

Levy Lid Lift for Health Care Services

The Commission of Public Hospital District No. 2, Kittitas County, Washington adopted Resolution No. 07-18-22-02 concerning an increase in the district's regular property tax levy. If approved, this proposition would provide additional funds for emergency medical services, urgent care services, and other health care services. It authorizes a maximum regular property tax levy rate for collection in 2023 of \$.50/\$1,000 assessed value. The 2023 levy amount will be used for the purpose of computing the limitations for levies in subsequent years. Should this proposition be:
