

7-11 Committee Report on School Reconfiguration

April 8, 2015

Summary

As described below in more detail, the recommendation by the 7-11 Committee was primarily driven by declining student enrollment over the past several years and the impact that declining enrollment has on the District's ability to continue to provide Amador County students with the best educational experience possible. To date, Amador students, teachers, and administrators have done an outstanding job in maintaining an extremely high educational standard, as evidenced by the fact that every secondary school in the County was recently awarded Gold Ribbon designation by the California Department of Education. However, as student populations within the District continue to decline, and with most indicators suggesting that trend toward fewer students will continue well in the future, the ability to maintain those high standards for all students will be significantly impacted.

After careful consideration, this committee ultimately concluded that changes to the current two high school configuration should be made. The Committee did not reach this recommendation lightly, recognizing that long-standing and important community traditions are tied to the two current schools.

Ultimately, however, the Committee chose to focus primarily on identifying a school configuration that provided the best opportunity for Amador County students to continue to receive the best educational experience possible, and that focus led the Committee to its recommendation of a single high school for the County. Whichever site is not chosen as the single high school would likely become the junior high for students from the Upcountry, Plymouth, Jackson, and Sutter Creek areas.

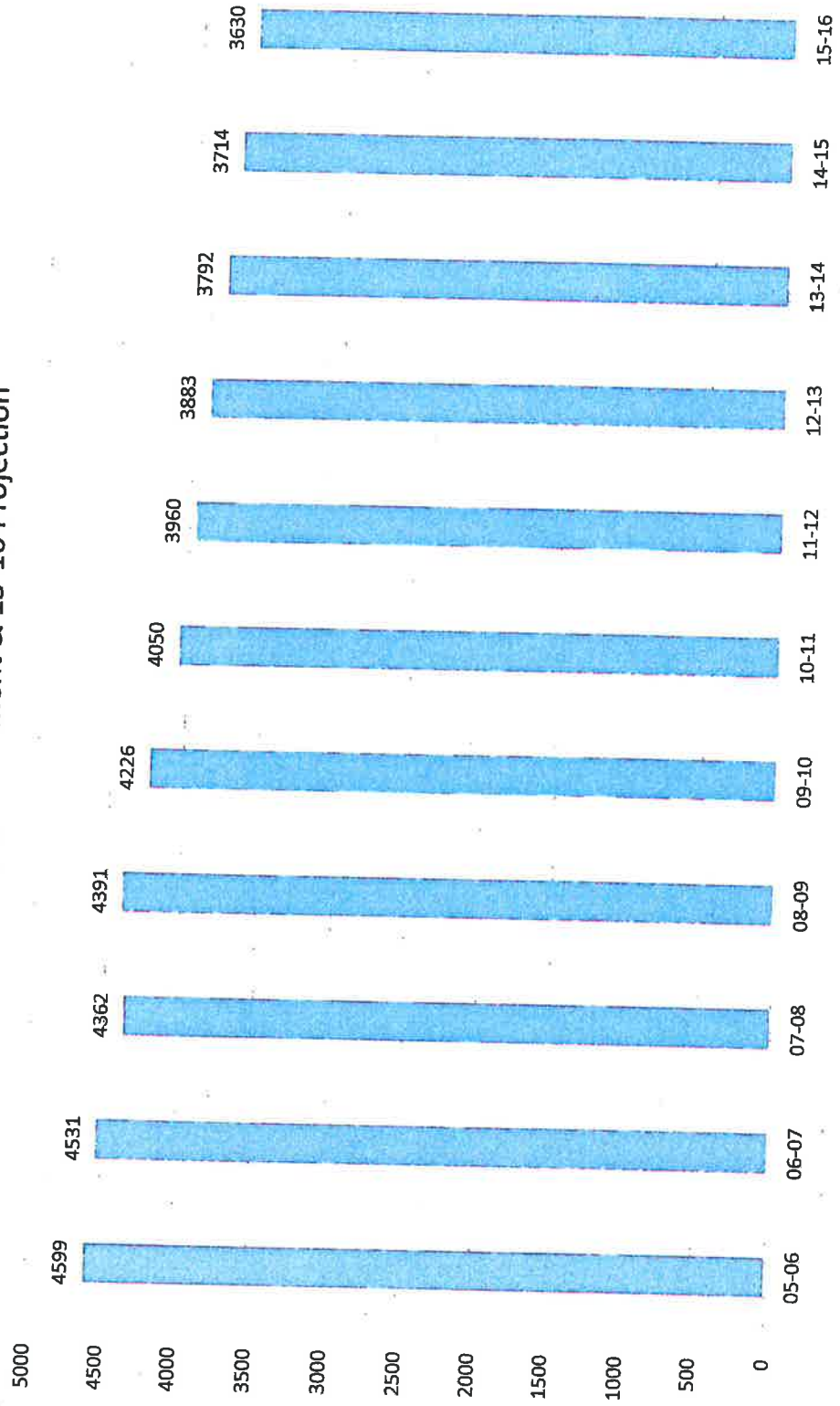
7-11 Committee

Recommendation

1 High School grades 9-12 (HS campus to be determined)

2 Junior High Schools

- Lone Elementary attendance area students remain at Lone Jr. Hi
- All other 7-8 grade students attend a county wide Jr. Hi. (HS campus to be determined)
 - 6th Graders from Jackson Elementary School would also move to campus with 7-8 graders
 - Discontinue use of Jackson Junior High campus as a 6-8th grade campus

Curriculum/Teachers

- Eliminates guest students
- Increase new class offerings provided staffing remains at current level
- Consistent feeder programs from Jr to High School (not lone) resulting in a smoother transition from Jr to High schools for both students and staff
- May result in fewer preps due to less courses each teachers will be teaching (some HS teachers preparing for 4 different courses)
- More opportunities for staff collaboration among teachers resulting in less isolation of teachers

Suggested Staffing for one High School

- Principal
- Vice Principal
- 4 counselors
- Comparable (to like size school) office staff
- Full time nurse
- No teachers sharing classrooms
- Utilize same number of current teaching positions at the two high schools to provide:

SB 1458

SB 1458 changes the criteria on how a school's API is calculated

Currently test scores and attendance are used

Once implemented other factors including "Completion of a Career Technology Education" will make up 40% of the API score.

- It is not an option to not fully implement the program
- The API is tied to both the State and Federal accountability acts
- There are penalties, sanctions and ultimately the potential for the State government to come in and take over operations of our schools for non-compliance. There is no opt-out option.
- **Costs to Implement SB 1458**
- ACSD does not have the resources to fully implement the required Career Technology Education portion of SB1458 under the current configuration if we want to offer all pathways to all students. The only way to offer complete pathways, without adding teachers, is to have them all in one location, or to split them between the two high schools and have students choose a site based on pathway interest.

Maintaining a high API

- Increases grant eligibility
- Increases eligibility for awards - All secondary schools recently received Gold Ribbon designations by the California Department of Education.

Timeline for Implementation of SB 1458

- Signed into law in September, 2012
- Full implementation was originally 2016-17
- 1 year extension for implementation was approved March 17, 2015, making the new implementation date 2017-2018

SB 1458 Unknowns

- When
- How will the 'Career and Technical Education Pathways' portion affect seniors that only attend ½ day of school
- How will it affect 7 & 8th graders, including those at lone. May change the feasibility of two junior high schools resulting in all 7 & 8th graders attending one site.

Athletics

Overall, there would be a likelihood that the opportunities for students to participate in team athletics would increase due to potential for additional teams/sports with a larger student population. It is recognized that a few sports may need to have cuts; however, other sports do not cut and/or currently have difficulty fielding full teams.

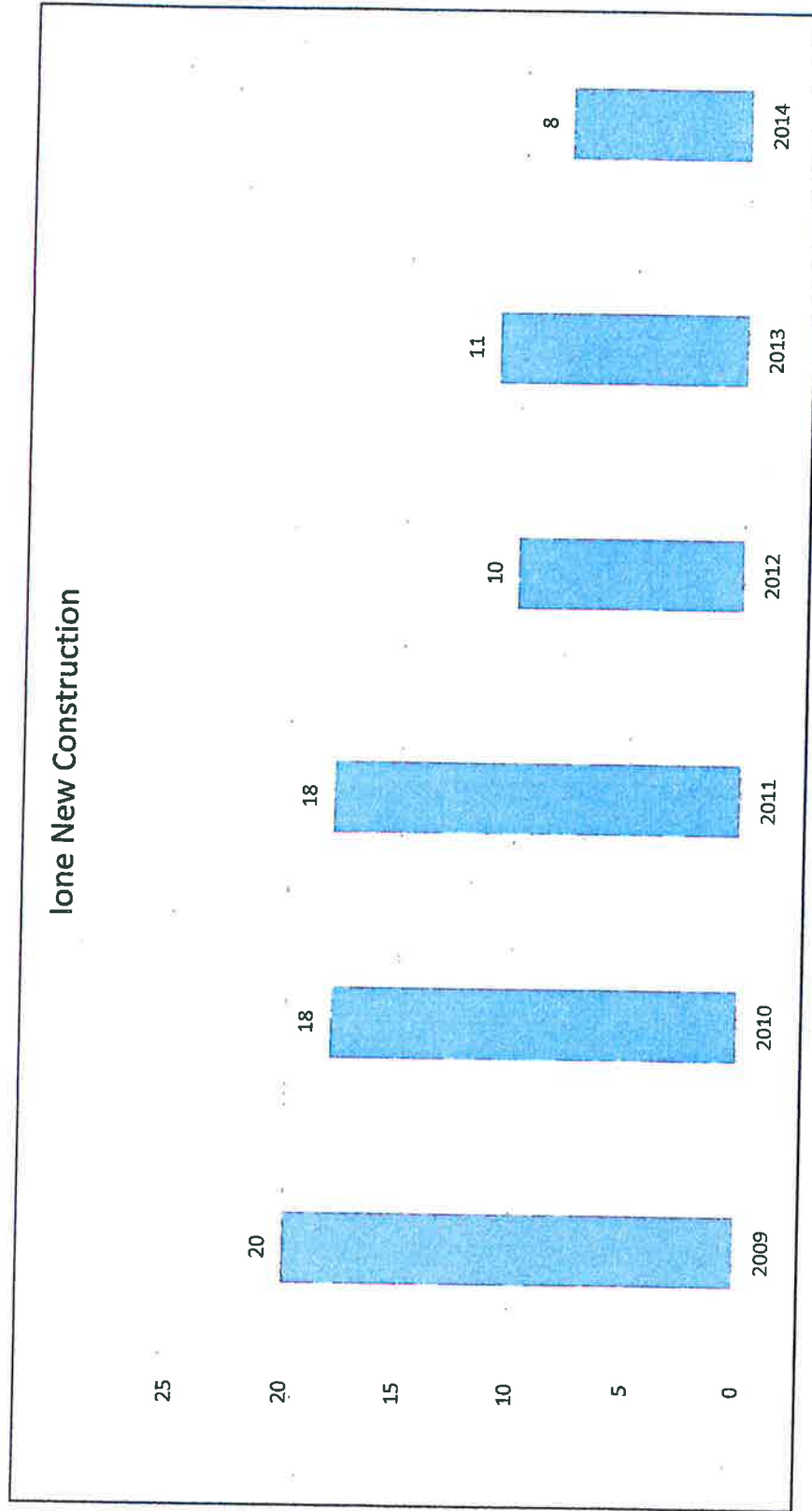

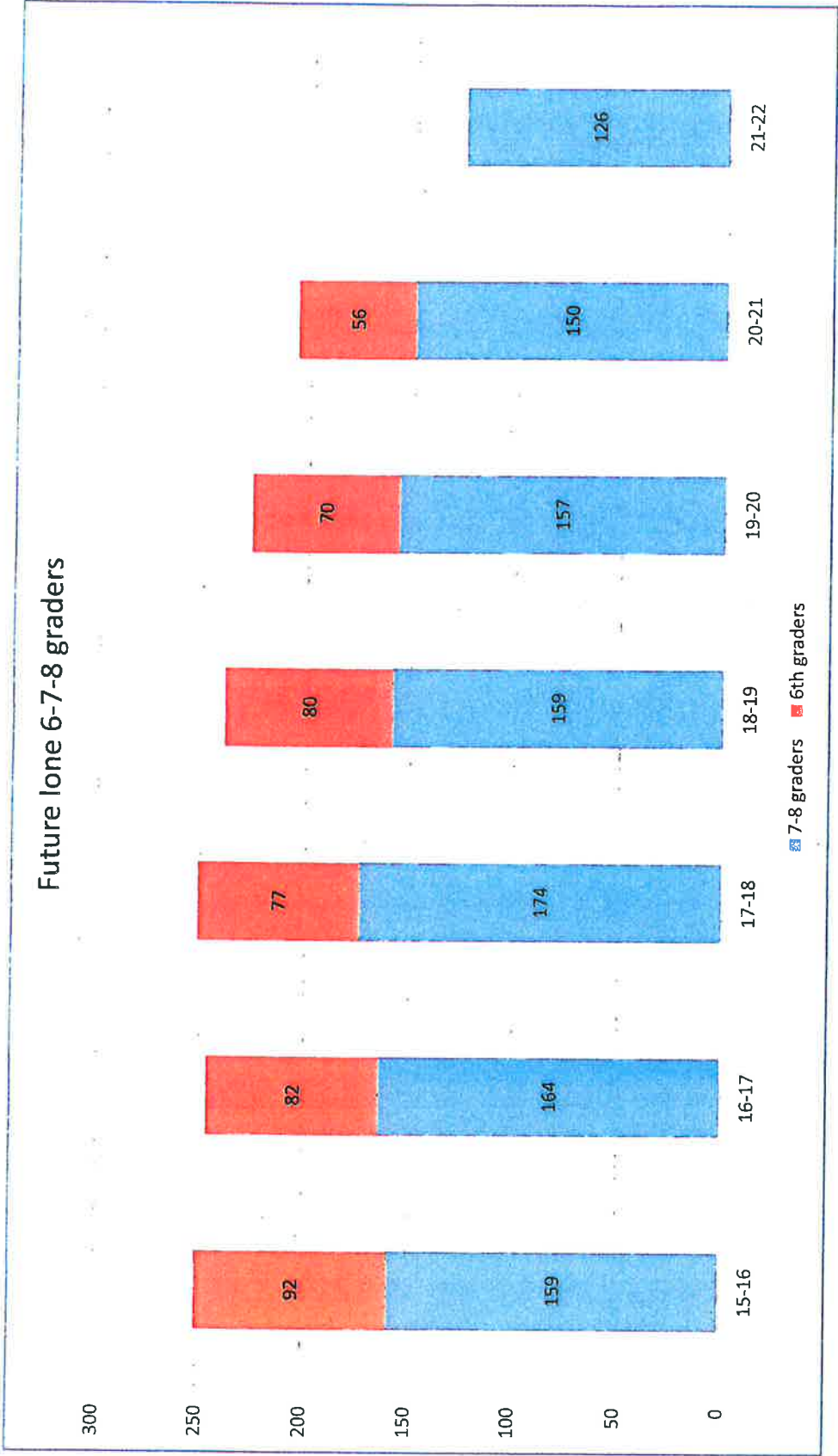
New Home Construction

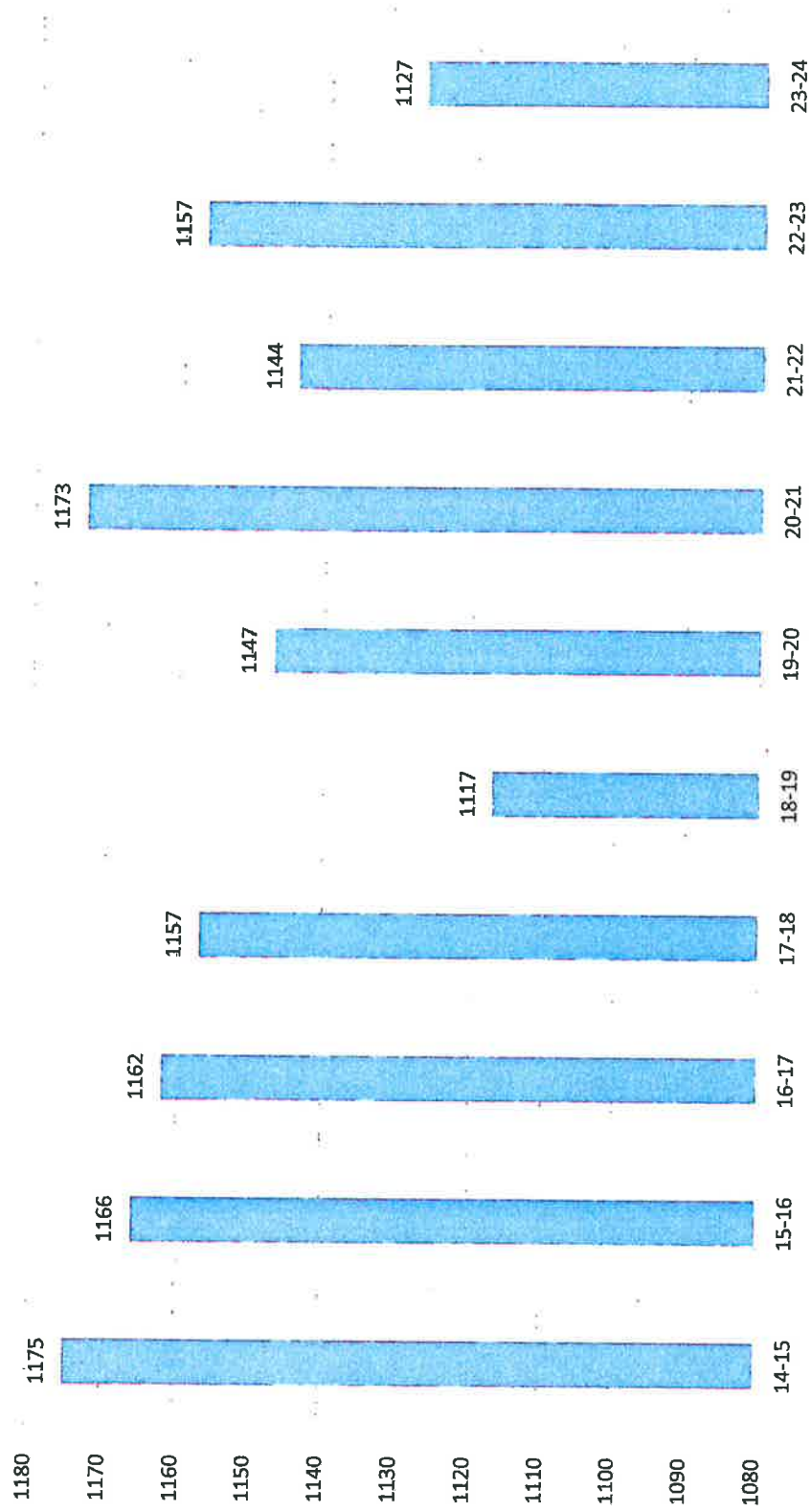
Projected Enrollment at County Junior High School

Where will the combined High School be located?

The recommendation does not formally recommend a specific site for the single County high school.

- Neither current high school presently has the capacity to adequately accommodate all of the students; certain modifications and improvements would have to be made. The necessary improvements that have been identified, differ depending on which school site is selected. Exact costs of the needed improvements remain to be determined by District.
- The Committee did identify an “Ideal” or best-case scenario, which would be a significantly expanded and improved high school located on the Argonaut site, funded by a bond measure or parcel tax, as may be deemed appropriate by the Board.

The following Additions/Improvements are needed to house 1200 students

- 10 additional classrooms (3 would be need to be science rooms).
- Additional 550-600 Student lockers
- New Gym / locker rooms
- Facility that would be equal to the Triglia Center at Argonaut to house the Transition classroom and the Moderate/severe students classroom
- Parking, possibly use the parking lot above the stadium and/or below the tennis courts.

Other consideration: Determining how an increase in students will impose on the elementary campus will take thoughtful planning.

School Facilities Bond

Would need Bond committee to determine the rate/time period of new bond. Requires 55% for passage

Current bond on property tax bill that was passed in 2002, expires in 2029, has a rate of \$.0155 per \$100 value = \$45.50 for a \$300,000 home

Parcel Tax

Approx. 22,953 parcels in county, \$43M over 20 years, per parcel would be \$93.67 annually, requires 2/3 vote for passage.

Should the Board decide to pursue this option, the Committee would recommend that consideration be given to the needs of ALL schools in the district to include facility improvements needed and included in bond/parcel tax.
