An ordinance submitted under Docket No. WS-125-25 approving the Preliminary Plat of subdivision of Lot H-321-H-2E, Ames Farms Subdivision, Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, into Lots 1-47, Mary Ann Estates Subdivision, Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, with a waiver to the general design standards in accordance with Sec. 33-2.35 Subdivision Waivers of the Unified Development Code, and the dedication of Mary Ann Drive, Ramon Matthew Court, Chevy Court, Mileena Court and an extension of Le Mans Drive and Marie St., and a five (5) foot utility and drainage servitudes, which lots are owned by HCLD, L.L.C. (Council District 1)

WHEREAS, HCLD, L.L.C. is the owner of Lot H-321-H-2E, Ames Farms Subdivision, Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, which was acquired by Act before Claudia Trapani, Notary Public, dated September 23, 2025 registered in COB 3516 Folio 509, Parish of Jefferson; and

WHEREAS, said owner desires to subdivide said Lot into Lots to be designated as Lots1-47, Mary Ann Estates Subdivision; and

WHEREAS, the proposed lots shown on the Preliminary Plat prepared by Tildon J. Dufrene, Jr., L.S., dated September 26, 2025, shall not be recorded or for sale until Final Plat approval and acceptance; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Director of this Parish has caused to be duly advertised, as prescribed by law, a public hearing in connection with the subdivision of said lots under Docket No. WS-125-25; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held by the Planning Advisory Board, in accordance with the law.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE JEFFERSON PARISH COUNCIL HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. That the Preliminary Plat of Tildon J. Dufrene, Jr., L.S., dated September 26, 2025 showing the subdivision of Lot H-321-H-2E, Ames Farms Subdivision, Jefferson Parish,

Louisiana into Lots 1-47, Mary Ann Estates Subdivision, Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, and the dedication of Mary Ann Drive, Ramon Matthew Court, Chevy Court, Mileena Court and an extension of Le Mans Drive and Marie St., and a five (5) foot utility servitude and drainage servitudes in accordance with said plan, is hereby approved.

SECTION 2. That in accordance with **Section 33-2.35** of the Unified Development Code (UDC), Subdivision Waivers, the lot orientation regulation of Sec. 33-6.6.1.g)(1) for Lots 44 and 45 is hereby waived, approved and accepted.

provider is located underground Grantee shall be required to install the System underground. In those areas where Grantee is permitted to go above ground, Grantee agrees that no new poles are allowed under this Franchise, however any existing failing pole can be replaced with a new pole.

- (c) The purpose of the System of Grantee is to operate a fiber optic communications network pursuant to Chapter 35.5 of the Jefferson Parish Code of Ordinances ("Chapter 35.5").
 - i. Grantee agrees that the System will be operated solely for the purposes stated in **Section 1**(a) above and that any other operation of the System for other purposes shall constitute a violation of a material provision of the Franchise.
 - ii. Grantee agrees that the System will not be operated for subscribers or customers as defined in Jefferson Parish Code of Ordinances 35.5-3.
 - iii. Grantee agrees that any construction above the ground surface shall require prior approval from the Parish of Jefferson.
 - iv. Grantee agrees to abide by all requirements of Chapter 35.5 that are not in direct conflict herein.
 - v. Grantee agrees to become a member of and participate in a regional notification center as outlined in LRS 40:1749.14.

SECTION 2.

- (a) The non-exclusive Franchise hereby granted shall be for a period of one (1) year effective the date of the franchise, i.e., the date of acceptance of the franchise by Grantee after passage of this ordinance which grants the franchise.
- (b) The annual fee to be paid by Grantee for the Franchise shall be the greater of five percent (5%) of Grantee's gross receipts from the operation of the telecommunications system within the Parish or the footage rates as outlined in Chapter 35.5-8(a)(2).
- (c) The maximum annual franchise fee based on footage rates shall be twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00). However, any year in which five percent (5%) of Grantee's gross receipts exceeds twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) and all CPI-U increases, the franchise fee shall be five (5) percent of Grantee's gross receipts from the operation of the telecommunications system.
- (d) All payments calculated by the per foot usage rates, other than the initial annual franchise fee which is due upon Grantee's acceptance of the Franchise, are due and payable one (1) year in advance and shall be paid annually by January 1 of each year. Payments calculated on a gross receipt's basis are payable quarterly, within thirty (30) days after the end of the preceding calendar quarter. If any payment is not received by the due date, Grantee shall add to its payment a late penalty in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the amount due. Interest in the amount of ten percent (10%) per annum shall accrue on all payments and penalties until paid in full.
- (e) Contemporaneous with the payment of the franchise fee, the Grantee shall file with Grantor, through the Parish President, a statement of gross receipts for the relevant period certified as complete and accurate by a responsible Grantee representative and that the statement may be relied upon by third parties.
- (f) The compensation and other payments to be made by Grantee pursuant to the Franchise shall be in addition to any and all taxes and fees or charges which the Grantee or any affiliated Person shall be required to pay to Grantor or to any other governmental entity. Neither the Grantee nor any affiliated Person of Grantee shall have or make any claim for any deduction or other credit of all or any part of the amount of compensation or other payments made pursuant to the Franchise against any other fees or charges, including ad valorem taxes and/or any taxes, which Grantee or any such affiliated Person is required to pay to Grantor.
- (g) Both the Grantor and the Grantee expressly reserve all rights they may have under federal and state law to the maximum extent possible. Subject to Louisiana Civil Code Articles 1906 et. seq., neither the Grantor nor the Grantee shall be deemed to have waived any rights they may now have or may acquire in the future pursuant to this Franchise.

SECTION 3.

- (a) Unless otherwise provided in this Ordinance, this non-exclusive Franchise is granted under, and subject to, the conditions and terms herein stated, and the administrative rules and regulations of the Parish and its Departments, Chapter 35.5 of the Code of Ordinances of the Parish of Jefferson, and the Home Rule Charter ("Charter") of the Parish, the conditions and terms of which are made part of the Franchise as though copied and set forth herein, all as the same may be subsequently amended. Nothing in this Franchise shall be deemed to constitute a waiver or limitation of any powers of supervision, regulation and control of the Council of the Parish of Jefferson ("Council"). Grantee shall comply with all federal and state laws, as well as all ordinances, resolutions, rules, and regulations of Grantor heretofore or hereafter adopted or established during the term of the Franchise including, but not limited to, all zoning and subdivision regulations of the Parish.
- (b) Grantor asserts, and Grantee agrees, that the purpose of the Franchise is declared to be for a public purpose and affecting the health, safety, and welfare of the general public, consistent with the maximum permissible exercise of the general Home Rule Charter and police powers of the Parish.
- (c) Any member of the Council or any Parish official or employee or agent charged with the enforcement of the provisions of the Franchise, acting for Grantor in the discharge of his duties, shall not thereby render himself personally liable for any act of commission or omission and such official, employee or agent is hereby relieved from all and any personal liability or damages that might accrue to persons or property as a result of any act required or permitted in the discharge of his said duties under the provisions of the Franchise.
- (d) Grantee shall not be relieved of its obligation to comply with any of the provisions of the Franchise by reason of any failure of Grantor to enforce prompt compliance of its provisions. Should the State of Louisiana, the Louisiana Public Service Commission ("LPSC"), the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") or any other agency of the state or federal government require Grantee to perform or cease to perform any act which is not consistent with any provision(s) of the Franchise, Grantee shall so notify Grantor, in writing, of such requirement(s).
- (e) Upon receipt of such notification, Grantor, after consultation with Grantee, shall determine if a material provision of the Franchise is affected, breached or violated. Upon such a determination, Grantor in consultation with Grantee shall have the right to modify or amend any of the provisions of the Franchise to such extent as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the full intent and purpose of the Franchise. Grantor may terminate the Franchise in the event Grantor determines that substantial and material compliance with the terms and provisions of the Franchise is frustrated by such state or federal law requirements. In such event, Grantee's rights are reserved to pursue whatever remedies it may have and to comply with the duties and obligations which may be imposed upon it by state or federal law.
- (f) Notwithstanding any provision contained herein or in the Franchise or in the Ordinances of the Parish of Jefferson to the contrary, in the event any one or more of the provisions contained herein shall for any reason be determined to be unenforceable, unlawful or invalid in any respect under law, regulation or court decision, either Grantor or Grantee shall have the right to request that the terms of the Franchise be renegotiated in order to bring the Franchise into compliance with such law, regulation or court decision.

SECTION 4.

- (a) Security Franchise Bond: No later than the date of Grantee's execution of the acceptance of the Franchise, Grantee shall post a performance bond in accordance with the applicable procedures, in an amount of One Hundred Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$100,000.00); the bond shall contain the following endorsement: "It is hereby understood and agreed that this bond may not be cancelled by the surety nor any intention not to renew be exercised by the surety until sixty (60) days after receipt by the Parish of Jefferson, by registered or certified mail, of written notice of such intent." Said bond shall effectuate the following purposes:
 - i. The faithful performance by Grantee of all the provisions of the franchise; and
 - ii. Compliance by Grantee with all orders, permits and directions of any agency of Grantor having jurisdiction over Grantee's acts or defaults pursuant to this Franchise; and
 - iii. The payment by Grantee of any claims, liens, fees and/or taxes due Grantor which may arise by reason of the construction, operation or maintenance of the System. Posting the security for the franchise does not fulfill the separate requirements for a completion and restoration bond that may be required for the issuance of a utility construction

permit for construction related to a franchise.

- (b) Security Maintenance: The maintenance of the franchise bond ("Security") as provided in subsection (a) of this section shall be a continuing obligation of Grantee which shall continue until Grantee has satisfied all of its obligations to Grantor that may arise by the acceptance of the Franchise by Grantee or from its exercise of any privilege or right granted by the Franchise. If the Grantee: (1) fails to pay to Grantor any fees due and unpaid; or (2) fails, after ten (10) days' notice, to repay to Grantor any damages, costs or expenses which Grantor shall be required to pay by reason of any act of commission or omission and/or default of Grantee in connection with the Franchise; (3) fails to pay Grantor any fees due; or (4) fails, after thirty (30) days' notice of any such failure described above, to comply with any provisions of the Franchise which Grantor reasonably determines can be remedied by a claim against the Security, Grantor may without further notice to Grantee demand payment out of the Security a sum in satisfaction of its obligation for its failure to pay as provided in this subsection (b).
- (c) Security Restoration and Refund: Within thirty (30) days after notice to Grantee that any amount has been paid to Grantor from the franchise bond pursuant to the provisions above, Grantee shall restore the balance in the Security to its original amount. The original balance amount may be restored by the Grantee submitting an additional bond equal in amount to the amount paid to Grantor. In the event that the Franchise is terminated by reason of default by Grantee, to the extent that such default is for non-payment of any amount due and payable pursuant to the Franchise, a claim equal to the amount of the non-payment may be made against the franchise bond.
- (d) Reservation of Rights: The rights reserved to Grantor with respect to the Security are in addition to all other rights of Grantor, whether reserved by this Article or authorized by law, and no action, proceeding or exercise of a right with respect to such Security shall affect any other right Grantor may have.

SECTION 5.

- (a) Indemnification: Grantee shall indemnify Grantor for all damage to Parish property and hold Grantor harmless for all injury to third parties and for damage to the property of third parties that is the result of or arises out of Grantee's negligent use, installation, maintenance, repair and/or operation of its telecommunications system whether or not any act or omission complained of is authorized, allowed, or prohibited by the Franchise. In the event any claim is made against the Parish related to this franchise and a court of competent jurisdiction should adjudge, by final decree, that Grantor is liable therefor, Grantee shall indemnify and hold Grantor harmless of any from any judgment and/or liability, including any court costs, expenses, and attorney fees incurred by Grantor in defense thereof. Upon commencement of any proceeding at law or in equity against Grantor relating to or covering any matter covered by this Section, where Grantee has agreed, by the act of accepting Franchise, to indemnify and hold Grantor harmless, or to pay said final judgment and costs, as proceeding brought in connection therewith, and Grantee shall pay all costs and fees, as aforesaid, as well as any final judgment or judgments that may be rendered against Grantor.
- (b) Right to Defend: Upon failure of Grantee to defend Grantor under this section, after reasonable notice to it by Grantor, Grantor shall have the right to defend the same and in addition to being reimbursed for any such judgment that may be rendered against Grantor, together with all court costs incurred therein, Grantee shall further reimburse Grantor its attorney's fees, including those employed by Grantor in such case or cases, as well as all expenses incurred by Grantor by reason of undertaking the defense of such suit or suits, whether such suit or suits are successfully defended, settled, compromised, or fully adjudicated against Grantor. Grantee shall pay all expenses incurred by Grantor in defending itself with regard to all damages and penalties and/or interest mentioned above and for all claims against Grantor arising out of the Franchise. These expenses shall include all reasonable out-of-pocket expenses, such as attorney fees, and shall also include the reasonable value of any services rendered by any employee of Grantor. Grantee shall also reimburse Grantor for any such fees and costs incurred by Grantor in an action against Grantee for reimbursement owed to Grantor under this Franchise.
- (c) Settlement authority: In the event Grantor is compelled to undertake the defense of any such suit by reason of Grantee's failure to perform as here and above provided, Grantor shall have the full right and authority to make or enter into any settlement or compromise of such adjudication as the Parish Attorney shall deem in the best interest of Grantor, without the prior approval or consent of Grantee.
- (d) With the exception of negligence or willful misconduct of the Grantor, as described above, Grantor shall not be liable for any damage occurring to the Grantee's system caused by the Grantor, its officers, agents, employees, or independent contractors, in the performance of their duties in connection with public works, nor shall the Grantor be held liable for the interruption of service by actions of the Grantor, its officers, agents, employees, or independent contractors, in the performance of their duties in connection with public works. When reasonably possible, Grantee shall be consulted prior to any public work affecting its telecommunications system. In the event of an emergency, Grantor may not notify Grantee prior to commencing public work affecting Grantee's system. However, in the event such an emergency exists, Grantor will notify Grantee of such public work within twenty-four (24) hours of commencing work, or as soon as is reasonably possible.

SECTION 6.

- (a) Insurance: The Grantee shall provide at its own expense, proof of the following insurance coverage by insurance companies authorized to do business in the State of Louisiana. With the exception of the Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance policy, the Parish of Jefferson, its Districts, Departments and Agencies under the Direction of the Parish President and Parish Council jointly and severally, shall be included as additional insured(s) as their interest may appear under this agreement on all of the insurance policies for the entire period during which the equipment of the Grantee remains on the sites related to this franchise. Grantee shall furnish to Grantor certificate(s) of insurance evidencing current and continuing coverages as outlined below. Insurance shall be placed with insurers with an A.M. Best rating of no less than A.VI. and shall be in the following minimum amounts and in accordance with the following provisions.
 - (1) Worker's Compensation Insurance: As required by the Louisiana State Statute exception, employer's liability limit shall be \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence when work is to be over water and involves maritime exposures; otherwise, this limit shall be no less than \$500,000.00 per occurrence.
 - (2) Commercial General Liability Insurance with a Limit of \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage. This insurance shall include coverage for bodily injury and property damage and indicate the following coverages on the certificate of insurance: premises-operations, contractual liability, products and completed operations, use of contractors and sub-contractors, personal and advertising injury, broad form property damage and explosion, collapse and underground (XCU) claims. Combined single limits (CSL) amount of insurance required and each occurrence minimum limits shall be \$1,000,000.00.
 - (3) Commercial Automobile Liability Insurance with a Combined Single Limit of \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage, covering all owned, hired, or non-owned automobiles.
 - (4) Said policies shall apply as primary insurance and shall stipulate that no other insurance in effect by the Parish will be called on to contribute to a loss covered thereunder.
 - (5) The Parish has the right but not the obligation to review and approve all insurance policies and certificates of insurance prior to the issuance of a permit for the requested installation.
 - (6) Upon receipt of notice from its insurer(s) Grantee shall provide the Parish thirty (30) days' prior notice of a material change or cancellation of any required coverage and will submit a replacement certificate of insurance including the Parish as an additional insured as their interest may appear under this Agreement.
 - (7) Failure of the Grantee to take out and/or maintain insurance shall not relieve the Grantee from any liability under this permit, nor shall the insurance requirements be construed to conflict with the obligations of the Grantee concerning indemnification.
 - (8) All deductibles shall be assumed by the Grantee.

SECTION 7.

If any clause, phrase, portion, provision, section, or subsection of this Franchise is held to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, or deemed to be preempted by federal or state regulations or laws by a court of competent jurisdiction, such holding or preemption shall not affect any remainder of this Franchise which can reasonably be given effect.

SECTION 8.

Grantee agrees that irreparable damage would occur in the event that any of the provisions of this Franchise are not performed by it in accordance with specific terms contained herein. Grantee agrees that Grantor shall be entitled to an injunction or injunctions to prevent breaches of this Franchise and to enforce specifically the terms and provisions hereof, this being in addition to any other remedy to which the Parish may be entitled at law or in equity.

SECTION 9.

Grantee agrees that the venue of any action brought under, or as the result of a breach of, this Franchise shall be in the 24th Judicial District Court, for the Parish of Jefferson, State of Louisiana.

SECTION 10.

Should a dispute arise relating to this Franchise and the Parish prevails in such dispute, the Parish shall be entitled to all costs and reasonable attorneys' fees and paralegals' fees (whether or not involving litigation and/or appellate, administrative, or bankruptcy proceedings), in addition to such other relief as may be granted.

SECTION 11.

This Franchise may not be assigned by the Grantee to any other company or legal entity without the prior written approval by the Parish, except that Grantee may assign its rights and obligations under this Franchise to Grantee's parent, subsidiary, affiliate or successor entity without such consent, so long as the parent, subsidiary, affiliate or successor assumes all obligations of the Grantee under this Franchise. At least thirty (30) days prior to any transfer of interest in the Franchise, Grantee shall provide Grantor with written notice of Grantee's intent to transfer, which notice shall include the name, address and telephone number of the appropriate contact of the proposed transferee as well as certifying that the proposed transferee agrees to assume the Grantee's obligations under the Franchise and agrees to be bound to the same extent as the Grantee, including, but not limited to, indemnification of Grantor, payment of all outstanding and future fees dues to Grantor, and maintenance of the Security and insurance coverages required under the Franchise.

SECTION 12.

It shall be the duty of every parish officer, employee, department, agency, special district, board, and commission and the duty of every contractor, subcontractor, and licensee of the parish, and the duty of every applicant for certification of eligibility for a parish contract or program, to cooperate with the inspector general in any investigation, audit, inspection, performance review, or hearing pursuant to JPCO 2-155.10(19). By signing this document, every corporation, partnership, or person contracting with Grantor, whether by franchise agreement, cooperative endeavor, bid, proposal, application or solicitation for a parish contract and every application for certification of eligibility for a parish contract or program, attests that it understands and will abide by all provisions of JPCO 2-155.10.

SECTION 13.

That the Chairperson of the Jefferson Parish Council or in her absence the Vice-Chairperson, be and is hereby authorized to sign and approve any and all documents necessary to give full force and effect to this agreement.

The foregoing ordinance having been submitted to a vote, the vote thereon was as follows:

An ordinance to amend sections 35.5-1 through 35.5-26 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana (the "Code") relative to wireline telecommunications franchises, to add sections 35.5-27 and 35.5-28 to the Code relative to wireline telecommunications franchises, to amend the title of Chapter 35.5 of the Code, to amend the titles of Articles I., II., and III. of Chapter 35.5 of the Code, to add Articles IV., V., and VI. to Chapter 35.5 of the Code, to repeal sections 35.5-60 through 35.5-66 and **section 35.5-80** of the Code, and to provide for related matters. (Parishwide)

WHEREAS, the Parish of Jefferson ("Parish") is a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana that, pursuant to the Louisiana Constitution, state law, and its home rule charter, possesses the full scope of powers to protect and promote the public health, safety, and welfare and to regulate the use of the public rights-of-way and public property; and

WHEREAS, the Parish has the authority to manage the public rights-of-way and the placement, construction, and/or modification of wireline facilities, which includes but is not limited to, the power to grant franchises to use the public rights-of-way to provide telecommunication services; and

WHEREAS, the public rights of way have finite capacity for occupancy by telecommunication facilities and other infrastructure and the physical occupancy and use of public rights of way by existing and new users has limited the capacity and continues to place a burden on the public rights of way within the Parish and on the citizens and businesses located within the Parish; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that occupants of the public rights of way be supervised with respect to the terms and conditions of their occupancy of such public rights of way; and

WHEREAS, the Parish desires to exercise its home rule charter and police powers to the maximum possible extent for the protection of the public safety and well-being; to minimize the inconvenience to the Parish and the degradation of the public rights of way occasioned by the occupancy of the public rights of way; and to occasion the orderly deployment of telecommunication infrastructure in the Parish in an efficient manner; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Parish to update its

ordinances concerning telecommunication franchises to reflect the current federal and state laws; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Parish to update its ordinances concerning telecommunication franchises to reflect the current recognized practices and standards; and

WHEREAS, the Parish desires to codify a uniform and comprehensive set of standards for the deployment of telecommunication facilities in the public rights-of-way and on public property in the public rights-of-way in order to protect and safeguard the health, safety, and welfare of the public.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE JEFFERSON PARISH COUNCIL HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. That the title of Chapter 35.5 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Chapter 35.5 - WIRELINE TELECOMMUNICATIONS FRANCHISES

SECTION 2. That the title of Article I. of Chapter 35.5 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE I. - GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 3. That Article I. of Chapter 35.5 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana shall be comprised of sections 35.5-1 through 35.5-12.

SECTION 4. That the title of Article II. of Chapter 35.5 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE II. - WIRELINE VIDEO SERVICE FRANCHISES

SECTION 5. That Article II. of Chapter 35.5 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana shall be comprised of sections 35.5-13 through 35.5-15.

SECTION 6. That the title of Article III. of Chapter 35.5 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE III. - WIRELINE INFRASTRUCTURE FRANCHISES

SECTION 7. That Article III. of Chapter 35.5 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana shall be comprised of sections 35.5-16 through 35.5-17.

SECTION 8. That the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended by adding a new article to Chapter 35.5, entitled ARTICLE IV. - GENERAL WIRELINE TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES FRANCHISES, which shall be comprised of **section 35.5-18**.

SECTION 9. That the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended by adding a new article to Chapter 35.5, entitled ARTICLE V. - GENERAL PERMIT REQUIREMENTS, DESIGN STANDARDS, AND CONSTRUCTION PROVISIONS, which shall be comprised of sections 35.5-19 through 35.5-26.

SECTION 10. That the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended by adding a new article to Chapter 35.5, entitled ARTICLE VI. - AUDITS AND REPORTS AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS, which shall be comprised of sections 35.5-27 through 35.5-30.

SECTION 11. That **section 35.5-1** of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-1. - Purpose and applicability.

- (a) The purpose and intent of this ordinance is to provide a uniform and comprehensive set of standards for the Deployment of Wireline Telecommunications Facilities in the Public ROW or on Public Property in the ROW. These regulations are intended to protect and promote the public health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the unincorporated areas of Jefferson Parish, to preserve and protect community character and aesthetic quality, and to reduce the visual and land use impacts associated with wireline Facilities, consistent with the maximum permissible exercise of the Parish's general, home rule charter and police powers. Any member of the governing body or Parish official or employee charged with the enforcement of this Chapter, acting for the Grantor in the discharge of his or her duties, shall not thereby render himself or herself personally liable; and he or she is hereby relieved from all personal liability or any damages that might accrue to Persons or property as a result of any act required or permitted in the discharge of his or her said duties.
- (b) This Chapter shall be generally and immediately applicable to any Person, including their Affiliates, assignees, lessees, or partners, who is occupying or who intends to occupy the Public ROW or Public Property in the ROW for the Deployment of Wireline Telecommunications Facilities.
- (c) This Chapter shall not apply to activities related to laying, placing, stringing, or otherwise deploying wireless facilities on, in, over, or under any Public ROW, and this Chapter shall not apply to activities related to laying, placing, stringing, or otherwise deploying Utility facilities on, in, over, or under any Public ROW. Such activities shall be governed by the provisions set forth in Chapters 35.6 and 35.7, as may be amended, or other applicable law.
- (d) This Chapter shall not apply to the lease or other use of private property or Public Property located outside of the Public ROW for the Deployment of Wireline Telecommunications Facilities. The Parish's Department of Building Permits shall be responsible for the issuance of permits for Facilities located on private property or Public Property located outside of the Public ROW.
- (e) In addition to the requirements of this Chapter, Grantees are required to obtain such permits or other approvals for activities on Public ROW or Public Property that pertain to environmental activities such as soil or ground water sampling, installation and plugging and abandonment of ground water monitoring wells, and any other similar activity undertaken in fulfillment of an order or requirements of the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development or the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality, or their successors or the United States Environmental Protection Agency or any other state or federal agency that has jurisdiction over environmental issues.
- (f) No Grantee shall use any Wireline Telecommunications Facilities located in the Public ROW to provide any services regulated by the LPSC, FCC, or any other government entity unless and until such Grantee has received specific prior authorization from the applicable regulating authority to provide such services.
- (g) No Person shall construct, install, replace, or use any Wireline Telecommunications Facilities located in the Public ROW without first obtaining an appropriate Franchise or other required approval from the Grantor pursuant to this Chapter.
- (h) Nothing in this Chapter shall alter the terms, including rates of compensation, of any current and valid franchise or other authorization to use or occupy the Public ROW issued by the Grantor prior to the date on which this Chapter first becomes effective.
- (i) In case of Emergency or disaster, Grantee shall, upon request of the Grantor, cooperate with Grantor to the greatest extent reasonably feasible to render such assistance as may be required, which may include but shall not be limited to the usage of Grantee's equipment, facilities, and plant, in accordance with the provisions of the Louisiana Homeland Security and Emergency Assistance and Disaster Act, La. R.S. 29:721 et seq.
- (j) The requirements of this Chapter represent the present intention of the Grantor. The Grantor reserves the right to amend or revise this Chapter in the future as deemed necessary by the Grantor.
- (k) Nothing contained in this Chapter shall restrict or prohibit a Grantee's use of contractors or otherwise require any Grantee contractor to obtain a Franchise.
- (l) Telephone Service Providers and Internet Service Providers who Deployed Wireline Telecommunications Facilities on, in, over, or under any Public ROW located in an unincorporated area of Jefferson Parish prior to January 1, 1974 shall be exempt from the requirement to obtain a Franchise in accordance with this Chapter and shall be exempt from the requirement to pay a franchise fee in accordance with this Chapter; provided, however, that all other requirements, duties, and/or obligations imposed upon Grantees or other Persons pursuant to this Chapter shall remain applicable to otherwise exempt Telephone Service Providers and Internet Service Providers; and provided further that the exemption provided by this paragraph shall not include any use of the Public ROW to provide Cable Service and/or IPTV Service and that any otherwise exempt Telephone Service Providers and Internet Service Providers using the Public ROW to provide Cable Service and/or IPTV Service shall be required to obtain a Wireline Video Service Franchise for such use in accordance with this Chapter and pay any applicable franchise fees related to such use.
- SECTION 12.** That **section 35.5-2** of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-2. - Definitions.

For the purposes of this Chapter, where not separately defined or inconsistent with the purposes of said articles, the following words, terms, phrases, and their derivations shall have the meanings given herein:

Affiliate, when used in relation to any Person, means another Person who owns or controls, is owned or controlled by, or is under common ownership of control with, such Person.

Applicable Codes means uniform building, fire, electrical, plumbing, or mechanical codes adopted by a recognized national code organization and any local amendments to those codes

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which are in effect as of the date work is completed.

Cable Acts means the Cable Communications Policy Act of 1984, as amended by the Cable Television Consumer Protection and Completion Act of 1992, as amended by portions of the Telecommunications Act of 1996, as thereafter amended.

Cable Operator means any Person or group of Persons (A) who provides Cable Service over a Cable System and directly or through one or more Affiliates owns a significant interest in such Cable System, or (B) who otherwise controls or is responsible for, through any arrangement, the management and operation of such a Cable System.

Cable Service means (A) the one-way transmission to subscribers of (i) video programming, or (ii) other programming service, and (B) subscriber interaction, if any, which is required for the selection or use of such video programming or other programming service.

Cable System shall have the meaning defined in the Cable Acts.

Camouflage means actions taken to ensure that Facilities are covered, blended, painted, disguised, or otherwise concealed such that the Facilities blend into the surrounding environment or area and are visually unobtrusive to the extent reasonably possible considering the inherent nature of the Facilities. Camouflage measures include, without limitation, hiding Facilities beneath a façade, blending Facilities with surrounding area design, painting Facilities to match the surrounding area, integrating Facilities into existing architectural elements, or designing Facilities to look like trees, light poles, traffic signal poles, or other items compatible with the existing environment. In certain circumstances, Camouflage measures may include painting or wrapping the Facilities in an artistic manner subject to Parish approval.

Co-locate means Deploying equipment, plant, fixtures, apparatus, appliances, and appurtenances on or in a pre-existing pole, other support structure, or Facility, including, but not limited to, equipment boxes and/or cabinets.

Community Character means those unique attributes including, but not limited to, architecture, historical and cultural features, historical development patterns, landscape, hardscape and the size, scale and spacing of buildings and other structures that define a community's identity.

Council shall mean the Jefferson Parish Council or its successor as the governing authority of the Parish of Jefferson.

Deploy or Deployment means placement, location, installation, erection, construction, collocation, maintenance, repair, service, use, operation, upgrade, expansion, modification, replacement, or removal of a Wireline Telecommunications Facility.

Emergency means a reasonably unforeseen occurrence with a potential to endanger personal safety or health, or cause substantial damage to property, that calls for immediate action.

FCC means the Federal Communications Commission, its functional successor in the United States government or a designated representative.

Franchise means the authority granted by resolution to occupy Public Property or the Public ROW in the Parish for the Deployment of Wireline Telecommunications Facilities.

Franchise Agreement means the written agreement entered into by Grantee and Grantor after approval of Grantee's application for a Franchise, which agreement includes any applicable general provisions of this Chapter, includes any applicable specific provisions set forth in Articles III, IV, or V of this Chapter, and includes any other provisions necessary to effectuate the Franchise that are not in conflict with the provisions of this Chapter.

Grantee means any person to whom a Franchise is granted by the Parish of Jefferson pursuant to this Chapter.

Grantor means the Parish of Jefferson or/and department or agency thereof, or any special district or agency governed or acting by and through the Jefferson Parish Council.

Gross Revenues has the meaning defined in Articles III, IV, and V of this Chapter.

Hazardous Material means dangerous goods which are usually subject to stringent regulatory and statutory restrictions or may cause or significantly contribute to an increase in mortality or otherwise harm human health or the environment because of its quantity, concentration, or physical, chemical, or infectious characteristics.

IPTV Service means the use of Internet Protocol (IP) networks for (A) the one-way transmission to Subscribers of (i) video programming, or (ii) other programming service, and (B) Subscriber interaction, if any, which is required for the selection or use of such video programming or other programming service.

IPTV Operator means any person or group of Persons (A) who provides IPTV Services over a Wireline Telecommunication System and directly, or through one or more Affiliates, owns a significant interest in such System, or (B) who otherwise controls or is responsible for, through any arrangement, the management and operation of such a System.

Internet Service Provider means any Person, other than a Cable Operator, IPTV Operator, or Telephone Service Provider, that provides access to the internet for individuals and/or businesses in exchange for a fee.

Law means jurisprudential law or a federal, state, or local law, statute, code, rule, regulation, ruling, order, or ordinance.

LPSC means the Louisiana Public Service Commission or its functional successor in the government of the State of Louisiana.

LURTC means the land use review technical committee established pursuant to Sec. 33-1.26 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana.

Parish means the Parish of Jefferson. When used in reference to geographical areas, Parish means the unincorporated areas of the Parish of Jefferson.

Permit means a "Permit for Telecommunications and Utility Installations on Parish Rights of Way, Servitudes and Other Parish Property" (as may be amended from time to time) issued by the Parish or such other form of written authority designated by the Parish to occupy the Public ROW and Public Property in the ROW for the Deployment of a Wireline Facility.

Person means an individual, partnership, association, joint stock company, trust, corporation, or governmental entity.

Public Property or Parish Property means any movable or immovable property owned or controlled by the Parish of Jefferson or any department, agency, or subdivision thereof.

Public Rights-of-Way, Parish Rights-of-Way, Rights-of-Way, Public ROW, or ROW means the space in, upon, above, below, along, across, and over any public streets, roads, highways, lanes, courts, ways, alleys, boulevards, sidewalks, bicycle lanes, and places, including all public utility easements, public service easements, and servitudes granted to the Parish, including poles, towers or other facilities located thereon of any type, as the same now or may hereafter exist, that are under the jurisdiction of the Parish of Jefferson.

Routine Maintenance means ensuring that an existing Facility is kept in good operating condition, and includes (i) inspecting, testing, or repairing a Facility or any portion thereof to maintain functional capacity, aesthetic appearance, or structural integrity, and (ii) substituting or replacing a Facility or any portion thereof with equipment of the same, or lesser, size and weight, and the same, or less visually obtrusive, shape, color, and Camouflage elements.

Subscriber means any Person lawfully receiving any service provided by a Grantee by means of, or in connection with, a Wireline Telecommunications System whether or not a fee is paid for such service.

Telephone Service Provider means any Person who provides competitive local exchange service ("CLEC"), long distance network service ("long distance"), and/or competitive access provider service ("CAP").

Utility or Utilities means any Person, other than the Parish, primarily engaged in the provision of water, gas, or electric services to the public.

Wireline means communications using conducted electromagnetic or optical emissions by, over, or within a physically tangible means of transmission, including without limitation wire or cable, and the apparatus used for such transmission.

Wireline Infrastructure Provider means any Person, other than a Cable Operator, IPTV Operator, Internet Service Provider, or Telephone Service Provider, that Deploys Wireline Telecommunications Facilities for use or operation by another non-Affiliate Person and neither itself nor its Affiliates provides any Telecommunications services over such Facilities.

Wireline Telecommunications Facility or **Facility** means equipment, plant, fixtures, apparatus, appliances, and appurtenances common to and used now and in the future by Wireline Telecommunications Systems, including but not limited to, cables, wires, conduits, ducts, poles, boxes, cabinets, pedestals, electronics, and other appurtenances.

Wireline Telecommunications System or System means the Facilities essential to the transmission of information related to the provision of Cable Services, IPTV Services, or any other Wireline-based telecommunications services.

Wireline Video Service Provider means Cable Operators and IPTV Operators.

SECTION 13. That section 35.5-3 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-3. - Grant of franchise.

- Franchise requirement.** No Person, including their Affiliates, shall Deploy any Wireline Telecommunications Facilities on, in, over, or under any Public ROW, make any cuts or excavations and/or constructions or erections of equipment, facilities or plant or works of any sort, or do any act, including the placement of equipment, facilities or plant, in anticipation or preparation of any of the foregoing acts, and/or the cutting, trimming, destruction or damaging any trees or shrubs, nor make any cuts or excavations for the purpose of constructing or placing Wireline Telecommunications Facilities on, in, over, or under any Public ROW, without first having obtained

the necessary Permits and a Franchise in accordance with this Chapter. Upon the expiration or termination of any existing franchise or other grant of authority to use the Public ROW, a Franchise governed by this article shall be required before any additional, continued or new occupancy or use of the Public ROW may lawfully occur; provided, however, that Grantor may, in its discretion, authorize Grantee in writing to temporarily continue its occupancy and use of the Public ROW prior to Grantee obtaining a new Franchise governed by this article. Access to certain parcels of Public ROW by a Grantee hereunder may be denied by the Grantor when, in the Grantor's sole discretion, it is determined that placement of Facilities on the Public ROW will be detrimental to the public health, safety, or welfare or will unreasonably impair or impede the normal use thereof.

- Scope of franchise.** Except as specifically provided by this Chapter, and subject to the requirements of this Chapter and the approval of a Permit application, if required, a Grantee of a Franchise granted under this Chapter shall be authorized to Deploy Wireline Telecommunications Facilities in the Public ROW. Any Franchise granted pursuant to this Chapter shall be deemed to incorporate by reference the terms and conditions of this Chapter as if fully set forth at length therein. In the event of conflict between the terms and conditions of any Franchise and the terms and conditions of this Chapter, this Chapter shall control, unless the Franchise specifically and expressly modifies the terms of this Chapter. In addition, any Franchise granted pursuant to this Chapter shall be subject to the Home Rule Charter of Jefferson Parish, the provisions of the general ordinances of Jefferson Parish, and any applicable federal or state laws or regulations. Nothing in the Franchise shall be deemed to waive the requirements of the various codes and ordinances of the Grantor regarding permitting, permit fees to be paid, manner of construction, or zoning and land use regulations.

- Applicable Codes and Laws.** Any and all actions taken by any Person pursuant to a Franchise granted pursuant to this Chapter shall be subject to all Applicable Codes and Laws, including applicable Public ROW management ordinances heretofore or hereafter adopted or established during the entire term of the Franchise. Grantee agrees to become a member of and participate in a regional notification center as outlined in La. R.S. 40:1749.14.

- Duration.** With respect to Franchises granted pursuant to this Chapter, the term of the Franchise and all rights, obligations and restrictions pertaining thereto shall be for a period of 10 years together with up to two five-year renewal periods as may be set forth in the Franchise Agreement itself. Upon final signature of a Franchise Agreement by both Grantor and Grantee, the effective date of the Franchise shall be the date of adoption of the resolution approving the Franchise by the Council. To request approval of a renewal period, Grantee shall give written notice to Grantor through the Parish Attorney for Jefferson Parish of Grantee's desire to renew its Franchise, at least 60 days in advance of the expiration of the then-current Franchise period. Grantor's approval of a Grantee's timely renewal request shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- Franchise non-exclusive.** The Franchise shall be non-exclusive. The Grantor specifically reserves the right to grant, at any time, such additional Franchises as it deems appropriate.

- Non-transferability.** Franchises granted pursuant to this Chapter may not be assigned, sold, or otherwise transferred by Grantee to any Person, including any Affiliate of the Grantee or any Person which acquires substantially all of the assets or ownership interests of the Grantee, without the written consent of Grantor expressed by resolution of the Council, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld. A Grantee desiring to assign, sell, or transfer a Franchise in accordance with this subsection, shall submit a written request for Grantor consent to the Parish Attorney for Jefferson Parish.

- Parish notice required for any Co-location.** Within 60 days after the effective date of this Chapter, Grantee shall (1) provide written notice to Grantor identifying all Persons that Grantee has currently authorized, allowed, or permitted to Co-locate, lease, or otherwise occupy or use any of Grantee Facilities in the Public ROW, and (2) provide Grantor with copies of all written agreements providing for such use. In addition, Grantee shall comply with the annual reporting requirements set forth in **Section 35.5-27**.

- Grounds for termination.** In addition to any other acts by Grantee which may be considered to violate a material provision of this Chapter and which may subject Grantee to the penalties provided for in this Chapter, should Grantee violate any of the requirements set forth in this **Section 35.5-3**, such violation shall be deemed to be a violation of a material provision of this Chapter and may result in termination of Grantee's Franchise in accordance with **Section 35.5-11**.

- Change of Law.** In the event of any future change in applicable Law, including the interpretation thereof by a court, the FCC, or other executive agency, that affects a material provision of this Chapter or any Franchise granted pursuant to this Chapter, Grantor and Grantee agree immediately to initiate good faith negotiations to amend the terms of the Franchise to bring it into compliance with applicable Law. If either Grantor or Grantee, acting in good faith, determines that the parties will be unable to mutually agree upon and make amendments or alterations to the Franchise to meet the requirements in question, or alternatively, either party determines in good faith that amendments or alterations to meet the requirements are not feasible, then such party may terminate the Franchise on 30 days prior written notice to the other party.

- Nonenforcement by the Grantor.** The Grantee shall not be relieved of its obligation to comply with any of the provisions of the Franchise by reason of any failure of the Grantor to enforce prompt compliance.

- Penalty for unauthorized operation.** It shall be unlawful for any Person to use or operate any Wireline Telecommunications Facilities in the Public ROW without a Franchise granted in accordance with this Chapter. Whenever any Person uses or operates any Wireline Telecommunications Facilities in the Public ROW without a valid Franchise, the Parish Attorney shall be authorized to immediately issue and enforce an order to cease and desist from said use or operation. In addition, such Person shall be liable for a fine of \$1,000.00 per day for its unauthorized use of the Public ROW beginning with the date such unauthorized use commenced and continuing through the date of discontinuance of the unauthorized use or operation.

SECTION 14. That section 35.5-4 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-4. - Franchise applications.

- Application.** Applicants for a Franchise to Deploy Wireline Telecommunications Facilities in Jefferson Parish under this Chapter shall submit to the Council through the Parish Attorney for Jefferson Parish an application in the form prescribed by the Parish to enter into a Wireline Video Service Franchise Agreement, Wireline Infrastructure Franchise Agreement, or Local Exchange Carrier Franchise Agreement with the Parish, which application shall include, but not be limited to: (i) a description of the Facilities to be Deployed in the Public ROW, their location, and the services to be provided, if any, (ii) proof of required insurance coverages, (iii) proof of the applicant's legal formation, incorporation, and/or organization, the applicant's state of citizenship, and the applicant's primary place of business, (iv) the name and address of the applicant's registered agent for service of process in Louisiana, (v) the certificate of the applicant's corporate representative or other appropriate document confirming the authority of person(s) who will sign the Franchise Agreement and any related other documents to bind the applicant, and (vi) any other reasonably requested information as may be required by the Parish.
- Application Fee.** An applicant for a Franchise under this Chapter shall pay an initial application fee of \$2,500.00. The application fee shall be submitted at the time that all application documents are submitted for the Grantor's review.
- Publication Costs.** The applicant shall pay the costs of publication of the Franchise in the event publication is required by law.

SECTION 15. That section 35.5-5 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-5. - Insurance requirements.

- Applicants for a Franchise to Deploy Wireline Telecommunications Facilities in Jefferson Parish shall provide Grantor with proof of the following insurance coverages by insurance companies authorized to do business in the State of Louisiana. With the exception of the worker's compensation insurance policy, Jefferson Parish, its districts, departments, and agencies under the direction of the Parish President and Parish Council

shall be included as additional insureds on all of the required insurance policies.

- Worker's compensation insurance: As required by the Louisiana State Statute exception, employer's liability limit shall be \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence when work is to be over water and involves maritime exposures, otherwise this limit shall be no less than \$500,000.00 per occurrence; and
 - A Waiver of Transfer of Rights of Recovery Against Others to Us in favor of the Parish of Jefferson, its districts, departments, and agencies under the direction of the Parish President and Parish Council.
- Commercial general liability insurance with minimum acceptable limits of: \$1,000,000 per occurrence; \$2,000,000 general aggregate; and \$2,000,000 products/completed operations aggregate; with
 - An Additional Insured endorsement in favor of Parish of Jefferson, its districts, departments, and agencies under the direction of the Parish President and the Parish Council CG 20 10 Form B (edition 07 04) or approved equivalent; and
 - A Waiver of Transfer of Rights of Recovery Against Others to Us in favor of Parish of Jefferson, its districts, departments, and agencies under the direction of the Parish President and the Parish Council.
- Commercial Automobile Liability coverage to be provided for Any Auto OR All Owned Autos and Hired and Non-owned Autos. If Grantee owns no vehicles, then a Hired and Non-owned Auto Liability policy is required; Minimal acceptable limit \$1,000,000 Combined Single Limits for bodily injury and property damage; with
 - An Additional Insured endorsement in favor of Parish of Jefferson, its districts, departments, and agencies under the direction of the Parish President and the Parish Council; and
 - A Waiver of Transfer of Rights of Recovery Against Others to Us in favor of Parish of Jefferson, its districts, departments, and agencies under the direction of the Parish President and the Parish Council.

- The applicant's/Grantee's policies shall stipulate that such policies will apply as primary insurance and shall further stipulate that no other insurance maintained in effect by the Parish will be called on to contribute to a loss covered thereunder.

- The Parish has the right, but not the obligation, to review and approve all insurance policies and certificates of insurance prior to the issuance of a Franchise under this Chapter.

- An umbrella policy or excess may be used to meet minimum requirements.

- All property losses to the Parish's property for which the applicant/Grantee is responsible shall be payable to the Parish and adjusted with the Jefferson Parish Department of Risk Management.

- All deductibles shall be assumed by the applicant/Grantee and the applicant's/Grantee's insurers shall have no recourse against the Parish of Jefferson for the payment of any premiums, state insurance assessments or deductibles; these provisions shall be stated on the certificate of insurance.

- Proof of self-insurance, after approval by the Director of the Jefferson Parish Department of Risk Management and the Office of the Parish Attorney, may be accepted in lieu of a certificate of insurance.

- Grantee shall notify the Parish Attorney for Jefferson Parish in writing within 30 days of any event of cancellation, expiration, or other termination of any required insurance policy.

SECTION 16. That section 35.5-6 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-6. - Security fund.

- Franchise Security.** Prior to applying for any Permits or engaging in any activities authorized pursuant to this Chapter, the Grantee shall deposit into a bank account established by the Parish of Jefferson, and maintain on deposit through the term of the Franchise, the sum of \$100,000.00 (the "Security Fund"). The maintenance of such Security Fund shall be a continuing obligation of Grantee.

- Purpose of the Security Fund.** The Security Fund is intended to secure, and may be utilized by Grantor to satisfy, Grantee's: (1) faithful performance of, and compliance with, all the provisions of the Franchise, this Chapter, and applicable Law, (2) compliance with all orders, permits and directions of Grantor, and (3) payment of any claims, liens, fines, fees, penalties, and/or taxes due to the Grantor which arise by reason of the construction, operation or maintenance of a System or the exercise of any rights granted under a Franchise.

- Reasons for withdrawal.** If Grantee: (1) fails to make timely payment to Grantor of any amount due under its Franchise, this Chapter, or applicable Law; (2) fails to compensate Grantor for any damages, costs or expenses the Grantor suffers or incurs by reason of any act or omission of Grantee; or (3) fails to comply with any provisions of the Franchise, this Chapter, or applicable Law which Grantor reasonably determines can be remedied by an expenditure from the Security Fund, Grantor may withdraw from the Security Fund a sufficient sum in satisfaction of same.

- Procedure for withdrawal.** Prior to making any withdrawal from the Security Fund, Grantor shall provide Grantee with written notice of the reason for withdrawal and the amount of the intended withdrawal. Grantee shall have 30 days from the date of notice to cure the default. In the event Grantee fails to cure the default, Grantor shall have the right and authority to make the noticed withdrawal from the Security Fund sua sponte and without necessity of obtaining any prior approval from Grantee or any court of law or other tribunal and without prejudice to any other rights or remedies Grantor may be entitled to under a Franchise, this Chapter, or Law.

- Restoration of security.** Grantor shall provide Grantee with written notice of any withdrawal made from the Security Fund in accordance with this section. Within 30 days after notice to Grantee that any amount has been withdrawn by the Grantor from the Security Fund, the Grantee shall deposit a sum of money sufficient to restore such Security Fund to the original amount.

- Return upon expiration or termination.** In the event that a Franchise expires, or is terminated by Grantor, and to the extent that there is any amount due from Grantee to Grantor under the Franchise, this Chapter, or applicable Law, Grantor may withdraw from the Security Fund a sufficient sum in satisfaction of same. Grantee shall then be entitled to the return of such Security Fund, or portion thereof, as remains on deposit at the expiration of the term of the Franchise, or upon termination of the Franchise at an earlier date, less any amounts withdrawn in accordance with this section.

- Rights of Grantor.** The rights reserved to the Grantor with respect to the Security Fund are in addition to all other rights of the Grantor whether reserved by this Chapter or authorized by law, and no action, proceeding or exercise of a right with respect to such Security Fund shall affect any other right the Grantor may have.

- Construction bond.** Grantor may require a reasonable construction, restoration, and/or performance bond from Grantee based on the length and type of construction (aerial, above ground, or underground).

SECTION 17. That section 35.5-7 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-7. - Hold harmless, indemnification, and limitation of liability.

- Hold harmless and indemnification.** Subject to the procedures set forth in Subsections (a)(1) and (2) below, the Grantee shall indemnify the Grantor for, and shall hold the Grantor harmless against, all damages, penalties, court costs, expenses, claim processing and/or investigation costs, and reasonable attorney fees suffered by the Grantor as a result of, or arising out of, the Grantee's Deployment of Facilities in the Public ROW whether or not the Grantee's acts or omissions were authorized, allowed, or prohibited by a Franchise; provided, however, that no indemnity shall be required to the extent that the liability arises from the negligent or willful misconduct of the Grantor, its officers, agents, boards, or employees. This provision is not intended to create liability for the benefit of third parties but is solely for the benefit of the Grantor.

- Upon commencement of any proceeding at law or in equity against the Grantor relating to or covering any matter covered by the hold harmless and indemnity obligations set forth in Subsection (a) above, the Grantor shall give the Grantee timely notice of such suit or proceeding. The Grantee shall provide a defense to any such suit or suits, including any appellate proceedings brought in connection therewith, and pay any final judgment or judgments that may be rendered against the Grantor by reason

of such or suits.

- Upon failure of the Grantee to comply with the "defense of suit" provisions set forth in Subsection (a)(1) above, the Grantor shall have the right to defend the same and in addition to being reimbursed for any such judgment that may be rendered against the Grantor, together with all court costs incurred therein, the Grantee shall reimburse the Grantor for attorney's fees, including those employed by the Grantor in such case or cases, as well as all expenses incurred by the Grantor by reason of undertaking the defense of such suit or suits, whether such suit or suits are successfully defended, settled, compromised, or fully adjudicated against the Grantor. These expenses shall include all out-of-pocket expenses, such as attorney fees, and shall also include the reasonable value of any services rendered by any employees of the Grantor. In the event the Grantor is compelled to undertake the defense of any such suit by reason of the Grantee's failure to perform as here and above provided, the Grantor shall have the full right and authority to make or enter into any settlement or compromise of such adjudication as the Grantor shall deem to be in its best interest without the prior approval or consent of the Grantee with respect to the terms of such compromise or settlement.

- Damage to Grantor Property.** Grantee shall exercise reasonable precautions to avoid causing damage to any Parish-owned poles or other Parish Property. Grantee shall assume responsibility for any loss from such damage caused by Grantee. Grantee shall make a report to the Director of the Parish's Department of Streets without delay, and Grantee shall, within 30 days following demand by Grantor, either repair such damage or reimburse Grantor for the total cost incurred in making repairs, including all direct employee wage and benefit costs, cost of materials, and cost of equipment used. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if Grantee causes damage to water or sewer infrastructure located on Parish Property, then Grantor shall immediately notify the appropriate Parish department of the damage to its infrastructure, and shall reimburse the Grantor for the total cost incurred in making repairs, including all direct employee wage and benefit costs, cost of materials, cost of equipment used, and the cost of any repair work performed by a contracted third party.

- Grantor Not Liable.** With the exception of gross negligence or willful misconduct of the Grantor, Grantor shall not be liable for any damage occurring to the Grantee's System caused by the Grantor, its officers, agents, employees or independent contractors, in the performance of their duties in connection with public works, nor shall the Grantor be held liable for the interruption of service by actions of the Grantor, its officers, agents, employees or independent contractors, in the performance of their duties in connection with public works. When reasonably possible, Grantee shall be consulted prior to any public work affecting its Facilities, but the Grantor shall have no liability to the Grantee in the event it does not so consult the Grantee.

SECTION 18. That section 35.5-8 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-8. - Grantor to require removal of property.

- Except in cases of Emergency, within 180 days following written notice from Grantor, Grantee shall, at its own expense, protect, support, temporarily or permanently disconnect, remove, relocate, change or alter the position of any Facility within the Public ROW whenever Grantor has determined that such removal, relocation, change or alteration, is reasonably necessary for the construction, repair, maintenance, or installation of any public works or improvements, or the operations of the Grantor, in or upon, the Public ROW.

- In the event any Parish-owned pole or support structure upon which any Facilities are Co-located is to be removed, replaced, repaired or altered by Grantor, or should it otherwise become necessary to remove or relocate any Facilities occupying the Public ROW or Public Property in the ROW to accommodate Parish projects, the Grantee shall, at its own sole risk and expense, remove or relocate its equipment upon request by Grantor. To the extent feasible, the Grantee shall be allowed to replace its equipment in the same location at the conclusion of the Parish project without the necessity of obtaining a new Permit to do so.

SECTION 19. That section 35.5-9 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-9. - Emergency removal or relocation of Facilities.

In the event of an Emergency, Grantor shall notify Grantee of the need for Grantee to disconnect, remove, relocate, change or alter the position of any Facility within the Public ROW, and Grantor shall provide Grantee with a reasonable opportunity to act. If Grantee fails to timely disconnect, remove, relocate, change or alter its Facility, Grantor shall have the right to do so. Under no circumstances shall Grantor be liable to Grantee, nor shall Grantee be entitled to any reimbursement from Grantor, for the cost of any Facilities removed or relocated in accordance with this Section or for any losses or damages of any sort caused by the removal or relocation of Facilities in accordance with this Section, including, but not limited to, any losses caused by disruption of the System.

SECTION 20. That section 35.5-10 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-10. - Grantee removal of equipment.

Except as provided in **Section 35.5-8(b)**, should Grantee remove its equipment from any Parish-owned pole or Parish-owned support structure, Grantee shall, within 30 days after such removal, give notice thereof to the Director of the Parish's Department of Streets, specifying the locations vacated as well as the date of removal. Removal of all Facility equipment from any Parish-owned pole or Parish-owned support structure without commencing its replacement or substitution by Grantee within 90 days shall constitute a termination of Grantee's right to use such poles or support structures without seeking a new Permit therefor.

SECTION 21. That section 35.5-11 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-11. - Termination of Franchise.

- Termination of Franchise.** Grantor reserves the right to terminate a Franchise granted under this Chapter, and all rights and privileges pertaining thereto, in the event that any of the following occur (the "Termination Events"):
 - Failure to Pay.** Grantee fails to pay, after 60 days' notice, any amounts due to the Grantor as provided in its Franchise or this Chapter, including, but not limited to, franchise fees, Security Fund payments, or any damages, costs, expenses, or financial obligations which the Grantor incurs by reason of any act or default of the Grantee in connection with the Franchise; or
 - Violation of Provisions.** Grantee violates any material provision of its Franchise, this Chapter, or any applicable Laws, and Grantee fails to cure such default within 60 days after Grantor provides Grantee with written notice of default (or such longer period as Grantee may establish to Grantor's satisfaction, which shall not be unreasonably withheld, is reasonably required to complete the cure so long as the cure is commenced within 60 days); or
 - Insolvency.** Grantee becomes insolvent or is adjudged bankrupt; or
 - Fraud.** Grantee is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to have practiced any fraud or deceit upon the Grantor or Subscribers; or
 - Abandonment.** Grantee fails to exercise its Franchise or otherwise use or operate its Facilities covered by the Franchise for a period of 12 months.

Procedure for termination.

- Termination shall be declared only by a written resolution of the Parish Council after an appropriate public proceeding whereby the Grantee is afforded the full opportunity to be heard and to respond to any such notice of violation or failure to comply. The Grantee shall be provided at least 30 days' prior written notice of any public hearing concerning the termination of the Franchise. In addition, 30 days' notice by publication shall be given of the date, time and place of any public hearing to interested members of the public, which notice shall be paid for by the Grantee.
- The Parish Council, after public hearing, and upon finding a material violation or failure to comply, may at its discretion terminate the Franchise, or impose a lesser penalty then termination of the Franchise, including but not limited to a penalty of up to one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) per day per violation, or excuse the violation or failure to comply upon a showing by the Grantee of mitigating circumstances or upon a showing of good cause of said violation or failure to comply as may be determined by the Parish Council.

SECTION 22. That section 35.5-12 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to

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read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-12. - Effect of termination or expiration.

Upon termination or expiration of any Franchise granted pursuant to this Chapter or any other authorization to use the Public ROW, and unless Grantor has authorized Grantee to temporarily continue its occupancy and use of the Public ROW pursuant to **Section 35.5-3(a)**, all rights of the Grantee shall immediately be divested without further action by Grantor. Unless Grantor expressly authorizes Grantee to leave certain Facilities in place, Grantee shall forthwith remove its equipment, facilities and plant from the Public Property or Public ROW at Grantee's sole expense within a reasonable period of time to be agreed to between Grantor and Grantee, and Grantee shall restore the area to the same or better condition in which it existed prior to its use by Grantee using in kind materials and construction techniques. Upon failure to do so, the Grantor may perform the work or cause it to be done, and the reasonable cost thereof as determined by the Grantor, including the cost of inspection and supervision, shall be paid by the Grantee and collection by Grantor may be made by deduction from the Grantee's Security Fund, court action, or otherwise. Any deficiency between the cost of the work and the balance of the Security Fund, including any other withdrawals from the fund which may be provided for under this Chapter or by Law, shall be a lien upon all equipment, facilities, plant and property of the Grantee in addition to any other remedies available to Grantor pursuant to applicable Laws.

SECTION 23. That **section 35.5-13** of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-13. - Franchise Agreement.

- Agreement required.* All Wireline Video Service Providers seeking to Deploy Facilities in the Public ROW shall enter into a Wireline Video Service Franchise Agreement with the Parish.
- Required terms of Franchise Agreement.*
 - Any Wireline Video Service Franchise Agreement shall comply with the applicable requirements of the Law, including, but not limited to the Cable Acts with respect to Franchises for Cable Operators.
 - Any Wireline Video Service Franchise Agreement shall provide that:
 - Grantee agrees to provide Cable Service or IPTV Service to all residents in the Parish subject to limitations imposed by the Grantee's sound and reasonable judgment regarding financial, technical and economical feasibility, considering customer demand, system capacity, and other factors, and agrees not to deny access to its Cable Service or IPTV Service to any group of potential residential Subscribers because of the income of the residents within the service area;
 - Grantee agrees to make available on demand, free of charge, one public, educational, and governmental ("PEG") channel for educational use; one PEG channel for use by the Parish government, and one PEG channel for the presentation of programming by the general public on a first-come, first-served nondiscriminatory basis;
 - Grantee agrees to carry all required federal, state and local alerts provided over the "Federal Emergency Alert System" through the Grantee's System in the event of a public safety emergency, which at a minimum will include the concurrent rebroadcast of local broadcast channels; agrees in the event of an emergency or disaster and upon request of the Parish President or Parish Council, to make available its Facilities to the Parish or to any other governmental or civil defense agency that the Parish shall designate, at no cost to the Parish or the designated agency, for emergency use during the period of emergency or disaster and shall make every reasonable effort to use its own employees to operate the System under such circumstances; agrees at the Parish's request, to train employees of the Parish to run the System in the event of an emergency or disaster as contemplated by this section, in which event the Parish shall be solely responsible for any damage to the equipment or facilities of the Grantee and shall indemnify and hold the Grantee harmless in connection with the Parish's use of the System in such event; and agrees at its expense to immediately incorporate into its existing Facilities the capability for an emergency override audio alert service enabling the Parish to issue electronic emergency alerts at any time without prior authorization of any kind from the Grantee; and
 - Grantee agrees to provide closed captioning for all programming provided over its System where such closed captioning is provided to the Grantee by the programmer.

SECTION 24. That **section 35.5-14** of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-14. - Franchise fees.

- Nature of fees.* As fair and reasonable compensation for the occupancy by the Grantee of the Public ROW and other Public Property for the Deployment of Wireline Telecommunications Facilities within the Parish, the value of such rights and privileges granted by the Franchise, the fact that the Public ROW contain limited and finite capacity, the administration of the Franchise by the Grantor, the usage and interference with the public's use of Public ROW, the reduction in the useful life of the Public ROW and other Public Property and other costs and obligations undertaken by the Grantor herein, the Grantee shall pay to the Grantor an annual compensation (also referred to herein as "franchise fee"), to be calculated as stated in this section. The franchise fees to be paid in connection with a Franchise granted under this Chapter are in addition to any and all taxes and fees or charges which the Grantee or any Affiliate shall be required to pay to the Grantor or to any other governmental authority. Neither the Grantee nor any Affiliate shall have or make any claim for any deduction or other credit of all or any part of the amount of franchise fee payments made pursuant to the Franchise against any other fees or charges, including ad valorem taxes and/or any taxes which the Grantee or any Affiliate is required to pay to the Grantor.
- Calculation of fees.* A Grantee of a Wireline Video Service Franchise shall pay to the Grantor a franchise fee equal to five percent of the Grantee's Gross Revenues from the operation of its System in the unincorporated areas of Jefferson Parish.
- Fee increases.* In the event that the maximum franchise fee applicable to Cable Operators under the Cable Acts increases during the term of a Wireline Video Service Franchise Agreement, then the franchise fee due from the Wireline Video Service Provider (whether a Cable Operator or an IPTV Operator) shall be increased accordingly, and the terms of the Wireline Video Service Franchise Agreement shall be deemed to have been automatically amended to reflect such increase. No decreases shall apply.
- "Gross Revenues" defined.* "Gross Revenues" means all revenues derived by the Grantee from regular subscriber service, auxiliary services, per program or per channel charges, leased channel revenues, advertising revenues, or any other revenue derived from the operation of the Facilities to provide Cable Services or IPTV Services in unincorporated Jefferson Parish. Gross Revenues shall also include money collected from Subscribers that is ultimately allocated by the Grantee to pay the franchise fee to Grantor. The term "Gross Revenues" shall not include revenue from any refundable Subscriber deposits, any taxes, whether the costs of such taxes are passed on to Subscribers or not, and shall not include the portion of any revenue received by Grantee for pay television services which Grantee is required by contract to pass on to the provider of the pay television program service. In addition, the term "Gross Revenues" shall not include revenue derived from telecommunications, telephony, internet or other non-Cable Services or non-IPTV Services provided by the Grantee. In cases where the Grantee bundles, integrates, ties or combines its Cable Services or IPTV Services with non-Cable Services or non-IPTV Services creating a bundled package so that Subscribers will receive a discount on Cable Services or IPTV Services, the Grantee will allocate the discount amount between the covered services and non-covered services comprising the bundle in the same manner it has allocated the discount to the Subscribers on their bills.
- Time for payment.* Payments of franchise fees calculated on a Gross Revenues basis are due and payable quarterly, within 30 days after the end of the preceding calendar quarter. Payments shall be by check made payable to Jefferson Parish. If any payment is not received by the due date, Grantor shall add to its payment a late penalty in the amount of 10 percent of the amount due. Additionally, interest in the amount of 10 percent per annum shall accrue on all payments and penalties until paid in full.

SECTION 25. That **section 35.5-15** of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-15 - Other payments.

In addition to any other amounts due under this Chapter, the Grantee shall remit to the Parish an applicable percentage of its Gross Revenues, as defined above, for the purpose of PEG capital costs. Such applicable percentage shall be one half of one percent (½ %). Payments under this section shall be made in the same manner as and as a part of the Grantee's payment of franchise fees and all administrative provisions applicable to such franchise fees shall apply to payments under this section.

SECTION 26. That **section 35.5-16** of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-16. - Franchise Agreement.

All Wireline Infrastructure Providers seeking to Deploy Facilities in the Public ROW shall enter into a Wireline Infrastructure Franchise Agreement with the Parish.

SECTION 27. That **section 35.5-17** of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-17. - Franchise fees.

- Nature of fees.* As fair and reasonable compensation for the occupancy by the Grantee of the Public ROW and other Public Property for the Deployment of Wireline Telecommunications Facilities within the Parish, the value of such rights and privileges granted by the Franchise, the fact that the Public ROW contain limited and finite capacity, the administration of the Franchise by the Grantor, the usage and interference with the public's use of Public ROW, the reduction in the useful life of the Public ROW and other Public Property and other costs and obligations undertaken by the Grantor herein, the Grantee shall pay to the Grantor an annual compensation (also referred to herein as "franchise fee"), to be calculated as stated in this section. The franchise fees to be paid in connection with a Franchise granted under this Chapter are in addition to any and all taxes and fees or charges which the Grantee or any Affiliate shall be required to pay to the Grantor or to any other governmental authority. Neither the Grantee nor any Affiliate shall have or make any claim for any deduction or other credit of all or any part of the amount of franchise fee payments made pursuant to the Franchise against any other fees or charges, including ad valorem taxes and/or any taxes which the Grantee or any Affiliate is required to pay to the Grantor.
- Calculation of fees.*
 - A Grantee of a Wireline Infrastructure Franchise shall pay to the Grantor a franchise fee equal to \$4.03 per linear foot of above-ground wiring, fiber, or cabling, plus \$4.03 per linear foot of below-ground conduits and ducts three inches or less in diameter, plus \$8.06 per linear foot of below-ground conduits and ducts greater three inches in diameter but no larger than six inches in diameter. Below-ground conduits and ducts larger than six inches in diameter are prohibited for use in Deploying Facilities in the Public ROW under this Chapter.
 - Where a Wireline Infrastructure Franchise has been granted to a Grantee by Grantor, the compensation to Grantor for any additional Person granted permission by the Parish to lease or otherwise use all or a portion of the System operated by the Grantee, shall be the sum which results from multiplying the total linear footage to be used by such Person times the charge per linear foot paid by the Grantee.
 - Fee increases.* All franchise fees based on footage rates and the amount of the maximum franchise fee shall be increased annually by the U.S. City Average twelve-month percentage increase, if any, in the All Urban Consumers—All Items Index (CPI-U) as compiled by the U. S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics (or its functional successor); no decreases shall apply. The CPI-U increase shall first be applied on January 1st following the first anniversary of the effective date of Grantee's Franchise Agreement and then on each following January 1st during the term of the Franchise.
 - Time for payment.* Payments of franchise fees calculated by footage rates are due and payable one year in advance and shall be paid annually by January 1 of each year. Payments shall be by check made payable to Jefferson Parish. If any payment is not received by the due date, Grantee shall add to its payment a late penalty in the amount of 10 percent of the amount due. Additionally, interest in the amount of 10 percent per annum shall accrue on all payments and penalties until paid in full.
- Fee increases.* All franchise fees based on footage rates and the amount of the maximum franchise fee shall be increased annually by the U.S. City Average twelve-month percentage increase, if any, in the All Urban Consumers—All Items Index (CPI-U) as compiled by the U. S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics (or its functional successor); no decreases shall apply. The CPI-U increase shall first be applied on January 1st following the first anniversary of the effective date of Grantee's Franchise Agreement and then on each following January 1st during the term of the Franchise.
- Time for payment.* Payments of franchise fees calculated by footage rates are due and payable one year in advance and shall be paid annually by January 1 of each year. Payments shall be by check made payable to Jefferson Parish. If any payment is not received by the due date, Grantee shall add to its payment a late penalty in the amount of 10 percent of the amount due. Additionally, interest in the amount of 10 percent per annum shall accrue on all payments and penalties until paid in full.

SECTION 29. That **section 35.5-19** of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-19. - Permit applications.

Prior to installing any Wireline Telecommunications Facility in, on or under the Public ROW, Grantee shall submit to the Parish's Department of Streets an application for a Permit. Any Permit issued pursuant to this Chapter shall be valid only for the locations(s) authorized in the Permit.

SECTION 30. That **section 35.5-20** of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-20. - Content of applications.

All Permit applications shall include the following information; provided, however, that the Department of Streets may agree, in

its sole discretion, to modify or waive a requirement to provide certain information listed below on a case-by-case basis based on nature and/or scope of a particular application:

- A certification that the applicant is the holder of a current and valid Franchise granted pursuant to this Chapter or other authorization to use the Public ROW;
- A detailed description of the Deployment activities sought to be conducted including applicable construction and engineering drawings;
- A topographic survey showing: (1) the location(s) of the proposed Facilities, and (2) the location(s) of all natural and man-made features located above ground or below ground in the Public ROW within 200 feet of the proposed Facilities, including, but not limited to, any Facilities, poles, support structures, conduits, pipes, cabling, cabinets, boxes, markers, trees, and/or driveways;
- Illustrations, photographs, or other visual depictions showing the visual impact of the proposed Facilities, including, but not limited to, the maximum silhouette, color and finish palette, and the proposed screening, Camouflage, signage, and/or other markers for the Facilities;
- A detailed construction sequence including a progress schedule, area construction maps, test plan, and projected dates for offering service;
- Certification that the Facilities being Deployed comply with all Applicable Codes and Laws;
- With respect to any Permit to Deploy Facilities using underground equipment, facilities and plant within the Public ROW, Grantee must submit evidence that it is a member of, participates in, and shares the cost of the Louisiana One Call System, as required in R.S. 40:1749.11 et seq.;
- Certification that the Facilities being Deployed will be placed into active commercial service not later than the 60th day after the date the construction and final testing of the Facilities are completed;
- With respect to a Deployment that involves Co-location on or in Facilities owned by another Person, certification that the applicant has the consent or approval of the owner to the proposed Deployment; and
- Any other requested information as may be reasonably requested by the Parish.

SECTION 31. That **section 35.5-21** of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-21. - Permit exceptions.

- Public Project Relocations:* A Permit shall not be required for any relocation of an existing Facility in the Public ROW in the event that the relocation is required for a Parish project or is otherwise requested by a local government, or state or federal agency, and the relocation plans have been approved by the Parish.
- Emergencies:* In the event of an Emergency, a Grantee may remove or repair its Facilities in the Public ROW without first obtaining a Permit; provided, however, that, in the event that the Grantee's Emergency work exceeds the requirements for Routine Maintenance, the Grantee shall notify the Parish of the work that was performed within 30 days of the date of completion of the work, and the Grantee shall be responsible to indemnify the Parish any damages which may result from such an installation or operation.
- Routine Maintenance:* A Grantee may perform Routine Maintenance of a Facility without first obtaining a Permit.

SECTION 32. That **section 35.5-22** of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-22. - Permit fees.

- Non-refundable fee.* The non-fundable fee for a Permit for the Deployment of any Facilities on Public ROW or Public Property shall be \$3.00 per each linear foot of such installations not to exceed an area of one contiguous cubic foot per each linear foot of the installation ("the linear installation route") for each permit. In the event that the installation will occupy more than one contiguous cubic foot per any linear foot of the linear installation route under a permit, the permit fee for such an installation shall be increased by an additional \$3.00 for each additional contiguous cubic foot and part thereof per each such linear foot. In all cases, there shall be a minimum non-refundable Permit application fee of \$500 and a fee in the amount of \$500 for each request for a time extension regarding a previously-issued Permit. A later or similar installation by the same Permit holder on the same linear installation route for which a Permit has been issued shall require an additional Permit and fee whether such an installation is, or is not, within the contiguous cubic foot or feet per linear foot for which a Permit had previously been issued.
- Cumulative permitting option:* Wireline Video Service Providers, Wireline Infrastructure Providers, Telephone Service Providers, and Internet Service Providers which require more than three Permits per month for service lines to individual residential or commercial structures have the option to use a cumulative permitting process.
 - The cumulative permitting process shall apply only to Permits for less than 100 linear feet of equipment installation up to a maximum of one contiguous cubic foot to be occupied by equipment per linear foot of the linear installation route for each permit for service lines to an individual residential or commercial structure and relocations requested by a government agency. The cumulative permitting process shall not apply to any other type of installation regardless of the size or extent of the installation. For multiple individual service line installations on Parish Property to a multi-family or commercial structure occupied by multiple businesses, each line on Parish Property shall be considered a separate project under the cumulative permit.
 - After approval by the Parish of an entity's cumulative permit application, including the entity's acknowledgment that no Parish personnel has the duty or may have the opportunity to inspect the project site before, during or after the installation of equipment under the cumulative permit and the fulfillment of the insurance, indemnity and restoration bond as outlined above for a permit, that entity:
 - May proceed with individual residential or commercial service installations after giving notice to the Parish of the location of such installations but without the prior issuance of individual project permits for those installations; and
 - Shall be allowed to furnish the length and GIS information for all such installations and also pay the permit fee on such installations on established six-month reporting and invoicing intervals.
 - The Permit fees and provisions outlined above shall apply to cumulative permits except that the \$500 minimum Permit fee shall apply only to the first 200 permits under the cumulative permit for service line installations for which a fee is paid by the same entity within each 12-month period. The first 12-month period for each entity using the cumulative permitting process shall begin on the first day of the month in which the first project was permitted under the cumulative process and each following 12-month period shall begin on the anniversary of the first period.
 - Construction bond.* Grantor may require a reasonable construction, restoration, and/or performance bond based on the length and type of construction (aerial, above ground, or underground).

SECTION 33. That **section 35.5-23** of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-23. - Penalties.

- Whenever a Permit is required by this Chapter, it shall be unlawful for any Person to commence or continue any work, excavation or activity without having first obtained such Permit. Whoever commits, or participates in the commission of, any act made unlawful by this Subsection, shall be in violation of Sec. 20-43 – *Injury to or destruction of parish property prohibited*.
- Whenever any Person commences any work, excavation or activity without a Permit or continues any such work, excavation, or activity that threatens public safety, interferes with the operation or maintenance of streets, public utilities or other public works, or is in violation of this Chapter or of the conditions of a Permit issued under this Chapter, the appropriate Parish department shall be authorized to immediately issue and enforce an order to cease and desist from said work, excavation, or activity. Said order shall be subject to review, and all of the procedures related to said order shall be conducted in the same manner as is provided for a cease-and-desist order for violation of the Parish building code. Within 90 days of the date of issuance of a cease-and-desist order, such Person shall remove any unpermitted work and restore the Public ROW to the same or better condition in which it existed prior to the unpermitted work. In the event that all unpermitted work has not been removed and the Public ROW has not been restored within the 90-day period, such Person shall be liable for

a fine of \$1,000.00 per day beginning on the 91st day after the date of issuance of the cease-and-desist order and continuing through the date that all unpermitted work has been removed and restoration of the Public ROW is complete. In addition, any Person who performs any work, excavation or activity in the Public ROW without a Permit, shall be prohibited from receiving any new Permits to perform work in the Public ROW until all unpermitted work has been removed and restoration of the Public ROW is complete.

- In addition, any violation of this Section shall be deemed a violation of a public health and environmental ordinance and shall be subject to civil administrative adjudication by the Parish administrative hearing officer.

SECTION 34. That **section 35.5-24** of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-24. - Design standards.

To protect and promote the public health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the unincorporated areas of Jefferson Parish, and to preserve and protect Community Character and aesthetic quality, and to strengthen, harden, and preserve the access of Jefferson Parish residents to telecommunications services in the event of future occurrences of severe weather or other damaging conditions, and in response to the widespread damage and loss of such services caused high winds and wind-blown debris during Hurricane Ida and prior extreme weather events, the Parish has determined that any Grantee seeking a Permit to Deploy Wireline Telecommunications Facilities in the Public ROW shall comply with the following design characteristics and requirements:

- General Standards Applicable to All Facilities.
 - A Grantee shall not Deploy any Facility or part thereof that: (i) obstructs, impedes, or hinders the usual travel or public safety on a Public ROW; (ii) interferes with entry or exit from a residence or business, use of a delivery area, or use of a bus, taxi, or valet loading zone; (iii) blocks view of traffic signs or signals; or (iv) interferes with access to a fire hydrant, fire station, fire escape, water valve, underground vault, valve housing structure, or any other public health or safety facility.
 - Grantees shall ensure to the extent technologically feasible that all elements of a Facility: (i) are designed, located, and/or Camouflaged in such a manner as to minimize their visual and sound impact, and (ii) conform with the Community Character and general aesthetic and design standards of the surrounding neighborhood.
 - Except as provided in this subsection, Grantees shall not construct or install any marker posts or signs in the Public ROW to mark the location of underground Facilities without the prior written approval and consent of the Parish. Grantees seeking to construct or install marker posts or signs in the Public ROW shall submit a written request to the Director of the Parish's Department of Streets. Grantees shall provide the Parish with an explanation as to why the posts or signs are necessary, a description of the type and number of posts or signs sought to be constructed or installed, illustrations of the proposed installations, and a map showing their locations in the Public ROW. Any marker posts or signs which are constructed or installed in the Public ROW without prior Parish approval shall be removed by Grantee at Grantee's cost within 30 days of written demand for removal by Grantor. Upon failure to do so, the Grantor may perform the work or cause it to be done, and the reasonable cost thereof as determined by the Grantor, including the cost of inspection and supervision, shall be paid by the Grantee and collection by Grantor may be made by deduction from the Grantee's Security Fund, court action, or otherwise. Any deficiency between the cost of the work and the balance of the Security Fund, including any other withdrawals from the fund which may be provided for under this Chapter or by Law, shall be a lien upon all equipment, facilities, plant and property of the Grantee in addition to any other remedies available to Grantor pursuant to applicable Laws.
 - To the extent practicable, Grantees shall use the least visible equipment possible, and each Facility shall be designed to occupy the least amount of space in the Public ROW that is technologically feasible.
 - Any above-ground Facilities shall be properly engineered to withstand wind loads as required by all Applicable Codes and all applicable local, state, and federal Laws. An evaluation of wind load capacity shall include the impact of modification of an existing Facility.
- Additional Standards Applicable to All New Facilities.
 - All new Facilities, including, but not limited to equipment cabinets and/or boxes, to be installed after the effective date of the Council ordinance approving the adoption of this Chapter, as amended, shall be installed underground with the exception of any above-ground Facilities for which a Permit was issued prior to such effective date;
 - Conduits and ducts shall be installed in the Public ROW between the adjacent property line and the curb line;
 - Conduits and ducts shall be installed parallel with the curb line and cross the Public ROW perpendicular to the Public ROW centerline;
 - Conduits and ducts shall be installed by trenchless excavation or directional boring;
 - Conduits and ducts shall be no larger than is reasonably necessary to accommodate the wires, fiber, or cabling for which a Permit has been granted;
 - All Facilities installed in the Public ROW shall have Co-location capabilities to the extent technologically feasible; and
 - All Facilities shall be installed with a minimum clearance of 3 feet from all water, sewerage, and drainage equipment, fixtures, or plant in the Public ROW.
- Additional Standards Applicable to Existing Above-Ground Facilities.
 - Above-ground Facilities in existence as of the effective date of the Council ordinance approving the adoption of this Chapter, as amended, or for which a Permit was issued prior to the effective date of the Council ordinance approving the adoption of this Chapter; including, but not limited to equipment cabinets and/or boxes, may remain in place and may be maintained, upgraded, serviced, repaired, and/or replaced in place for a period of 15 years from such date, during which time Grantee shall ensure that:
 - All graffiti on any components of a Facility shall be remediated within 30 days of notice from Grantor;
 - All landscaping, concealment, and/or Camouflage elements of a Facility shall be maintained at all times and shall be promptly replaced if necessary;
 - All Facilities shall be kept clean and free of litter;
 - All Facilities shall display a legible operator's address and telephone number for reporting maintenance problems;
 - Except as provided in Subsection (D) above, Grantees shall not allow any other signage or advertising to be displayed on any Facilities unless otherwise required by state or federal law;
 - Any of Grantee's lighting or other functionable elements incorporated into the design of a Facility shall be kept in good working order at all times; and
 - Each Facility shall be properly engineered to withstand wind loads as required by all Applicable Codes and all applicable local, state, and federal Laws. An evaluation of wind load capacity shall include the impact of modification of an existing Facility.
 - In the event that Grantee's maintenance of its Facilities requires the installation of a new replacement pole in the Public ROW, Grantee shall remove the existing pole within 120 days of installation of the replacement pole. Within 15 days of the date of installation of the replacement pole, Grantee shall notify the Parish in writing of the date of installation and provide the Parish with the identities of any Persons owning Co-located equipment on the existing pole. Within 15 days of the date of installation of the replacement pole, Grantee shall also notify any Persons owning Co-located equipment on the existing pole of the requirement to remove their equipment from the existing pole within 90 days. In the event that an existing pole is not removed within the 120-day period, Grantee shall be liable for a fine of \$1,000 per day beginning on the 121st day after installation of the replacement pole and a denial of all permits continuing until the date

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of removal of the existing pole. In the event that Co-located equipment is not removed within the 90-day period, Co-locators shall be liable for a fine of \$1,000 per day beginning on the 91st day after installation of the replacement pole and a denial of all permits continuing until the date of removal from the existing pole.

- (2) No later than the expiration of the 15-year period set forth in **Section 35.5-24(c)(1)**, all existing above-ground Facilities shall be relocated underground or replaced by new Facilities installed underground in accordance with the following:
 - (A) Conduits and ducts shall be installed in the Public ROW between the adjacent property line and the curb line;
 - (B) Conduits and ducts shall be installed parallel with the curb line and cross the Public ROW perpendicular to the Public ROW centerline;
 - (C) Conduits and ducts shall be installed by trenchless excavation or directional boring;
 - (D) Conduits and ducts shall be no larger than is reasonably necessary to accommodate the wires, fiber, or cabling for which a Permit has been granted;
 - (E) All Facilities installed in the Public ROW shall have Co-location capabilities to the extent technologically feasible; and
 - (F) All Facilities shall be installed with a minimum clearance of 3 feet from all water, sewerage, and drainage equipment, fixtures, or plant in the Public ROW.
- (d) Exceptions and Extensions to Undergrounding Requirements.

- (1) In the event that a Grantee desires to be granted an exception to the undergrounding requirements for new Facilities set forth in this Section, such Grantee shall file a written request for an exception with the Parish's Department of Streets as an addendum to any Permit applications filed by Grantee in accordance with this Chapter. The request shall include a detailed explanation as to why the undergrounding requirements are not feasible with respect to the Facilities for which the Permit is being sought, and the request may include a detailed explanation of any other reasons for which the Grantee may be requesting the exception. The request shall also include an alternative proposal or otherwise demonstrate how the Grantee's Facilities will meet the Parish's intent to protect and promote the public health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the unincorporated areas of Jefferson Parish, to preserve and protect Community Character and aesthetic quality, and to strengthen, harden, and preserve the access of Jefferson Parish residents to telecommunication services in the event of future occurrences of severe weather or other damaging conditions.
- (2) In the event that a Grantee desires to be granted an extension of the 15-year period for removal and/or relocation of existing Facilities, such Grantee shall file a written request for an extension with the Parish's Department of Streets prior to expiration of the 15-year period. The request shall include a detailed explanation of the reasons for the extension, a detailed description of the efforts made by Grantee to underground Facilities up to that time, and a detailed plan explaining the systematic approach the Grantee will agree to follow to achieve the objective of undergrounding Facilities as soon as practicable.
- (3) Any request for an exception to the undergrounding requirements or an extension of the undergrounding deadline set forth in this Section will be submitted to the LURTC and/or to a professional consultant designated by Jefferson Parish for review and recommendations. Upon completion of the LURTC and/or consultant's review and issuance of its recommendations, the Parish's Department of Streets will forward the Grantee's request and the LURTC and/or consultant's recommendations to the Council for consideration. The Council acting by resolution has final authority to approve or deny any exception or extension to the undergrounding requirements set forth in this Section.

SECTION 35. That **section 35.5-25** of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-25. - Construction provisions.

- (a) *Compliance with industry practices, Applicable Codes, and Laws.* All Facilities Deployed pursuant to a Franchise granted hereunder shall be in accordance with generally accepted industry practices and in strict compliance with all building, safety, and zoning codes, and all Applicable Codes and Laws, including, where applicable, any relevant LPSC or FCC regulations.
- (b) *No interference with public property.* Grantee shall arrange its Facilities so as to cause no unreasonable interference with the use of Public Property by any Person. In the event of such interference, the Grantor may require the removal of the Grantee's Facilities from the property in question with costs borne by the Grantee.
- (c) *Restoration of public ways.*

- (1) Whenever the Grantee shall disturb the surface, ground, base or landscape treatment of any Public ROW for any purpose mentioned herein, Grantee shall restore the area to the same or better condition, using in kind materials and construction techniques, in which it existed prior to the disturbance at Grantee's cost, and when any opening is made by the Grantee in any hard surface pavement in any Public ROW, the Grantee shall promptly refill the opening and restore the pavement at Grantee's cost. In the event of the failure, neglect or refusal of the Grantee, after 30 days' notice by the Grantor to repair, improve or maintain such Public ROW portion, the Grantor may do such work or cause it to be done, and the reasonable cost thereof as determined by the Grantor, including the cost in inspection and supervision, shall be paid by the Grantee and collection may be made by deduction from Grantee's Security Fund, court action, or otherwise. Any deficiency between the cost of the work and the balance of the Security Fund, including any other withdrawals from the fund which may be provided for under this Chapter or by Law, shall be a lien upon all equipment, facilities, plant and property of the Grantee in addition to any other remedies available to Grantor pursuant to applicable Laws.
- (2) The surface, base, and landscape treatment of any Public ROW disturbed by Grantee in the construction or maintenance of its System shall be restored in accordance with the existing standards of Grantor in effect at the time of the work. Should Grantor determine, within one year from the date of such restoration, that such surface, base, or landscape treatment requires additional restoration work to meet existing standards of Grantor, Grantee shall perform such additional restoration work at its expense to the reasonable satisfaction of Grantor.

- (d) *Reservation of street rights.* Nothing in the Franchise shall be construed to prevent the Grantor from constructing sewers, grading, paving, repairing and/or altering any street, alley, or public highway, or laying down, repairing or removing water mains or constructing or establishing any other public work. All such work shall be done, insofar as practicable, in such manner as not to obstruct, injure or prevent the free use and operation of the equipment, facilities, and plant of the Grantee. If any such property of the Grantee shall interfere with the construction or repair of any street or public improvement, including but not limited to the construction, repair or removal of a sewer or water main and the improvement of a Public ROW or any other public improvement, all such equipment, facilities and plant shall be removed or replaced in such manner as shall be directed by the Grantor so that the same shall not interfere with said public work of the Grantor, and such removal or replacement shall be at the expense of the Grantee.
- (e) *Trimming of trees.* Prior to performing any trimming, cutting, or other removal of trees or natural growth that are interfering with the Grantee's Facilities in the Public ROW, the Grantee shall apply for and receive a special area permit in accordance with the provisions applicable to public Utilities under Sec. 37-21 of the Jefferson Parish Code of Ordinances.
- (f) *Street or Public ROW vacation or abandonment.* In the event any Public ROW or portion thereof occupied by the Grantee shall be vacated by the Grantor, or the use thereof is discontinued by the Grantee during the term of the Franchise, all rights of the Grantee shall immediately be divested without further action by Grantor. Unless Grantor expressly authorizes Grantee to leave certain Facilities in place, Grantee shall forthwith remove its equipment, facilities and plant from the Public Property or Public ROW within 30 days at Grantee's sole expense, and Grantee shall restore the area to the same or better

condition in which it existed prior to its use by Grantee using in kind materials and construction techniques. Upon failure to do so, the Grantor may perform the work or cause it to be done, and the reasonable cost thereof as determined by the Grantor, including the cost of inspection and supervision, shall be paid by the Grantee and collection by Grantor may be made by deduction from the Grantee's Security Fund, court action, or otherwise. Any deficiency between the cost of the work and the balance of the Security Fund, including any other withdrawals from the fund which may be provided for under this Chapter or by Law, shall be a lien upon all equipment, facilities, plant and property of the Grantee in addition to any other remedies available to Grantor pursuant to applicable Laws.

- (g) *Movement of Facilities.* In the event it is necessary temporarily to move or remove any of the Grantee's Facilities placed pursuant to a Franchise, in order to lawfully move a larger object, vehicle, building or other structure over the Public ROW of the Grantor, Grantee upon reasonable notice shall move, at the expense of the Person requesting the temporarily removal, such as its equipment, facilities and plant as may be required to facilitate such movements. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Grantor shall not be required to pay such costs for temporary or permanent relocation of Grantee's equipment if such relocation is necessary for a Parish purpose.
- (h) *Safety.*
 - (1) Standard of care. The Grantee shall, at all times, employ the standard of care attendant to the risks involved and shall install and maintain in use commonly accepted methods and devices for preventing failures and accidents which are likely to cause damage, injury, or nuisance to the public or to employees of the Grantee.
 - (2) National Electrical Safety Code. The Grantee shall use, install, maintain, repair and/or operate it equipment, facilities and plant in accordance with the then-applicable requirements of the National Electrical Safety Code and the requirements of any electric utility providing pole or conduit space and in such manner that Grantee will not interfere with any installations of the Grantor or any electric utility.
 - (3) Maintenance. All of Grantee's equipment, facilities, and plant and connections in, over, under, and upon the Public ROW, wherever situated or located, shall at all times be kept and maintained in a safe and suitable condition, and in good order and repair.
 - (4) Louisiana One Call. No Permit shall be granted hereunder for the Deployment of Facilities using underground equipment, facilities and plant within the Public ROW unless and until the Grantee becomes a member of, participates in, and shares the cost of the Louisiana One Call System, as required in R.S. 40:1749.11 et seq. Written evidence of compliance with this section shall be provided with Grantee's Permit application. Compliance with this section must be maintained throughout the term of the Franchise.
 - (i) *Joint use of Grantee poles by Parish.* The Grantee agrees that the Parish, free of expense, may jointly use all poles owned and installed by the Grantee for any proper public purpose, so long as the use of the Grantee's poles by the Parish does not interfere with the use or enjoyment of the wiring, cables, and fixtures of the Grantee. In the event that the Parish uses poles belonging to the Grantee, the Parish shall indemnify and hold the Grantee harmless from and against any and all actions or damages caused by the placement of the Parish's property or equipment upon the Grantee's poles.

SECTION 36. That **section 35.5-26** of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-26. - Time of installation.

- (a) *Commencement of work.* A Grantee shall begin the work, excavation or activity for which a permit is granted not later than 90 days after final approval of the permit and shall diligently and actively pursue the work, excavation or activity to completion within a reasonable time period.
- (b) *Requests for extensions.* A Grantee may submit a written request for a reasonable extension of the time periods set forth in subsection (a) above to the Parish's Director of the Department of Streets. The request shall specify the reason(s) the work, excavation or activity could not be timely commenced or completed within a reasonable period despite the Grantee's best, good faith efforts and shall provide an expected commencement or completion date. The Parish's consent to a timely request for an extension shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned, or delayed.
- (c) *As built drawings.* Grantee shall furnish Grantor "as built" drawings not later than 90 days after construction has been substantially completed. Drawings shall be submitted to the Parish as computer generated GIS data showing the location of installed Facilities in a format acceptable to Parish, and Grantee shall also submit one set of blue or black line "as built" drawings. State plane coordinates shall be shown for benchmarks, curb lines, and structures. Drawings shall show horizontal dimensions from the curb line and elevations and be certified as correct by an authorized representative of Grantee.

SECTION 37. That **section 35.5-27** of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-27. - Audits and Reports.

- (a) *Audit of books and records.* After reasonable notice, Grantor shall have the right to inspect at any time during normal business hours, all books, records, maps, plans, income tax return, financial statements, and other like materials of Wireline Video Service Providers of and relating to such Grantee's services and System in the Parish in accordance with the provisions of this article and the Franchise Agreement. Access to the aforementioned records shall not be denied by the Grantee on the basis that said records contain "confidential" or "proprietary" information. To the extent permitted by law, the Grantor shall preserve the confidentiality of information so designated by Grantee, and the auditor conducting the audit on behalf of Grantor may execute a confidentiality agreement, subject to the approval of the Grantor and Grantee, for the protection of confidential or proprietary documents made available for review under this section. In the event such an audit reveals that Grantee has underpaid its franchise fees, Grantee shall promptly reimburse the Grantor for such underpayment. In the event that the underpayment is in the amount of three percent or more, Grantee shall promptly reimburse the Grantor for such underpayment as well as the Grantor's reasonable costs associated with the conduct of the audit.
- (b) *Communications with regulatory agencies.* Grantor shall have the right to request and receive copies of all petitions, applications, communications, and reports submitted by the Grantee to the LPSC, the FCC, or any federal or state regulatory commission or agency having jurisdiction in respect to any matters affecting the System located in the Parish authorized pursuant to the Franchise. Grantor likewise reserves the right to request and receive copies of responses from the said regulatory agencies to the Grantee. Grantee shall be entitled to redact any confidential, market sensitive information from the documents Grantee provides to Grantor.
- (c) *Annual report.* Grantee shall notify the Parish of the end of its fiscal year and within 90 days of the end of Grantee's fiscal year, the Grantee shall present the following written reports to the Grantor each of which shall be certified by an appropriate representative of the Grantee:
 - (1) A report specifying the linear length, volume, location, and extent of Grantee's aboveground and underground Facilities in the Public ROW, which information shall include, but not be limited to, the total number of poles located in the Public ROW as of the end of the fiscal year, the number of new or replacement poles installed in the Public ROW during the fiscal year, and the number poles removed from the Public ROW during the fiscal year;
 - (2) A report on completed and projected construction in the Parish during the fiscal year and projected construction in the Parish during future fiscal years, which information shall include, but not be limited to, a detailed description of Grantee's weather-related risk mitigation and resiliency improvements to its System which were completed during the fiscal year and which are projected to be completed during future fiscal years;
 - (3) A report which identifies each Person, including Affiliates, lessees, and/or assignees, that Grantee has authorized, allowed, or permitted to Co-locate, lease, or otherwise occupy or use any of Grantee Facilities in the Public ROW during the fiscal year and which describes the extent of such use together with copies of all agreements providing for such use; and
 - (4) A report recertifying self-insurance ability if applicable; and

- (5) A financial report for the previous calendar year itemizing Grantee's Gross Revenues if applicable.

SECTION 38. That **section 35.5-28** of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35.5-28. - Miscellaneous provisions.

- (a) *Severability.* If any provisions of this Chapter or a Franchise adopted hereunder is held to be invalid or preempted by federal or state regulations or laws, such findings or pre-emption shall not affect the remaining provisions of this Chapter or the Franchise which can reasonably be given effect, except as provided in subsection (f) below.
- (b) *Captions.* The captions to sections throughout this Chapter are intended solely to facilitate reading and reference to the sections and provisions of this Chapter. Such captions shall not affect the meaning or interpretation of this Chapter.
- (c) *Subsequent action by state of federal agencies.* Should the State of Louisiana, the LPSC, the FCC or any other agency of the state or federal government subsequently require the Grantee to perform or cease to perform any act which is inconsistent with any provisions of the Franchise, the Grantee shall so notify the Grantor. Upon receipt of such notification, the Grantor, after consultation with the Grantee, shall determine if a material provision of the Franchise is affected. Upon such determination, the Grantor in consultation with the Grantee, shall have the right to modify or amend any of the sections of the Franchise to such reasonable extent as may be necessary to carry out the full intent and purpose of the Franchise. The Grantor may terminate the Franchise in the event the Grantor determines that substantial and material compliance with the original proposed terms of the Franchise has been frustrated by such state or federal requirements. In such event, Grantee's rights are reserved to pursue whatever remedies it may have, and to comply with the duties and obligations which may be imposed upon it by such state or federal law.
- (d) *Causes beyond reasonable control.* In the event Grantee's performance of any of the terms, conditions, obligations, or requirements of the Franchise is prevented or impaired due to any cause beyond its reasonable control or not reasonably foreseeable, such inability to perform shall be deemed to be excused and no penalties or sanctions shall be imposed as result thereof. Such causes beyond Grantee's reasonable control or not reasonably foreseeable shall include, but shall not be limited to, acts of God, civil emergencies and labor unrest or strikes. Grantee shall notify the Parish Attorney for Jefferson Parish whenever performance is prevented or impaired.
- (e) *Non-waiver of regulatory authority.* Nothing in this article shall be deemed to constitute waiver or limitation of any powers of supervision, regulation and control of the Parish of Jefferson.
- (f) *Choice of law and forum.* Unless prohibited by Law, any and all claims related in any way to a Franchise or a Franchise Agreement under this Chapter shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the Laws of the State of Louisiana and shall be heard and determined in a federal or state Court having jurisdiction in the Parish of Jefferson.
- (g) *Inspector General cooperation.* Pursuant to **Section 2-155.10(19)** of the Jefferson Parish Code of Ordinances, any Grantee of a Franchise Agreement granted under this Chapter agrees to abide by the provisions of Chapter 2 of the Code of Ordinances and will cooperate with the Inspector General in any investigation, audit, inspection, performance review, or hearing pursuant to Chapter 2 of the Code of Ordinances.
- (h) *Administrative rules.* The Parish President shall promulgate or cause to be promulgated administrative rules and regulations for the more efficient enforcement and administration of this Chapter, which shall be prepared and promulgated in accordance with all applicable Laws.
 - (i) *Equal employment opportunity and affirmative action programs.* Grantee shall be an equal opportunity employer adhering to all applicable federal, state, parochial, or other laws and regulations.
 - (j) *Grantor's attorney fees and costs.* If any amounts due from a Grantee under this Chapter are not paid by the 30th day following their due date, the Grantee shall in addition pay a late fee of 10 percent of the amount due, plus legal interest on any sum unpaid until the entire sum due is paid in full. Should the Parish be required to file a civil action to collect any portion of said fee, late fees and/or interest, then the Grantee shall also be liable for the parish's reasonable attorney's fees and court costs.
 - (k) *Telephone alarm systems; prohibition, penalty.*
 - (1) It shall be unlawful for any Person to use, or cause to be used, install, operate, adjust, program or otherwise maintain a telephonic alarm system which automatically or mechanically transmits a signal, message or warning to any Jefferson Parish Sheriff's Office telephone lines. All signals, messages or warnings that are automatically transmitted to the Jefferson Parish Emergency Operation Center and approved by the Jefferson Parish Fire Department and the Jefferson Parish Sheriff's Office shall be excluded from the prohibitions and penalties of this section.
 - (2) For the purpose of this section, "telephonic alarm system" shall mean any mechanism, equipment or device which is designed to operate automatically through the use of public telephone facilities to transmit a signal, message or warning to another location.
 - (3) Any person violating the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, by a court of law, be punished by a fine of not less than \$20 nor more than \$100 or by imprisonment of not less than 30 days, nor more than 90 days and/or both. This section shall not apply to any Person furnishing facilities, lines or equipment under tariffs on file with regulatory agencies.
 - (l) *Placement of telecommunications devices on public rights-of-way.*
 - (1) No Person shall place or caused to be placed in, on, under or over the Public ROW, any fixed location telephone, whether coin-operated, nor any other fixed location telecommunications device, unless he has authority to do so under a valid Franchise or similar right properly granted by the Parish, and unless he has first obtained a permit from the Parish's Department of Streets after paying an application fee of \$500.
 - (2) No permit shall be granted under this section unless the following conditions are met:
 - (A) The applicant has entered into a binding contact with the Parish in which he agrees to pay an annual fee for the use of a described area or space in, on, over, and/or under the Public ROW, which fee shall be calculated by the Parish's Finance Director as an approximation of the market value for the particular use and/or particular location for one year;
 - (B) The placement will not violate any land use, zoning or safety ordinance nor create any unreasonable danger, risk, harm, inconvenience, nor impede other lawful uses of the Public ROW and/or private property nor create or foster a public nuisance;
 - (C) The location will not unduly facilitate criminal conduct in the area.
 - (3) Any fixed location telecommunications device illegally placed in, on, over, and/or under the Public ROW may be removed by the Parish subject to the same restrictions and procedures as govern removal of signage unlawfully erected in the Public ROW.

SECTION 39. That sections 35.5-60 through 35.5-66 and **section 35.5-80** of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana are hereby repealed.

WHEREAS, public officials, government managers, and private citizens want and need to have confidence in Jefferson Parish's financial reporting and audit readiness and that the resulting financial statements and reports detailing Jefferson Parish's finances are in compliance with laws and regulations governing their preparation, upkeep and dissemination; and

WHEREAS, Jefferson Parish's financial statements must be prepared efficiently, effectively, transparently, and timely to help ensure full accountability to the public and compliance with a multitude of oversight bodies and other stakeholders; and

WHEREAS, the tasks and responsibilities involved in Jefferson Parish's financial statement audit and report preparation for other agreed upon procedures has become more difficult over the years for a variety of reasons and the intricacies of fiscal management and reporting requirements mirror that complexity; and

WHEREAS, the administration recognizes that a need exists to divide the role of accounting oversight into two distinct elements, one that focuses on the day-to-day operations and transactions (i.e. Director of Accounting), and the other being the Comptroller position, which would focus on financial oversight, reporting integrity, high-level financial management, policy, and controls ensuring alignment with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) and the Government Accounting Standards Board (GASB); and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Parish of Jefferson to create a senior leadership role within The Department of Finance named Comptroller to assist in the oversight and integrity of Jefferson Parish's financial reporting framework, systems, and internal controls.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE JEFFERSON PARISH COUNCIL HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. That the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended by adding a section, to be numbered 2-158 which said section reads as follows:

Sec. 2-158 – Office of Comptroller; Qualifications, appointment and salary of Comptroller.

- (a) Principal office and position created; purpose. The Office of Comptroller and the position of Comptroller are hereby created, which office and position shall have direct administrative supervision and authority over all financial reporting, general ledger integrity, and audit readiness and shall set and maintain a tone of integrity and accountability regarding enterprise-wide financial reporting compliance. Activities of the Office and position include, but are not limited to, ensuring full compliance with GAAP/GASB standards, accurate and timely disclosure of parish-wide financial data, maintenance of strong internal controls, and the integrity of Jefferson Parish's public financial data. Responsibilities shall also include preparing and certifying the ACFR, SEFA, and related disclosures, and advises leadership on technical accounting, audit responses, and policy compliance with the goal in mind of maintaining steadfast bond ratings and credit-worthiness.
- (b) Qualifications. The Comptroller shall possess a thorough knowledge of governmental accounting, public budgeting systems and reporting requirements and how these concepts may be implemented, demonstrate an ability to manage and supervise administrative operations, possess skills in operations analysis techniques and work method improvement concepts, have proven oral and written communication skills, and demonstrate leadership ability in a local government setting. The Comptroller shall also possess the following qualifications:
 - (1) A four-year bachelor's degree in accounting, finance or a related field
 - (2) A licensed certified public accountant (CPA)
 - (3) Five (5) to ten (10) years of progressively responsible government experience in public financial management including a supervisory role in accounting and financial reporting in compliance with GAAP and GASB; and
 - (4) In addition to the qualifications above it is preferred that the ideal candidate also possess a CGFM designation (Certified Government Financial Manager) or a Master's degree with a concentration in Business Administration, Accounting, Finance, or related field.
- (c) Appointment. The Comptroller shall be appointed by the parish president and with the approval of the council.
- (d) Salary. The salary of the Comptroller shall be established by the parish president within the pay grade for the position as defined in the executive pay plan.

SECTION 2. That the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana is hereby amended by adding a section, to be numbered 2-159 which said section reads as follows:

Sec. 2-159 – Duties and responsibilities.

- The Comptroller is hereby assigned duties and responsibilities as follows:
- (1) Collaborates on policy development and management guidance with the director of accounting, director of budgeting, and director purchasing under the direction of the Director of Finance;
 - (2) Supervises and evaluates the operations under their supervision and report on performance on a regular basis;
 - (3) Counsels with the parish president and the parish council on policy decisions affecting finance and administrative operating directives;
 - (4) Oversight over the integrity of the Parish's financial reporting framework, systems, and internal controls;
 - (5) Reviews and validates financial statements and reports prepared by the Accounting Department and ensures alignment with Governments Accounting Standards Board (GASB) and Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP);
 - (6) Coordinates with internal and external auditors and oversees audit preparation and responses;
 - (7) Ensures and maintains compliance with local, state and federal financial regulations and new guidance from authoritative bodies;
 - (8) Oversees implementation of audit recommendations and corrective action plans;
 - (9) Assists in oversight of cash management, investments, and debt issuance and provides analysis related to bond financing, capital projects, and long-term liabilities;
 - (10) All other such duties or responsibilities that are related to financial statement preparation and reporting as
