I. CONSENT AGENDA

It is ordered to approve the Consent Agenda for July 13, 2026, McCracken County Fiscal Court.

II. BUDGET TRANSFERS

It is ordered that the necessary cash transfers, in the amount of \$_____ be made in order to pay County bills and payroll approved July 13, 2026.

III. ACCOUNTS PAYABLE

It is ordered to approve the Voucher Claims Register from June 22, 2026, to July 13, 2026, to show County bills in the amount of \$_____ were paid.

IV. BOARD APPOINTMENT

A. It is ordered that Rod Martin is reappointed to the Lone Oak Fire Board for a term ending June 30, 2029.

- B. It is ordered that Jeremi Bumpus is appointed to the PADD Board of Directors as a joint appointment with the city for a term ending June 30, 2029.

- A. It is ordered that the Judge Executive is authorized to sign a lease for additional office space with MAD Properties, LLC. It is further ordered that the Treasurer is authorized to pay invoices related to the same.

VI. COURT ORDERS

- A. It is hereby ordered that the Memorandum of Understanding regarding insurance and Waiver of Subrogation, as shown on the attached document, be approved. In summary, the order agrees that the McCracken County Convention Center Corporation will continue to provide insurance covering the existing buildings, the project, and all improvements. It is further ordered that the Judge Executive is authorized to sign all documents necessary to effectuate the Memorandum of Understanding.
- B. It is ordered to pay the invoice dated June 12, 2026, to BFW for the Sports Complex Project, in the amount of \$11,532.29. This is pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement dated September 7, 2022, between the City of Paducah, Kentucky, the County of McCracken County, Kentucky, and the Sports Tourism Commission. As per the Interlocal Agreement, the City of Paducah pays half of the invoice to McCracken County.
- C. It is ordered to pay the invoice dated June 24, 2026, to Medo Supply Company for the Sports Complex Project, in the amount of \$7,918.50. This is pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement dated September 7, 2022, between the City of Paducah, Kentucky, the County of McCracken County, Kentucky, and the Sports Tourism Commission. As per the Interlocal Agreement, the City of Paducah pays half of the invoice to McCracken County.
- D. It is ordered to pay the invoice dated June 23, 2026, to Empire Netting & Fencing for the Sports Complex Project, in the amount of \$10,110.00. This is

pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement dated September 7, 2022, between the City of Paducah, Kentucky, the County of McCracken County, Kentucky, and the Sports Tourism Commission. As per the Interlocal Agreement, the City of Paducah pays half of the invoice to McCracken County.

E. It is ordered to pay the invoices dated June 25, 2026, to United Electrical for the Sports Complex Project, in the amount of \$18,163.00. This is pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement dated September 7, 2022, between the City of Paducah, Kentucky, the County of McCracken County, Kentucky, and the Sports Tourism Commission. As per the Interlocal Agreement, the City of Paducah pays half of the invoice to McCracken County.

F. It is ordered to pay the invoices dated June 5, 2026, to Uline for the Sports Complex Project, in the amount of \$2,823.80. This is pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement dated September 7, 2022, between the City of Paducah, Kentucky, the County of McCracken County, Kentucky, and the Sports Tourism Commission. As per the Interlocal Agreement, the City of Paducah pays half of the invoice to McCracken County.

G. It is ordered to pay the invoices dated June 23, 2026, to Petter Business Systems for the Sports Complex Project, in the amount of \$26,710.55. This is pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement dated September 7, 2022, between the City of Paducah, Kentucky, the County of McCracken County, Kentucky, and the Sports Tourism Commission. As per the Interlocal Agreement, the City of Paducah pays half of the invoice to McCracken County.

H. It is ordered that the Treasurer is authorized to pay Elan Financial Services (Visa) in the amount of \$2,290.00 for Challenge Coins. The cost is from the federal drug forfeiture fund.

I. It is ordered that \$228,255.83 from the Transient Room Tax escrow fund be transferred to the City of Paducah for bond payment on the Convention Center Series 2017.

ORDINANCE NO. 2026-11

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING IN ITS ENTIRETY MCCRACKEN COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 2024-05, SETTING FORTH THE PREVIOUS FORM OF THE MCCRACKEN COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE CODE, AND ENACTING A REPLACEMENT ADMINISTRATIVE CODE CONTAINING ALL AMENDMENTS ENACTED SUBSEQUENT TO THE INITIAL PASSAGE OF MCCRACKEN COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 2024-05.

Summary: The present action is mandated by KRS 67.710 and KRS 68.005 and operates to repeal in its entirety the current McCracken County Administrative Code as previously enacted by Ordinance 2024-05 and containing the amendments enacted subsequently to its initial passage. The present action allows the full incorporation of all such subsequent amendments into a single self-contained code for ease of administration and more effective and efficient notice of and compliance with its provisions
