SECOND AMENDMENT TO INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT TO FACILITATE PLANNED SCHOOL FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS

(Champaign Unit 4 School District – City of Champaign, Illinois)

This Second Amendment to Intergovernmental Agreement to Facilitate Planned School Facility Improvements is entered into as of the date fully executed by and between the City of Champaign, Illinois, a Municipal Corporation ("City"), and Community Unit 4 School District #4, Champaign County, Illinois, a School District ("School District"), collectively referred to as the "Parties".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Section 10 of Article VII of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, 1970, provides authority for units of local government and school districts to associate among themselves to exercise, combine or transfer any power or function in any manner not prohibited by law or ordinance and the Intergovernmental Government Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1 *et seq.*) provides that any one or more public agencies may contract with each other to perform any activity or undertaking which any of the public agencies entering into the contract is authorized by law to perform.

WHEREAS, the School District is implementing multiple facility improvement projects in accordance with a \$183.4 million referendum approved by the voters on November 8, 2016 and has identified areas where the City's cooperation is needed to facilitate the completion of said projects.

WHEREAS, in October 2018, the Parties memorialized their understanding as to the plans for said facility improvements and the City's actions to facilitate their completion by entering into the Intergovernmental Agreement to Facilitate Planned School Facility Improvements.

WHEREAS, in November 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic and changes and delays in facility design and construction, the Parties entered into the First Amendment to Intergovernmental Agreement to Facilitate Planned School Facility Improvements to accommodate delaying the vacation of Lynn Street right-of-way; updating parking restrictions near Central High School and Edison Middle School; and updating lighting standards at new Unit 4 sports fields.

WHEREAS, the intergovernmental agreement restricts McKinley Field from being used for varsity football games and the Parties now desire to allow one varsity football game during the 2022 football season.

WHEREAS, the Parties agree to modify the intergovernmental agreement to accordingly.

NOW, THEREFORE, the agreement shall be amended as follows:

- I. Section J is amended to read as follows:
- J. McKinley Field. The parties agree to the following provisions to facilitate the construction of improvements to McKinley Field substantially in conformance to the site plan shown on Exhibit I, Site Plan attached hereto. Said improvements are intended to provide for utilization of the complex for Unit 4 athletic and educational purposes with the exception of varsity football games. Based on this intent, the parties agree to the following:
 - Off street parking shall be provided through shared parking with existing facilities at
 Southside and the Mellon Building. Unit 4 agrees to provide on-site directional signage
 and information on its website directing event parking to this location.
 - 2. Sanitary and Storm Sewer lines It is understood by the parties that the existing sanitary sewer running underneath McKinley Field was previously lined and does not require any repairs. The storm sewer running underneath McKinley Field was inspected in 2011 and was in good condition at that time. The City agrees to complete another evaluation of the storm sewer by October 2018 to determine if repairs and/or improvements are needed on the pipe. Both parties agree that it is preferable that such repairs and/or improvements be completed before the athletic facilities at McKinley Field are upgraded. The School District agrees to coordinate construction activities to facilitate repairs and/or improvements to the sanitary and storm sewer lines, and to reach agreement with the City on any potential cost sharing for improvements to the City's existing sanitary and storm lines. Improvements shall be completed in advance of upgrades being made to the athletic facilities at McKinley Field.
 - 3. Notwithstanding the general restrictions in Section J, one varsity football game will be allowed at McKinley Field during the 2022 football season subject to the conditions of a

special event permit to be issued by the City no later than 48 hours before the game and pursuant to Chapter 24 of the Champaign Municipal Code.

II. All other terms and conditions of the First Amendment to Intergovernmental Agreement to Facilitate Planned School Facility Improvements, except as specifically modified herein, shall remain in full force and effect.

SUBJECT: EXPLANATION OF COUNCIL BILL NO. 2022-147

A. Introduction: The purpose of this Council Bill is to authorize the City Manager to execute and amendment to the Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) between Unit 4 School District and the City which was designed to facilitate the District's planned facility improvements as part of the passage of a \$183.4 million referendum. The requested amendment is to allow one Central High School varsity football game at McKinley Field in the 2022 football season.

B. Recommended Action: The Administration recommends approval of the Council Bill.

C. Prior Council Action:

- At its July 19, 2016, Study Session (<u>SS 2016-036</u>), Council reviewed the recommendations of the Tier II Committee and directed staff to work with Unit 4 on processing the necessary actions to support the reconstruction of Central High School.
- At its February 13, 2018, Study Session (<u>SS 2018-007</u>), Council directed staff to negotiate an intergovernmental agreement with Unit 4 addressing City support for the projects approved by the referendum.
- At its August 14, 2018, Study Session (<u>SS 2018-034</u>), Council directed staff to finalize the draft intergovernmental agreement with Unit 4 based on Council feedback and schedule it for consideration on a regular agenda.
- At its October 2, 2018, Regular Meeting, Council passed Council Bill <u>2018-158</u> approving an Intergovernmental Agreement with Unit 4 School District to Facilitate Planned School Facility Improvements.
- At its November 16, 2021, Regular Meeting, Council passed Council Bill <u>2021-158</u> approving the First Amendment to the Intergovernmental Agreement with Champaign Unit 4 School District.
- At its August 9, 2022, Study Session Council directed staff to negotiate an amendment to the Unit 4 IGA to allow a Saturday afternoon Central varsity football game at McKinley Field subject to approval of the action plan via the City's Special Event Permit process.

D. Background:

1. Unit 4 Intergovernmental Agreement. Section 20 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution and the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq., encourages public agencies to

enter into agreements that authorize joint cooperation and exercise of powers. The purpose of the IGA approved by Council Bill 2018-158 was to facilitate the implementation of the Unit 4 facility projects approved by the referendum. The IGA states that its purpose is to provide the basis for mutual cooperation between Unit 4 and the City in implementing the referendum projects. It specifically addressed the issue that Unit 4 facility projects in existing neighborhoods had unique challenges not typically experienced when building a school on a green field site on the edge of town.

The IGA stated that improvements to McKinley Field were intended to provide for utilization of the School District complex for educational and athletic purposes, except varsity football games. The language to clearly prohibit varsity football games was added per Council direction at the August 14, 2018, Study Session (<u>link to meeting video</u>) based on concerns about excessive traffic and parking demand associated with these games, and the lack of streetlights in the neighborhood for potential night games.

- 2. Request from Unit 4 to Amend the IGA. Unit 4 made the official request on behalf of the Champaign Central Football Booster Club and football team members for an amendment to the IGA to allow one varsity football game to be played at McKinley Field during the 2022 season. This request included a proposed McKinley Game Action Plan to allow the Central Maroons to play the Urbana Tigers at McKinley Field on September 24, 2022. Subsequently the Urbana Board of Education decided that their High School would not play a varsity football schedule in 2022. Unit 4 then obtained a game with Wheaton St. Francis for the September 24 date and now proposes to play that game at McKinley Field.
- 3. City Council Direction. At its August 9 Study Session, Council directed staff to negotiate an amendment to the IGA to facilitate a Central football game at McKinley Field in the fall of 2022, subject to approval of the plan to facilitate the game through the City's Special Event Permit process. Primary areas of focus in finalizing details were to include whether additional street closures are necessary, how to manage on-street parking on streets that remain open and assuring access for Fire and EMS vehicle throughout the neighborhood in the event of an emergency, ensuring an appropriate security plan for both the event location and surrounding area, establishing the most effective traffic pattern for traffic that will be coming into the area, and planning for timely trash and litter pick-up. Council members also wanted to ensure that neighbors had the opportunity to give input into the final proposed action plan prior to Council action.
- **4. Proposed IGA Amendment.** The proposed amendment to the IGA provides a one-time exemption to the language prohibiting varsity football to allow Central High School to play Wheaton St. Francis High School on September 24, 2022, at 1:00 pm subject to the conditions of a special event permit to be issued no later than 48 hours before the game.
- **5. Special Event Permit.** The City's special event permit process is governed by the regulations in Chapter 24 of the Champaign Municipal Code. Unit 4 must submit an application (Attachment 1) with specifics of the event and the Police Chief will review the application with staff from the Fire Department and Public Works Department. Before a permit is issued, Unit 4 will provide a certificate of insurance with liability coverage as required in the Code. Within 21

days of the conclusion of the event, the City will bill Unit 4 for direct and reasonable costs incurred by the City to provide services for the game.

The permit will be finalized by no later than September 22. The proposed Action Plan (attachment 2) details the minimum actions and conditions for the Special Event Permit which are summarized below:

- Installation of portable bleachers adding 200 additional seats
- Placement of portable toilets
- Shuttle bus service from Champaign Central High School or other alternative offsite location
- Map of shuttle bus route
- Unit 4 personnel to wear high visibility vests
- Access to South Side Elementary School for weather related emergency shelter
- Placement of additional garbage receptacles at field, parking lot, and South Side
- Private security personnel with Unit 4 administrative staff
- Ticket presale with maximum fan capacity of 700 (existing bleachers: 500, portable bleachers: 200)
- Boosters arrange for the Kona Ice truck to be on site for the game
- Access to Champaign Country Club parking lot for gameday parking
- Assist with pedestrian traffic crossing Prospect to and from Champaign Country Club
- Boosters postgame pickup of trash and temporary parking signs; volunteers to be supervised by Unit 4 employees
- Assist with fans departing game

Subject to the final permit conditions, it is anticipated that the City will provide the following for the football game at McKinley Field.

- Up to two police officers and an onsite supervisor
- Up to four Neighborhood Ambassadors onsite
- Emergency vehicle access to the field taken from Pine
- Assist with pedestrian traffic
- Install parking signage and barricades
- **6. Parking Restrictions.** Chapter 33-51 of the Code authorizes the City Manager to issue a parking order to prohibit or restrict parking of vehicles on portions of City streets. As of the writing of this report, it is anticipated that the following streets near McKinley Field will be marked as "resident parking only, permit required" to ensure normal parking demand on those streets and not impede, interfere with, or obstruct the flow of gameday traffic or delivery of emergency services. The Neighborhood Ambassadors will assist with distribution of the parking permits to residents on those streets and they will be asked to place them on the dash of their cars for the day of the game. On gameday, two parking enforcement officers will work the neighborhood to address violations of the resident only parking. Neither of these expenses is planned to be submitted to Unit 4 for reimbursement since the work will be carried out during normal work hours.

7. Neighborhood Input. As discussed in Section H below, a neighborhood meeting was hosted by Unit 4 on September 1 to discuss the proposed action plan for the game and take neighbor input. Most of the neighbors expressed concern about having the game at all, or at a minimum having it this year feeling that the planning was rushed. Those that spoke specifically to the plan noted it was much improved and that they appreciated it addressed earlier comments. One specific concern that came up was that the proposal to limit parking to one side of the street only would not leave enough spaces to meet the demand by residents to park on the street. The City and Unit 4 staff met following this meeting to make adjustments to the Action Plan and determined that on-street parking control would shift to a "resident parking only" permit system for the day of the game. Following the game, there will be another round of neighborhood input and a meeting with staff from Unit 4 and the City to evaluate the special event and produce a report with recommendations for any future varsity football event at McKinley Field. This report will be provided to the Board of Education and City Council to inform any future discussions about games at McKinley Field.

E. Alternatives:

- 1. Approve the Council Bill authorizing the City Manager to execute an amendment to the IGA authorizing one Central High School varsity football game at McKinley Field on September 24, 2022, consistent with the action plan approved through the City's Special Event Permit process.
- **2.** Do not approve the Council Bill.

F. Discussion of Alternatives:

Alternative 1 would approve the Council Bill approving the amendment to the IGA to allow a varsity football game at McKinley Field on September 24, 2022.

a. Advantages

- Provides an opportunity to evaluate and determine whether varsity football at McKinley Field is workable under any circumstances.
- Recognizes the value placed on McKinley Field by coaches, players, and boosters as the home of Central Football.
- Allows the game to proceed based on an action plan approved through the City's Special Event Permit process.

b. Disadvantages

• Does not address all the neighborhoods concerns about the impacts of a varsity football event on the surrounding neighborhood.

Alternative 2 would not approve the Council Bill.

a. Advantages.

- Consistent with Council direction when the original IGA was adopted.
- Addresses concerns of neighbors of McKinley Field.

b. Disadvantages

- Inconsistent with Council direction from the August 9, 2022, Study Session.
- **G. Community Input:** A neighborhood meeting was held by Unit 4 on September 1, 2022, at the Mellon Building to allow input into the proposed action plan to mitigate impacts on the neighborhood during the football game on September 24. The meeting was attended by approximately 35 neighborhood residents, 3 City Council members, 8 Unit 4 staff and 6 City staff. Comments from residents included continuing concerns about having the game at all, suggestions to wait until next year rather than rushing the planning process this year, concern that limiting parking to one side of neighborhood streets will not leave enough on street parking for residents, (the plan has been amended to include a resident only parking permit), questions about the extra cost of playing at McKinley versus Tommy Stewart Field, suggestions to make Tommy Stewart Field feel more like a home for Central Football and disappointment that a neighborhood meeting wasn't held before the Board of Education discussed the proposal. Several residents spoke in favor of the proposed game at McKinley Field, and several noted they thought the plan was much improved from what had originally been presented.
- **H. Budget Impact:** The IGA Amendment includes a provision requiring Unit 4 to reimburse the City for the cost of any staff time or services provided by the City in support of the event. As such there will be no budget impact on the City resulting from this amendment. Following is a cost comparison of City and Unit 4 expenses for a Friday night game at Tommy Stewart Field, versus the one-time game proposed at McKinley:
