

DRAWING WITH MARK!

Let's draw a horse!

Start with an action line

Now you can start adding the stick figure. The circles are where joints will be.

Also, by doing the stick figure first it means we can also make sure that the limbs are correct: not too short or too long.

Now you can use more basic shapes like ovals and tubes to "fill out" the horse.

Once these tubes are in place...

...then you can start drawing over them and curving the muscles.

Now the foundation lines can be erased. Or put a new piece of paper on top to follow your lines and add the detail!

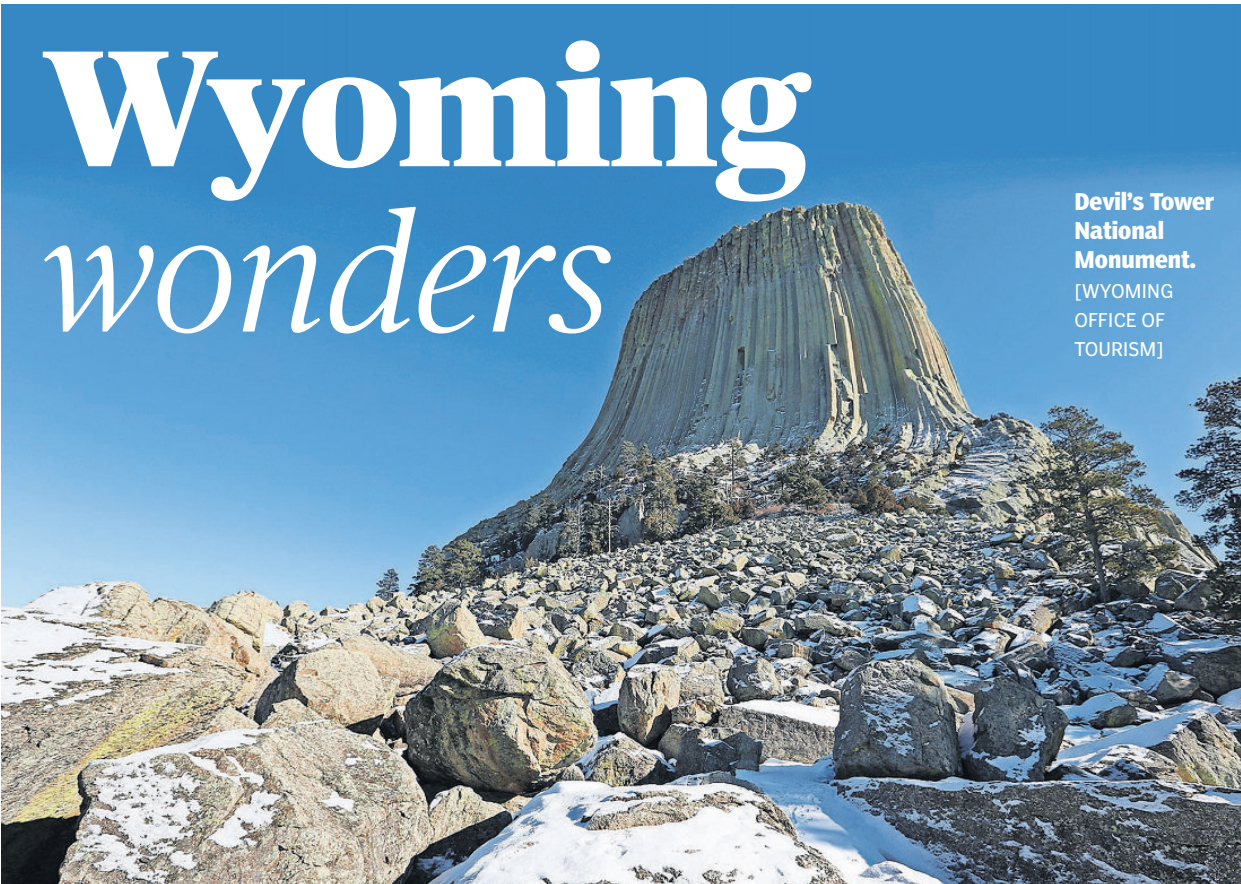

Wyoming in the West

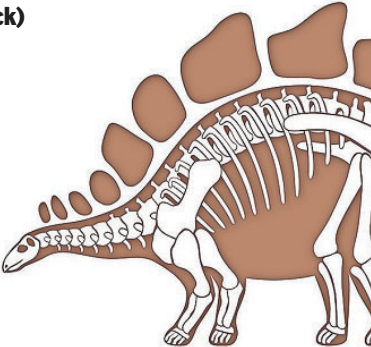
Wyoming is in the western part of the United States and borders Montana, Idaho, South Dakota, Colorado, Nebraska and Utah. The western half of the state is mountainous; the Rocky Mountains are in this area of the state. The highest mountain in the state is Gannett Peak and is 13,810 feet high. The eastern half of the state is flat, dry prairie.

National parks and other natural wonders

If you enjoy the outdoors, Wyoming is a wonderful place to explore. It's a beautiful state with many natural wonders. It is home to two important national parks: Grand Teton and Yellowstone. Grand Teton is named for the largest mountain in the area and is located in the northwest area of the

state. Yellowstone was the first national park in the country and maybe the world. It is home to many geysers, natural springs that shoot out water and steam. The most famous one is Old Faithful, which erupts about every 90 minutes. Wyoming is also home to the national monuments Devil's Tower and Fossil Butte.

Native American history

Wyoming was once home to many indigenous tribes, and many still live there including Shoshone, Arapaho, Crow and Northern Cheyenne. There is one reservation, the Wind River Reservation, and people can visit to learn about the tribes that live there.

Wild history

Wyoming also is home to many wild animals like the black bear, white-tailed deer, coyote, wolf, mountain goat and bison. People who enjoy hunting can find good opportunities in Wyoming, and if you just like to look at animals, you can do that, too. There are many places in Wyoming where you can take wildlife tours and see wild animals. One special group of animals in Wyoming are dinosaurs. Of course, there are no live ones, but there are several museums where you can see fossils and learn about the dinosaurs that once roamed the area. Wyoming even has a state dinosaur: the triceratops.
