AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE INSURANCE
PREMIUM TAX ORDINANCE, ORDINANCE NO. 2020-01
AND 2026-01, BY REDUCING THE TAX AMOUNTS OF THE
INSURANCE CATEGORIES

Summary: The action taken in the present Ordinance is authorized by KRS 91A.080 and operates to amend the Insurance Premium Tax Ordinance, McCracken County Ordinance 2020-01 and 2026-01. This Ordinance reduces the tax on premiums received by insurance companies for all insurance categories from the current rates to four point

forty-five (4.45) percent, with an effective date of July 1, 2027. The reduction of this tax is a result of McCracken County now being in a sound financial position and the Fiscal Court's determination to take measured action to reduce the tax burden on McCracken County residents and businesses, whenever practical and always in accord with principles of sound fiscal management.

Summary: The present action is mandated by KRS 67.710 and KRS 68.005 and operates to repeal in its entirety the current McCracken County Administrative Code as previously enacted by Ordinance 2024-05 and containing the amendments enacted subsequently to its initial passage. The present action allows the full incorporation of all such subsequent amendments into a single self-contained code for ease of administration and more effective and efficient notice of and compliance with its provisions

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MCCRACKEN COUNTY OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE TAX, ORDINANCE NO 2007-16, AS AMENDED, BY REVISING THE FILING REQUIREMENTS, PERMITTING CERTAIN REDACTIONS OF FILINGS, DETAILING THE COUNTY'S AUDIT PROCESS, AND REQUIRING FISCAL COURT APPROVAL OF RULES AND REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO THE OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE TAX PRIOR TO THEIR IMPLEMENTATION AND USE.

Summary: the actions effectuated in the present Ordinance operate to amend McCracken County Ordinance No. 2007-16, as amended, by revising the filing requirements of sole proprietorships and other similarly situated business entities. Further, by permitting certain redactions of business entity's and owner's forms and schedules. Additionally, by detailing the audit process to be used by the County. Lastly, by requiring rules and regulations proposed pursuant to the Occupational License Tax be adopted by the Fiscal Court prior to their implementation and use.
