

MLWR football season ends early

Coronavirus has forced Moose Lake Willow River's football season to end. All MLWR football coaches, players, and managers are required to quarantine until November 14. The game with Pine City, on November 5, has been cancelled and the game with Mora on November 12 will be cancelled.

The next game would be a playoff game on November 17. The coaches and players would only have one day to condition and practice. Because this would not be safe for the MLWR players, the coaching decision is to end the Rebel season at this point. The Rebels finished the 2020 football season with three wins and one loss and were ranked fifth in Section Class AA.

FINAL GAME

Moose Lake Willow River football team took on Aitkin for the Gobblers 2020 homecoming game at Veteran's Field on Friday, October 30. The

Aitkin Color Guard started the evening with a presentation of the Nation's Flag. The Concordia College (Moorhead, Minn.) Freshmen Quartet sang the National Anthem.

The Rebels had a total of 322 passing and rushing yards compared to Aitkin's 175. Both teams were charged with three penalties for 20 yards each. Rebels had 17 first downs to Aitkin's 10. But the Rebels' squad came out on the short end losing 36-20.

Logan Orvedahl led the offensive with 99 rushing yards and Jackson Thompson was right behind him with 83 yards. Defensively, Jackson Thompson took over with six tackles and six assists. Ethan Burton had four tackles and four assists. Landin Kurhajetz was right in there with three solos and two assists. Adam Olson and Myca Helfman were able to get to the Gobbler quarterback for two sacks. Brady Watrin was the main target of quarterback Mason Olson's

After four long months in the hospital for a bone marrow biopsy, chemotherapy, infusions and immunotherapy Paige was finally able to be surprised with her wish.

Her wish from Minnesota's Own, Wishes & More was to convert a storage container into her own personal space. The team at Wishes & More purchased, moved and converted the storage container into a personal private space just for Paige. Taking direct specifications from her application the team chose colors, designed a special patio door, installed a

solar panel, bunk beds and a wood stove. Paige's new space is located at the family cabin near Moose Lake.

Paige, prior to her diagnosis, was a very active person. She loves being outdoors and especially loves hiking, biking, swimming, boxing and skiing. Her favorite place for these activities is the family cabin at Moose Lake. Part of what helped her get through the months of treatment was focusing on designing her upcycled storage container and applying for colleges.

Wishes & More Volunteer President, Karla Blomberg states, "Paige's wish is so unique and fits her to a T. She loves the outdoors, she is very environmentally conscious and like many teens, she wants her own space! Wishes & More believes that every kid deserves to experience a dream come true and this is especially true for kids who have had their dreams disrupted, and even taken away, as a result of a terrible diagnosis. Paige is a fighter and an inspiration to so many and the Wishes & More Community has come together to support this amazing young lady. Including the parents of

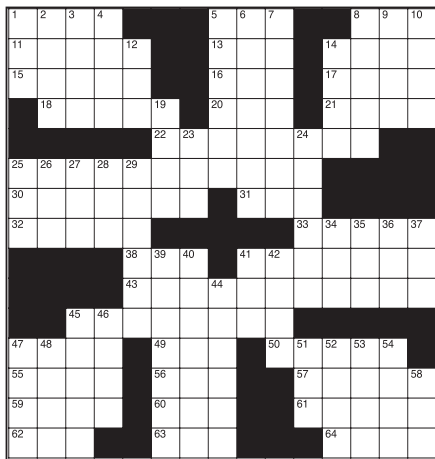

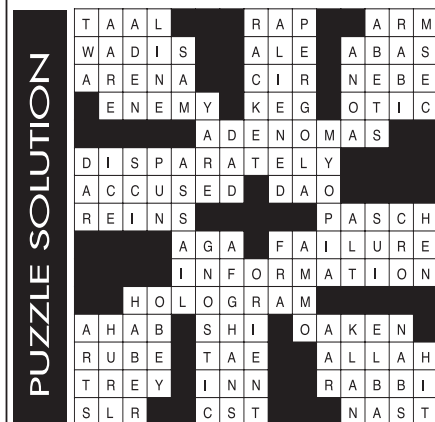

passes. The score saw-sawed back and forth between the Rebels and Gobblers.

To start the game, Craig Ashton kicked off to Thompson, who got it to the 32-yard line. Thompson carried it the next four times for another first down. Mason Olson ran a keeper and on third down was intercepted by Owen Miller. Aitkin had nine yards to go on fourth down and had to punt. Orvedahl ran 50 yards for the first score of the game. Carter Johnson was stopped on the two-point conversion. Sam Kenezivich kicked off to Aitkin's Owen Miller who went 85 yards for six. Two-point conversion failed and the first quarter ended tied 6-6.

Rebels had the ball to

start the second quarter. It was second down and seven yards to go on the ten-yard line and Thompson took the pigskin into the end zone for six more. Adam Olson ran it in for the two-point conversion. Rebels led 14 to 6. MLWR got the ball back after Aitkin was four and out, second down and four to go on the 36-yard line. Mason Olson threw an interception. Aitkin's quarterback, Caiden Kjelstrom, took it six-yards for the touchdown and Miller got in the end zone for two, to tie the score, 14-14. With only 14.1 seconds left until half-time, Kjelstrom threw a 16-yard touchdown pass to Joey Simonson. Two-point conversion failed. Aitkin led 20-14 at the end of the first half.

The third quarter

started with Rebels going four and out, and Mason Olson punting. Aitkin didn't move down the field so Rebels' ball. Rebels got a couple first downs. Rebels had second down and six to go on the 45-yard line, with 6:57 left in the third quarter. Adam Olson scampered 55-yards into the end zone for six more. The announcer stated that the game was all knotted up at 20-20. There was 2:47 left in the third quarter. Kjelstrom threw a 20-yard pass into the end zone for six. Aitkin took the lead 26-20. With a minute until the fourth quarter, Carter Johnson caught Mason Olson's pass.

In the fourth quarter, the Rebels got a couple first downs and then the ball was intercepted in the middle of the field.

Brodie Hoffman stopped Austin Price on the 26-yard line and Kurhajetz stopped Miller on the 25-yard line. Price got the ball to the 2-yard line and took it in for the touchdown. A pass to Simonson for the two-point conversion was good. There was only 1:49 left in the game when Rebels got the ball back. Olson passed a couple times to Kurhajetz and Watrin and then was sacked for a loss of 5. Aitkin won their homecoming game 36-20.

The Rebels are still first in Section 7AA QRF Standings but in the District NE (Blue) Conference standings: Mora is first (3-0), followed by Aitkin (2-1), MLWR (2-1), Esko (1-2), Pine City (1-2), and Crosby-Ironton (0-3).

I have several visible tattoos and have plans to get several more.

Every tattoo I have has personal meaning to me and represents something that I wanted to carry with me on my skin for the rest of my life. Each piece was chosen by me to represent someone special in my life. Now I know that tattoos are not for everyone, some folks even have religious beliefs that are strongly against them.

My first tattoo was one that I got with my mom and sister on the second anniversary of my grandma's death. Tattoos take a few weeks to heal and most tattoo artists recommend leaving them uncovered during the healing process. For folks that don't know healing tattoos don't

look very pretty for a few days because they scab up during the healing process. The goal is to never pick, pull or in any way force the scab to leave before it is healed. Removing too early also removes the color the tattoo artist put under the skin.

At the time I got this first tattoo and was going through the healing process, I was also working at a chain craft store. I had been warned before getting this tattoo that some folks would try to touch my tattoo.

I scoffed at this, until the day a customer I was helping at the register physically grabbed my wrist and pulled my tattooed arm and the rest of my body by proxy close for a look. If you ask anyone with a visible tattoo if they have a story similar to this I can almost guarantee that each of them does.

Some people will say that by choosing to get a piece of art permanently attached to my body that I and others who have made the same choice are asking for the attention. My response is that I did make a choice to make ink a physical part of me, but these parts of myself are still parts of my body and personal to me. Each of my tattoos are beautiful to me and I got them in part to share, but VISUALLY. Almost all the folks that I know, myself included, are more than happy to share the stories of our ink with anyone who asks. Asking though doesn't include touching automatically and not everyone is cool with physical contact.

A note for the curious, if a tattoo healed right those pretty colors feel just like the rest of the skin. Sometimes the lines around shapes can feel a bit raised. Don't be afraid to ask someone for a closer look at their art, most often you will have pleasantly surprised the person, get the whole story of the tattoo and a closer look at the tattoo.

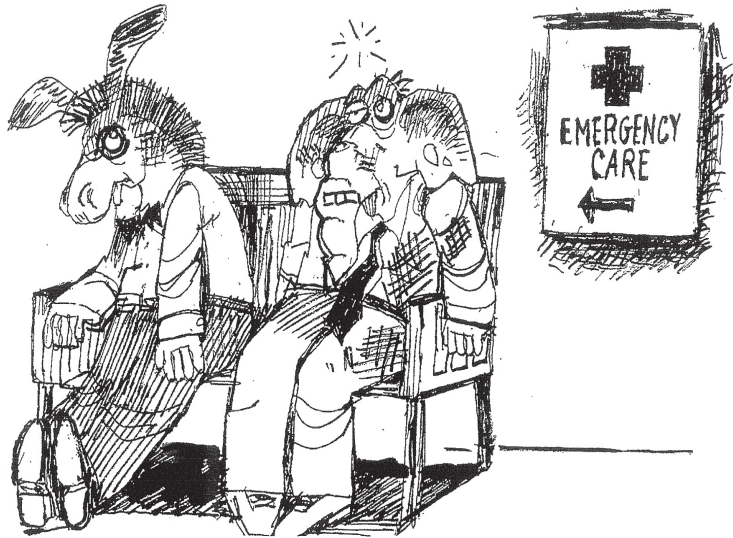

Transporting firearms during hunting season

Question-Can I transport a loaded rifle or shotgun in a vehicle if I have a permit to carry? What are the rules if I am actively hunting?

Answer-The permit to carry law applies only to handguns, so the answer is no with some exceptions.

Minnesota law says that a person may not transport a firearm in a motor vehicle unless the firearm is:
(1) unloaded and in a gun case ex-

pressly made to contain a firearm, and the case fully encloses the firearm by being zipped, snapped, buckled, tied, or otherwise fastened, and without any portion of the firearm exposed;
(2) unloaded and in the closed trunk of a motor vehicle; or
(3) a handgun carried in compliance with sections 62A.714 and 62A.715

Subd. 3. Exceptions; hunting and shooting ranges- a person may transport an unloaded, uncased firearm, excluding a pistol, in a motor vehicle while at a shooting range, lawfully hunting on private or public land; or travelling to or from a site the person intends to hunt lawfully that day or has hunted lawfully that day, unless:

- (1) within Anoka, Hennepin, or Ramsey County;
- (2) within the boundaries of a home rule charter or statutory city with a population of 2,500 or more;
- (3) on school grounds

United States Veteran gives ultimate gift to friend

Jerry Telker of Moose Lake, Minnesota never planned on enlisting in the United States Army. After graduating high school in 1960, Telker began working for a technical company called Control Data Corporation. It was shortly after he turned 18 that he was drafted. "I had no intention of ever joining the military," Telker admits, "but if Uncle Sam called me to duty I wasn't going to fight it. It was something I didn't think about. I just accepted it."

Telker was sent to Kentucky for basic training. "At the time, I wasn't too happy about it," he expressed, "but it was probably the best thing for me." Telker says basic training was his first exposure to people of other cultures and races after living in Minnesota his whole life. "By the time I got back to Moose Lake in the late 1960's I was used to the diversity that had spread to Minnesota."

Unlike many vets his age, Telker was not sent to Vietnam, rather he did his whole tour in Korea. "At the time, Korea was a hostile zone, but

fortunately I didn't have to see the atrocities that many of the men in Vietnam did."

Although Telker was released by the time he got back to Washington, he didn't bounce back into civilian life so easily. "I helped open up the first Holiday Gas Station in Moose Lake, but at the time, I didn't take too well to direction." Telker also confessed he struggled with alcoholism.

After seeking help from organizations like Alcoholics Anonymous, Telker was able to get his life back on track when he took a position at the Federal Correctional Institution in

Sandstone.

It has been 17 years now since he retired from his position in Sandstone, yet Telker stays busy with his lawn mowing business, is a member to the American Legion, and is on the Members Cooperative Credit Union Board.

It was when a close friend of his, who is also a member on the Members Cooperative Board, became severely ill that Telker got his bright idea. "My friend was dying and he needed a kidney," Telker explained. "I thought, well, I've got two. I could give one away." Telker kept the idea to himself while

he called to discuss the possibility with the University of Minnesota Medical Center.

Have you purchased or moved into a property in the past year?

Contact your county assessor to file a homestead application if you or a qualifying relative occupy the property as a homestead on or before December 1, 2020.

What is a qualifying relative?

For agricultural property, a qualifying relative includes the child, grandchild, sibling, or parent of the owner or owner's

spouse. For residential property a qualifying relative also includes the owner's uncle, aunt, nephew, or niece.

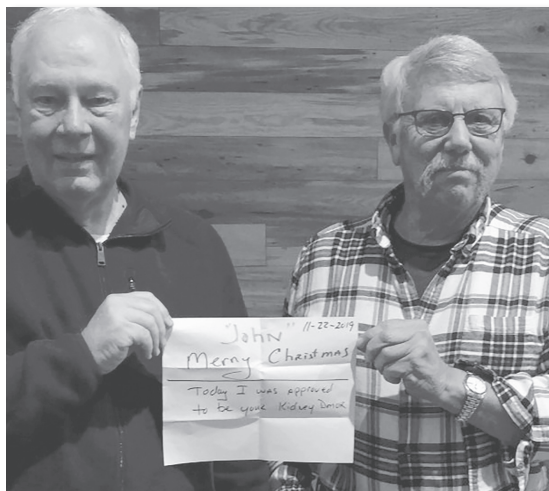

PHASE will no longer run Pine County recycling

Pine Habilitation and Supported Employment (PHASE) has offered its recycling program to Pine County residents and businesses for the past 12 years. Unfortunately, this will be the last year of that program.

Since 2009, this program has supported over 300 people with disabilities in vocational training placement, employment supports and has created dozens of jobs for support staff. According to Tim Schmutzer,

Executive Director, it is a highly regarded and in demand program.

However, due to regulatory changes made by the Minnesota Department of Human Services (MDHS), PHASE's funder and licensor, they have made the difficult decision to end the recycling program. MDHS began initiatives several years ago to move funding away from facility-based employment services towards supports that result in competitive integrated employment. What this means is PHASE cannot be both

the employer of record and the support provider on a long-term basis for new service recipients. PHASE Recycling fits this model that is no longer going to be funded by MDHS. Schmutzer said they tried to find a work-around, but the initiatives are narrowly written. It was after this PHASE decided not to seek a contract renewal with Pine County.

As far as the building, Cheryl Gullickson, Director of Operations, said the goal is to repurpose the building and program in order to offer

more opportunities to PHASE service recipients and staff. While the recycling side of services is going away, PHASE will continue to offer support to service recipients in Sandstone and throughout East-Central Minnesota. A person-centered, individualized approach to each service recipient remains the priority of the organization, and new programs and opportunities will reflect this. They have put a task force together to gather input from employees and service recipients focused on

developing more community-integrated supports and transferrable skill development services.

Both Schmutzer and Gullickson commented on how incredible it has been to work with the residents of Pine County as well as the Pine County Board of Commissioners. "I can't say enough about this community and the whole county and their support. A huge thank you to the residents that do support us...and the programs that we have. It has just been incredible to see that support. The

County has a vendor and plan in place to ensure the continuation of residential recycling," said Gullickson.

They noted that over the past 12 years, Pine County residents have tripled their recycling efforts. Since January of 2009, PHASE Recycling has processed over 14,000 tons of recyclables. PHASE Recycling will continue to take recyclables at their Sandstone location until December 31, 2020, and service business customers shortly into 2021. PHASE will continue serving the community to promote the inclusion and success of community members experiencing a disability.
