Subject: Prairie Lakes Ice Arena Recognized as the Small Cities/Rural Communities Project of the Year, Structure for 2025 by the American Public Works Association

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The American Public Works Association is a non-for-profit 501(c)3 organization with over 32,000 members globally working to advance the quality of life for all. City of Watertown has been a member as a public agency since 2022. In 1996 the APWA started the Project of the Year program, and this is the first time a South Dakota project has been awarded such an honor, the Prairie Lakes Ice Arena.

Hundreds of submissions are submitted annually and both the Public Works and Parks, Recreation and Forestry Departments are proud to say that Watertown's exceptional facility has earned such an exclusive title. The APWA Public Works Project of the Year Award for Small Cities/Rural Communities category must have a population of 50,000 or less. The project must promote excellence, demonstrate creativity, ingenuity, and efficiency in the delivery of public works projects as well as have a profound impact on the community. Projects must be developed, owned, and maintained by a public agency to be eligible for a nomination. Criteria that projects are judged on include construction process, environmental preservation, creativity of municipal resources, use of alternative materials and ability to meet a perceived community need.

As a winning project the City of Watertown will send a designated representative of the public agency, contractor, and consultant are all presented a plaque at the Awards Recognition Ceremony in August during PWX which is in Chicago this year. Projects will also be featured in APWA publications and on the APWA website as well.

The Prairie Lakes Ice Arena was a long-awaited dream that grew from a \$10 million project to an over \$36 million project in no time. Thanks to the incredible generosity of the community this dream was made possible. With the construction of the PLIA Watertown gained a second sheet of ice, ice year-round, and efficiencies in scheduling ice time even allowing of a new user group to start (curling). It is the largest completed public works project Watertown has seen.

To quote the Head Coach of the Watertown Shamrocks, " The PLIA has become a hub of social activity" and Visit Watertown Executive Director, Anjelica Uthe, "The PLIA is already proving to be a game-changer for our community. It stands as a testament to the pride our community has in investing in quality spaces that enhance our way of life... The economic impact will be substantial, fueling growth and further positioning Watertown as a premier destination for ice sports."

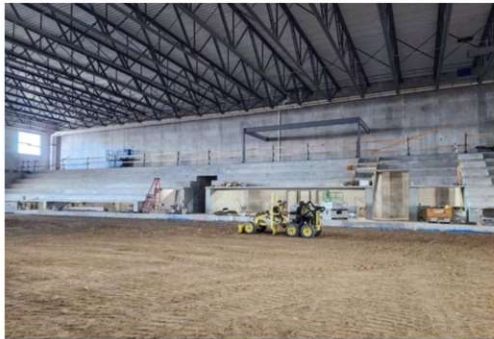

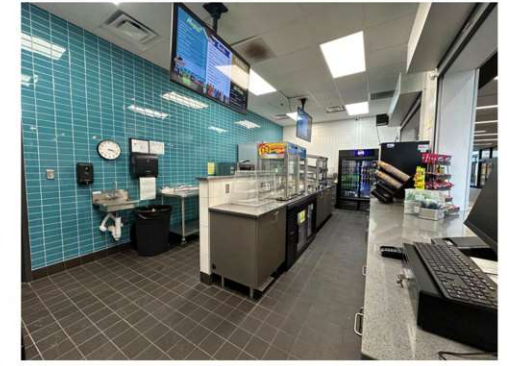

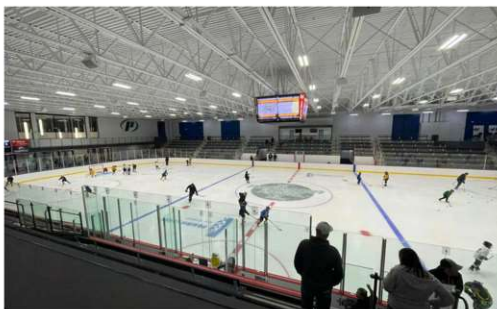

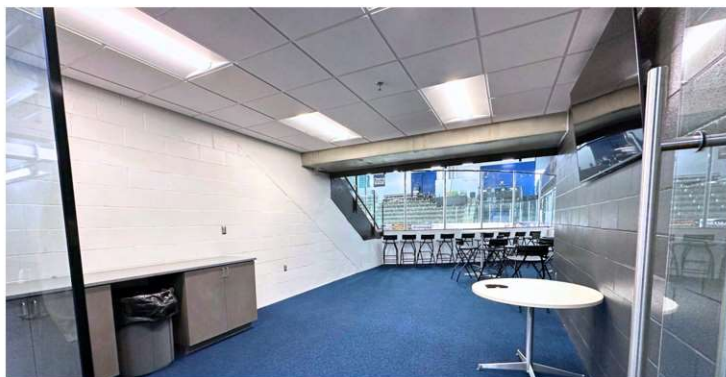
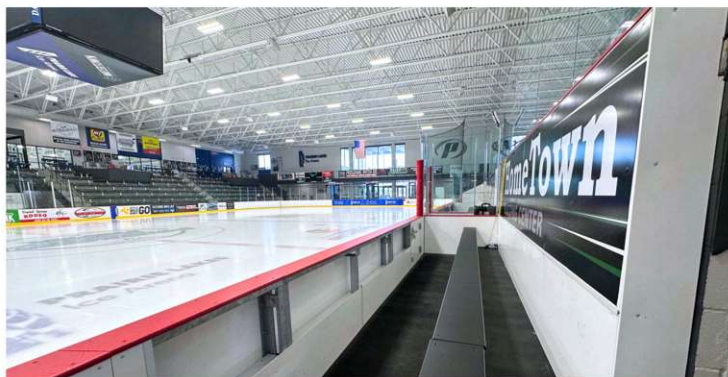
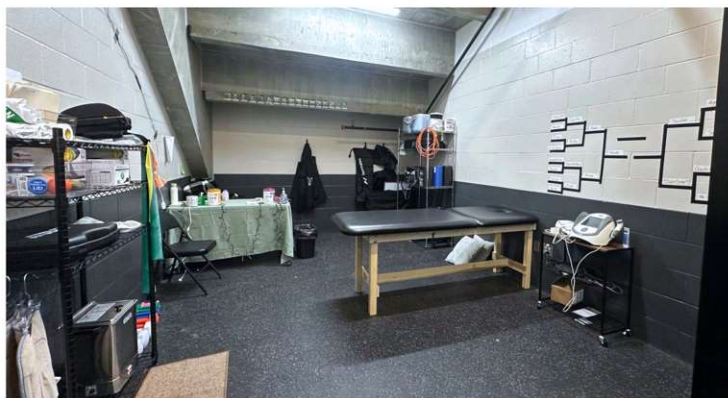

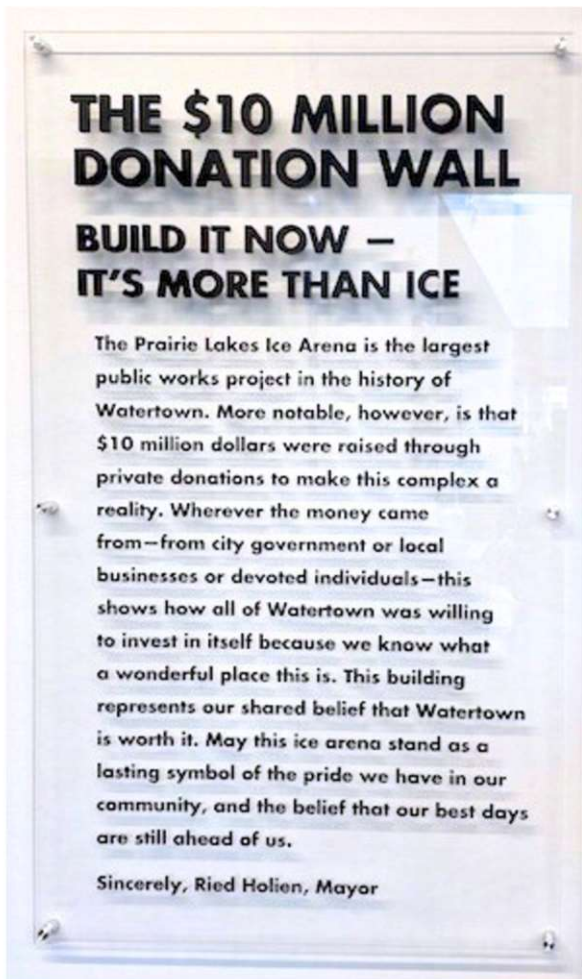

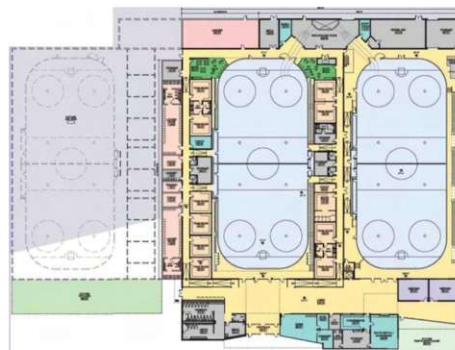
