Overview

Too many Virginians who dedicate their careers to public service struggle when making the transition into the private sector. Skills built through service — discipline, leadership, technical expertise — are real and valuable, but our economy often fails to connect them to private-sector opportunity.

John Reid's *Pathways for Public Servants* plan respects service, rewards hard work, and ensures a smooth transition into private careers that strengthen Virginia's workforce and economy.

Key Components

1. Service-to-Workforce Pathways

- Build structured career bridges between public service and private work.
- Partner with Virginia businesses, trade schools, and universities to connect displaced public employees with high-demand sectors including:
 - Health care
 - Cybersecurity
 - Logistics
 - Skilled trades
- Ensure every public servant leaving government has a clear "on-ramp" to opportunity.

2. Private-Sector Incentives

- Offer short-term tax incentives to Virginia businesses that hire and train former public employees.
- o Incentives tied to retention and results not just paperwork or temporary hires.
- Address workforce shortages while honoring public service.

3. Skill Certification & Accountability

- Develop a certification system that translates public-sector experience into privatesector qualifications.
- Recognize leadership, management, and technical skills earned in government service.
- Require accountability measures, with workers and employers both investing in training.



4. Respect for Taxpayers

- Keep the implementation lean and cost-conscious.
- Focus on partnerships and results, not bureaucracy.
- o Ensure taxpayers receive value for investment while strengthening Virginia's economy.
