At the regularly scheduled meeting on July 13, 2026, the Town Council of Glenwood, Indiana will consider the approval of 2026-4 An Ordinance Prohibiting and Regulating Parking on Public Streets within the Town Limits. The meeting will be at 7:00 P.M. in the Town Hall. The meeting will be livestreamed via <https://glenwoodtown.com>.

Ordinance 2026-4, Prohibiting and Regulating Parking on Public Streets within the Town Limits

WHEREAS, the Town Council of Glenwood, Indiana intends to ensure traffic safety, emergency vehicle access, and clear street access.

WHEREAS, other State of Indiana statutes, Rush County Unified Development Ordinance (UDO), and Glenwood ordinances cover many parking restrictions for public streets, private driveways, fire lanes, alleys, and sidewalks. This ordinance addresses specific no-parking zones and limited parking zones for Glenwood public streets and alleys. The UDO applies to both Rush and Fayette Counties within Glenwood.

WHEREAS, Indiana Code § 9-21-16-1 prohibits parking, stopping, or leaving a vehicle on the paved or main traveled part of a state highway outside of a business or residential district if it is practical to park elsewhere. Vehicles must leave at least 20 feet of clear, unobstructed road width, and be visible from 200 feet away.

WHEREAS, this ordinance will replace in their entirety previous ordinances 1989-4, 1992-3, 1993-1, 1997-4, and 2003-2.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF GLENWOOD, INDIANA, AS FOLLOWS:

§ I. NO-PARKING ZONES

A. No person shall park in the following locations:

Street	Location
Main Street (County Line Road), East Side	Beginning at the South Corporation Limit to the North Corporation Limit with Limited Parking Zones listed below.
Main Street (County Line Road), West Side	Beginning at the South Corporation Limit to the North Corporation Limit with Limited Parking Zone listed below.
Pearl Street (West), North & South Sides	Beginning at Main Street (County Line Road) to the West Corporation Limit.

B. Other no-parking restrictions.

1. Within fifteen (15) feet of a fire hydrant
2. Within twenty (20) feet of an intersection.
3. In any manner that obstructs traffic flow or creates a hazard.
4. In alleys, except for active loading or unloading.
5. RVs, Trailers, and Boats may not be parked on any public street.
6. In any temporary "No Parking" zones as established by the Glenwood Town Council or law enforcement officers.
7. On any area that is not a designated parking facility. Parking is prohibited on grass, in yards, or on any unapproved surface that is not an improved parking facility such as gravel, asphalt, concrete, or similar material. Parking on lawns or unapproved areas that obstruct visibility at intersections or create a safety hazard is strictly prohibited. Refer to the Rush County Unified Development Ordinance for more parking restrictions.

§ II. LIMITED PARKING ZONES

A. The following are designated as limited parking zones.

Street	Location	Limitation
Main Street (County Line Road), East Side	The parking cutout at the Christian Church, 100 S Main Street	For Church parking only.
Main Street (County Line Road), East Side	The parking cutout at the U.S. Post Office, 212-214 N Main Street	15-minute parking.
Main Street (County Line Road), West Side	The parking cutout at the Town Hall, 217 N Main Street	15-minute parking to deposit payments and documents in the utility or complaint box. Handicap parking for Town Hall purpose.
Town Properties to include Town Hall, Town Garage, Park, and Fire Station	217 N Main Street, 107 W Pearl Street, 207 N Durbon Street, 206 North Durbon, 105 N Main Street, West State Street	No overnight parking.

B. No parking cutout is allowed without the Glenwood Town Council approval and following requirements in the Rush County Unified Development Ordinance.

§ III. TEMPORARY NO PARKING

A. The Glenwood Town Council or law enforcement officers may designate temporary parking locations as necessary.

§ IV. ENFORCEMENT

- A. The registered owner of a vehicle is presumed to be responsible for any violation unless evidence shows otherwise.
- B. Any vehicle which is parked in a manner in violation of this section may be towed to an area designated by the town at the owner's expense. The owner shall also be required to pay any and all storage fees resulting from this action.
- C. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall be fined a sum of \$25.00 per day for each offense. Each day's violation of this section shall be considered a separate offense. Legal action may be taken to enforce any penalty assessed.

§ VI. EFFECTIVE DATE

A. This ordinance shall be in full force and effective upon passage.
