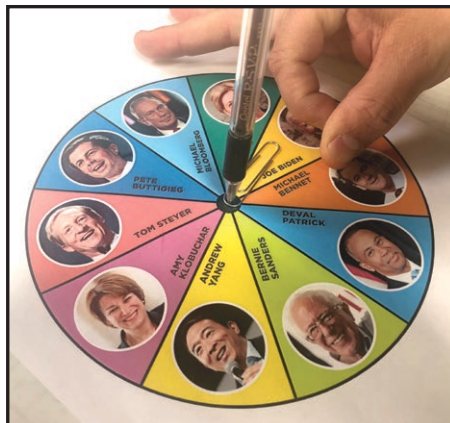


ELECTION SPINNY WHEEL

Create a spin toy and have some fun selecting a candidate.

Feeling confused? You're not alone. It's an unprecedented moment in American democratic life, and the Democratic field—that's with a capital D—is also unprecedented. Despite its diversity, its breadth, its well of knowledge and experience, the field lacks a clear front-runner. If you're a registered Democrat, or requested a Democratic presidential ballot last year, you will see 20 candidates for president on your California primary ballot. Some of them, like Cory Booker and Julián Castro, suspended their campaigns, but too late to be removed from the ballot. While our editorial board has selected our top three picks (see story, left), we also think any of the 10 active candidates represented on this board are worth considering—and would be far superior than the current occupant of the White House. Make it fun, introduce the element of chance, and if you are still undecided, use this spinner to choose who to vote for. The last day to register to vote in the primary is Feb. 18. Join the party—that's with a lowercase P—democracy is depending on you.



HOW TO SPIN FOR YOUR CANDIDATE

Items needed: Pen and paper clip

1. Position paper clip on black dot in the center of the wheel. This will be your spinner.
2. Place tip of pen inside paper clip on black dot and hold upright to anchor spinner.
3. Hold pen still and flick paper clip with thumb and forefinger.
4. Paper clip-spinner lands on your candidate!*
