# **Recommendation to apply for Cattail Crossing Liquor License**

# Recommendation to enter into an agreement with the Watertown School District for use of the stadium.

The City would enter into an agreement with the Watertown School District for use of the stadium. The Parks & Recreation Department would use it for the fall football program with primary use being the Watertown Baseball Association program activities. The maintenance of the Stadium would be taken over by the Parks & Recreation Department for a period of 3 years. This timeframe would allow the Watertown Baseball Association and the City to develop a long-term future plan for baseball field needs.

Motion by Terronez, seconded by Leitheiser, Motion to enter into an agreement with the Watertown School District for use of the stadium. Motion Carried.

Recommendation to enter into an agreement with the Watertown Baseball Association for the use of the Stadium

The City would enter into a parallel agreement with the Watertown Baseball Association for a period of 3 years. An annual fee of \$11,000 would be the responsibility of the WBA to the City of Watertown. Watertown Baseball Association would be responsible for pitching mound, moving fences and their sound system, whereas the Parks & Recreation Department would be responsible for the cost of the utilities, garbage, mowing and turf management for this site. This agreement would allow for continued use of the Stadium.

Motion by Terronez, seconded by Keyes, Motion to enter into an agreement with the Watertown Baseball Association for the use of the stadium. Motion Carried.

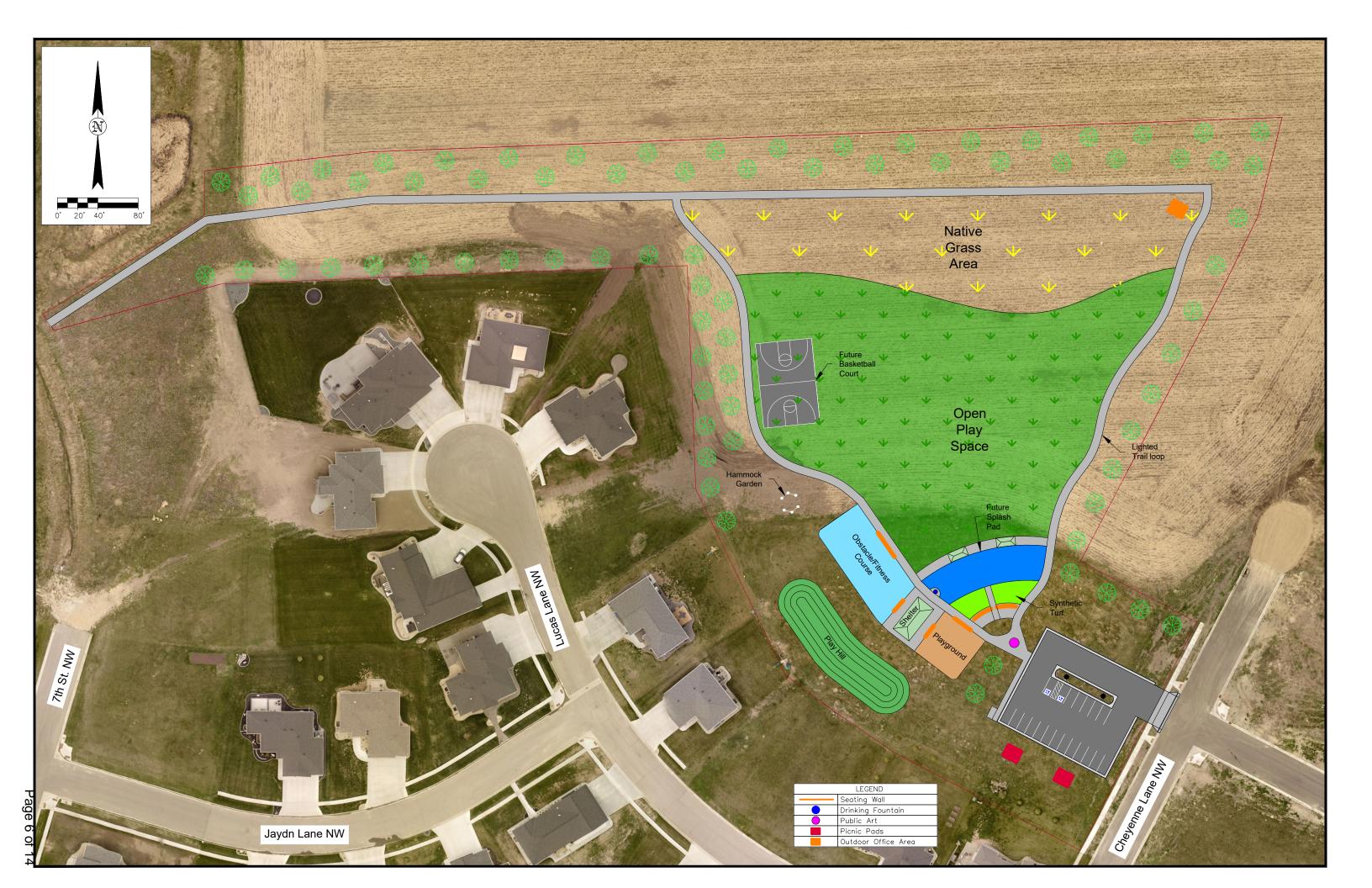

# **Parks**

- Service and maintenance on all equipment is still in the works.
- Seasonal staffing needs are being addressed with letters sent out to returning staff.
- CIP equipment purchasing is ongoing.
- Walk-in interviews are scheduled for the coming weeks with the hopes of attracting candidates for seasonal work.
- Flooding of the outdoor rinks continues.
- Staff that needed to recertify their Commercial Applicator license have been completed.
- Outsourcing letters for mowing have been sent out. We will review submitted quotes to decide which contractors to use for the season.
- Fieldhouse turf was removed and put back in after the Watertown Winter Farm Show.

# **Forestry**

- Tree removals continue with hazardous/dangerous trees being removed when possible.
- Ash trees continue to be removed when staff has an opportunity.
- Forestry staff have been trimming trees when possible, as well, with the help of the Street Division.
- Forestry Technician position is open with Jamie Maag transferring to Cattail Crossing as their new mechanic.

# PLWC Parks and Rec Committee Report - January 2025

January was another membership record with 4,027 memberships recorded. PLWC 2025 Winter/Spring Swim Lesson registration started at the end of December and we currently have 175 kids registered with 18 classes full and 11 classes that are still open. In the Sports Zone, PLWC Open Volleyball League, WPR Youth Basketball, WPR Co-Ed Volleyball League, and WPR City League Adult Basketball started in January. Rentals included LATC Basketball Intramural League, Elite Volleyball practice, Watertown School District Basketball team practice. Rental events included the Heiser Basketball Tournament (Jan. 4), the Watertown Swim Club Swim Meet (Jan. 11 & 12), and Watertown Christian School Basketball Tournament (Jan. 25). The Watertown Swim Club continues to practice at the PLWC Indoor Pool and birthday party rentals were booked in the PLWC Party Room.

A quick introduction / bio as a new employee. I began my role as the Prairie Lakes Ice Arena Superintendent on November 1<sup>st</sup>. I was born and raised in Tracy, MN. Served four years in the Air Force with duty stations in the United Kingdom and Washington State. Returned to MN and received a B.S. in Recreation Management from Mankato State University. I also met my wife Marilyn while at Mankato and we have been married 33 years. Following graduation, we served a two-year stint in the Peace Corps, living in the small rural community named El Papayo in the Dominican Republic. For the past 22 years I worked in the YMCA movement. 10 years in Willmar, MN with a focus on programming, membership, and marketing. The last 12 years as the CEO of the Marshall Area YMCA. We have two grown daughters. Grace is a Speech Language Pathologist for LifeScape in Sioux Falls. Laura is working on her Doctorate in Occupational Therapy at St. Catherine's in St. Paul.

A year-to-year comparison report for September 1 - January 31 shows a 52% increase in ice time within our major stakeholder groups. 2023 / 24 saw at total of 1,045 hours of ice time between WHA and WFSC. 55% WHA and 35% WFSC. 2024/25 expanded to 1,588 hours between WHA, WFSC, and the Shamrocks. 41% WHA, 32% Shamrocks, and 27% WFSC. This does not include curling, facility rentals, open skate sessions, adult hockey, birthday parties, etc.

We have recently completed the Lakers home tournament schedule. WFSC continues to practice for their competitions and Spring Show in early May. The Curling League is finishing league play with 4 teams. Their goal is to expand their participation and ice time in the coming year. The Shamrocks have completed 23 home games. 8 home games remain through April 11<sup>th</sup>

The inaugural stakeholder meeting was held in February with goals of establishing relationships, building trust, aligning our goals and objectives, creating our leadership and decision-making processes, identifying and working through our key concerns, etc. Immediate priorities include the completion of new user agreements, identifying summer ice maintenance windows, and bringing everyone to the table to set the 2025 / 26 master ice schedule.

Matt, Jeff, and I attended the 11-month warranty meeting with RJM construction. We toured the facility and documented all outstanding facility concerns. Most were addressed by sub-contractors within days. Other projects are still underway but protected by documenting during the warranty period.

- March 13 to 15 we host the Boy's State Tournament.
- April 12 Great Plains High School After-Prom Party.

- July Shamrocks 2025 / 26 Try Outs
- September Tentative pre-season tournament hosted by 1820 Athletics from Aberdeen.
