# Blockbuster lowers curtain on Alaska stores

Video provider says locations in Fairbanks, Anchorage will close Monday; inventory sale starts Tuesday By Erin Granger EGRANGER

The last two remaining Blockbuster stores in Alaska announced their impending closures Thursday afternoon, leaving only one store remaining in the United States.

The two stores are in Fairbanks on College Road and in Anchorage

on Debarr Road. The lone remaining store is in Bend, Oregon.

Kevin Daymude, general manager of the Anchorage store, pointed to the economy as a reason for the closures.

"It's just not what it used to be," Daymude said.

The Anchorage store has been open since 1990



# FAI gets grant to lure direct flights to LAX, Phoenix

The U.S. Department of Transportation announced Thursday that Fairbanks International Airport has won a \$750,000 grant to encourage airlines to and Los Angeles and/or Fairbanks and Phoenix.

Fairbanks was one of 16 communities across the U.S. picked for grants in the Small Community Air Service Development Program and the only one in

# Road safety projects for 2019 get backing

A center turning lane will be extended throughout Badger Road next summer, and two traffic circles plus sidewalks are going in on about a mile of Gillam Way in South Fairbanks. The two road projects received local approval this week.

Both federally-funded projects will enhance traffic safety in the borough, according to transportation planner Donald C. Galligan.

Improvements on Badger Road are likely to attract more commercial activity to the area — the fastest growing area of the Fairbanks North Star Borough, a July 10 memorandum from Galligan to the Planning Commission stated.

"It would be unlikely that a major retailer would be attracted by a relatively small improvement like this, but strip malls and service stations with convenience stores could be expected once the improvement was complete," Galligan wrote.

The commission endorsed both road projects on Tuesday night after the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities requested local approval. The votes were unanimous, Galligan said.
