# Truck Driving / Welding / Auto Body

## PROFESSIONAL TRUCK DRIVING

Do you want to pursue a new trade? This training program is an intensive six-week course scheduled from 8 am-5 pm Monday through Friday. Training does require some 14-hour days. Students will learn to operate articulated vehicles in a training environment that includes driving on city streets, two-lane, and interstate highways. Students will go on night drives and long runs during the fifth week of class. Most street driving exercises involve up to three students assigned to each unit. The program includes 240 contact hours, 44+ hours of behind-the-wheel training and 190 hours of classroom, lab, and observation. Tuition does not include the cost of books, DOT physical, drug screen, MVR report, learner's permit, or CDL license. Financial assistance is available through the Community College GAP Assistance Program for students meeting income guidelines. For more information on the income guidelines call 402-844-7245.

## GAS TUNGSTEN ARC WELDING (GTAW) TIG.

This course provides the student with a technical understanding of gas tungsten arc welding, arc characteristics, and welding safety. It provides training to develop the skill necessary to make TIG fillet welds on mild steel, stainless, and aluminum thin gage material which does not include thick plate, pipe, or other structural shapes. If a student desires to practice on different types of material other than what is offered, material must be provided by student. Supplies needed are helmet, welding cap, clear safety glasses, pliers, diagonal cutting pliers, welding coat, TIG gloves, and stainless-steel wire brush. No book is required.
