
LYCOMING COUNTY RECYCLING UPDATE

Lycoming County Drop Off collection procedures have changed! As the County works to slowly reopen its sites, you will notice the following changes. These changes will help maintain a sustainable recycling program.



FIBER/PAPERS - magazines, newspapers, chipboard, office paper, junk mail, and cardboard that has been broken down are all acceptable into one container (shredded office paper must be bagged and tied in a clear bag).

(No Styrofoam, No paper plates, No paper towels, No food)



PLASTICS BOTTLES 1&2/METAL CANS -

plastic bottles/jars #1&2 only, tin/steel cans, and aluminum cans are all acceptable into one container.

(No Styrofoam, No Plastic Bags/Film, No heavy plastics like laundry baskets & No clothing hangers)



GLASS BOTTLES/JARS - still separated by color (clear/brown/green) (Blue glass goes with green). (No Glass Cups, No Pyrex, No Ceramics, and No Window Glass) A small amount of any of these unwanted items will contaminate the entire glass load.

PLASTIC BAGS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE IN THE RECYCLING CONTAINERS, PLEASE EMPTY ANY BAGGED MATERIAL AND TAKE THE BAGS BACK HOME (take them to grocery store for recycling).

If someone in your household has COVID19, please throw away the recyclables.

Plastic

Containers

Kitchen, laundry, bath bottles and containers with numbers #1&2. Rinse the inside, labels may be left on.

No oil or anti-freeze containers, plastic bags/film, Styrofoam, laundry baskets, or plastic toys. Do NOT Bag recyclables.



Cans

Steel/Tin Cans, Aluminum Cans. Rinse the inside, labels may be left on.



Glass

Glass Bottles and Jars.

Clear, Brown, and Green glass; blue glass may be recycled with Green glass.

Rinse the inside, labels may be left on, dot not break glass.

No glass drinking cups, Pyrex, ceramics, window glass, plate glass, mirrors, auto glass, Earthen ware, pottery, or light bulbs.



Cartons

Food and Beverage Cartons.

Cartons are available in two types, shelf-stable and refrigerated.

(Milk, Juice, Broth, and Soup Cartons)



Paper

ALL PAPER MUST BE DRY

Newspaper and Magazines - separate bundles

Mixed Papers - Junk Mail, including envelopes, papers from junk mail, glossy ads, office paper, notepaper

Cardboard - flattened cardboard (breakdown boxes) No Styrofoam or packaging materials, No waxed cardboard

Chipboard - cereal boxes, soda cases, dry food boxes, paper towel rolls *No plastic or foil liners* Composite Cans - Rigid cylindrical container whose body is made of layers of papers, ends with metal or plastic (i.e. Pringles cans, coffee cans)

Wrapping Paper/Cards - wrapping paper and greeting cards may be placed in the cardboard containers No foil gift wrap

Do Not Bag Recyclables No Garbage



No Food or Liquid (Empty all containers)





No Plastic Bags or Plastic Wrap

(Take back to local grocery store)



No Tanglers (No hoses, wires, chains, or electronics)
