In 1914, W(illiam) C(hristopher) H(andy) (1-Across) published his “St. Louis Blues,” which was one of the first blues songs to succeed as a pop song, and which remains today a fundamental part of jazz musicians’ repertoire. “ALOHA OE” (19-Across), literally “farewell to you,” was written by Queen Lili’uokalani, who was then a princess of the Hawaiian Kingdom. In the 1988 Calgary Olympics MIDORI Ito (35-Across) became the first woman to land seven triple-jumps in Olympic free skating.
