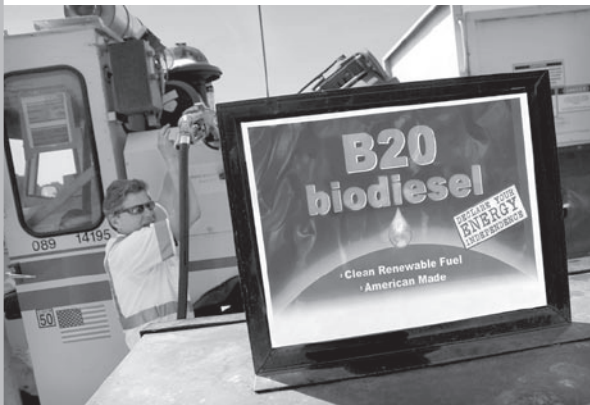

# This year's festival to be more foot friendly

It all started 29 years ago. When the Los Altos Village Association presents the Arts and Wine Festival to the community this year, it will be the 29th time they have hosted the event.

It all started in 1979 when LAVA was looking for ways to raise funds to promote the merchants in the downtown village. This was a time of transition for Los Altos and much of the Santa Clara Valley. The population was growing rapidly, housing was overtaking sleepy orchards, and shopping malls and strip malls were opening throughout Silicon Valley. The life breath of the village business environment was threatened.

The Arts and Wine Festival started small, with just 150 exhibitors in a parking plaza and a two-day attendance of approximately 30,000. This year's festival, by contrast, will host 380 exhibitors, 30 food vendors and have an expected attendance of approximately 125,000.

The festival is a major endeavor, requiring

the involvement of more than 400 volunteers including downtown merchants who donate hours upon hours of their spare (and not so spare) time.

JoAnn Fishpaw of Coldwell Banker is the chairwoman of this year's Arts and Wine Festival. Working in conjunction with the LAVA staff and other downtown business owners and community members, Fishpaw organized this year's festival and incorporated new ideas and features.

Promoter Pacific Fine Arts of Pacific Grove selected 380 talented artisans and craftspeople from around the nation for the festival. This is the third year that PFA has engaged artists for the festival.

Festivalgoers will find it easier to traverse the festival this year. The Los Altos Arts and Wine Committee has endeavored to make the festival more walkable – that means wider aisles and more accessible vendor booths.

The most popular segments of the festival remain the same. The food booths again will be on Second and Third streets, between State and Main streets.

The Main Stage, sponsored by Walgreens, will still be the spot to hear an array of musical acts. The lineup includes The Joe Band, Old School, Midlife Vices, Shark Sandwich and Livewire. The Heartbeats return for their fourth appearance, headlining Saturday's show 6-8 p.m.

Lemo, Fred McCarty, Blue House, The Woogiemen and Debbie Thacker are scheduled throughout the weekend on the Community Plaza Stage. Like the festival itself, admission to all concerts is free.

The KidZone sits in Central Plaza between Third

Street and the Community Stage. There will be activities and amusements for children of all ages, from rock climbing to face painting to "Crazy Hair" to a trackless train ride. Check out the KidZone Stage for music, magic and comedy.

Six wineries are slated to pour their vintages at this year's festival. Fernwood Cellars will join returning wineries Roudon-Smith Winery, Naumann Vineyards, Léal Vineyards, Thomas Fogarty Winery and Page Mill Winery.

For the second year in a row, M.E. Fox & Company is providing beer for the festival. There will be Belgian and domestic beers, some of them from microbreweries. The beer list includes GB Marzen, Widmer Hefeweizen, Stella Artois, Bud Light, Hoegaarden, Bass and Leffe.

Light, frosty margaritas for a cool refresher will be available at the Main Stage Margarita booth.

Festival hours are 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday and Sunday in downtown Los Altos.

Proceeds help promote downtown Los Altos as a shopping and eating destination and benefit schools and charitable organizations in the community.

# Where to park and why you should leave your pets at home

### Shuttle Bus and parking

Many attendees park along the residential streets surrounding the downtown triangle and in the South and North Parking plazas in the downtown area. These spaces fill quickly and savvy folks head over to the parking lot at Los Altos High School, 201 Almond Ave. A free shuttle bus will run at regular intervals from the school to the corner of Main Street and San Antonio Road at the entrance to the festival. When ready to head back to the car, riders can rest at the

shade tent and/or on one of the benches by the shuttle stop while they wait for the next bus.

### Bicycles

For bikers, the Silicon Valley Bicycle Coalition will again operate a free bike-parking corral in the South Plaza area off Third Street. It is an efficient way to keep the bikes secure and safe. Coalition members will also park strollers.

### Restrooms

Restrooms will be located throughout the festival on the numbered streets at the entrances to the parking plazas. There will be portable toilets, hand-washing sinks and sanitizing lotion on Second, Third and Fourth streets at the North Plaza and Second and Third streets at South Plaza. Patrons should refrain from asking business owners for use of their bathrooms unless they are patronizing these businesses.

### Pets

As always, the Los Altos Village Association asks attendees to leave their pets at home. Due to unfortunate incidents with children, strollers and dogs, it is best that all animals stay at home in a safer and quieter environment.

# Klocko the creator

artwork started as a side activity but blossomed into a full-time job after friends began to request original Klocko creations.

Klocko, who moved to Mountain View in 1975, then to Los Altos in 1988, formed her own company, which she later sold to Dakin Toys. Klocko worked for Dakin for three years before taking a break to remodel her home and raise her children.

After eight years, Klocko got restless enough to return to her career as a professional artist. Klocko said her oldest daughter, now attending an art school in Southern California, "has given me inspiration to explore different things and mediums."

Three years ago, Klocko started working with ceramics, in addition to the polymer clay she has been crafting for 18 years. She enrolled in ceramics classes at Foothill College.

Klocko's ideas come from magazines and books. She keeps a stack of inspirational clippings nearby.

"I usually have too many ideas and can't use all of them," she said.

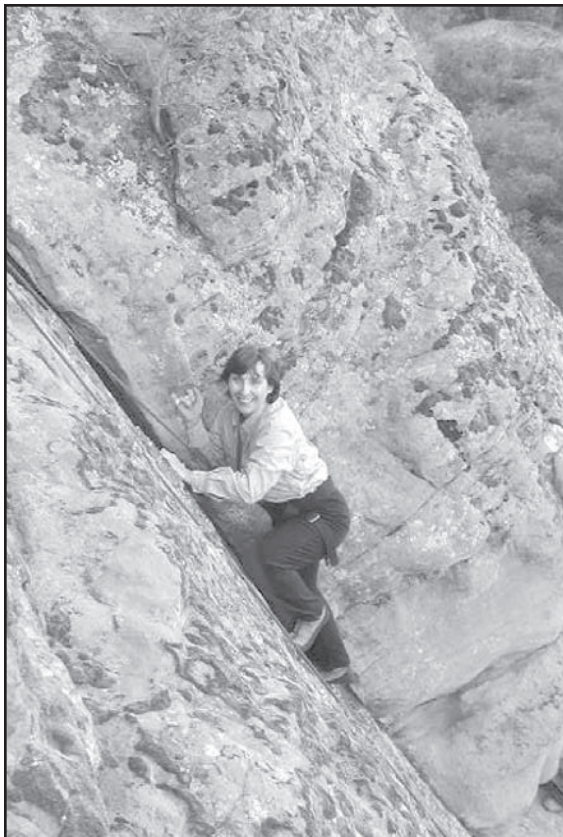
People, animals and bugs are among her favorite subjects.

Klocko has showcased her work at the Los Altos Arts

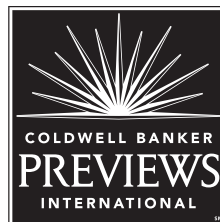

and Wine Festival – one of her favorite shows – since 1995. She said the people who attend the festival appreciate fine artwork, and the size of the show allows for greater intimacy.

At this year's festival, Klocko will feature her new work – “Fingertip Sculptures” – that she has been crafting over the past nine months. Although the sculptures are made of polymer clay, the figures do not sit behind frames; they hang on walls and sit on stands. The works are jointed, touchable and “really beautiful and wonderful,” Klocko said.

This will be only the third festival at which Klocko has exhibited “Fingertip Sculptures.” Klocko said she's received positive responses at the prior two shows, although “most people don't know that it's me because it's so different.” ❀

Matt Oetinger, founder of Fernwood Cellars and a second-generation winemaker, was introduced to the wine business by his father, Lew Oetinger, owner of Hummingbird Hill Vineyards. vineyards of the Santa Cruz Mountains, including an estate-grown Chardonnay. Matching vintages of carefully chosen vineyards, Roudon-Smith specializes in estate-grown Chardonnay, Cabernet Sauvignon, Syrah and Merlot.

The Wine and Food Companion of New York has recognized Roudon-Smith as one of the top wineries in California.

Roudon-Smith representatives will pour Sauvignon Blanc, Chardonnay, Claret and a Syrah Rosé under a tent at their new location at Second and Main streets.

### Naumann Vineyards

Naumann Vineyards is in its third year at the festival. The winery is located at an elevation of 2,000 feet, atop Montebello Road in Santa Clara Valley overlooking Silicon Valley.

Vintner Don Naumann believes the quality of the wine begins with the fruit. Naumann Vineyards' Estate Merlot is grown atop the mountain on an eastern-facing slope. All work in the vineyard is performed by hand. The Naumanns cultivate for low-yield, high-quality fruit to produce their wines.

The winery has two Merlot vineyards. The lower vineyard, planted in 1994, is 1 1/2 acres on a gentle 20-degree slope. The upper vineyard, planted in 1997, is on a 1-acre parcel on a 40-degree slope. The upper area is rocky and yields half the amount of fruit per plant as the lower

vineyard. Neither vineyard receives irrigation during the growing season. All these stresses – the terrain, climate, and irrigation – as well as hand nurturing, enhance the flavors of this intense fruit.

Vintner Naumann will be pouring a 2003 Merlot, a 2004 Merlot and a 2005 Chardonnay at the festival

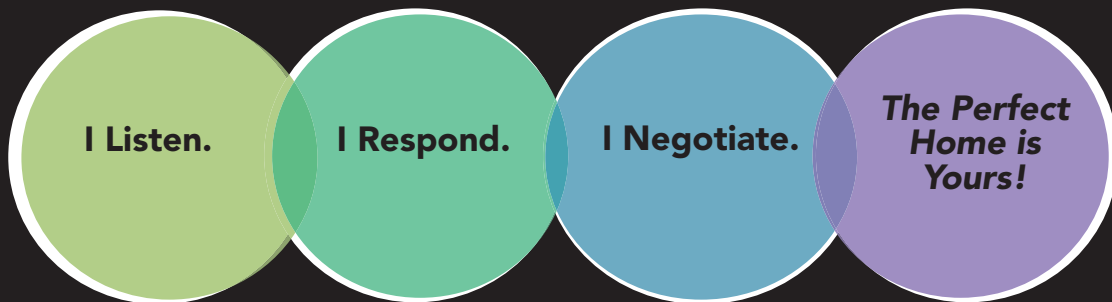
Dane Stark, son of the winery founder, now runs Page Mill Winery, and his extensive training in France and California has led to the production of distinguished wines.

### Thomas Fogarty Winery & Vineyards

What began as a pastime is now considered one of the Peninsula's most-respected wineries.

About the time of the first Los Altos Arts and Wine Festival, Dr. Thomas Fogarty – a cardiovascular surgeon at Stanford and world-renowned inventor – took up home winemaking in a small cabin. That property is now the site of the Thomas Fogarty Winery and Vineyards.

Fogarty planted his first grapes in 1978 and, in 1981, he established a commercial winery in the historic grape-growing region of the Santa Cruz Mountains.

Representatives from Thomas Fogarty Winery & Vineyards will pour a 2006 Monterey Gewurztraminer, a 2006 California Skyline Chardonnay, a 2005 California Skyline Red Wine Blend and a 2006 Santa Cruz Mountains Pinot Noir.

### Léal Vineyards

Léal Vineyards is returning to the Los Altos Arts and Wine Festival for the fourth year.

The winery owner, Frank Léal, is living his dream. His goal is to have fun, re-establish San Benito County's historic reputation as a winegrowing region and consistently provide limited, exceptional vintages. It appears he's succeeded on all counts.

Léal started pursuing this dream while still in his 20s. Leaving his blue-collar career behind, he searched for the perfect locale to grow grapes. In 1998 and only

28 years old, Léal purchased 45 acres for the new vineyard in the foothills of Hollister in San Benito County toward the northern end of California's sprawling Central Coast region. Léal recognized that here was a perfect synthesis of climate, soils and people for producing truly great wines.

As the vines were left to mature in Hollister, Léal headed to Napa to learn firsthand how to craft world-class wines. He returned to his vineyard secure in the knowledge that the eventual Léal wines and visitor experience would have to reflect his belief that wine should be built for and around good friends, good meals and good times.

The winery was designed and built with a freestyle approach including three massive doors hewn from 100-year-old fermentation tanks.

At this year's festival, Léal Vineyards representatives will pour an Estate Chardonnay, a Sauvignon Blanc, an Estate Syrah and an Estate Carnaval. ❀

Family-owned and -operated Page Mill Winery began 28 years ago on Page Mill Road in Los Altos Hills, just a few miles from downtown Los Altos. The winery recently moved to Livermore.

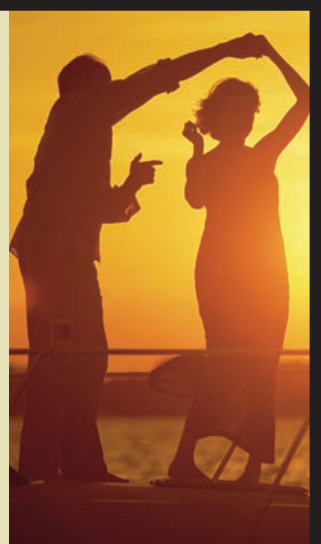

than 400 each year, from Fortune 500 executives to local grandmas and grandpas – give the event a friendly community flavor that appeals to those who attend.

Festival organizers strive to personalize the event, treating it as a celebration for friends and giving it a family orientation that reflects the makeup of the area. The event's Linden Tree Books Kids Stage, begun in the early 1990s, has been expanded into a popular KidZone, a separate venue featuring entertainment exclusively for children.

Since 1990, the festival has included a tempting array of international foods and a full two-day program of musicians and entertainers to suit every taste.

Staying sensitive to community makeup and concerns, festival organizers have added a bike valet and shuttles to manage parking and provide easier access.

Since 1980, the Los Altos Village Association has produced and managed the festival with the goal of providing a first-class program for a first-class community. The festival enjoys support from many local businesses. The first Los Altos Arts and Wine Festival was held in downtown Los Altos' South Parking Plaza July 19 and 20, 1980, with approximately 150 exhibitors and 30,000 in attendance. By 1983, Main and State streets were closed to accommodate the weekend event and by 1985, the number of festival exhibitors had doubled. In 1993, attendance topped 100,000 and since 1997 the festival has attracted more than 150,000 people annually to

LAVA is the only downtown association that stages a festival without a professional production staff, and the only association whose membership is entirely voluntary. 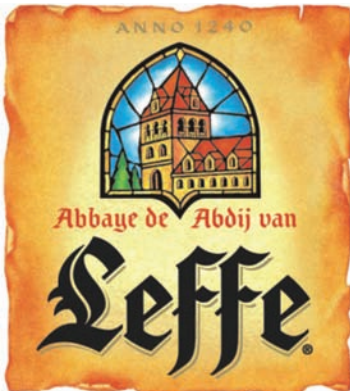

# From Ohlones to high-techies

## Town Crier Report

**N**ative Indians who are referred to as the Ohlones – meaning “people of the west” – settled in what is now Los Altos thousands of years before the arrival of the Europeans.

In the 1800s, most of the acreage that is now Los Altos and Los Altos Hills was included in two Mexican land grants: Rancho la Purissima Concepcion and Rancho San Antonio.

The grazing lands of the large ranchos gradually were divided into smaller holdings of 40-100 acres with the planting of wheat and vineyards.

In the late 1800s, Sarah Winchester, widow of the inventor of the Winchester rifle, owned the 100 acres that later became the town site of Los Altos. The Peninsula Interurban Railway purchased her land in 1906.

One year later, the Southern Pacific Railroad bought the land for a right of way for its commuter trains to run

from San Francisco through the west valley and to connect to a branch line from San Jose to Santa Cruz.

Paul Shoup, who later became Southern Pacific president and is known as the “father of Los Altos,” helped

create the town when he and others formed the Altos Land Company. In 1908, the company hosted a free barbecue to entice San Franciscans to ride the train down to the country and purchase lots (starting at \$250) in the downtown triangle.

The Shoup family built several summer homes along University Avenue that remain there today.

In January 2000, the Los Altos Town Crier newspaper selected Paul Shoup as its "Los Altan of the Century."

The town developed rather slowly, with hitching posts down Main Street, the first school class held above the grocery store and the post office located in the hardware store.

The wheat fields and vineyards soon gave way to vast orchards of apricot, cherry, walnut and plum trees.

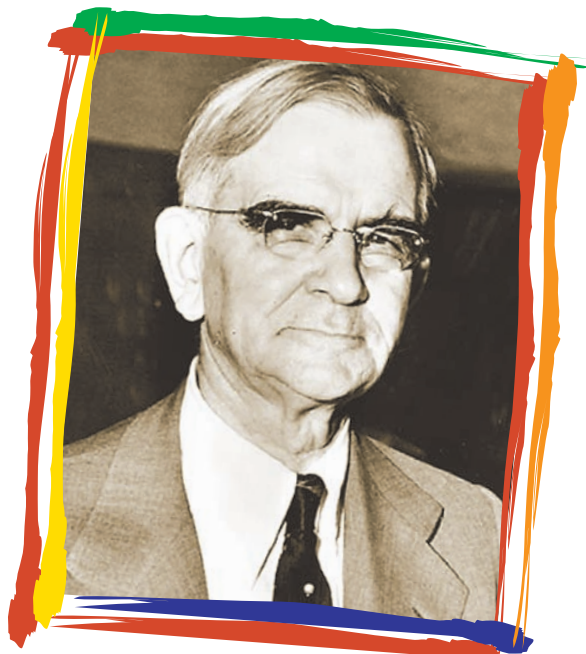
With the mild climate, the train for transportation and the number of businesses starting to increase, families began locating here in larger numbers.

Los Altans voted to incorporate in 1952 due to fear of intense development and the possible annexation of some lands by surrounding communities.

Shortly thereafter, in 1956, voters in Los Altos Hills approved their own incorporation to protect their 1-acre zoning.

Today, Los Altos and Los Altos Hills serve as home-towns for many of the high-tech executives working in Silicon Valley.

The elements that blend to make these communities so desirable include the award-winning schools, small-town atmosphere, climate, volunteerism, community spirit and

**Heritage Oaks Park**

parking is off Fremont Avenue, next to the tennis courts.

### Montclair Park

Montclair is in the southern part of Los Altos, on St. Joseph's Avenue, adjacent to Montclair School. The city's smallest park has two lighted tennis courts, picnic tables, barbecue pits and a preschool play area. The adjacent school property (part of the Cupertino Union School District) has a large grass area for softball or soccer and a fitness trail.

### McKenzie Park

McKenzie is located at 707 Fremont Ave., near Rancho Shopping Center. The park offers two lighted tennis courts, children's play areas, picnic tables, barbecue pits and a large grass area.

### Redwood Grove

Redwood Grove is at 482 University Ave., though it's not easy to see from the street (watch for the driveway). A 6-acre nature preserve, the park includes a boardwalk and trail that follows Adobe Creek and winds among the redwood trees. It includes a hillside trail, observation decks, picnic tables, rose and herb gardens and a building that houses a summer nature day camp and the Fava Indian Artifact Collection. Community open houses are held periodically.

### Shoup Park

Shoup Park is named after Paul Shoup, called the

"father of Los Altos." The park is at 400 University Ave. Adobe Creek forms the back boundary for Shoup Park, which includes picnic tables, barbecue pits, turf areas, playground, parking and restrooms. The park is the home of the Garden House, a facility available for rent through the Los Altos Recreation Department.

### Village Park

This small park, just under an acre, is at the corner of Edith Avenue and San Antonio Road. It offers paths, benches and the "Olympic Wannabes" sculpture. Limited parking is available off Edith.
