ORDINANCE NO. 5-82

AN ORDINANCE TO REAPPORTION HORRY COUNTY COUNCIL DISTRICTS  
IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE 1980 UNITED STATES CENSUS.

WHEREAS it is necessary for the election districts from  
which members of Council are elected to be reapportioned in  
accordance with the official 1980 United States Census; and

WHEREAS the South Carolina General Assembly by Act No.  
248 of the Statutes at Large of 1981 has reapportioned Horry County  
for that purpose; and

WHEREAS it is the intention of the Horry County Council  
to adopt, ratify or otherwise endorse Act No. 248, also known as  
"Plan F Modified", now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Council of Horry County in  
Council duly assembled:

That Act No. 248 of the Statutes at Large of 1981 of the  
State of South Carolina, a copy of which is attached hereto, is  
hereby adopted, ratified or otherwise endorsed as being the official  
plan of the Horry County Council with regards to reapportionment  
of election districts from which members of the said Council are  
elected.

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon  
its adoption.

(1) The election required by Article 1, Chapter 71 of Title 59 of the 1976 Code as a condition precedent to the issuance of bonds results favorably thereto;

(2) The bonds are issued within five years following the holding of the election;

(3) The county board wherein such operating school unit is located, if there is such, shall give its approval to the issuance of such bonds.

(B) Such general obligation bonds of operating school units in Hampton County shall mature in such annual series or installments as the authorities shall provide, except that:

(1) The first maturing bonds shall mature within three years from the date as of which they may be issued;

(2) Not less than three per cent of the aggregate of the issue shall mature in any year;

(3) No bond shall mature later than thirty years from the date as of which it may be issued.

The provisions of this subsection (B) shall not prevent the authorities from issuing the aggregate of the bonds authorized by the election held pursuant to Article 1, Chapter 71 of Title 59 of the 1976 Code on one or more occasions as two or more issues.

**Other provisions to remain applicable**

SECTION 3. All other provisions of law, including the provisions of Chapter 71 of Title 59 of the 1976 Code, relating to the issuance of general obligation school bonds shall apply to the issuance of such bonds in Hampton County except as may be otherwise provided by this act.

**Time effective**

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon approval by the Governor.

**A Joint Resolution To Designate A Road In Lancaster County As "W. Bruce Williams Memorial Highway".**

Whereas, the late W. Bruce Williams was a successful businessman and public servant who made many lasting and significant contributions to the improvement and welfare of Lancaster County and the State of South Carolina; and

Whereas, the late Senator Williams, a native and lifelong resident of Heath Springs, had a long and distinguished career in public service which began in 1934 as a member of the Town Council of Heath Springs and continued on the local level with service on the Board of Commissioners of Lancaster County and Board of Trustees of Heath Springs schools; and

Whereas, Bruce Williams was a member of the House of Representatives, serving Lancaster County in the years 1941 and 1942 and his political career culminated by his election to and service in the Senate of South Carolina during the years 1947 through 1962; and
