The first manufacturer of the **BABY RUTH BAR** (22-Across) claimed that it was named for the daughter of Grover Cleveland; its debut in 1920 caused many to believe the name was chosen as an evocation of Babe Ruth. **SUGAR CREAM PIE** (32-Across) is the (unofficial) state pie of Indiana, where it was first made in the early 1800s. Erik **SATIE** (45-Across) was an inspiration to numerous composers, including Debussy and Ravel.
