APPLICATION FOR SEARCH WARRANT

I, Angela C Evans, a licensed peace officer in the State of Minnesota, make an application to this Court for a warrant to search the motor vehicle(s) described below, for the property and thing(s) described below.

I know the content of this application and affirm that the statements contained in this application are true based on my own knowledge, or are believed to be true.

I believe that the following described property and thing(s), namely:

- **Items to establish the identity of the victim(s), suspect(s), or possible witnesses;**
- **Trace and microscopic evidence, including but not limited to blood, hair, fingerprints, body tissues, body fluids and excretions;**
- **Items that may contain trace and microscopic evidence, including but not limited to bedding, upholstery, clothing, glass, furniture, woodwork, carpet**
or other flooring;
- **Weapons, to include firearms, ammunition, knives, club, bats or other items used to inflict sharp force or blunt force injury, ligatures or any other item that could have been used to aid in the disappearance of Madeline Kingsbury;**
- **Any spent ammunition and ammunition parts, including but not limited to the bullets and fragments, jackets, gun powder residue, primer, pellets, and wads;**
- **Digital cameras, camcorders, photographs, writings, documents, computers, laptops, electronic tablets, computer data, cell phones, covert digital recording devices, USB memory devices, computer hard drives, GPS devices, and other similar electronic items;**
- **Documentation by the Minnesota Bureau of Criminal Apprehension (Agents/Crime Scene Team) and other law enforcement agencies including but not limited to photographs, video recordings, sketches, measurements;**
- **Indicia of usage or ownership; and**
- **Any other items/evidence which may assist in determining the cause and manner of**

Madeline Kingsbury's disappearance

- **Infotainment System and related historical digital media stored locally inside the vehicles infotainment system to include but not limited to Blue tooth, WIFI, devices, device information, media files, embedded devices, storage devices, vehicle event information, navigation and GPS related to a missing and endangered adult;**
- **The recording device, commonly referred to as an "Event Data Recorders (EDR)" or "sensing and diagnostic modules (SDM)," installed within the vehicle described, a 2015 Chrysler 200 bearing Minnesota License Plate ABN466, VIN Number-1C3CCCAB6FN667578, currently located within a Winona Police Department secure storage facility;**
- **Data as stored by vehicle systems as it is collected and processed. Access event logs associated with activity such as door opens, gearshifts, odometer reads, ignition cycles, speed logs, steering performance, brake performance, seatbelt status, history of where the motor vehicle travels, information related to how fast and in which direction the motor vehicle is traveling, and more. This vehicle data is commonly stored in the vehicles in-car infotainment system. This information is collected and interpreted by an industry extraction tool known as Berla;**
- **Conduct a vehicle inspection, which may involve photographing the exterior and interior of the vehicle;**
- **A complete examination of the motor vehicle for the purpose of determining the existence of, or lack thereof, any mechanical defects, if necessary;**
- **Permission to have the Infotainment System forensically analyzed, including applying programs needed to download information and the authority to examine these devices and associated data storage; which may need to be done at a location offsite.**

is or are in the motor vehicle(s) described as:

2015 Chrysler 200, bearing Minnesota License Plate ABN466, VIN Number-1C3CCCAB6FN667578, currently located within a Winona Police Department secure storage facility.

located in city or township of Winona, County of Winona, State of Minnesota.

I apply for a search warrant on the following grounds:

- The property or things above-described constitutes evidence which tends to show a crime has been committed, or tends to show that a particular person has committed a crime.

The facts establishing the grounds for issuance of a search warrant are as follows:

Affiant's Background

Your affiant is a licensed peace officer and has been a licensed peace officer in the State of Minnesota since August 1996. Your affiant has worked for the Winona Police Department in various capacities for the past 26 years, including patrol officer, evidence technician, and is currently an investigator assigned to the Criminal Investigation Division. Your affiant has worked in her current capacity since September 2012. Your affiant has investigated this case, discussed this case and reviewed reports of other officers about this case and believes the following to be true, and to constitute probable cause sufficient to support the requested search.

Nature of Investigation

March 31, 2023

At approximately 8:20pm on Friday, March 31, 2023 the Winona Police Department took a report of a missing person. The reporting party ("Reporting Party") indicated that they were best friends with Madeline Jane Kingsbury (Date of Birth: June 1, 1996), who she had not had contact with all day, which she characterized as unusual. Reporting Party went to Kingsbury's residence and did not get an answer to her knocks at the door at 465 Kerry Drive, located in the City of Winona, Winona County, Minnesota. Reporting Party also informed officers that she was aware that Kingsbury was having issues with her significant other, Adam Taylor Fravel (Date of Birth: January 29, 1994).

One of Kingsbury's neighbors ("Neighbor") reported that they she did not see Kingsbury's van in the driveway at approximately 7:00am, but had seen it back at approximately 6:00pm. The van was still in the driveway when officers arrived on scene, as is still there at 12:00pm on April 1, 2023.

Officers did not get an answer to knocks at Kingsbury's door and noted that there were no lights on inside. Officers then spoke with Kingsbury's dad who reported not having had any contact with her throughout the day, explaining that as odd.

Officers also spoke with Fravel via phone. Fravel said he had not heard from Kingsbury since earlier that morning. He reported that Kingsbury was supposed to pick up their children from daycare after she got off of work, however, she did not show up so he went to pick them up. After picking up the children he and the kids went to his parents' residence in

Mabel, Fillmore County, Minnesota. Law enforcement knows, based on phone contact with Fravel, an in-person interview of Fravel and surveillance of Fravel's movements, that he has been at that residence the majority of the time since then.

Officers gained access to Kingsbury's apartment and verified that she was not there and noted that the apartment did not look disturbed.

April 1, 2023

On April 1, 2023 Kingsbury's mother and sister ("Sister") came to the Winona County Law Enforcement Center to report that there had still not been any contact with Kingsbury, which was extremely out of character for her. Sister said that she had texted Kingsbury Friday morning and that Kingsbury replied at 8:15am with a response that is typical of Kingsbury. Sister reports sending a second text to her at 8:23am, which went unanswered. Sister said that she and Kingsbury communicated with one another multiple times a day.

They informed officers that Kingsbury and Fravel were in the process of splitting up, however, they were still living together. They said that the first night that Fravel hasn't stayed at their joint residence on Kerry Drive was last night, March 31, 2023.

Kingsbury reportedly told Fravel earlier in the week that she no longer wanted to continue with the plans they had to move closer to his parents and change the children's daycare, rather, she was going to stay in Winona, keep the children with her and at the daycare they were currently attending and that she was looking for an apartment. It was also known to Fravel, and others, that Kingsbury was currently seeing someone else.

They reported that Fravel was very emotionally abusive and controlling over Kingsbury. He insisted that she was not allowed to speak with her new boyfriend while he was around and demanded to see all text messages between the two of them. Kingsbury told Sister that Fravel had told her, "if you don't listen you'll end up like Gabby Petito".

Officers learned that Kingsbury had also told Reporting Party that Fravel told her, "if you don't listen you'll end up like Gabby Petito".

Gabrielle "Gabby" Petito was reported missing on September 11, 2022 after not returning from a monthslong cross-county trip with her significant other, a case which garnered significant, nation-wide media coverage. Her remains were later located in a national park in Wyoming and it was determined that her death was a homicide. The person of interest in that case was her significant other.

Sister reported that Kingsbury had planned to travel, with her daughter, to visit her in the cities for the weekend and that Fravel was supposed to be taking their son with him to his parents' in Mabel. Both were supposed to be leaving for their intended destinations on

Saturday, April 1, 2023, so they were very concerned that Fravel left with both children on Friday, knowing Kingsbury was going to be taking their daughter with her on Saturday.

Officers spoke with the childrens' daycare provider ("Daycare Provider"). She reported that Kingsbury and Fravel dropped the children off together Friday morning, and they arrived in the van, which is typically driven by Kingsbury. She told officers that Kingsbury is the one who typically picks up the children at the end of the day, but that Fravel will if Kingsbury can't. She explained that Fravel arrived to pick up the children at their normal pick-up time. When asked, Daycare Provider said that she never contacted Fravel, or anyone, in reference to Kingsbury not arriving to pick up the children because Fravel picked them up at their regularly scheduled time. Daycare Provider said that when Fravel showed up to get the children they asked where their mother was. She said that he never answered their question, rather he just said, "we're going to Grandma's house". A review of the daycare provider's ring camera shows both Kingsbury and Fravel arrive at 8:03am to drop off the kids and Fravel arrive alone to pick up the kids at 4:21pm. Fravel can be seen wearing a white jacket, dark pants, a red bomber-style hat and white tennis shoes at drop-off and the same white jacket, a red colored shirt underneath, the same red bomber-style hat, dark pants and dark colored footwear at pick-up. It should be noted that there was no snow on the ground at that time, it was raining and the temperature was approximately 40 degrees.

Reporting Party reported that her significant other (Witness #1) is very close friends with Fravel. Witness #1 and Fravel communicated via text about Kingsbury being missing. Witness #1 reports Fravel as being very frustrated that law enforcement is involved so quickly since he had seen her Friday morning. Witness #1 shared screenshots of his conversation with Fravel from Friday, March 31, 2023, which is detailed, in part, below

- Fravel 9:37pm – "I talked to the police. Who or what prompted you guys to go check at the house? I'm so confused, she hasn't been gone for a day yet so I'm not freaking out but everyone else is"
- Fravel 9:42pm – "So Katie called the police?"
- Fravel 9:44pm – "She was leaving for Farmington in the morning"
- Witness #1 9:45pm – "Yes she did. Weird that no one can get ahold of her."
- Fravel 9:46pm – "Wow that's a little out of bounds of Katie. It hasn't even been 24 hrs and I saw her this morning"
- Witness #1 9:48pm – "Not really when no one has heard from her most of the day. Apparently no one was able to reach you either to at least know you've heard from her. You can't blame people for being worried man."

- Fravel 10:04pm – “Nobody tried to reach me at all until 7pm which was Megan so idk what you mean by that”

- Fravel 10:04pm – “I get being worried. But nobody asked me anything so it’s like wtf lol”

An investigator spoke with Kingsbury’s work supervisor (“Supervisor”) who reported that Kingsbury works at the office on Mondays and Fridays, however, she did not show up for work on March 31, 2023. Supervisor said that Kingsbury did not contact anyone to let them know she was not coming in to work, which Supervisor said was out of character for Kingsbury. The IT department at Kingsbury’s place of employment reported to investigators that Kingsbury last logged into her work system at 7:44am on Friday, March 31, 2023 and had not logged back in after it timed out, which it would have done in the time it took for them to drop the children off at daycare at 8:03am.

Family also told investigators that a friend (“Friend”) of Kingsbury’s reports that, a couple weeks ago Kingsbury visited Friend in the hospital and told her that if something ever happened to her, “it was Adam”.

Pings of Kingsbury’s phone on April 1, 2023 reported GPS coordinates of 44.05627, -91.691015, which is the tower located at Service Drive and Sebo Steet in Winona, with an accuracy of 4043 meter radius. Multiple pings returned the same coordinates. Investigators located Kingsbury’s phone at her residence during the execution of a search warrant later on April 1, 2023.

Investigators spoke with Fravel on April 1, 2023. Fravel told investigators that he and Kingsbury dropped their children off at daycare and returned home together. Fravel told investigators he played on his laptop in the living room while Kingsbury had breakfast in the kitchen. Fravel reports having left the Kerry Drive residence at approximately 10:30am, at which time he left in Kingsbury’s van to move boxes and totes of belongings to his parents’ residence, located at 42227 County Road 18, Mabel, Minnesota. According to Fravel, during the trip to his parents’ residence he realized he had brought the wrong load of belongings and when he got to Choice, Minnesota, he turned around and returned to his Kerry Drive residence, approximating his arrival at about noon. Fravel allowed investigators to look through his vehicle, a gray Chrysler 200, bearing MN license plate ABN466. Investigators noted two pair of footwear that matched the general description of what Fravel was seen wearing on the Ring video when he picked up and dropped off the children at daycare. Investigators noted several faint scratches on Fravel’s forehead, area immediately below his nose and on his neck. Your affiant would note that sometime during the course of the investigation I observed, on other investigators’ bodycam footage of the interview with Fravel, a dog on the porch at Fravel’s parents residence in Mabel, Minnesota.

Investigators were able to retrieve business surveillance video in Rushford, Minnesota,

showing a van matching the description of Kingsbury's van, to include a sticker in the lower left corner of the back window. The van travels south, on Hwy 43 toward Choice, Minnesota, at 11:56am, and nearly an hour later, at 12:47pm, what appears to be the same vehicle is seen returning, travelling north on Hwy 43 from the direction of Choice, Minnesota. According to Google maps the distance between the business that captured the van on camera and Choice, Minnesota, travelling via Hwy 43, is approximately 11.5 miles, and takes 15 minutes to drive one way.

For reference, according to Google Maps, the distance between the business that captured the van on camera and Fravel's parents' residence, travelling via Hwy 43, is approximately 16.7 miles, and takes 23 minutes to drive one way.

Pursuant to a search warrant, a Minnesota Bureau of Criminal Apprehension (BCA) agent completed a forensic extraction of Fravel's cell phone on April 1, 2023, and found text messages sent from Fravel to Kingsbury, relevant to the timing of his travel, detailed below. At no time did Kingsbury reply to the messages.

- March 31, 2023 10:29am – Fravel to Kingsbury – “Got gas in van and stuff ready to go. Gonna leave soon. When do you have to leave?”
- March 31, 2023 10:29am – Fravel to Kingsbury – “You just gonna stay home?”
- March 31, 2023 1:33pm – Fravel to Kingsbury – “Umm I’m back and my car is still here? You get a ride or something?”

Also located within the forensic extraction, investigators found a web search, “are dog scratches on face dangerous”, dated March 31, 2023 at 6:51pm.

Investigators executed search warrants for the production of records from Fravel's cell phone provider for geolocation information and found that Fravel's phone last recorded geolocation information on March 30, 2023. Geolocation services can be turned on or off by the user at any time.

Investigators also found that Fravel has four different Gmail accounts on his cell phone. A search of each of those account profiles, in the phone itself, shows that the location services for each account was turned off.

iPhones and iCloud connected devices can keep track of locations the devices have recently been, as well as how often that device visited those locations, in order to learn places that are significant to the user. A user can delete their significant location history at any time. Fravel's only significant location listed was the location of his children's daycare.

Based on the information detailed above, your affiant believes that Fravel went to great lengths to conceal the locations that he visited or traveled after March 30, 2023.

Investigators and BCA agents executed a search warrant at Kingsbury's residence on Kerry Drive and her Chrysler Town and Country van and did not locate her or any obvious signs of a struggle or foul play.

April 2, 2023

During an interview of Fravel on April 2, 2023, regarding Kingsbury's disappearance, Fravel told investigators that he is "infatuated" with the Gabby Petito case. Investigators asked Fravel where his laptop was located and Fravel said it was at his parents' residence. Fravel asked investigators if they could bring him the laptop because he had to do homework. Fravel later told investigators that the laptop was in the basement of the Mabel, Minnesota residence, where investigators located it sitting on a bed after a consent search of the residence and property.

In reviewing the publically viewable information on Fravel's Facebook account, the intro section reads the following:

- "Studied Computer Science and Engineering at Winona State University"
- "Studied Web Design and Software Development at Minnesota State College Southeast Tech"
- "From Mabel, Minnesota"

A Winona Police Department sergeant spoke with Reporting Party. Reporting Party told the sergeant that Kingsbury had told her that she couldn't deal with this any longer and asked Reporting Party to take care of her children. Reporting Party doesn't know what happened to Kingsbury. Reporting Party wondered aloud if Kingsbury could have done something like jumped off a bridge, checked herself in to a mental health facility or left for a while.

Investigators executed a search warrant at Fravel's parents' residence, located at 42227 County Road 18 in Mabel, Fillmore County, Minnesota. During the execution of that search warrant they collected SD cards from the Wyze cameras located on that property. Later review of those cameras, which is still ongoing as of April 11, 2023, shows the following:

- March 31, 2023 at 5:14pm - Fravel parks in the driveway at the Fillmore County property, and is seen unpacking the vehicle and going back and forth from the house.
- March 31, 2023 at 5:19pm – Fravel walks into camera view from the house and goes to the open trunk of the vehicle and removes a garbage bag, that appeared to be full, and places it into a garbage dumpster. Fravel then walks back to the vehicle, shuts the trunk, retrieves items from the front passenger seat and the video stops at 5:20pm

Based on training and experience, perpetrators of homicide, kidnapping and/or false imprisonment may:

- transport deceased or detained individuals to and from various locations in order to hide or dispose of a body or person;
- return to disposed bodies to further destroy evidence or further conceal a body;
- use vehicles to transport evidence away from the initial crime scene to destroy evidence;
- use a vehicle for transportation to purchase items to aid in concealing and/or destroying evidence; and
- use vehicles to avoid detection of their actions by law enforcement.

Pursuant to a search warrant, investigators placed a GPS tracking device on Fravel's Chrysler 200 vehicle in an attempt to track his travels to see if they would lead to Kingsbury's location. To date, data obtained from the GPS tracking device has not lead to the recovery of Kingsbury.

April 4, 2023

Investigators reviewed surveillance video from March 31, 2023 at Kwik Trip, located at 375 Cottonwood Drive in Winona, Minnesota, which is the closest gas station to the Kerry Drive residence, at .3 miles. While reviewing the video, Investigators found a blue van, matching Kingsbury's vehicle, at the pumps at 10:02am. The rear license plate on the van was MN ABN466, which is the license plate for Fravel's Chrysler 200 sedan. A male subject matching Fravel's description was seen pumping gas in the van.

It should be noted that when investigators located Kingsbury's van at her Kerry Drive residence on both March 31, 2023 and April 1, 2023, it had plates belonging to her vehicle on it with areas around the bolts that hold the plate to the vehicle that were clean and clear of dirt, when the remainder of the plate was dirty.

Also of note is that Fravel's vehicle, when viewed by law enforcement, had plates belonging to his vehicle on it.

April 7, 2023

Investigators and MN BCA agents executed a search warrant at 42227 County Road 18,

Mabel, located in Fillmore County, Minnesota. During the execution of that search warrant Investigators noted that there was a Polaris brand UTV (Utility Terrain Vehicle), commonly

referred to as a "side-by-side" or a "Ranger" parked in a hoop shed next to Fravel's Chrysler 200 vehicle. Polaris describes a UTV as "an off-road vehicle that can be used for hauling as it has a cargo bed at the back of the vehicle".

The UTV had a 2024 registration sticker affixed to the back of the cab, facing the rear of the UTV, with what appears to be white letter stickers reading "FRAVEL" below the registration sticker.

April 10, 2023

On April 10, 2023 a Winona County Deputy ("Deputy") received information from an individual who owns land ("land owner") adjacent to Fravel's parents' land at 42227 County Road 18 in Mabel. Land owner informed Deputy that he had installed trail cameras on his property over the weekend. Land owner told Deputy that one of the cameras captured a picture of Fravel traveling on Land owner's property, headed away from Fravel's parents' property, on a Polaris Ranger with a long handled tool of some sort in the bed of the ranger. Land owner then sent Deputy the picture.

A review of the photo shows a time-stamp of 09 APR 2023 04:51 pm. The picture shows Adam Fravel as the lone occupant, driving a Polaris Ranger 570. There is a handle of some piece of tool sticking out of the back of the drivers' side of the bed. The handle is tan in color with a darker end. Due to the placement of the camera relative to the height of the bed of the ranger, the picture does not show the inside of the bed to see what is inside.

It should also be noted that the long handled tool was not in the back of the ranger at the time of the execution of the search warrant on the property on April 7, 2023. Investigators reviewed body cameras from the execution of the search warrant and noticed a spade shovel with a long tan handle with a darker colored end, consistent with the one seen in the trail camera picture in the bed of the ranger standing in the corner of the garage.

A check of MN DNR off-road vehicle registrations revealed a 2021 Polaris Ranger 570 registered to Richard Peter Fravel at 42227 County 18, Mabel, Minnesota.

Law enforcement froze the residence in anticipation of executing a search warrant at the property due to active burning in a fire pit on the property. Fravel then got on the ranger and drove off. Investigators were able to stop Fravel on 180th Street near the intersection of Hwy 43, located in Preble Township, Fillmore County, Minnesota, and found a shovel in the bed of the UTV that appeared consistent with the one in the body cam footage from the prior search warrant, which appeared consistent with the handle seen in the trail cam picture. Fravel was also wearing clothing consistent with what he was seen wearing in the trail cam picture.

Pursuant to a search warrant, investigators seized the Polaris Ranger that Fravel was driving,

as well as the shovel that was located in the bed of the ranger and placed them in a secure storage facility. Later in the day two Certified Land and Water Human Remains Detection (HRD) dogs, commonly referred to as cadaver dogs, deployed separately around the Polaris Ranger. Both dogs alerted/indicated, in the bed of the Polaris Ranger, at or near the spade of the shovel.

Per Minnesota-Wisconsin Canine Search and Rescue, Cadaver Dogs are "specially trained to find human remains and alert their handlers to their location. They can be used to locate human cadavers, body parts and body fluids involving new or old cases". According to Search Dog Organization of North America, "HRD dogs are trained to specifically find the odor of decomposing human remains. HRD dogs are trained to ignore live human scent and animal scent, and only indicate on human remains".

During a large-scale search of land owner's property, which was only half completed at the conclusion of the evening due to the vastness of the land, law enforcement located an area of fresh dirt. Law enforcement did not locate remains in that area of fresh dirt. Deputy reported that it appears that area of dirt was transported from elsewhere and dumped there, however, law enforcement has yet to locate an area that it came from. The large-scale search of that property is on-going at this time.

April 12, 2023

Madeline Kingsbury remains missing as of 3:30 pm.

Vehicle Infotainment Systems Generally

Based on training and experience, your Affiant knows that a motor vehicle is no longer just limited to transportation. Many modern motor vehicles are factory installed with entertainment and communications consoles. These consoles are commonly called "Infotainment Systems" and have the ability to capture data throughout the systems.

Based on training and experience, your Affiant also knows that if these items are not seized and isolated from network connectivity in a timely manner, evidence may be destroyed, transferred, encrypted, modified, or otherwise erased from the system indefinitely.

Based on training and experience, your Affiant knows that data on infotainment systems can only be extracted in its entirety and cannot be extracted for a specific date range. Because of this, any/all data present on the infotainment systems at the time it is extracted is captured by law enforcement.

Based on training and experience, your Affiant knows to capture this data infotainment systems may have to be physically removed from the vehicle. Due to these circumstances, officers executing the warrant will make all necessary precautions and measures during the

search warrant execution to ensure the integrity of the vehicle, while ensuring the full extraction of the infotainment system can be removed and analyzed.

Your Affiant is aware that often times it is necessary to use electronic tools and software to obtain/recover the information from these devices. Your affiant is also aware that it is a time-consuming task and would not be able to be properly done at the scene.

Advanced processes may need specialists (located in and outside of the State of Minnesota) to assist in the extraction/analysis of the EDR/SDM/Infotainment System Data and evidence. In addition, the extraction/analysis of the data may be sent to the lab and/or specialist to conduct the examination/analysis. The Court permits additional time, as necessary, to execute the extraction and analysis of the data from the EDR/SDM/Infotainment System Data.

Your Affiant respectfully requests the court to authorize the removal of the data infotainment system from MN ABN466. Your Affiant also requests permission to extract the data once the infotainment system is removed from MN ABN466.

WHEREAS, Angela C Evans has this day on oath made an application to this Court for a warrant to search the following described motor vehicle(s) :

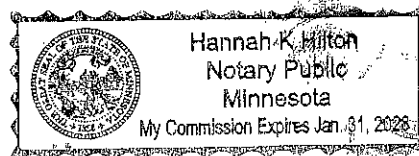
