Dangerous Wind Chills

January 16, 2025 2:43 PM

At these values, frostbite could form in just 10 minutes on exposed skin!

- → Minimize Exposure Avoid exposure during the coldest wind chills.
- → Stay Dry Wet clothing causes body heat to be lost faster. Wear waterproof insulated boots.
- → Stay Covered Wear a hat and gloves! At least half your body heat is lost if your head is not covered.
- → Dress in Layers Trapped air between layers helps to insulate.

Wind Chill is the air temperature equivalent in calm wind which would result in heat loss equal to the temperature and wind together. Body heat loss can cause frostbite and/or hypothermia.




Snow Squall Potential Friday Afternoon

Details

- → A strong cold front will pass through the Northland on Friday
 - Northwest winds 15-20 mph, gusting to 30-35 mph
 - Temperatures around freezing will rapidly fall into the teens and low 20s by early Friday evening
 - A band of snow may accompany the cold front as it passes through
 - Brief snow squalls capable of reducing visibility to ¼ mile (30% chance regionwide)

How Do I Read This?

The graphic above shows reasonable onset timining of snow squall potential on Friday, January 17, 2025. Timing may be +/-1 hour from depicted times.

WHAT ARE THEY?

Quick intense bursts of snow Accompanied by strong gusty winds Short-lived, typically less than 3 hours Normally occur during the day

WHAT ARE THE IMPACTS?

Rapidly reduced visibility
Treacherous travel conditions
Potential for chain-reaction accidents



WHAT'S A SNOW SQUALL WARNING?

Warning is usually 30-60 minutes in length
Issued for small areas where snow
squalls are expected
Similar to a Tornado or Severe
Thunderstorm Warning

HOW CAN YOU STAY SAFE?

Have a way to get forecasts and warnings Consider an alternate route or delaying travel Stay alert for rapidly changing road conditions Reduce speed and use low beam headlights


