Re: Hannah's Place/Willingham Village Emergency Request

Dear Ms. Hudson:

Thank you for forwarding your emergency funding request to Senator Hufstetler. United Way agrees with your assessment that the existing sewer and water infrastructure is an emergency situation and health hazard to our Rapid Re-Housing Pilot participants. As you noted, once the individuals occupy the units, there are problems with the sewage backing up in the toilets and the bathtubs.

Effective immediately, please accept this letter as 60-day notice, per the terms and conditions of our Memorandum of Understanding, that we are returning 7 of the 26 units identified below to NWGHA for its own rental purposes going forward. United Way currently has participants in the remaining 19 units and will work as quickly as possible to transition them into safe housing alternatives according to their case plans.

United Way hopes NWGHA is able to resolve these infrastructure issues as quickly as possible for future tenants; safe and affordable housing remains a critical need in our community.
