On motion of Ms. Bohannan, seconded by Ms. Van Vrancken, the following resolution was offered:

RESOLUTION NO. 148936

A resolution declaring the intention of Consolidated Sewerage District No. 1 of the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana to issue Taxable Sewer Revenue Bonds, in one or more series, in an amount not to exceed Twenty Million and No/100 Dollars (\$20,000,000) for the purpose of constructing, acquiring and equipping improvements to the wastewater disposal and treatment facilities of the District; making application to the Louisiana State Bond Commission for consent and authority to issue, sell and deliver the Sewer Revenue Bonds; and providing for other matters in connection therewith. (Parishwide)

WHEREAS, Chapter 9, Part I, Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (La. R.S. 33:3881, et seq.), provides for the creation by parish governing authorities of sewerage districts within their respective parishes, and provides for the powers of such sewerage districts, the governing authority thereof, and other provisions relating thereto; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the aforesaid authority, the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana (the “Parish”), acting through this Parish Council as its governing authority (the “Governing Authority”), adopted Ordinance No. 18420 on December 4, 1991, creating Consolidated Sewerage District No. 1 of the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana (the “Issuer” or “District”), consisting of all of that territory situated on the west bank of the Parish, with the exception of that territory contained within the corporate limits of the City of Gretna (except that portion of the City of Gretna that is contained within Jefferson Parish Precincts 12-G and 13-G, as those precincts are constituted as of May 15, 2013, shall be included within the District); the City of Westwego and the Town of Grand Isle; and all of that territory situated on the east bank of the Parish, with the exception of that territory contained within the corporate limits of the City of Harahan and the City of Kenner; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the foregoing, the Issuer owns and operates a wastewater collection, treatment and disposal system (the “System”), as a revenue-producing work of public improvement; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer wishes to issue sewer revenue bonds, as hereinafter described, for the purpose of providing funds (i) for the following priority projects: construction of new lift station at Hillcrest and Shawn Drive; replace 900HP pumps at Eastbank Wastewater Treatment Plant; and funding for Inflow and Infiltration Pipe Replacement Program (collectively, the “Project”) and (ii) paying the costs of issuance thereof; and

WHEREAS, this Council, as Governing Authority of the Issuer, proposes to issue not to exceed Twenty Million and No/100 Dollars (\$20,000,000) of Sewer Revenue Bonds (the “Bonds”), in one or more series, in the manner prescribed by and under the authority of Article 6, **Section 37** of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, the Consolidated Local Government Public Finance Act (La. R.S. 39:501 through 531, as amended), La. R.S. 30:2304, and other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto (collectively, the “Act”), said Bonds to be secured by and payable from a pledge and dedication of revenues derived from the System and user fees of the Issuer pursuant to the authority contained in the Act, subject to the prior payment of the reasonable and necessary expenses of operating and maintaining the System; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer has filed an application with the Clean Water State Revolving Fund Loan Program operated by the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality (“DEQ”) for financial assistance to fund the Project, and DEQ has indicated that it will lend funds to the Issuer pursuant to the terms of that certain Commitment Letter dated as of November 3, 2025 and purchase the Bonds in order to finance the Project; and

WHEREAS, this Governing Authority now desires to give notice of intention pursuant to the Act to issue not to exceed Twenty Million and No/100 Dollars (\$20,000,000) of bonds or other indebtedness to finance the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer seeks approval of the Louisiana State Bond Commission to issue not to exceed Twenty Million and No/100 Dollars (\$20,000,000) Taxable Sewer Revenue Bonds, in one or more series.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Jefferson Parish Council, acting as the Governing Authority of Consolidated Sewerage District No. 1 of the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana, that:

SECTION 1. Intent to Issue Revenue Bonds. Pursuant to and in compliance with the provisions of the Act, and other constitutional and statutory authority, this Governing Authority does hereby declare its intention to issue not to exceed Twenty Million and No/100 Dollars (\$20,000,000) of Taxable Sewer Revenue Bonds (the “Bonds”), or other evidences of indebtedness, in the name of the Issuer, in one or more series, the proceeds of which will be used to pay a portion of the cost of the Project, paying all costs and expenses in connection with the issuance of said Bonds and funding a debt service reserve fund therefor, if required. The Bonds will be issued pursuant to General Bond Ordinance No. 24406 adopted by this Governing Authority on January 16, 2013, as amended by this Governing Authority on December 8, 2021 and February 16, 2022 (collectively, the “General Bond Ordinance”), and a series ordinance to be adopted in the manner set forth in said General Bond Ordinance.

All of the Bonds shall be limited and special revenue bonds of the Issuer, secured by and payable in principal, interest and redemption premium, if any, solely from a pledge and dedication of revenues derived from the System and user fees of the Issuer pursuant to the authority contained in the Act, after paying the reasonable and necessary expenses of operating and maintaining the System, and shall be issued on a parity with the Issuer’s outstanding (a) Taxable Sewer Revenue Bonds, Series 2013, currently outstanding in the amount of \$5,549,683; (b) Taxable Sewer Revenue Bonds, Series 2014, currently outstanding in the amount of \$10,472,000; (c) Taxable Sewer Revenue Bonds, Series 2017, currently outstanding in the amount of \$14,183,000; and (d) Sewer Revenue Bonds, Series 2022, currently outstanding in the amount of \$86,450,000 (collectively, the “Outstanding Parity Bonds”).

The Bonds shall not be a charge on the other income and revenues of the Issuer as prohibited under the provisions of Article VI, **Section 37** of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, nor shall they constitute an indebtedness or pledge of the general credit of the Issuer. The Bonds shall be of such series, bear such dates, mature at such time or times, not to exceed twenty-two (22) years from their date of issuance, bear interest at such rate or rates not exceeding one percent (1.00%) per annum, be sold at such price or prices, be in such denomination or denominations, be in fully registered form, carry such registration privileges, be payable in such medium of payment and at such place or places, be subject to such terms of redemption and be entitled to such priorities on the income and revenues of the System as the Issuer may provide by ordinance(s) adopted at the time or times of issuance of the Bonds.

The Issuer will, in such ordinance(s), enter into such covenants with the future owner or owners of the Bonds as to the management and operation of the System, the imposition and collection of rates and charges for the services rendered thereby, the disposition of such fees and revenues, the issuance of future bonds and the creation of future liens and encumbrances against the System and the revenues therefrom, the carrying of insurance on the System and the disposition of the proceeds of insurance, the keeping of books and records, and other pertinent matters as may be deemed proper by this Governing Authority to assure the marketability of the Bonds, consistent with the provisions of the Act and other applicable laws and regulations. Such ordinance(s) will also include remedies in case of default, provision for the issuance of parity bonds, and such additional covenants, agreements and provisions as are judged advisable or necessary by the Issuer for the security of the registered owners of the Bonds, including sinking funds and reserves for the payment of principal and interest on the Bonds and an adequate depreciation fund for those repairs, extensions and improvements to the System as may be necessary to assure adequate and efficient service to the public, all as provided by the Act.

SECTION 2. Sale of Bonds. The Bonds are expected to be sold as a private sale to DEQ pursuant to the Consolidated Local Government Public Finance Act, and the purchase price of the Bonds will be paid by DEQ to the Issuer in installments, in the manner and under the terms and conditions set forth in a loan agreement to be entered into at the time of delivery of the Bonds.

SECTION 3. Public Hearing. This Governing Authority will meet in open and public session, on Wednesday, September 30, 2026 at TEN O’CLOCK (10:00) A.M., at the Council Chambers on the 2nd floor of the Yenni Building located at 1221 Elmwood Park Blvd., Jefferson, Louisiana, or at an earlier or later regular or special meeting of the Governing Authority to be determined by the Council, in consultation with Bond Counsel and duly advertised in the manner provided by law, to hear any objections to the proposed issuance of the Bonds; provided, however, if at such hearing a petition or petitions duly signed by the electors of the Issuer in an aggregate number not less than five percent (5%) of the number of the electors of the Issuer voting in the last special or general election held in the Issuer object to the issuance of the Bonds, then the Bonds shall not be issued until approved by a vote of a majority of the qualified electors of the Issuer who vote at a special election held for that purpose in the manner provided by Chapter 6-A, Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950. Any such petition shall be accompanied by a certificate of the Jefferson Parish Registrar of Voters certifying that the signers of the petition are registered electors of the Issuer and the number of signers amounts to not less than five percent (5%) of the registered voters that voted in the last election held in the Issuer, all as provided by the Act.

SECTION 4. Notice of Intention. The Issuer is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to publish an appropriate notice of the intention of the Issuer to issue the Bonds in accordance with the provisions of this resolution and the Act. Such notice of intention shall be published in four (4) consecutive weekly issues of the official journal of the Issuer, and shall be in substantially the following form, with any such changes as may be necessary upon the advice of Bond Counsel:

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ISSUE NOT TO EXCEED \$20,000,000 OF TAXABLE SEWER REVENUE BONDS OF CONSOLIDATED SEWERAGE DISTRICT NO. 1 OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, STATE OF LOUISIANA

As provided by a resolution adopted by the Jefferson Parish Council, acting as the governing authority of Consolidated Sewerage District No. 1 of the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana (the “Issuer”), on July 22, 2026, the Issuer HEREBY DECLARES ITS INTENTION to issue not to exceed TWENTY MILLION AND NO/100 Dollars (\$20,000,000) of sewer revenue bonds (the “Bonds”), for the purpose of paying the cost of constructing, acquiring and equipping improvements to the wastewater disposal and treatment facilities of the Issuer (the “System”).

The Bonds will be limited and special revenue bonds of the Issuer, secured by and payable solely from a pledge and dedication of revenues derived from the System and user fees of the Issuer, after there have been paid from those revenues the reasonable and necessary expenses of operating and maintaining the System. The Bonds will not be a charge on the other income and revenues of the Issuer or the Issuer, nor shall they constitute an indebtedness or pledge of the general credit of the Issuer or the Issuer. The Bonds will be issued on a parity with the Issuer’s outstanding (a) Taxable Sewer Revenue Bonds, Series 2013, currently outstanding in the amount of \$5,549,683; (b) Taxable Sewer Revenue Bonds, Series 2014, currently outstanding in the amount of \$10,472,000; (c) Taxable Sewer Revenue Bonds, Series 2017, currently outstanding in the amount of \$14,183,000; and (d) Sewer Revenue Bonds, Series 2022, currently outstanding in the amount of \$86,450,000, pursuant to the authority of Article 6, **Section 37** of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, the Consolidated Local Government Public Finance Act (La. R.S. 39:501 through 531, as amended), La. R.S. 30:2304, and other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto (collectively, the “Act”).

The Bonds will be issued and authorized by ordinance(s) adopted by the governing authority of the Issuer, in one or more series, will mature up to twenty-two (22) years from their date of issuance, will bear interest at rates up to one percent (1.00%), and will be subject to prepayment anytime without penalty.

As provided by the Act, all of the other details of the Bonds will be set forth in the ordinance(s) authorizing their issuance, including the following: covenants relating to the management and operation of the System, the imposition and collection of rates and charges from the System’s customers, the expenditure of such rates and charges, the issuance of future bonds and the creation of future liens and encumbrances against the System and all other pertinent matters as may be necessary to the authorization and issuance of the Bonds.

The Bonds are expected to be sold at a private sale, as provided for in the Act, to the Clean Water State Revolving Fund Loan Program, and the Bonds will also be approved by the State Bond Commission prior to their delivery.

THE PUBLIC IS HEREBY NOTIFIED that the governing authority of the Issuer will meet in open and public session on Wednesday, September 30, 2026 at TEN O’CLOCK (10:00) A.M., at the Council Chambers on the 2nd floor of the Yenni Building located at 1221 Elmwood Park Blvd., Jefferson, Louisiana, or at another regular or special meeting of the governing authority as may be determined by the Council in consultation with Bond Counsel and duly advertised in the manner provided by law, to hear any objections to the proposed issuance of the Bonds. If at such hearing a petition duly signed by electors of the Issuer in a number not less than five percent (5%) of the number of such electors voting in the last election object to the issuance of the Bonds, then the Bonds shall not be issued until approved at an election held for that purpose. Any such petition must be accompanied by a certificate of the Jefferson Parish Registrar of Voters certifying that the signers of the petition(s) are registered

electors of the Issuer and the number of signers amounts to not less than five percent (5%) of the registered voters that voted in the last election held in the Issuer, all as provided by the Act.

CONSOLIDATED SEWERAGE DISTRICT NO. 1 OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON, STATE OF LOUISIANA

SECTION 5. State Bond Commission. Application is hereby formally made to the Louisiana State Bond Commission, for approval of not to exceed \$20,000,000 of taxable sewer revenue bonds of the Issuer, to mature on or before twenty-two (22) years from the date thereof and to bear interest at a rate not to exceed one percent (1.00%) per annum, as described above. A certified copy of this resolution shall be submitted to the State Bond Commission by the Clerk of the Council and Bond Counsel, together with a request for prompt consideration and approval of this application.

By virtue of the Issuer’s application for, acceptance and utilization of the benefits of the Louisiana State Bond Commission’s approval(s) resolved and set forth herein, it resolves that the Issuer understands and agrees that such approval(s) are expressly conditioned upon, and it further resolves that it understands, agrees and binds itself, its successors and assigns, to full and continuing compliance with the “State Bond Commission Policy on Approval of Proposed Use of Swaps, or other forms of Derivative Products Hedges, Etc.”, adopted by the State Bond Commission on July 20, 2006, as to the borrowing(s) and other matter(s) subject to the approval(s), including subsequent application and approval under said Policy of the implementation or use of any swap(s) or other product(s) or enhancement(s) covered thereby.

SECTION 6. Bond Counsel. It is hereby determined and declared that the Becknell Law Firm, APLC, Metairie, Louisiana (“Bond Counsel”) shall provide legal services as bond counsel to the Issuer to do and to perform comprehensive, legal and coordinate professional work with respect to the issuance and sale of the Bonds, pursuant to that certain Professional Services Contract between the Parish of Jefferson and The Becknell Law Firm dated April 3, 2026 and pursuant to the provisions of Resolution No. 148174 adopted on March 16, 2026. The meeting opened at 5:00 p.m. with Director Danos leading the meeting at the Grand Isle Port Office Building located at 2757 Louisiana Highway 1 until the end of 2026. The commissioners present were Terrill Pizani, Kerry Besson and Ernie Ballard. Commissioners John Cheramie and Patrick Landry were absent.

A motion was made by Commissioner Pizani, seconded by Commissioner Besson, and unanimously agreed to approve the minutes of the meeting held on June 11, 2026, as read.

Director Danos discussed invoices and checks made for the prior month with the board. He went over checks that were written that were not normal everyday invoices. A motion was made by Commissioner Besson, seconded by Commissioner Pizani, and unanimously agreed to approve the financial report and pay all invoices associated with operating the port commission.

Jeff Meyers from PEEC addressed the board and gave the following report: 1. The GIPC has received a grant from HUD in the amount of \$2.7 M for improvements to the Oak Lane Dock Facility. 2.Repair s to Oak Lane Dock Facility Phase 1 and 2 and Shrimp facility are complete. 3. C and O Marine is working on the Oyster Processing Facility. 4. The Oyster Farm 2 expansion is on hold until the new layout has been approved. 5. The plans and specifications for the Drainage Pump is complete. 6. 2026 Capital Outlay proposals were submitted on behalf of the port.

Director Danos stated that: 1. Collected \$198.00 for a new slip lease. 2. Collected \$16,704.00 for Slip Renewal Fees which total 18 boat slips. Still have 10 boat slips not paid. A motion was made by Commissioner Ballard, seconded by Commissioner Besson and unanimously agreed to approve the Dried Shrimp Shed fee of \$6,000.00 for the first year. 3. Collected \$700.00 for Oyster Farm No 1 and collected \$3,000.00 for Oyster Farm No 2. Received a payment request from Mike Roberts to pay \$6,000.00 in 6 months. 4. Participated in on-line HUD Grantee Training Seminars. 5. Completed 2026 Preventing Sexual Harassment on-line training course. 6. Completed 2026 Supervisor Preventing sexual Harassment on-line training course. 7. Completed 2026 Cybersecurity on-line training course. 8. Submitted letter of support to USACE Colonel for dredging of Bayour Rigaud Project. 9. Request travel approval to go to Washington DC Jan 17 – 24, 2027. A motion was made by Commissioner Besson, seconded by Commissioner Pizani and unanimously agreed to approve all expenses associated with Director Danos going to Washington D.C. Jan 17 – 24, 2027.

Director Danos gave the commissioners a list of all boat slips at the Commercial Dock and all oyster farms that are rented.

Director Danos gave the commissioners GIPC Project Funding for all current projects.

Director Danos informed the board that GIPC has received a grant from HUD for \$2.7M and gave the commissioners what the money can be used for.

A motion was made by Commissioner Besson, seconded by Commissioner Ballard and unanimously agreed to approve Wright National Flood Insurance in the amount of \$1,712.00.

Director Danos informed the commissioners of an incident that happened at Oyster Farm 2. The board decided that the navigation lights need to be fixed and no other action was taken.

A motion was made by Commissioner Besson, seconded by Commissioner Pizani and unanimously agreed to adjourn the meeting at 6:16 p.m.
