


TIME:

The election officials will be at the polls at 6:00am Tuesday, November 4, 2025 • Voting will begin promptly at 6:30am and end promptly at 7:30pm

VOTING:

All ballots will be opened 6:00am Tuesday - and then only in the presence of all the election officials. The election officials have been instructed to allow any and all voters present

to examine the ballot boxes before they are locked at 6:30am. Vote promptly and leave the voting room immediately after you have cast your ballot. No one is permitted in the polling place except election officials and those in the act of voting. Challengers may step into the polling room to challenge, but after doing so, they must retire immediately. Any person who is allowed to vote after being challenged must write his name on the back of any of his ballots. If voter is physically unable to mark his or her ballot, he may ask for anyone's assistance in marking his ballot. All other voters may ask a near relative for assistance. Curbside voting will be allowed throughout regular voting hours.

Soliciting votes within 50 feet of the polls and offering to buy or sell votes are violations of the law.

Town of Old Fort voters will vote at the Old Fort Depot.

City of Marion voters will vote at the Marion Community Building with the exception of all city voters that reside in the West Marion precinct will vote at the McDowell Senior Center.
