Criminal Investigation

He described the probe as a small chrome with a metal end. said it left a little tear in his pants with a little string of pant that tore out. did not see any blood or injury to . He was unaware if it broke skin and. did not indicate that it did. explained that one of the coaches is a military medic and carries a bag with him and if they saw something like that they would have given a band aid.

asked if he was okay multiple times and he said he was. described demeanor afterward as a little skeptical at first, maybe shocked that it happened, but totally fine and excited about it. thought might have appeared a little pale. was the team manager and later said he had talked to mother about the situation and what had happened, and she said everything was fine. was surprised to hear about all this going on. They continued to practice and after it ended, went to talk to the mother. The coaches really did not have conversation about incident until the next day, which was at a game. said he had talked to mom and that she was totally fine with it and was happy that was able to see how a taser worked. usually handled the parental conversation since he is the manager. described as totally fine during the next couple of weeks. never once said he had pain in his legs or had any issues. I asked if he would surprised if I told him that had an injury to his leg. said he would not be surprised because if something had poked a hole in his pants it could do the same to leg. He said after the incident, Ryan was quiet and left not too long after. The coaches went back to practice. He had no conversation with Ryan since.
