Calling the surprised recipients of these honorary gifts up one-by-one before a gathering of friends and local well-wishers, Paulette Manemann, representing the Ripple River Quilt Guild, paid honor to each of the four veterans, saying, "On behalf of the Aitkin quilters, I would like to present each of you with a handmade quilt as a small token to let

you know how important you were and still are to us." Manemann continued, "Welcome home and thank you for your service.'

every member of the Aitkin guild had a hand in the construction of the quilts, including sewing the blocks, hand-stitching the lining as well as quilting and sewing on the labels and the fact that each of the quilts is unique. "We feel it (the quilt) is the best for the best." Manemann added. "We honor and respect you
