumstances surrounding the unintentional discharge

All the above documents and evidence were loaded into Karpel at the El Dorado District Attorney's Office.

On 06/01/2022 at approximately 1730 hrs. Amador Sheriff's Lt. Navarre, Supervising Investigator Joe Ramsey and I met with . . . and her son, . . . in a second-floor conference room located in the County Administration building located at 810 Court Street, Jackson CA. The interview as
