said he knew that two probes had fired out of the taser, but he only remembered the one probe attached to [redacted] pantleg and was not sure where the second probe had gone. Ryan pulled the taser out of [redacted] pants with a quick "pop out" from grabbing it by the wire. [redacted] did see a hole in the [redacted] sweatpants but again no injury. [redacted] did not yell out when the probe was removed from his pants, nor did he tell them he was injured. He had known Ryan for a couple of years because their kids play baseball together. He would not classify them as friends.

On 06/02/2022 at approximately 1445 hrs., I received a phone call from Manager [redacted] audio recorded the conversation and later loaded into Evidence.Com at the El Dorado District Attorney's Office. The following is a synopsis of that call.

**Interview**

I explained to [redacted] who I was and that I was tasked with an unbiased investigation into the events that occurred at Mike Clark Field in Amador County on May 2, 2022. [redacted] said he was the Manager for the baseball team, the Braves which is sponsored by his family company Roaring Camp Mining. His other, Coach [redacted] was out in right field working with the kids. Ryan pulled up in his squad car. He was working but is one of the coaches and some times stops by to see what is going on. [redacted] had been asking him about his taser for weeks and weeks. Every time [redacted] saw Ryan, he called him taser man. Ryan walked out to the field. [redacted] said he was on the infield when he heard a taser go off. [redacted] did not hear [redacted] yell out. [redacted] walked over to [redacted] and saw one of the leads stuck in the kid's pants. [redacted] said they removed it and they were not any prongs in [redacted] leg or anything. He had never seen a taser before or did not know how it works. [redacted] described the prong as a tiny little watch battery. [redacted] said they pulled it out. [redacted] asked [redacted] if he was alright. [redacted] said he was fine and that it did not hurt at all. Ryan left shortly after the incident and the team practiced for about another hour more. [redacted] mom was approximately 15 minutes late that day picking him up.
