DISTRICT 1 (most of urban Salinas):

DISTRICT 5 (Monterey, Pacific Grove, the Highway 68 corridor, Carmel Valley, stretching south along the coast through Big Sur):

CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT 20 (includes all of Monterey and San Benito counties, parts of Santa Cruz and Santa Clara counties):
