

1. ***POSTHUMOUS* Larry Walter:** Larry's sister, Marlys Joanne Walter, is accepting the pin on his behalf.
  - a. Larry served in the US Army; 1961-1964. Worked with Minuteman Missiles at Fort DeRussy. Larry passed away in December of 2019.
2. **Gregory Overby:** US Army; 1966 – 1967. Served as Sgt E5 Machine Gunner in 4<sup>th</sup> infantry with 173<sup>rd</sup> Airborne Division
3. **Glen Folk:** US Army from 1968-1970. Worked in Communications. Was stationed in Korea. Nominated by neighbor Corin McCollick.
4. **James McNamara:** US Navy; 1967 – 1968; Rank E4 Communications/Security in Vietnam. Nominated by daughter Tamy Lantgen
5. ***POSTHUMOUS* William Snittjer;** Will's wife, Maze, is accepting the pin on his behalf.
  - a. Served in the US Navy from 1956-1976 (then retired). He was stationed in a field hospital north of Denang (w/the Marines). Died 26 years ago at the age of 58 (determined cause of death was due to agent Orange Exposure)
6. **Robert Grover:** US Air Force; 1972-1973. Worked in Germany as a cook. Nominated by wife, Nita.
7. **Richard Boettcher:** US Air Force; 1969-1973. Served as 462 Weapons Specialist in charge of loading bombs on the aircraft

8. **Paul Tobin:** US Navy; 1965-1969. Served as Navy Hospital Corpsman 3<sup>rd</sup> Marine Division in Okinawa Japan then transferred to Vietnam
9. **James Keith:** US Navy; 1965 – 1969. Gunners mate 2<sup>nd</sup> class in Vietnam
10. **Paul Marquardt:** US Navy; 1967-1973; CA, WA, RI, and Cuba; served as 1st class petty officer – electrician mate. After basic training and schools, served aboard USS Detroit – newly commissioned ship to serve in the 6th fleet. Final duty station was Guantanamo Bay serving as an electrician to service the stations' fleets of tug boats
11. **POSTHUMOUS Marcella Draper Nipps:** Marcella's sister, Gerry, is accepting pin on *her* behalf.
  - a. US Army from 1967-1997. 29 years of service including in America, Germany, and Vietnam. Recognized at Women's Military Memorial in DC. Retired Colonel and graduate of Mt Marty School of Nursing. Highly decorated for her years of service including ER work in Vietnam...*(Also listed: Heidelberg, Walter Reed Chief Medical nurse, Chief Med Nurse at Brook Army Hospital, Chief Nurse at Fort Huachuca, AZ, Deputy Commander of Hospital Services at Fort Leonard Wood, MO)*
12. **Alvin Wentzell, Jr. -** US Army; 1966-1969. Served in Vietnam. Rank E5 munitions (ammunition specialist) and EOD (Explosive Ordnance Disposal)
13. **Doug Modica:** US Navy; 1970-1973. Served on USS Benjamin Stoddert (Destroyer ship) as a firing control technician and was assigned to man the anti-missile launcher. Doug reported three major incidences: 1. bow of ship was hit by a North Vietnamese missile (thankfully no casualties); 2. A Russian missile *barely missed* their ship; 3. a gun mount exploded on ship – killing three US sailors.

14. **Dale Christensen:** US Air Force; 1964-1967; Served in Okinawa
15. **POSTHUMOUS James Thronson:** James' brother Jeff will be accepting pin on his behalf
  - a. US Army; 1965-1967. Served in 4th Infantry Division as a rifleman. Passed away in 1985 from Agent Orange related cancer
16. **Jay Trepanier:** US Navy; 1966-1993; Naval Aviation, Flight Engineer, Command Master Chief
17. **John Heisler:** US Army; 1969 – 1971. Served in San Antonio, TX and Vietnam (Quang Tri and Khe Shan). Spec 5 - served as a Medic. Flew dust off mission during operation Lam Son 719
18. **Leroy Warborg:** US Army; 1966-1967. Served as helicopter gunner. Nominated by wife Marjorie
19. **Larry Isaacson:** US Army; 1967-1968. Served in Vietnam. Worked in electrical initially, but later transferred to another outfit where he worked primarily in communications for the last six months in Vietnam. Nominated by sister, Wanda Olson.

**Michael Smeins:** US Navy; 1971-1975; VA-25 USS Ranger; 3<sup>rd</sup> class Petty officer; Plane captain training and Safety Petty Officer; also served at Naval Air Station Lemoore (in CA)
