SUMMARY NO. 25455 ORDINANCE NO. 25996
An ordinance amending the Official Zoning Map of Jefferson Parish, a portion of Lot 3A (Proposed Lot 3B), Fountain Park Centre Subdivision, located in the 1500 block of Central Park Blvd., bounded by Gretna Blvd., Heebe Canal, and Kings Rd.; more particularly amending the zoning classification from MUCD Mixed Use Corridor District to R-3 Multiple-Family Residential District, as requested under Planning Department Docket No. W-37-19. (Council District 3)

WHEREAS, a portion of Lot 3A (proposed Lot 3B), Fountain Park Centre Subdivision, located in the 1500 block of Central Park Blvd., bounded by Gretna Blvd., Heebe Canal, and Kings Rd is designated as MUCD Mixed Use Corridor District on the Official Zoning Map of Jefferson Parish; and

WHEREAS, Planning Department Docket No. WS-195-19-PF is the subdivision of Lot 3A into proposed Lots 3B and 3C Fountain Park Centre Subdivision; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Director of this Parish has caused to be duly advertised, as prescribed by law, a public hearing in connection with the zoning reclassification of said proposed Lot 3B under Docket No. W-37-19; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held by the Planning Advisory Board, in accordance with law; NOW, THEREFORE,

THE JEFFERSON PARISH COUNCIL HEREBY ORDAINS:

SUMMARY NO. 25433 ORDINANCE NO. 25998
An ordinance to amend Article VII, Division 3.1 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, in order to revise selection of persons for professional services requirements, and to provide for other related matters. (Parishwide)

THE JEFFERSON PARISH COUNCIL HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. That Section 2-927 of the Jefferson parish Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-927. – Advertisement for and receipt submittals.

a. The parish council shall by resolution authorize the parish clerk purchasing department to advertise for submittals of statements of qualifications from persons or firms interested in providing professional services to the parish for each project, other than routine engineering tasks and outside legal services, for which professional services are desired or required. The resolution shall set forth the content of the advertisement and shall be prepared by the department directly involved with the project. The resolution shall also identify (1) the account(s) by name and numerical description to which work under the contract shall be charged; (2) the budget(s), balance(s) and amount(s) of unencumbered funds in the account(s), if such amounts are established. Beginning November 1, 2020, all submittals shall be received electronically through the Jefferson Parish e-procurement system.

b.

- The advertisement for architectural, engineering and surveying projects, financial projects, insurance projects, and data processing projects shall include as a minimum the scope of work to be performed, the relative importance of the evaluation criteria, an estimate of the total cost of the project and the cost of the requested professional services needed for the project, the date and time by which a response is to be received, and the location and mailing address of the parish clerk to mail or deliver the responses. Beginning November 1, 2020, it shall include the Jefferson Parish e-procurement system to use to

submit responses electronically.

- For all other professional service projects, the advertisement shall include as a minimum the scope of work to be performed, the minimum qualifications necessary to be selected to perform the work and any other criteria for selection deemed to be relevant or desirable by the council, the date and time by which a response is to be received, and the location and mailing address of the parish clerk to mail or deliver the responses. Beginning November 1, 2020, it shall include the Jefferson Parish e-procurement system to use to submit responses electronically. The resolution authorizing the advertisement for such projects may create or name a committee to evaluate the responses for the project.

- Notwithstanding the provisions of this division, all selection of architects and engineers for community development projects shall be in accordance with the most recent guidelines provided by the area office of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development in those areas in which the federal guidelines conflict with the provisions of this division. In addition, all qualifications of contractors, businesses and vendors for work associated with the housing rehabilitation program as administered by the department of community development programs shall be in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 2, Article VII, Division 3.2 of this Code and with applicable federal guidelines.

c. The purchasing department parish clerk shall receive the submittals required under section 2-928(a) and forward copies of each submittal to each member of the council, and to each member of the technical evaluation committee for each project. The directors of the research and budget analysis staff shall also receive a list of all persons or firms submitting for each project. No submittals required under section 2-928(a) shall be accepted after the deadline. The purchasing department parish clerk shall also retain copies of all submittals in the parish records.

d. The purchasing department parish clerk shall also forward copies of the affidavits required under section 2-928(b) submitted for each project to each member of the council and shall retain a copy of same in the parish records.

SECTION 2. That Section 2-927.1(a) of the Jefferson parish Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-927.1 – Advertisement for and receipt of submittals for routine engineering tasks.

a. The parish council shall by resolution authorize the parish clerk purchasing department to advertise for submittals of statements of qualifications once every two (2) years from persons or firms interested in providing routine engineering tasks for each of the following categories of work: water, sewerage, drainage and streets for the parish. Beginning November 1, 2020, all submittals shall be received electronically through the Jefferson Parish e-procurement system.

SECTION 3. That Section 2-927.1(b) of the Jefferson parish Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-927.1 – Advertisement for and receipt of submittals for routine engineering tasks.

b. The technical evaluation committee shall evaluate the statement of qualifications from each person or firm and supply a list to the parish council, through the purchasing department parish clerk, of all firms demonstrating adequate qualifications for routine engineering tasks in each of the following categories of work; water, sewer, drainage and streets. The technical evaluation committee shall list all qualifying firms by category, without ranking them. The list will be valid for all routine engineering tasks until the next list is established.

SECTION 4. That Section 2-927.1(f) of the Jefferson parish Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-927.1 – Advertisement for and receipt of submittals for routine engineering tasks.

f. Supplemental list: Every six (6) months after the advertisement noted in section 2-927.1(a), the parish council shall by resolution authorize the purchasing department parish clerk to advertise for submittals of statements of qualifications from additional persons or firms interested in providing routine engineering tasks for water, sewerage, drainage or streets work for the parish who are not on the previously approved list established by the procedures outlined in section 2-927.1 section 2-927.1(a), (b), and (c) above. The technical evaluation committee shall evaluate each person or firm and supply a supplemental list to the parish council of all additional firms demonstrating adequate qualifications for routine engineering tasks in each of the following categories; water, sewer, drainage and streets. The technical evaluation committee shall list all qualifying firms by category without ranking them. The supplemental list will be valid for all routine engineering tasks until a new list is developed in accordance with 2-927.1; (a), (b) and (c) above.

SECTION 5. That Section 2-927.2(a) of the Jefferson parish Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-927.2 – Selection of attorneys to provide outside legal services in matters not covered by a contract of insurance.

a. The parish council shall, by resolution, authorize the parish clerk purchasing department to advertise for submittals of statements of qualifications once every two (2) years from persons or firms interested in providing outside legal services for each of the following categories of work: bond services; elections; administrative law and regulatory practice; antitrust law; business law; criminal justice; dispute resolution; environment, energy and resources; health law; intellectual property law; international law; labor and employment law; public contract law; public utilities law; communications law; transportation law; property; trust and estate law; science and technology law; state and local government law; taxation; tort trial and insurance practice; complex litigation (including asbestos litigation); securities; ethics law; civil service matters; civil rights and the constitution; municipality representation (including liability and intergovernmental conflicts); code enforcement matters; oil spill litigation; public finance; land use, planning and zoning law; economic development; construction law. Beginning November 1, 2020, all submittals shall be received electronically through the Jefferson Parish e-procurement system.

SECTION 6. That Section 2-927.2(b) of the Jefferson parish Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-927.2 – Selection of attorneys to provide outside legal services in matters not covered by a contract of insurance.

b. The legal services evaluation committee shall evaluate the statement of qualifications from each person or firm and supply a list to the parish council, through the purchasing department parish clerk, of all firms demonstrating adequate qualifications to perform outside legal services in each of the categories listed in section 2-927.2(a). The legal services evaluation committee shall list all qualifying firms by category, without ranking them. The list will be valid for all outside legal tasks until the next list is established.

SECTION 7. That Section 2-927.2(f) of the Jefferson parish Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-927.2 – Selection of attorneys to provide outside legal services in matters not covered by a contract of insurance.

f. Supplemental list: Every six (6) months after the advertisement noted in section 2-927.2(a), the parish council shall by resolution authorize the purchasing department parish clerk to advertise for submittals of statements of qualifications from additional persons or firms interested in providing outside legal services for each of the following categories of work: bond services; elections; administrative law and regulatory practice; antitrust law; business law; criminal justice; dispute resolution; environment, energy and resources; health law; intellectual property law; international law; labor and employment law; public contract law; public utilities law; communications law; transportation law; property; trust and estate law; science and technology law; state and local government law; taxation; tort trial and insurance practice; complex litigation (including asbestos litigation); securities; ethics law; civil service matters; civil rights and the constitution; municipality representation (including liability and intergovernmental conflicts); code enforcement matters; oil spill litigation; public finance; land use, planning and zoning law; economic development; construction law. Only persons or firms not previously approved on the list established by the procedures outlined in section 2-927.2 shall submit. The legal services evaluation committee shall evaluate each person or firm and supply a supplemental list to the parish council of all additional firms demonstrating adequate qualifications for outside legal services in each of the categories listed herein. The legal services evaluation committee shall list all qualifying firms by category without ranking them. The supplemental list will be valid for all outside legal services until a new list is developed in accordance with 2-927.2 (a), (b) and (c) above.

SECTION 8. That Section 2-928(a) of the Jefferson parish Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-928 – Required submittals.

a. In order to be considered for selection to perform professional services for the parish or for any of its departments or districts, the person or firm submitting must submit electronically:

- A signed copy of the applicable questionnaire as required in the advertisement that is most recently approved by the council, including professional license information, if applicable;
- Any other information required by the advertisement for the project and any additional information related to the technical abilities of the person or firm submitting, if specifically requested by the parish prior to the deadline for submittals; and
- All information as required by (1) and (2) above relative

to all subcontractors who would assist in providing professional services for the project.

SECTION 6. That Section 2-933(b) of the Jefferson parish Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-933(b) – Contract negotiation and approval.
b. Should the administration be unable to reach agreement with the person(s) or firm(s) selected by the council within sixty (60) days from the selection, the administration shall report to the council the reasons for the inability to reach agreement before the end of the sixty-day period and within each thirty-day period subsequent to the initial negotiating period for as long as the inability to reach agreement continues. Should the administration be unable to reach agreement with the person or firm selected by the selection committee, the administration shall request from the council authority to proceed to negotiate with an alternate person or firm from the list submitted to the council by the evaluation committee for the project. The council may at any time after the initial period, authorize the administration to negotiate with an alternate person or firm from the list submitted to the council by the evaluation committee for the project, may authorize the purchasing department parish clerk to readvertise for persons or firms wishing to provide professional services for the project or may cancel the selection of such persons or firms for the project. In any event, if a contract is not negotiated and approved within one (1) year from the date of the resolution making the selection, the selection shall become null and void.

SECTION 1. That Article VII, Division 2, Section 2-902 be amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE VII. DIVISION 2. UNIFORM PURCHASING PROCEDURES
Sec. 2-895. Request for proposal (RFP) process

6. Response(s) to RFP. All responses to an RFP shall be submitted electronically through the Jefferson Parish e-procurement system and shall be due on or before the advertised date and time deadline for receipt, provided that date shall not be less than thirty (30) days after the date of the first of three consecutive weekly publications in the official parish journal as defined in Section (4) above. Late proposals shall be rejected and shall not receive further consideration. Proposals should be submitted on the most favorable technical terms which the proposer is able to submit, and at the best price for which the proposer is able to submit. Each person or firm submitting an RFP proposal must submit with their proposal:

- An affidavit by the proposer attesting: (i) that the affiant has not and will not employ any person either directly or indirectly to secure the public contract under which he is to receive payment, other than persons regularly employed by the affiant whose service in connection with the project or in securing the public contract are in the regular course of their duties for the affiant; and (ii) that no part of the contract price was paid or will be paid to any person for soliciting the contract other than payment of normal compensation to persons regularly employed by the affiant whose services with the project are in the regular course of their duties for the affiant; and
2. An affidavit by the proposer attesting to: (i) any and all campaign contributions that the affiant has made to elected officials of the parish during the current term; and (ii) any and all debts owed by the affiant to any elected or appointed official of the parish, and any and debts owed by any elected or appointed official of the parish to the affiant; and (iii) that the affiant has not made any contribution to or in support of elected officials of the parish through or in the name of another person or firm either directly or indirectly. For purposes of this section, elected or appointed officials of the parish shall be limited to members of the Jefferson Parish Council and the Parish President; and
3. An affidavit by the proposer identifying any and all subcontractors, and/or persons, excluding full-time employees, who may assist in providing the item(s) and/or service(s) under any ensuing RFP agreement. Pre-placed emergency contracts, as defined by section 2-917, shall be exempted from submitting the affidavit described in this provision, section 2-895(f); however, a list of all subcontractors used in the performance of the pre-placed emergency contracts shall be submitted prior to payment on the contract.
4. Failure to timely submit the affidavits defined in (a) through (c) above in completed and notarized form shall result in the proposer's submission being deemed non-responsive by the RFP Evaluation Committee, and said submission shall receive no further consideration.

SECTION 2. That Article VII, Division 2, Section 2-902 be amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE VII. DIVISION 2. UNIFORM PURCHASING PROCEDURES
Sec. 2-902. Purchases less than or equal to five thousand dollars. Purchases less than or equal to five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) will require one (1) telephone or electronic quotation by the department requiring the purchase. The date, vendor's name, person contacted and the prices quoted shall become a permanent part of the transaction record. Good judgment must be exercised in choosing vendors whose past experience proves them to be generally competitive. This type of purchase should be equitably distributed with preference to the parish vendors. Under no circumstances shall there be a division or separation of any purchases or projects into smaller purchases or projects which bidding or separation would have the effect of avoiding the bidding requirements set forth herein.

SECTION 3. That Article VII, Division 2, Section 2-903 be amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE VII. DIVISION 2. UNIFORM PURCHASING PROCEDURES
Sec. 2-903. Purchases between five thousand dollars and for the purchase of materials and supplies the sum set in R.S. 38:2212.1, and for all public works below the contract limit, as defined in R.S. 38:2212.1.

For each purchase over five thousand dollars (\$5,000.01) and not exceeding the sum set in R.S. 38:2212.1, at least three (3) telephone or electronic quotes by the purchasing department shall be obtained when possible. The date, vendor's name, person contacted and the prices quoted shall become a permanent part of the transaction record. Prices shall not be shopped by departments.

SECTION 4. That Article VII, Division 2, Section 2-904 be amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE VII. DIVISION 2. UNIFORM PURCHASING PROCEDURES
Sec. 2-904. Purchases exceeding contract limits for bids under state bid laws.

Advertisement for bids shall be required, pursuant to the regulations contained in state statutes, more particularly R.S. 38:2212.1, for the purchase of materials and supplies in excess of the sum set in R.S. 38:2212.1, and for all public works in excess of the contract limit, as defined in R.S. 38:2212.1.

SECTION 5. That Article VII, Division 2, Section 2-905 be amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE VII. DIVISION 2. UNIFORM PURCHASING PROCEDURES
Sec. 2-905. Purchases under state contract.

Materials or equipment may be purchased from current state contract price lists when it is economical or expedient to do so.

SECTION 6. That Article VII, Division 2, Section 2-906 be amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE VII. DIVISION 2. UNIFORM PURCHASING PROCEDURES
Sec. 2-906. Council authorization to advertise for bids

Prior council authorization to advertise for bids pursuant to Section 2-904 is required.

SECTION 7. That Article VII, Division 2, Section 2-907 be amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE VII. DIVISION 2. UNIFORM PURCHASING PROCEDURES
Sec. 2-907. – Procedure for departments, prior to adoption of a director declared emergency.

The following procedures shall be established for all parish departments and prior to a declaration of a director declared emergency:

- Written documentation stipulating the nature of the emergency situation shall be furnished by the director of the affected department to the finance director, parish attorney, parish president, and each member of the parish council;
- The finance director and the parish attorney shall report to the parish president who shall recommend adoption of a director declared emergency by the parish council;
- The parish council, in accordance with provisions of Section 2.07(F) of the Charter, may adopt such a director declared emergency and make it effective immediately.
- Each director declared emergency shall include the exact nature of the emergency, the estimated cost of emergency operations and the expected duration of the emergency situation;
- If the estimated cost and/or duration of the emergency are exceeded, the director may be requested to appear before the parish council to explain said cost overruns and/or delays.

SECTION 8. That Article VII, Division 2, Section 2-908 be amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE VII. DIVISION 2. UNIFORM PURCHASING PROCEDURES
Sec. 2-908. – Emergency purchases.

a. Defined. Emergency purchases covered by this section are those for:

- Materials, supplies and equipments which cost less than the sum set in R.S. 38:2212.1; and for
- Public works which cost less than the state statutes requirement set in R.S. 38:2212 for advertisement; and
- Which must be handled immediately in order

that lack of materials, supplies and equipment or breakdowns do not seriously hamper the operations of the parish.

b. *Authority of purchasing director.* Emergency requisitions should be entered with a full explanation of the emergency. If a true emergency does exist, the purchasing director or chief buyer is authorized to expedite the purchase without delay, exercising as much diligence for the sake of the economy as time will permit.

c. *Requisition by telephone.* The purchasing department may accept an emergency requisition by the telephone and act immediately as above. The initiating department must send a written requisition to purchasing within twenty-four (24) hours, with full explanation of the emergency.

d. *Authority of department head.* In extraordinary cases, when the purchasing department is closed and the purchasing director or chief buyer cannot be contacted, the head of the initiating department may place the necessary emergency order. The written requisition with a full explanation must be sent to the purchasing department within twenty-four (24) hours.

e. Emergency purchases exceeding the amounts established above shall be acquired by following the emergency procedures set forth in R.S. 38:2212.

f. All mandatory affidavits required for normal purchases shall still apply to emergency purchases, except that the said affidavits and disclosure forms shall be supplied prior to the issuance of the last payment. The finance director shall be required to verify compliance before the last payment is made.

SECTION 9. That Article VII, Division 2, Section 2-909 be amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE VII. DIVISION 2. UNIFORM PURCHASING PROCEDURES
Sec. 2-909. – Council action on bids.

All bids received pursuant to Section 2-904 shall be placed on the agenda for action by the council at its next scheduled meeting pursuant to R.S. 38:2215.

SECTION 10. That Article VII, Division 2, Section 2-910 be amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE VII. DIVISION 2. UNIFORM PURCHASING PROCEDURES
Sec. 2-910. – Federal procurement procedures, when applicable.

a. Whenever equipment, materials, or supplies are purchased or public works are constructed in whole or in part with federal funds pursuant to a grant, contract or cooperative endeavor agreement, and the provisions thereof, or any federal rule, regulation or law, set forth mandatory procedures for such procurements, the department of in charge of the project and the purchasing department shall follow such procurement procedures regulation which would otherwise be applicable.

b. Whenever equipment, materials, or supplies are purchased or public works are constructed in whole or in part with federal funds pursuant to a grant, contract or cooperative endeavor agreement, and the provisions thereof, of any federal rule, regulation or law, set forth discretionary or optional procedures for such procurements, the department in charge of the project or the purchasing department may, on a case-by-case basis following council authorization by resolution, comply with the applicable federal rule, regulation or law, notwithstanding the existence of any local or state law or regulation which would otherwise be applicable.

c. The purchasing department shall establish policies within their handbook regarding federal procurement.

SECTION 11. That Article VII, Division 2, Section 2-911 be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-911. – Procurement of surety bonds and insurance.
