“Alcatraz” (35-Across) is derived from the Spanish word for “pelicans,” which were seen on the island by Spanish explorers; the word is also a close relative of “albatross.” A seven-time nominee for the Nobel Prize in Literature, Karel CAPEK (65-Across) has lent his name to a Czech literary prize. Italian skier ALBERTO Tomba (10-Down) won a total of three slalom gold medals at the 1988 and 1992 Winter Olympics.
