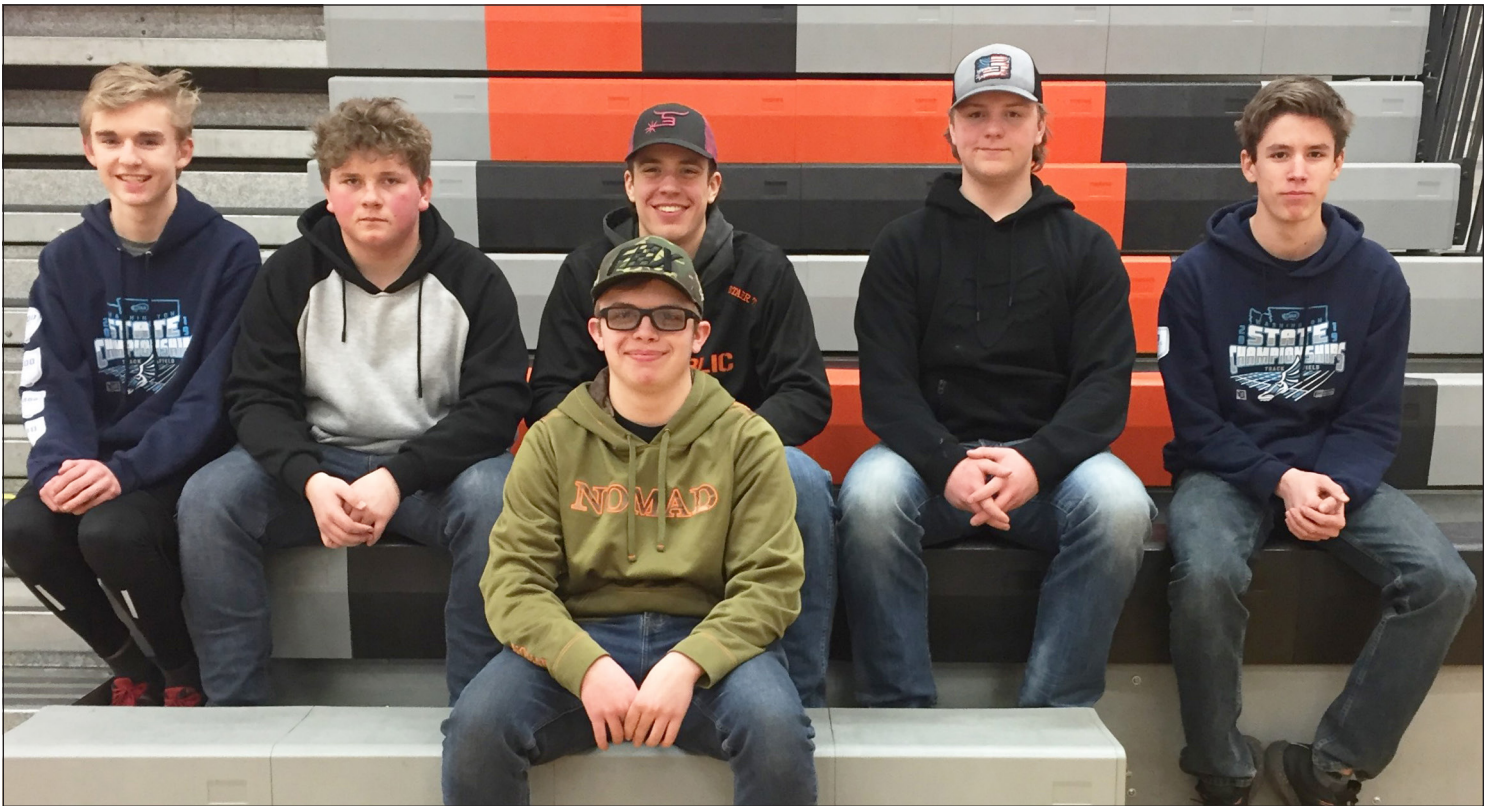
Republic makes plans to assist students

REPUBLIC — The Republic School District was still finalizing plans last week to assist with food services, daycare and educational opportunities amid the coronavirus crisis.

“Beginning March 17 we anticipate offering limited food service to our students,” a statement from the district said. “Per Gov. (Jay) Inslee’s proclamation, priority (for child care) will be given to medical personnel, first responders and others as needed; but families should consider additional options, if available.”

Plans were still underway last week for optional learning activities.

“We will keep you informed,” the district said.

Orient students will get workbooks

ORIENT — Teachers in the Orient School District have selected workbooks that will be mailed home for each student during the state-imposed closure.

“The workbooks contain work from all subject areas but were selected according to your child’s math grade levels,” said a school announcement. “These workbooks are meant for your child to work on at home. They will have an answer key for you to use to help you support your child’s learning.”

Workbooks do not need to be returned.

“That said, doing the work can only increase your child’s knowledge and keep their skills sharp for when school opens again,” said the district. “We also encourage all students to read at

least one-half hour a day.”

District officials also will be offering free breakfast and lunch services to all children up to age 18, regardless of whether they are enrolled. Meals will be delivered by school bus, with additional areas available for pickup.

Children must be present to participate.

Sign-ups are available by calling the school at 509-684-6873.

Spring parent-teacher conferences are canceled. Parents and guardians can contact their child’s teacher with concerns.

No grades will be posted for third quarter. They will be incorporated into the final semester grade, said the school.

Updates will be emailed, posted on the district website, sent out through mailings, and posted at the Barstow Store and Essentials General Store in Orient.
